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

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
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Dear Subscribers,

be as rich as Bill Gates, I'd be even richer. How so? I would do a little extra tutoring on the side.


The truth is, that we are all capable of being much richer than even Bill Gates.

I asked a young fellow the other day, and I don't mean to be gruesome, "If someone would give you a million dollars but they

would remove your hand, would you accept that deal?"

He said no.

I said, "Five million?"



So we know we have at least—if not more than—five million on this arm. And another five million on the other arm. And then we have two eyes. If you add it

all up, and we appreciate that it all comes from HaShem, then not only are we richer than Bill Gates, we're richer than rich!

Gut Shabbos!





Our teeth are uniquely strong and durable. They are the strongest part of the human body – even stronger than bone. Perhaps the reason that Hashem created our teeth so strong is based on a different unique attribute that our teeth have that differentiates them from bones.

All of our bones that get broken or fractured – they self heal. Hashem set them up in a miraculous manner that new cells are made that recreate the broken bone and that gets them ready for many more years of use.

The only bone like material in our body that does not self restore – is our teeth.

If a tooth gets broken or fractured, or even if it gets a small cavity, a small hole – it is there to stay. Time, creams or vitamins are not going to change that.

Since the damage to our teeth is irreversible, Hashem created our teeth from a special strong substance that does not break easily and does not need the self healing process. This is as opposed to the rest of our bones that are softer. They can break more easily and the self healing is vital.

The reason Hashem created our teeth extra strong is in addition to the simple reason that we already mentioned – they are constantly being used to apply a lot of pressure.

Hashem created our teeth uniquely strong with the ability to do their powerful job for

a lifetime. But despite the fact that the outer layer is as strong as steel, surprisingly it can be easily destroyed by its small and almost invisible adversary.

Plaque gathers on the tooth and it contains bacteria. This bacteria creates acids that if left on the tooth will eat away and erode the tooth. Just like acids that we are familiar with that can erode very strong substances, so too the acids in the plaque can erode and destroy the tooth. The main destructive acids come from sugar. Sweetened foods and drinks leave over bacteria that can be very destructive if they remain on our teeth. Not only can it eat through the hard layer of the teeth it can even attack the root inside the tooth which can be extremely painful.

This is why it is extremely important to consistently brush and floss our teeth to ensure that there is no bacteria that is parked on our teeth.

Remember, teeth do not self heal, if we are not responsible and we allow bacteria to devour our teeth, the damage or hole that develops is there for life. Our teeth are a gift, a very special, important and useful gift. If we value this gift and we want to keep it, we must take the time to take care of it, protect it and preserve it.

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Living With Apprechation By: R' Daniel Shasha

'And now Yisrael, what (mah) does Hashem ask of you, only to fear Hashem your G-D ...' (Devarim 10:12) Chazal (Menachos 43b) teachs do not read the verse mah, meaning what, but rather meah, 100. This is the source that one is obligated to recite 100 berachos each day.

The Chida teaches that when we recite berachos correctly, it is considered that we have brought all the korbanos listed in sefer Vayikra! He explains that each day we recite 100 berachos plus saying the word Baruch 11 times in Baruch She'amar which has some semblance of a berachah. This equals 111, the same number of verses in parashas Vayikra. Isn't this phenomenal! Every day we recite many berachos, such as birkas hashachar, when washing our hands, before eating, drinking, smelling etc. When these are recited correctly, it is like we have brought a korban in the Bais Hamikdash! What's more, there is a Midrash that teaches: not only are the berachos we recite like the korbanos, they are actually even Holier!!

What is the connection of korbanos to saying berachos? A korban is an expression of one's inner desire to express devotion to Hashem, creating a certain closeness. Hence the name korbanos, from the word kirvah drawing close. Each berachah we recite expresses our tremendous appreciation to Hashem for all He does, thus bringing us close to Him. We receive countless benefits on a constant basis and reciting berachos is the ideal way to express our appreciation. So before taking a bite from a scrumptious apple we stop and think, this delicious food is a gift from you Hashem, I really appreciate it, thank You! Then we recite Baruch atah.... before indulging from this delicious food. These few seconds of contemplation helps us appreciate the gifts we experience on a day-to-day basis that we often take for granted, thus strengthening our relationship with Hashem.

This idea is echoed by the Rambam (Hilchos Berachos 1:3) who teaches that the reason why we recite so many berachos is in order that we continually think about Hashem throughout our day. So, each time we say a berachah we bring ourselves closer to Hashem, just like bringing a korban. The Sfas Emes adds that the verse regarding bringing the Korban Tamid states 'Reyach Nichoach LaHashem'. Nowadays when we don't have a Bais Hamikdah, when we say berachos and thank Hashem it is considered like Rayach Nichoach, a pleasing aroma before Hashem!

Towards the end of his life, Rav Shach suffered greatly from a severe illness and his doctors told him that he would not be able to eat normally again. When he heard this, he cried uncontrollably, refusing to be comforted. He explained, "how can I not weep when I have been told

that I could never make berachos on food again, I would not be able to feel the incredible joy of this constant interaction between me and Hashem."

Q. I have a quiet personality, and I'm inclined to keep to myself. Should I try to break my nature and be around people? Or should I preserve my nature, because being shy has its advantages as well?

A. My Rebbe, Rabbi Yehuda Mandel Shlit"a said about himself:

"I used to be shy and scared of crowds. I would never speak in public, and I was even afraid to daven for the amud.

It was at that time that I went to Yeshivas Nevardohk in France. I arrived on Rosh Chodesh Elul, and the Rosh Yeshiva, HaGaon Reb Gershon Liebman Zatzal, asked me to dayen for the amud.

I told him, 'I never daven for the amud; I'm too shy. I don't know the nusach. I'm going to make so many mistakes!'

Reb Gershon countered, 'those are all reasons that you should daven for the amud! You can't go around being scared of people! The more you fear people the less you fear Hashem. And the more you fear Hashem the less you are intimidated by

That Rosh Chodesh was the first time I davened for the amud, and it was the beginning of breaking my fear of people. Today, I can speak in public with confidence and I'm able to reach out to so

people'.

many people'.

This is an example of someone who fought against his natural shyness, and thereby unleashed tremendous kochos.

On the other hand, we find Gedolim who used their natural shyness to climb to unimaginable heights.

Most dominant was Maran Rav Elyashiv Zatzal. He was extremely shy by nature. He was very intimidated by people and always preferred to be by himself. Therefore, he stayed alone and learned יומם ולילה, and emerged as the posek of Klal Yisroel.

Here we find someone who used his quality of bashfulness to his advantage.

We see that there are two ways a person could deal with his shyness. The common denominator of both instances is that each one dealt with his nature to harness his unique potential.

Therefore, if a person finds himself thriving by means of his bashfulness, there's no reason to break it.

But if one recognizes that his bashfulness is holding him back from bringing out his best, he should do exercises to free himself from the fear of people.

Q. Baruch Hashem, I have talents and believe that I can be a great rebbe. However, what's holding me back is, the fear of rejection. I'm concerned that some people won't appreciate me and I will feel very hurt. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. What is your underlying fear? You believe that you could be an excellent rebbe. But you're scared that people will point out deficiencies that you have, and this will make you look down at yourself. You'll think to yourself, 'so, I guess I'm not the perfect rebbe I thought I was'.

The truth is, a truly successful person is not someone who is flawless. Hashem made every person with strengths

weaknesses.

The criteria to being successful is when a person serves Hashem to the best of his unique abilities.

When you learn to feel comfortable with the qualities you have, you won't suffer from the fear of rejection.

Whenever someone tells you a discouraging remark, his negativity is because he is highlighting your shortcomings. However, don't believe the lashon harah about yourself! Tell yourself, 'Aderaba! I believe that I'm a fantastic rebbe'. And start focusing on the areas that you excel in. When you identify yourself with your virtues and work on developing your good qualities, you will bring the best out of yourself.

Q. I suffer from various emotional issues. Until now, I was trying to get techniques to overcome my difficulties. But recently, I visited a famous expert, and he concluded that I possess a certain emotional disorder. Now that I'm diagnosed 'emotionally disturbed' I feel helpless, and I have very

little motivation to try to work on my issues.

A. Biologically, you may have a certain condition. But the way it affects you, is in your control. If you label yourself 'emotionally disturbed', you're likely to feel the effects of your condition.

But you also have the ability to adopt the mindset that you're perfectly fine. If you have the self-discipline to adopt such a mindset, your body will react accordingly, and the condition will begin improving. This is a wellknown fact in the world of medicine. And it holds true in regards to physical ailments and emotional issues alike. If a person tells himself that he's healthy, the body can have the power to repair physical ailments. This is a phenomenon Hashem put in the briah to encourage and reward having a positive attitude.

Q. When someone compliments me, should I be concerned that it will turn me into a ba'al ga'ava and therefore dismiss the compliment by telling myself, 'it's not really true', 'I have so many other bad traits'. Or should I look at

him like a שליח of Hashem who's giving me a boost in knowing my value?

A. For some people, perhaps taking pride in the compliment will bring out their bad middos and turn them into a ba'al ga'avah. For such people, the right thing is to downplay the compliment, and not let it get to their heads.

However, most of us suffer from underappreciating ourselves. We have a low self-regard, and therefore don't tap into our true potential.

Oftentimes, when we receive compliments, we feel encouraged to utilize our strong points and bring the best out of ourselves.

When this is the case, the advantage of taking pleasure in the praise far outweighs the risk of becoming a ba'al ga'avah. Therefore, when someone gives you a compliment, appreciate it, enjoy it, and squeeze out all its positive energy to help you grow.
