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


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HASHEM SAVES YUNGERMAN

The Rabbi said, "Nothing."


So the wealthy man asked, "So then why do you come to my house immediately before

I have a few stories from the bitachon hotline, and I'd like to share them with you.

The first story goes like this: There was a man who was very into politics and news.

After a while, because he was following politics, it made him feel a little shvach and depressed.

That made him think: Wait a second, I follow 'A Life with Bitachon' and I know that politics and news is nothing. I know that politics have no power. They are not nice to follow, because this world is a whole big puppet show. Politics are nothing, really nothing, really nothing. Hashem is the one doing the puppets!

This world is a robot programmed factory by Hashem, and everything He does is for the best. When the man realized that he started to be so happy and not depressed anymore!

Here is another story:

Once there was a man named Eli Beer. He had a friend, who had a lot, a lot, of money.

Eli Beer was asked by his friend,

"Do you want to go overseas with me?" Eli Beer said "Why do you want me to go overseas with you?"

The very wealthy man said "because I know this poor man, who I owe hakoras hatov. He saved my father's life, and I want to give him a lot of money."

So they went.

When they were finding the house, they were thinking: oh boy we are about to make this poor, poor, man rich!

When they got to the poor man's house, it really looked like a shack, and they knocked on the door.

The poor man answered the door, "Hello what do you need?"

They said, "We have come to show and give you hakoras hatov for what you did, years ago".

The wealthy man said, "A long, long, time ago you saved my father's life, and we want to give you a lot, a lot of money, to pay you back for what you did years ago."

The poor man said, "Oh, why would I need that? I have everything I need!"

Then, they said, "What? You don't want to be rich?!"

The man said, but, "I have everything," and the man started listing all the things he has!

They went away thinking: we came to change his

life, and instead he changed ours, and we have this whole new mindset now!

We mentioned the chochmas Hashem in arranging our biting teeth to be in the front of our mouth and the crushing teeth in the back of our mouth.

Let's discuss another basic advantage of this arrangement.

Our molars do the main job of chewing in the back of our mouth and that is the area where our food is located until it is swallowed. During eating we are constantly opening up our mouth to insert another bite of food. If our molars were in the front of our mouth instead of our biting teeth — every time we opened up our mouth all the food that we are eating would be seen.

In addition to this, the food would be more prone to fall out if it was being chewed in the front of the mouth.

Hashem created man as a Tzelem Elokim, man is the crown of the whole creation as is very dignified. This is particularly true for Yidden who are called ממלכת כהנים - kingdom of princes. Therefore Hashem created us with molars that are hidden deeply in the back of our mouth so we can eat in a way that is polite and dignified for us and for all the

people around us.

Hashem arranged our front cutting teeth in two different sets. We have one set of sharp cutting teeth on the top of our mouth and another set of sharp cutting teeth on the bottom of our mouth.

Like so many of the wonderful gifts that Hashem gave us, we probably didn't ever consciously think about this point. Sharp teeth also have the ability to cut on a flat surface, the same way that a sharp knife cuts food on a cutting board. But when you have sharp blades that are cutting from opposite directions the pressure becomes much stronger and the cutting is easier and quicker. Our cutting teeth are not cutting on the gums; they are cutting on another sharp surface — the bottom teeth.

Our sharp teeth that work together simultaneously don't work as a knife; rather they work more like scissors.

The English word for the four front middle teeth is incisors, which comes from the same root word as scissors because that is how our front teeth work – as a team like scissors. Together they bite into the food and cut off a piece.

The unbelievable power of a good word By R'Y. Friedman

Last week we discussed how our relationship with Hashem makes such an impact on our davening. This week I would like to continue on this theme, as it's so vital for Tefilla.

We discussed last week how our feelings of love for Hashem and feeling His love, helps us connect to Him through Tefilla. Furthermore, when we really love Hashem, we will yearn to daven to Hashem, and we will enjoy every minute of it. Then we will want to daven longer as we are enjoying our connection of love.

In general when we refer to the basic Ahavas Hashem, it is based on Hakaras Hatov and also from the fact that He is our Father.

After Korach led his rebellion, Moshe and Aharon davened to Hashem for rachamim that all of Klal Yisrael be saved, and only Korach and his followers be punished.

The Ramban explains that Korach's influence was so strong that all of Klal Yisrael were somewhat persuaded and therefore deserving of punishment. Yet Moshe and Ahron pleaded for their case, referring to Hashem as "G-D of the spirits of all flesh... (16 22)". Why did they specifically use this term?

The Ohr Hachayim explains that there are three groups whom Hashem desires their praise.

Hashem first desires the praise of the malachim, but more so He desires the praise of the souls of the tzadikim in Gad Eden. Yet He values the praises of Klal Yisrael in this world the most. This is because the other two groups have such a strong clarity of the constant chessed of Hashem, that they are just compelled to praise Him without even thinking.

This is opposed to Klal Yisrael, who live in a world of hester panim where Hashem's involvement is more concealed. When we 'uncover the mask' and realize how everything that occurs is due to Hashem's incredible love and rachamim, it is tremendously valuable to Him, more than we can ever comprehend! Therefore, Moshe and Aharon used this demonstrating Hashem treasures the praises of human beings the most, and that it would be for His greater glory in this world to let them live! Phenomenal!

In reality, we are constantly surrounded by Hashem's goodness and each second we receive an abundance of gifts. After all, we can see, breathe, walk, talk etc. It is just that it isn't always easy to appreciate these benefits. When we make the effort to do so, and praise Hashem for His infinite goodness, it is unbelievably precious to Hashem. He said that, "anything is possible" and advised me to see a dentist.

I wasn't convinced that his diagnosis was correct.

In the shul where I davened at that time, there was a heimishe famous doctor known by a lot of chassidim as the Tzaddik Dr Friedman.

He served as a personal consultant for a lot of chassidishe rebbes paying them personal house calls for free. He was very helpful and close to the Stuchiner Rebbe a"h, the Bobover Rebbe a"h the Skulener Rebbe a"h and the Amshinover Rebbe a"h, to name

a few.

I went over to him after davening and asked him about it.

He immediately said that it's probably a blocked saliva duct that runs through the cheek. It was probably infected!

Wow! I never knew that there were tiny pipes and ducts running through my cheek designed by Hashem for the saliva to get inside my mouth!

He suggested that I should see an ENT, (ear nose and throat doctor).

Boruch Hashem he got me an appointment by the famous E.N.T. Dr Rufi for the next day.

Dr Rufi's diagnosis was concurrent with what Dr. Friedman had suspected.

He prescribed antibiotics and told me to eat sour things to get the saliva running through the duct and clear it out.

Thank you Hashem for the miracle medicine called antibiotics and for having someone to help and guide me to the right doctor.

At the time this story occurred, I acted like what people like to call, "young and dumb".

I should have been dancing for joy to find out about this amazing tiny but very important part of my cheek.

It is well known that Rav Avigdor Miller would speak at length about the wonders of the body. One topic was the amazing system of blood vessels that run through every inch of the body. If a contractor would build a house and run the clean water and sewage through the same pipes, he would very quickly become unemployed. So, it is absolutely amazing how in our bodies, the blood vessels that transport vital nutrients and vitamins to all parts of the body also carry away all the waste products that need to be expelled! Did you know that in the brain there are blood vessels so microscopic that they are just wide enough for the sticky blood cells to pass through one by one? Why is it that they so rarely clot and cause a deadly stroke? And just think about the amazing self-repair system the body employs to prevent us from bleeding to death if we get a cut.

Feeling Proud

Rabbi Yechiel Spero once told a remarkable story about one of our generation's most well-known philanthropists, Reb Shlomo Yehuda Rechnitz. On a trip from Eretz Yisrael to the United States, Reb Shlomo took a flight with a stopover in Shannon, Ireland. In the airport, he found a group of hundreds of American soldiers waiting for their own flights. It was mealtime, and upon striking up a conversation with the soldiers, Reb Shlomo discovered that they were displeased with the poor quality of the rations they had been served. The philanthropist approached the soldiers' commanding officer and asked him, "Sir, how many soldiers are in your battalion?"

"About four hundred," the man replied.

Reb Shlomo produced a credit card. "Tell your soldiers to go into town, and let each of them buy a fifty-dollar meal; I will sponsor it," he told the astounded commander.

Stunned by the stranger's generosity, the soldiers invited Reb Shlomo to say a few words. He spoke about the Jewish concept of hakaras hatov, explaining that Jews attach great importance to showing appreciation to those who benefit them. "People like you are the reason my family and I can be safe," he declared, eliciting a round of applause from the soldiers.

After his speech had ended, Reb Shlomo was approached by a soldier who revealed that he was a fellow Jew. "I come from Kentucky," he related. "All of us are from that area of the United States,

and there aren't many Jews there at all. I wear tefillin every day, and the other soldiers always mock me — not because they are anti-Semitic, but simply because they think I'm strange. I have always been the laughingstock of the group, but thanks to you, I am now going to be the hero, because they have seen what Orthodox Jews are about."

One of the ways a kiddush Hashem affects others is by enabling other Jews to feel a sense of pride in their Yiddishkeit. When a Jewish person acts in a way that brings honor to Hashem, others who witness it feel empowered to follow his example, and their own commitment to Yiddishkeit is enhanced. This can be a crucial component of avodas Hashem. As Rabbeinu Yonah teaches in Shaarei Teshuvah, when a person appreciates his own innate worth and recognizes the greatness of his roots as a Jew, he will find it much easier to resist the pull of the yetzer hara.

The Miracle of Bread

Recap: 18 of the many miracles that's in your slice of bread.

- The seed has all the bits and pieces of information to produce more wheat which is needed in the production of bread.
- 2. The seed stays fresh and do not rot so you can gather them and plant a whole crop's worth.
- 3. Soil is only found on earth.
- 4. Soil is the perfect environment for the seed to grow.
- 5. The soil is a natural habitat for ants to live in and also for the inchworm.
- The ant is an amazing creature that constantly is making holes in the ground. It tills the ground because Hashem put into its nature to constantly look for food.
- 7. The Inchworm bores bigger holes in the ground which is also a form of tilling the ground
- 8. Vegetation grows in the ground.

Q. I give a shiur in shalom bayis and chinuch issues. Sometimes, there is some friction in my own home. Additionally, I don't always deal with my children the way I should. When this happens, I feel like a hypocrite and faker when I give the shiur. What's the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. You should realize that these feelings are the trick and trap of the Yetzer Harah. He's hoping that you're going to get dejected and lose faith in yourself.

You have to say, aderaba! I'm going to take my current situation and make it the biggest motivation to excel and succeed in ruchnius more than ever before.

Q. I try very hard to honor my parents properly and to speak to them with derech eretz, but despite all my efforts I keep on slipping up. Although I'm trying so hard, I feel like I'm failing to fulfill kibbud av v'eim properly?

A. The reason you think that you're not being successful is because you think that avodas Hashem means: seeing results. Therefore, if you don't see the results you hoped for, you consider yourself a failure.

However, the true definition of avodas Hashem is to be an oived – to work. What this means in practice is to do a daily exercise that can help us achieve results.

Whether or not we will succeed is Hakadosh Baruch Hu's department

Here are some exercises to perfect our kibbud av v'eim:

- Learn one halacha a day on how to honor your parents.
- Focus on how endlessly devoted your parents are to you.
- Dwell on your parents ma'alos.

When you are practicing your daily exercises, even when you slip up you won't feel like you're a failure. You'll know that despite the bumps, you're on the right path and you're doing exactly what's expected of you.

Q. I was negligent, and caused serious problems in other people's lives. I asked them mechila and they were mochel me, but I still can't make peace with myself knowing that I caused other people to suffer. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. There was once a family who owned a swimming pool. Since there were little children in the house, they always made sure to lock the gate around the pool. Once, they forgot to lock the gate, and a child wandered into the pool area. He fell inside, and passed away, R"L.

The parents were beside themselves with guilt for having caused the death of their child through their negligence, and they went to Harav Ezriel Tauber Zatzal for chizuk.

Rabbi Tauber told them: when the Torah commands the mitzva of ma'ake, making a fence around one's roof, the Torah says כי יפול ממנו Chazal are מדייק from the word 'הנופל', that the person was going to fall and die anyway, just we have to make sure that it doesn't come through us.

Said Rabbi Tauber, we see, that even if someone is negligent by not fencing off his roof and someone falls off and dies, it would have happened anyway.

Another story: A Chashuva Yungerman once wanted to take family pictures by a stream. He made each child stand on a rock, and was about to snap a shot. Suddenly, one child lost his balance, fell into the stream and passed away.

That distraught father went crying to Rav Chaim Kanievsky that it's all his fault; he should've been more careful.

Rav Chaim told him, "Your daughter's death has nothing to do with you. It was nigzar that she should pass away at this exact time. You didn't cause it, and you couldn't have prevented it".

Therefore, if you feel you should have acted differently, you should do teshuva just like you would for any mistake, and plan how you could act differently in the

future. But you should realize that what happened to the other person has nothing to do with you.

Q. When I cause harm to others, I find it difficult to console myself by saying that whenever ever I affect others it was going to happen to them anyway, because chazal teach us מגלגלין זכות על ידי זכאי וחוב על ידי חייב. So even though I was just the שליח, it indicates that I'm a חייב?

A. Perhaps it does indicate that you were a חייב. But so what? It's like that with any aveira. Any time a person makes a mistake he's blameworthy to some degree. But does that mean that he should walk around labeling himself a חייב?

Instead, take this opportunity and reach places you never would have been able to reach otherwise. Do תשובה and your aveiros will be transformed into mitzvos. You can become a real צדיקים גמורים that even בעל תשובה can't reach your madreiga.

Q. My father has numerous health issues, and the doctor told him that if wants to live long he must change his eating habits and start exercising. However, my father ignored the doctor. He kept eating whatever he wanted and did not exercise. Recently, his condition deteriorated, and now he's in the hospital,

and the doctors say that his days are numbered.

At first, I felt very angry; all because my father disobeyed the doctor, he's going to die young. On the other hand, perhaps we say that if he was destined to die young, it would have happened anyway. What is the correct attitude?

A. One of the pillars of emunah is: Hakadosh Baruch Hu is echod. That means He is the epitome of perfection. He is running a perfect world, and whatever happens is in accordance with Hashem's plan, and it's impossible for things to turn out differently.

It's also true that Hashem gave a person bechirah, and there is a concept of s'char v'oneish. If a person takes care of himself. Hashem rewards him with bracha. If a person fails to guard his health, Hashem can make him fall ill.

How can we reconcile the two ideas? The Rambam says that our intellect is not sufficiently equipped to comprehend how these two concepts can co-exist. Nonetheless, we know with certainty that both concepts are one-hundred percent true. And when our neshamos go to shamayim after one-hundred and twenty, they will be capable of grasping the answer to this riddle.

All this is as far as our emunah is concerned. Now we come to another question: in regards to our personal avodas Hashem, which concept should we be focusing on?

The answer is: focus on whichever one will bring the best out of us. When faced with a nisayon, we should emphasize that our entire future is dependent on our bechirah.

However, when a person slips up and is now suffering the consequences of his decisions, he finds that dwelling on how much he is to blame is not helping him grow. In these circumstances, he should recognize that ultimately, his current situation is exactly in concurrence with Hashem's plan.

In your case too, focusing on your father's bechirah is bringing you down. In this circumstance, you should be highlighting that your father's condition is part of Hashem's grand-plan. And, although we may not understand how, we know that it's coming from Hashem's love and concern.

In your case specifically, you should strengthen your emunah that Hashem is the one in charge of life and death, not doctors. And the z'chus of having bitachon in Hashem and accepting his will b'ahavah is so powerful, that it can cause your father to have a complete recovery.
