After I got the tzitzis, she said to me, "Wonderful. Now I would like you to go with my brother to the south and distribute them."

to come closer. So I rolled the tzitzis up into a ball and threw them to him. It was windy, and a gust of wind blew the tzitzis

ball away from the soldier towards a bush.

Suddenly, someone stood up from behind the bush. It was the terrorist. He saw something flying towards him and it startled him.

The soldiers shot at him והוא (and the terrorist went up to Shomayim wrapped in tzitzis!!!)

One of the highlights of the summer, my wife and I were driving to the country through the




mountains on our way to a barbeque one early evening, and the GPS had us on an off-road, Route 52.

The Rambam explains that ever since Avraham was a young child, he was mesmerized at the incredible world and used to think about this day and night. He would ask himself questions like 'how does the universe go around, who is moving it? It can't just go around by itself?' Through asking these questions, he came to the realization that the world had to have a G-D and everyone else was mistaken. This eventually brought Hashem to reveal Himself to him. We were chosen to be Hashem's beloved nation, all in the merit of our father Avraham who appreciated the world's incredible natural beauty. We should strive to follow in his legacy and be awed by the stunning natural world around us. We could ask ourselves the same questions as Avraham. Imagine if we didn't have Suk-kos. No Sukka without all the excitement that goes into building the

Sukka. The decorations and all the love that goes into the construction. No eating and sleeping in the Sukka. No Lulav and Esrog. No searching for the most beautiful daled minim. No Hallel, and no shaking of the Lulav. Nobody circling the Bima crying out Hoshana.

Imagine we didn't have Chol Hamoed. No simchas bais hashoeiva. No extra time to learn more and no extra time with our family.

Imagine if we didn't have Hoshana raba with all it's beautiful minhagim. No second chance for a chasima Tova.

Imagine there was no Shemini Atzeres or Simchas Torah. No continuous singing and dancing with all the customs that come along with it. Every Shul has many customs that they received from their ancestors.

We would be missing so much!

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The Simply Solid Cemented City Sidewalk Squares

"Simple Matter that Simply Matters to us"

Did you ever give some thought to the interesting facts and benefits of the city's sidewalk concrete?


It looks like a simple light gray square box that's 'just sitting there'.

It's seems quite plainly, like a place of cement that is 'cemented into place'.

Well listen to this: It's not such a simple, plain thing at all. It's made up of a few very interesting 'stuff'.

Thank You, Hashem for such a wonderful tough, lime based substance.

Limestone is one of Hashem's interesting rock substances that He created. It has shell-like particles, that are made up of calcium+oxygen.



When heated up, it'll turn into a caustic, white, calcium-based powder called lime, (in Yiddish, "leim")

That's one of the most important ingredients in concrete.

The limestone is heated up

together with soft, mushy, sticky, clay that's dug out from underground deposits.

They add some grainy sand, yummy delicious water, and sometimes gravel as well.

All are Hashem's created inanimate matter, whose availability and usability really matters to us.

With the correct amount of each of the ingredients, this recipe will turn out to be a wonderful potent mixture.

After it's all mixed together there's an interesting chemical reaction that'll give off heat.

It releases its 'internal resting' powerful stuff.

When combined, the potent chemicals somehow, -Hashem knows how-release their koiach!

It's an , "inter - resting" mixture!

After drying, it'll serve as a strong, clean, dry surface.

"Ah mechaye!"

It'll be a tough, rock-like covering, over the top of the solidly packed earth underneath.

Boruch Hashem! No more dealing with earthy dirt and dust when it's dry weather, or with slippery Continued on mud when it next page

rains! Yippee!

Its rough surface gives you good traction as you walk, jog, run, hop, skip, and jump.

You'll be able to, "keep on going."

Now listen to this.

It can also withstand extreme changes in temperature.

Here in the N. Y. C. area we can go from - 0°F to over 100°F during the course of the four seasons, "ומחליף את הזמנים"

In the coldest times of the year the earth underneath freezes.

Even though everything else contracts when it's colder, amazingly Hashem makes the

frozen water expand! הפלא

Therefore, when the wet earth underneath expands as it freezes, the whole heavy slab of sidewalk can sometimes go along with the shifting ground and it'll lift up a bit. Amazing!

However the concrete itself can also sometimes crack because of the shifting ground.

That's why the pavement is shaped into separate detached squares.

This way of paving results in much less cracking of the sidewalk.

Since each box can shift a little bit on its own, as a result

there's much less cracking.

Thank Hashem for giving such a clever idea to man.

Then there's also the shifting of the slabs of cement due to the pressure of the tree roots.

Hashem makes the trees and roots grow larger over time.

He sends the roots to lengthen and find more area from where to draw in the daily nutrition that it needs.

The spreading of the roots also helps the tree to be more embedded and anchored deeper into the ground, over a wider amount of space, so that it shouldn't fall and topple over from its massive weight that it's gaining as it grows bigger.

Hashem planned it all out perfectly. Gevaldig!

These deep, searching roots put pressure on the underside of the sidewalk and therefore they will most likely lift the walkway.


The lines separating the squares also serve as a break off area, to stop the spreading of the cracking cement.

Let's give some thought and appreciation to having this hard dry cemented concrete covering of the ground.

In the days of old, people needed tall leather boots to be able to deal with the huge areas of muddy ground.

They had an opportunity to get more schar by coming to shul while trudging through the streets, in a muddy mess.

They had a mitzvah to scrape off their boots, from all the collected caked up mud, be-



fore entering a shul, or Yeshiva.

The olden times big tall wheels of the wagons would sometimes get, 'stuck in the mud'.

They would have to get another few strong, animal 'tow trucks', to pull them out of the mud.

That was another way to chap a mitzvah helping schlep someone's wagon and horses out of the mud.

B"H we don't have to be busy with all that mud.

We can however do plenty of mitzvos on the dry ground.

We can still get that extra s'char for going to shul, even when it's hard to get there, for some other reason, besides the mud.

Instead of helping a wagon out of the mud, we can give a boost to a stalled car, or help them fix a flat tire (on the dry ground).

We can show also kavod to the shul in other ways, instead of the mud scraping.

I'm sure you'll find plenty of good things to do, to be מכבד a great מקום קדוש

'V'ahavta l'reiachu kamocha'

The children can play nicely, and friendly, with their neighbors outside on the pavement.

There's plenty of great games that they can play.

On the long summer afternoons, Hashem helped the children learn, how these square shaped slabs of con-



crete can be turned, into being miniature playing courts.

There's the game, "Corners," and another game, "Three Boxes" both of which the game and it's rules, involve and revolve around the actual space, size, and shape, of the concrete squares.

Then there are many more outdoor games that can played on the dry outdoor area right outside of your home. Some of these are only for hard cemented areas.

Stoop, Basketball, Hopscotch, Belts, Dodge ball, Machanayim, Hoola Hoop, Tag, Freeze Tag, Monkey-in-the-Middle, Red Light Green Light, Hide and Go Seek, Circle Three, Ching Chong, Tap Tap Free All, Skippity, Elimination, Mosaic Chalk, and the list goes and on. Boruch Hashem!

Thank you Hashem for making the kinderlech so happy with all of those outdoor activities.

Add to that the unicycle, bicycle, tricycle, scooter, electric scooter, roller blades, skateboard, Hoverboard, and the Segway.

They would never work in the mud!

Thank Hashem for the dry, hard, paved walkways!

From now on when we walk on the sidewalk let's appreciate it, and thank Hashem for the great pavement of the walkway that we have, and use everyday.

I once heard from Rabbi Avigdor Miller zt"l, that these thoughts can be useful as we walk the city streets.

Especially when we are careful to look downward, at the sidewalk, watching our eyes from improper sights.

So from now on,.. As we, "look down" at the sidewalk we'll, "look up" to Hashem!!



THE LOST OPPORTUNITY

A young child in B'nei Brak unfortunately started losing his vision. His parents sought out the required medical care, but no doctor they took him to had any solution to his ailment. They turned to a world-famous askan who specialized in locating the specialist needed for special

cases, and after inquiring, he found that there was one and only one doctor in Texas who could heal the boy.

They scheduled the next available appointment, which was only in five months' time. Sometime in between, the doctor from Texas visited Eretz Yisroel for a three-day medical conference. After a day and



AN UNUSUAL PHENOM-ENON

Reb Michel Yehudah Lefkowitz was in chinuch for many years. Reb Michel Yehudah said that he observed an unusual phenomenon. Generally, the children who weren't successful in Torah in their youth became the most successful. out of their family, later in life. For some reason, the outstanding successful child of the family is precisely the one who didn't excel in his younger vears. Sometimes, his success is in Torah and mitzvos or in business, but the pattern is that the one who seemed least likely to succeed ultimately outshined the others.

Reb Michel added, "I don't know why, but I think it is because the parents invested many tefillos for those children. They dav-

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ened for all their children, but because they cried for those 'unsuccessful' ones, those tefillos were eventually answered."

RECALCULATE

There's a similar story heard about him that shows the same idea. The son of a widow was once kicked out of yeshiva because of his disrespectful behavior. The yeshiva had done their best to keep him in, but things had gotten to the point where there was nothing more that could be done, and they were forced to send him home.

They called his mother, and broke the news to her of his misbehavior and their decision to expel him from the yeshiva.

"Why didn't you tell me earlier," she asked. "You can't just do that to me—tell me suddenly that he's being kicked out. You must give me a warning!"

"We were strongly contem-

plating that," replied the hanhalah, "but we knew the situation. There was simply nothing to do. Had there been anything that could have been done, we would surely have told you. Instead, we tried to spare you unnecessary aggravation and stress by not telling you until he had to be sent home."

"But what do you mean 'nothing to do?" asked the mother, "I could've davened. There might've been nothing physically to do, but davening can change everything. Since you didn't give it a full try, I insist that he not be kicked out."

They were very taken back. The hanhalah hadn't been anticipating such a claim. They therefore decided to pose the question to Reb Michel Yehudah to see his opinion.

They came to Reb Michel Yehudah's room and presented him with the question. Each of the sides presented their side, and they awaited the response of the great tzaddik.

Hearing the two sides, the Rav responded that the widow was right. Although chinuch-wise there wasn't anything they could do, but she could've davened. They hadn't given it all they had to help this child, and therefore he said that they must take back the child and give him another fair chance with "davening."

This is an incredible, eye-opening story. We see from here that what can't be done without davening can surely be accomplished through davening. And therefore, the school would have to take the child back in for another try.

"R' ELYASHIV"

Klal Yisroel's greatest brachah in the past generation was the great tzaddik, R' Yosef Shalom Elyashiv. He enlightened the world with his p'sakim, halachah

rulings, and much more.

What's the story behind him?

His father, R' Avraham Elyashiv, was the son-inlaw of the Leshem. At first, they weren't zocheh to any children. They decided that they would travel from Hamala, where they lived, to Vienna, a two-week travel, where a top doctor in the field practiced.

After a full screening, the doctor picked up his hands and said that there's absolutely no hope for them to have any children. They'd have to settle with "reality," he told them.

Sadly and brokenheartedly, they started returning to their hometown with no cure. To prevent her embarrassment, R' Avraham's wife withheld her tears for the entire ride.

When she finally returned home, she immediately went to the shed where they kept the grain, and for a long time she sat there and cried her eyes out. When she finished letting out her tears, she began to walk back to her house, but before she could get there, she ran into her father, the Leshem. He saw something was bothering her and asked what was going on.

"Is there something that I can help you with?" he asked her.

She tried changing the conversation, but it didn't work. Her father saw her red eyes and knew that there's something that must be taken care of. She therefore told him of their entire trip, the appointment with the doctor, his sour report, and now her releasing of all her bottled-up emotions.

Her father said, "I'll tell you a pshat, and listen carefully. We say every day: 'Karov Hashem l'chol kor'av, Hashem is close to all that call out to Him, l'chol asher yikre'uhu b'emes, to those that call to Him with truth.'

"What does this mean?" asked the Leshem. there than a man that calls to Hashem lacking truth? What does it mean that he calls to him with truth? The verse is referring to when there's no one to turn to. There's nothing in the 'books' that can be done. When such a person turns to Hashem, he's turning to Him completely. There's no one that can possibly help. When there no hishtadlus to be done, that is what the pasuk is referring to.

"Now's the time to turn to Hashem, as now you just got to the point where you sense that there's no one to turn to. Now you're going to have your salvation!"

The rest, as they say, is history. A year later, they were bentched with a child—not an ordinary child, but a child that lit up the world with Torah.

World Trade Center on September 11, 2001. The very first ambulance to arrive at the Twin Towers following the first plane crash was a Hatzalah ambulance. By the time the second airplane crashed into the second tower, there were two dozen Hatzalah ambulances, including their communications and command center trailer, and 200 EMTs, paramedics, and doctors from Hatzalah on the scene. By the time the buildings collapsed, ambulances and emergency medical personnel from all the branches of Hatzalah throughout the five boroughs of the city of New York and as far away as Rockland County had arrived on the scene. During the first hour of the disaster, over 123 patients were transported to area hospitals by Hatzalah ambulances. At the south end of the Twin Towers, Hatzalah was the dominant ambulance service covering the disaster scene. They transported numerous victims to safety, including police officers and fire fighters.

When the buildings collapsed, about 3,000 people were killed. In addition to the people inside the buildings themselves, everyone in the vicinity was endangered by the huge pieces of metal and glass falling from great heights. People

raced for cover. Many were killed by falling debris or died from suffocation by the dust and smoke. The Hatzalah dispatcher was advised by two-

way radio that many Hatzalah members had been trapped under the debris, and he began calling each member by name over the radio. For the 850 members and their wives, it was an extremely long hour as they waited to hear responses from their colleagues and husbands. At the end, although there were injuries, every single Hatzalah member was accounted for and confirmed to be alive. It was clear to everyone that hundreds of miracles must have taken place for all of the members of Hatzalah to be saved. They all attributed their miraculous salvation to the zechus of being part of an organization that engages in constant lifesaving chessed.

Rabbi Mechel Handler, the executive director of Chevrah Hatzalah, was one of the people who came close to death as he struggled to breathe and race for cover in the midst of the falling debris. When Rabbi Hendler later met Chief Robert McCracken of FDNY/NYCEMS, the two men immediately hugged each other. After hearing that all of the Hatzalah members had survived, Chief McCracken said with conviction, "It is obvious that your G-d has miraculously saved all of you" (Even in the Darkest Moments, by Zeev

Breier).

This was not the only large-scale disaster in which countless Jewish lives were saved through overt miracles. During the



Gulf War, Iraq fired deadly Scud missiles into heavily populated areas in Israel. These missiles carried powerful warheads that had the power to cause massive damage. Incredibly, over the days that Israel was bombarded by the Scuds and its people found themselves constantly racing to their bomb shelters, no Jewish people were killed, although some buildings and houses were severely damaged. This frustrated the Arab enemy; in a prominent newspaper, an Arab was quoted as exclaiming, "What can we do? Their G-d is protecting them, He is obviously on their side!"

This is precisely what will transpire when the final geulah arrives: Hashem will demonstrate in the clearest possible way that the Jewish people are His chosen people. He will bring us to Eretz Yisrael and shower us with the benefits of His Presence and His hashgachah. When the Jewish people emulate Hashem's middos, then He considers it appropriate to demonstrate His love for us to the world. The miracles that He performs for us are His way of proclaiming

to the world that the Jewish people represent Him and have proven themselves worthy of His favor — and this will ultimately lead the entire world to recognize His timeless values and to accept Him as their King.

R' Mandel always says over the pasuk in Mishlei חרדת חודת – not only does fear not help but it also adds to the problem. This can be true regarding mental issues also. A person's mind can grossly exaggerate his issue, and when he's afraid of it and always repeating it, it makes it more real and can therefore worsen.

In Perek a"h the Shevet Mussar writes a list of twenty two things one should work on. 
least fulfill one! Now that you did, you will get rewarded!

The Quote: Another great advantage of achieving בוטח בה' is that: The בוטח בה' is happy in every circumstance that surrounds him, even if it's contradictory to his nature. The reason is because a ba'al Bitachon believes that



Hashem only puts him where it is good no matter what! He believes that just as a mother is so merciful and concerns herself only for her child's good – even though it sometimes looks as if the mother is doing many acts which seem to differ from the will of the child. And everyone understands that the mother only has her child's benefit in mind. So too, if we have in Hashem we will understand and realize that even in these uncomfortable situations he knows that Hashem is only good, loves him and is caring for him – just like a mother cares for a child. Such a feeling is a feeling of Bitachon, the Chovos Halevavos is teaching us, makes us feel calm in any situation. Just like a baby feels calm in the arms wherever he may be!

THE STORY: THERE WAS A RESTAURANT owner whom we will call Natan.

Natan was getting worried as it was nearing the Yom Tov of Purim, and he still did not have too many orders. It was just recently that Natan had begun to work on his בטחון בה', and Natan said the following words to himself, "I trust that '¬ will help me with my business and He will supply me with whatever I am meant to receive".

Shortly after this incident (still before Purim), Natan's refrigerator broke down. It was quite an expense to repair it, yet left with no choice Natan contacted a repairman to come fix it. Every day, Natan called the repairman and waited, yet each time the repairman failed to show up. Finally, after much waiting, the repairman showed up. He fixed the refrigerator and then approached the restaurant owner, Natan.

The repairman was surprised to see Natan so calm and he asked him, "How are you so calm? And why didn't you ever yell at me or complain-that it took me so long to come down? It was obvious that you needed your appliance fixed a.s.a.p.!" Natan replied, "I am working on my אמונה ובטחון בה' and I know that 'ה is taking care of me and it would not help for me to get upset."

The repairman was so impressed that he decided not to charge the man for his work. He did not stop there, he then told Natan, "Recently someone told me about a אמונה ובטחון but I didn't have any interest in going to it. The worker continued... But after seeing you, I am planning to join the שיעור [Story originally heard from Rabbi Dovid Ashir]

Postscript: Shortly after this incident, business picked up and Natan got many orders from different Yeshivos asking him to prepare their Purim Seudos.

The Best Flu Vaccine!

My father-in-law is a doctor, but not the type who believes that he is actually healing the patient. Rather, he tells his patients that the main part of the cure is the *tefillah* said before taking the pills, as it says in Shulchan Aruch (O.C. 230:4), that before any act of healing one should say:

יהי רצון מלפניך ה' אלקי שיהא עסק זה לי לרפואה כי רופא חנם אתה

"May it be Your will, Hashem, that this endeavor cure me, for You are a free healer" Afterward you should say:

ברוך רופא חולים

"Blessed is He who heals the sick!"

The Mishnah Berurah explains we say this tefillah so as not to think that the cure is coming from anything other than Hakadosh Baruch Hu. Saying this tefillah helps us place our trust solely in Hashem, as we ask Him with all our hearts to cure us.

My father-in-law gave me another valuable piece of medical advice, which is applicable right now. Many Ashkenazi shuls have a custom to say *selichos* of בה"ב – B'hab, after Sukkos and Pesach. B'hab refers to Monday (ב), Thursday (ה) and Monday (ב), which are three special days of teshuva and tefillah. (See Shulchan Aruch, O.C. 492.) This year it will begin in the second week of Cheshvan. The Mishnah Berura explains that it is to atone for any *aveiros* we may have done during the days of *simcha*.

However, my father-in-law told me that the *Levush* gives a medical reason for B'hab. He says that the reason for the custom of B'hab is because these are the two times of the year when there is a drastic change in weather, which could cause people to get sick. Therefore, we have three days of tefillah to ask Hashem to keep us healthy! So, even if you don't have the custom of B'hab, this lesson should be taken to heart. Of course, we must live a healthy lifestyle and take care of the wonderful present of the human body that Hashem gave us. But the most important way to stay healthy during the upcoming cold and wet days of the winter is through realizing that all health is from Hashem. Therefore, we must daven to Hashem that we stay healthy.

I am not a doctor so I will not tell you if you should get a flu vaccine or not, but I can say that Asher Yatzar is not just the best vaccine against the newest strain of the flu – it is the vaccine for *everything!* So, make sure to take your Asher Yatzar vitamin every day of the winter and be *zoche* to a truly *gezunteh vinter* – physically and spiritually!

----- Internalize It! -----

When performing any action of curing, or of staying healthy, such as exercise, taking vitamins, eating healthy, or even just staying away from matters that are detrimental to health, bear in mind that these are just actions. Make sure to say the aforementioned *tefillah* beforehand, with the feeling that this is what is really curing me and keeping me healthy!

Besides for all of the functions our teeth do which we mentioned previously - our teeth serve an additional important function and service. Through our teeth, we are able to give over to someone else a warm and bright smile.

This small and simple action might seem insignificant, but the power it has is unbelievable and its effects are very far reaching.

Let's list some examples. A request which is accompanied by a warm smile has much more of a chance of being responded to favorably.

A situation which is full of tension and friction can be changed dramatically by a smile. Even a full-fledged dispute which has the potential of causing a vast amount of harm and suffering can be changed by a smile. There are so many alliances partnerships, and business deals that the warmth given over by a smile was a pivotal factor that made it happen.

The vast power that a smile conveys necessitated the white shine that comes from the teeth. The lips and gums by



themselves just don't do the same job. The power that we have from our teeth that הקב"ה gave us to chew and it's involve-

ment in our speech - does not necessitate that our teeth should be beautifully white. We could've had black teeth, or teeth that are the same color of our lips and our gums - pinkish. הקב"ה gave us special white florescent teeth in order to do the service of smiling. Let's try to take advantage of this important מתנה that our teeth

contain.

The importance of smiling to someone, radiating warmth and friendship with our white teeth, is a concept we are taught from חז"ל.

כתובות דף in כתובות קיא says in the name of 'ר יוחנן – "טוב המלבין שינים - "לחבירו יותר ממשקהו חלב One who shows his white teeth in a smile to his



friend, did a greater kindness than one who gives him a glass of milk.

Let's picture this for a moment. An individual who's making his rounds with a refreshing drink and he is distributing it for free to whoever wants. We would be very impressed with this person's מדת החסד.

Actually, this is something that grabbed my attention when I attendthe enormous ed לויה of HaGaon R' Chaim Kanievsky Zt"l. Besides for the wonderful דברי חיזוק, and the הספידים unbelievable כבוד התורה, there was a side point that struck me. I saw the beautiful דסח that took place. So many residents of בני distributed free drinks and food to the public. In quite a number of places there was free coffee and milk.

This is משקהו חלב", which is described in the

גמרא; giving your friend drink a of milk. You can't help yourself from being deeply impressed by their חסד.

A simple smile that we don't give too much thought about is more than handing out free coffee. Did you ever consider opening a free smile stand? We see how important and beneficial a smile can be.



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"The chlorophyll (with the the world would RUN OUT OF photon energy captured in the chlorophyll antennae) then "somehow" cause a very complicated chemical reaction to take place which splits the water found in the leaf (you know, the water that somehow rose from the roots of the tree, to its tippy-top leaves) into hydrogen and oxygen. That sounds like a bit of a problem, doesn't it? So, what did G-d do? He made an amazing filtering system going on in all the leaves on our planet! They just happen to produce the oxygen that sustains all human and animal life. Since they have no need for the oxygen, it is released from the leave straight into our atmosphere."

"Wow, what an amazing process you have going on in this humble little leaf!"

What happens to the other molecules?" the alien then asks."

"The hydrogen?"

"Yeah."

"Well, the hydrogen is combined chemically with the carbon dioxide.

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
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Q. The Mishna in Sotah Perek 9 mishna 12 says from the churban and on: אין לך יום שאין בו קללה. ולא ירד הטל לברכה ונטל טעם הפירות.

from Simcha from that gemara!

And the reason is, the translation of the word klalla means hidden bracha. And that's why if you spell klalla backwards, you spell it 'hallel kuf'. That means, with all the klallos going around, you'll still be able to praise a hundred times (like me'ah brachos)! Klalla spelled backwards is hallel kaf, and hallel is lashon hollelus, which Rav Avigdor Millers says you're going to become intoxicated and shikar from Simcha. That means that no matter what situation a person finds himself in, if you're looking to become intoxicated, you'll be able to become intoxicated a hundred times over. So in the word klalla it says it's time to have a field day!

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

Because everything Hakadosh Baruch Hu does is kulo love, bracha, chesed and rachamim. Just in the times of the Beis Hamikdash it was an open relationship, open love.

In the times of galus it's called a hidden love and therefore, the Tiferes Tzion explains, why did Hashem take away the taste of the fruits and make no tal? Because in the olden days when the Beis Hamikdash was around, the fruits were delicious, yummy and scrumptious and it says Reish Lakish, and other Amoraim, used to eat the fruits until the liquid of the fruit would come off their forehead. R' Avigdor Miller speaks about it. The liquid of the fruit would make them all sweat and it would come on their forehead.



If you ate Hashem's fruits, you couldn't stop eating it! You would eat it 24/7, they're so delicious! So, the Tiferes Tzion brings down, in the times of the bais Hamikdash it was open love, Hashem says you can eat as much as you want and I'm going to have a special shemira and I'm going to protect you that you don't get any stomachaches.

But after the churban we don't have that special protection, so Hashem said I'm going to take away the taste of the fruit and take away the tal so that the fruit shouldn't be as delicious and then you won't overeat. So Hashem is taking away the

taste of the fruit, so that you shouldn't overeat! If everything would be so delicious we would just non-stop eating. Wherever we'd go, we just wouldn't be able to stop eating because the food is so delicious.

We all know, the Rambam says, that you're not allowed to eat too much. It's not healthy for a person to eat too much.


So the reason why Hashem took away the tastes of fruit is simply because if anyone eats too much it's not healthy for the guf, it's not healthy for the body. Therefore, Hashem did us a favor and He took away the taste so we shouldn't overeat.

Now, what is the excitement of this Mishna? The excitement of this Mishna is, like R' Yeruchim brings from the Arizal, that in the time of the Bais Hamikdash Hashem had an open love relationship with us, everything was in the open. That didn't give Hashem too much nachas. You know why? Because the point of this world is to show our devotion, dedication and love to Hashem. If Hashem shows Himself in the open with a big smile and gives you a hug and a kiss every time you come to Him, that doesn't show any big deal to serve Hashem. Of course you're going to serve Hashem, because you're going to get a smile!

But in galus, we don't see Hashem in the open, and still we love Hashem so much. We're 2,000 years in galus and we're still serving Hashem and we're thriving! And we're even coming up with chiddushim! For example, Spring Hill Times was never created since the world was created. So we're constantly growing and shteiging in our love for Hashem. That gives Hashem more nachas ruach more than anything else! That's why R' Yeruchim writes why we're more chashuv than Amoraim and Tannaim.

Nowadays all brachos are hidden brachos, Hashem doesn't show Himself in the open. So the Mishna is coming to say that our relationship with Hashem is in a hidden way, that's why klalla, in hidden, is spelled hallel ka. Yeah, it's hidden. It's not black and white, you have to find it! So everything is in the hidden.

Why does Hashem want us to be in galus for 2,000 years in a hidden way? Because that's what shows our devotion and that's what gives Hashem nachas ruach. And that's why galus is the most geshmake place to live because this is where Hashem gets the most nachas ruach



and that's why we're 2,000 years in galus. Hashem said: Destroy the Bais Hamikdash - you won't have karbanos, you won't have all the mitzvos, because that's not what gives me nachas when there's an open relationship. I want a hidden relationship! I want to see devotion and dedication! And that's why, it is our generation, the dor with the most hester panim and the most choshech, that is going to be the ones to see Mashiach because we're showing Hashem dedication, devotion and love by making Spring Hill Times, by

Q. A new school is opening, and they asked me to become a teacher. I told them that I never taught before and I don't feel qualified. But the school said that they specifically want me.

The

Should I refuse because I know that I'm not completely qualified, or should I accept the job because the school wants me anyway?

A. Rav Yisroel Falk responded: It depends: if you feel that you don't know what you're doing, and you will end up causing harm to the students, then you have the right – and responsibility – to say, 'I know that I'm under-qualified, and I don't want to become a teacher'.

But if you feel that you are able to help the students, just you are hesitant because you think that there are other people who could do a much better job, in that case, if the school says that they want you nevertheless, you should accept the job. Try your best, and B'ezras Hashem you will get siyata dishmaya to be very successful.

Q. I am a certified lifeguard, and I was offered a job to be a lifeguard in a camp. However, I'm hesitant to accept because of the tremendous responsibility that will be resting on me. I'm concerned that if something happens, chas v'shalom, while I'm there, I'll blame myself for the rest of my life.

A. If you feel confident that you will do your job properly, but you are scared that something might happen, chas v'shalom, and you will feel guilty, that is not a reason to refuse.

Hashem is running the word, and you're just doing your hishtadlus. If something happens which is beyond your control, it was caused by Hashem and you will not bear the responsibility.

But if you find that you are not calm, and you won't be able to do your job with confidence and menuchas hanefesh, you should look for a job that you will be able to do with confidence and certainty.

Q. I have a child that needs occupational therapy. I called up an organization that offers assistance in occupational therapy. They put me on the waiting list, but they said that there won't be an opening for a long time.

I mentioned this to my mother, and she told me, "In order to get places in life, sometimes

you have to be aggressive.

You have to keep calling them every week."

However, this is not my personality. They told me that they will call me back when they have something. It's against my nature to keep calling and nudging them. Am I supposed to listen to my mother and nudge?

A. Rav Yisroel Falk responded: If the reason that you don't want to keep on calling them is because you know that it won't help. They will just get annoyed, and tell you, "Why do you keep on calling? When it's your turn, we'll call you." If this is the case, there is no mitzva of kibbud eim to bother people, even though your

mother is telling you to do so.

But if you know that calling each week is likely to secure yourself an earlier appointment, only, it's out of your comfort zone to do so, in that case, the right thing is to listen to your mother, and because it's hard for you, you will receive extra s'char.

Q. Each time I make a new friend, it doesn't take too long until the friend loses interest in me. I see a pattern that no one is really interested in having a meaningful relationship with me. It feels that no one really cares about me. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. Harav Avigdor Miller Zatzal said about himself that he never had friends. Instead,

he chose to make Hashem his best friend, and in this way, he got everything he could want in a friendship.

The Chofetz Chaim also did not have any personal friends. Yet it didn't bother him, because he had Hakadosh Baruch Hu as his companion.

Therefore, if you are looking to hjave a deep and satisfying relationship, make Hashem into your best friend. He will be your loyal friend who holds of you to the sky and will think about you constantly. He is a friend that you could be confident will always be there for you, and never lose interest in you.

Another thing you should take to heart: You know firsthand how it feels when no one wants

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to be your friend.

Hashem wants you to look out for another person in your class who is in the same position as you; no one wants to be his friend. Go out and befriend him. He will feel like a million dollars that someone is actually interested in him.

When you go out of yourself and invest in someone else, you, in turn, will have the most satisfying feeling imaginable. The Sefer Hachinuch teaches: What gives the neshama true satisfaction? When it gives to others.

And Hakadosh Baruch Hu will act with you middah k'negged middah. Hashem will say, 'you went out to befriend someone that had no friends, I will cause other people to want to become friends with you as well'.

Q. Many of my friends are getting married, and I want to attend as many of their weddings as I can. However, my husband keeps coming up with reasons why he does not want me to go.

I feel that I'm missing out on all of these opportunities to get out and enjoy with my friends. As a result, I feel resentment towards my husband.

A. The reason you feel that you're losing out is because you think that your husband is running your life, and his decisions are able to affect how

much enjoyment you will have.

However, the truth is, Hashem already decided on Rosh Hashanah how much money you will have this year. And He also decided how much enjoyment you are destined to get this year as well as every other detail of your life.

No human being could take away one penny that is intended for you, nor can anyone diminish your enjoyment whatsoever.

When you live with the mindset that it's only Hakadosh Baruch Hu who is in control over your life, you'll realize that there is no such thing as 'losing out'. Whatever enjoyment you are not able to have, is because it wasn't supposed to get to you because it's not good for you. And whatever you are supposed to get will come to you, and no one in the world could prevent it.

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
