Dear Editor,

The following story was related by a solider in Israel. He wrote it and emailed it to his uncle here in the US, whom I know personally.

It has been a couple weeks, but I have some time now, and I wanted to write about a nes that happened to me during those first few days.

My unit was called in on Shabbat morning. No Tzav 8, no ishurim, no official order, nothing. Our brigade commander saw that the south needed a battalion to respond asap, and he told us to come in. Four hours later, we got on Humvees, and headed straight to Kfar Aza.

Our weapons had been handed to us on the spot; we had never shot them, didn't have time to clean them, and had no idea if they worked, and the sights definitely hadn't been zeroed in. The weapons in the Reserve units are notorious for being unreliable and usually don't even shoot properly before a good clean, or in

ting worse, I had to start using the pliers on my utility

knife to clear them. We ended

some cases, a visit to the armory. That is how we went in to combat.

We walked into the Yishuv, and were engaged by terrorists within the first few minutes of walking. A few minutes later we encountered one hiding in a bush with an AK-47, waiting to ambush us. My rifle worked perfectly, firing every shot, cycling every round, hitting what I was aiming at. Not a single jam.

I thanked Hashem for giving me a rifle that worked right off the bat.


After three days of fighting, it was clear my rifle was in pris-

tine condition.

On Tuesday night, we finished clearing Kfar Aza, we were

switched out by another battalion, and were sent up to a base so we could rest, shower, and finally clean and check our weapons.

We went to the range. Immediately I got a jam. Another round, another jam. And another. They were get-



That was her


koach and hatzlacha! Just believe in someone. Look at everyone in a positive way.





Chazal (Sotah 10a) teach that Avraham Avinu established a resting place for passersby. When these travelers got a chance to rest and enjoy a hearty meal, they wouldn't leave before wanting to thank their generous host. However, Avraham exclaimed 'don't thank me, did you eat from my food? Really you ate from Hashem's food; you need to thank Him!' He taught them how Hashem created the Universe and everything we enjoy, results from Him. In this way they would leave with the heightened awareness that everything is from Hashem and would offer praise before they left.

These guests were eager to express appreciation, and for sure wouldn't have left before saying thank you. However, Avraham was reminding them to look beyond the surface. "You think that I caused these beautiful trees to grow that you ate its fruit? Dd I create these animals from whom you partook of its meat etc? Really it results from our loving caring Father, Who always gives us everything we need."

This lesson that Avraham taught his guests is really a model for all of us. As Chazal (Berachos 58a) teach 'a good guest is one who says, 'look how much effort the host put in taking care of me, how much meat, wine and bread he gave me. All that trouble that he went to was only for me!' The Maharsha explains that we are all guests in this world and need to strive to be 'good guests', appreciating all the incredible good we receive.

It is very easy buy a loaf of bread, without thinking too much of it. Yet when we take a step back and contemplate, we will be mesmerized by all the many factors that went into it. For example, the sun evaporates water from the ocean and then clouds are formed. These clouds move inland and then showers all our fields with rain. This helps cause the seeds of wheat to grow. The wheat is than ground into flour and mixed with water to form dough. It is than baked and eventually reaches the shelves in the store!

The Menoras Hamaor, one of the Rishonim, records a fascinating account of a certain Tzaddik, who had a very remarkable practice. Each time he used to eat, he wore an elegant piece of clothing and gathered all his students together who were also dressed elegantly. They then used to sing songs of praises to Hashem. The Tzaddik was asked why he made this ceremony each time he ate, it was just a meal. He explained that if he was imprisoned or traveling and lacked sufficient food, he would be willing to pay a large amount just for a bit of bread and water. Baruch Hashem, he lives in peace with such a wide variety of food available. "If I would need to plant and harvest, he continued," how much would I need to work,

as Adam Harishon did; now when I arise in the morning, I have everything I need. So, it is very important I express my appreciation. (Menoras Hamaor ch. 14 p. 247)



This German (Franz Stigler) wasn't a Hitlerist ימ"ש and his General had once told him that if he would ever hit a pilot while he was parachuting in the air then the General would kill him! It was interesting that he felt that a person shouldn't forget that he's an אדם and he'd have to live for the rest of his life with the horrific guilt of acting like an animal .

Part VI

Stigler noticed that the unfortunate B17 had 2 severely wounded men on board and the plane was missing all kinds of vital parts. He knew that if the German antiaircraft would see his Messerschmidt flying alongside the B17 they might suspect that the B17 was really one of their own which they had captured and repaired to use for themselves (which was a common procedure) and they wouldn't shoot.

Part VII

Stigler decided to save the B17 and at the cost of a being shot or court-marshalled by the Germans he flew alongside the B17. He decided that preserving "his humanity" was more important than being awarded with the iron cross. (About 50 years later Brown and Stigler located each other and became best friends.)

Part VIII

We see how even a נכרי has a feeling for a נרדף despite being his arch enemy. (And indeed, its' international law not to shoot a parachutist in the air). How important it is to be full of compassion for human beings.

Part IX

And look how difficult it was for א"א to agree with שרה אמנו despite ישמעאל's wickedness. When Hakadosh Baruch Hu told Avraham Avinu to shecht his son, instead of interpreting it as, "I have to kill my child," because he loved Hashem, he interpreted it as the exact opposite message. "I have the opportunity to bring a korban to Hashem!" He felt so privileged and did it with excitement. He woke up early and harnessed his own donkey.


IN THE CITY OF RADIN, one of the townsmen was niftar. To spare the Chofetz Chaim the distress, his talmidim withheld the news from him, thinking that he didn't need to know of the petirah of a simple Jew. Why trouble the Chofetz Chaim with news of the misfortune?

After a while, the Chofetz

Chaim noticed that the man wasn't attending shul. When he inquired about his absence, he was told about how he had been niftar some time ago.

The Chofetz Chaim was bothered: "Why didn't you tell me about his passing?"

"We didn't want to bother you by telling you the news," replied the talimi-



dim. "We thought that he was just a simple fellow, and that he didn't mean to you."

The Chofetz Chaim replied something that will change the way we think, shedding a new light on the approach we should have toward life and its challenges.

"We don't know who's great in the Next World," the Chofetz Chaim told them. "Only Hashem knows who's truly great. Hashem knows what's in each man's heart.

"But one thing we do know, and that is that yisurim cleanse a person (see Brachos 5a), and this man was definitely a tzaddik, judging by how many yisurim he endured. Thus, it's only right to have gone to his levayah. He definitely was cleared of all his sins and is befitting the title of tzaddik. That's why I would've wanted to partake in the levayah."

"OUT OF LOVE!"

In 1943, the Nesivos Shalom was stricken by a skin condition that gave off a highly-contagious puss. He was instructed by the doctors to be secluded from everyone to prevent its spread.


His two-year-old daughter also had to Continued on next page



stay away from him, which was very hard for her. The Nesivos Shalom said, "she thinks the reason that I'm distancing from her is because I dislike her, but this is not true at all. If I didn't care for her, then I'd be careless about contact and potentially expose her to getting the disease. But I care so much for her, and therefore I have to distance myself from her, although it's very hard."

The Nesivos Shalom would repeat this story and say: "We think that when we encounter challenges, they come because they're a sign of Hashem's 'dislike' or 'hatred' of us, chas v'shalom. On the contrary, they're coming from Hashem's immense love for us! That's why we experience such challenges."

The Avodas Yisroel (parshas Devarim) compares it to a father who rebukes his child harshly, but then he draws him near and shows him how much he loves him. The great kindness makes up for the hard times that preceded it. The



Avodas Yisrael writes, "It is a mashal to a father who hits his son with a staff to educate him, afterward which the father is kind to the son, comforts him, and tells him how much he loves him..."

"SHOULD I LOSE MY MIND?"

Even if someone is confronted by challenges, they must not lose their mind.

There's an incredible story about the great tzaddik. Reb Zalman Brizel. One time, when he had just returned from a fundraising trip in chutz l'aretz, he couldn't find the parcel he'd stored the money. While his family frantically searched all over the home for the money, they soon saw their father dancing. At first, they assumed that he must've found the money, but when they asked him where the money had been, he replied, "I don't know. It's still lost."



They were perplexed. "So why are you dancing?

"Fine, I lost the money, but should I also lose my mind? The first part is hard enough, I don't have to make it worse than it is!"

This teaches us an incredible lesson. When encountering challenges, it is up to us how to respond. Remembering that it's coming from Hashem will ease the pain and give us the emotional support we need to ensure it.

"MY SAVIOR!"

Reb Elimelech Biderman relates that in the early 1930s, there was an individual named R' Baruch Frankel. He was having a difficult time making ends meet in Europe, and was advised to travel to America and build a business. He could send money to his family while still building the business and return after it was established and

running.

So. R' Baruch went to America and at first had a hard time finding a partner, but eventually he found a friend who would help him set up his business. This friend was an American citizen and was thus able to get a loan to start them off. After a while, the money started coming in, and within two years, they were able to amass enough to head back to Europe with a substantial and respectable amount of money.

A short time before their departure, R' Baruch received a telegram telling him of his father's petirah and that he had to start sitting shivah. At the onset of shivah, the partner told him that before closing the business, he had to sign certain documents, the final closure sheets, which would ensure him an easy and smooth return.

"Can it wait until after shivah?" asked R' Baruch.

"No!" the friend replied. "These are the last papers that are needed to ensure your smooth return. Let's iust take care of it."


that. R' Baruch With signed the papers, and the partner left.

When he got up from shivah. R' Baruch made his way to the bank to buy a new return ticket. He was in for the surprise of his life, as the account was empty! He didn't know how it could be, as there had been plenty of money in the account before he'd sat shivah, so he went to a teller to inquire as to what had happened. He was then told that he'd signed papers that agreed to his release of any interest he'd had in the partnership, and thus the partner owned everything and had taken all the money out.



He was taken back. In just a few minutes, he had lost everything he'd worked on the last two years. He never thought that the partner he'd been doing business with for two years would empty him out of all his work and leave him nothing to return home with.

He accepted the situation as being for his very best and moved on.



Let's pause at this point of the story. What happened to R' Baruch looks like "the worst thing in the world."

Now let's continue on, and see how this played out:

Since R' Baruch had to rebuild a business in America, he needed to get a loan on his own. But in order to do that, he had to become a citizen. And so, the

next day. he started the slow process of becoming citizen. а When he finally finished that. he went out and got that loan and started rebuilding.

It took him three additional years, but he finally was able to return home in the late 1930s. One year later, World War Two broke out, and everyone in Europe was looking for where to escape to. Being an American citizen, R' Baruch was able to get into the country and procure visas for his entire family as well.

This story is incredible! What seemed like "the worst thing in his life" turned out to be the very best! He, his family, and all his generations to come were saved due to "the worst thing in his life".

Sometimes we the see hashgachah that was planned soon after, and sometimes it can take a long time, and sometimes it can even take 120 years. but the bottom line is that everything Hashem does is done perfectly for our benefit, and this is the greatest comfort.

Gary Tessler, director of the Shalom Funeral Service in Denver, Colorado, probably never imagined that his hearse — a vehicle used for

When Gary closed the door

transporting a coffin to the burial site — would also become the vehicle for a unique and striking kiddush Hashem.

One morning, Gary had a funeral scheduled at Mount Nebo Cemetery in Aurora, Colorado. He placed the casket into the back of his hearse and drove to the cemetery, arriving long before the funeral was scheduled to take place. But his timely arrival was of little help when a serious technical difficulty arose: the door of the hearse refused to open. Despite Gary's best efforts, along with those of the funeral party and cemetery workers, the door could not be pried open. The result was that the casket was stuck inside and the burial could not proceed. Gary immediately reached a painful conclusion: the funeral would have to be postponed.

Gary first informed Rabbi Aharon Sirota, the officiating rabbi, of the situation, then braced himself to break the news to the family. But before he could approach them, Rabbi Sirota approached the hearse while reciting the chapters of Tehillim generally used to honor the deceased. Gary was shocked when Rabbi after the funeral, it refused to open again. An auto mechanic ascertained that the clamp that locked the door was still in place but the electronic mechanism that released it had broken off and had fallen to the bottom of the door. It should not have been possible, the mechanic added, for Rabbi Sirota to open the door. The fact that he had done so was nothing short of a miracle.

In Parashas Vaeschanan (4:6-8), the Torah tells us, "You should observe and do [the mitzvos] because that is your wisdom and intelligence in the eyes of the nations.... For who is a great nation that has a G-d Who is close to it as is Hashem, our G-d, whenever we call out to Him?" Sforno explains the connection between the two pesukim: "The reason it is important to make sure that you will be considered wise and insightful by the nations is that Hashem is close to you whenever you call out to Him, and this shows that He selected us from among the nations. If the nations think of you as fools, it will be a chillul Hashem when they say, 'This is Hashem's nation?!"

One of the ways that Hashem displays His love for the Jewish people is by answering their tefillos. When the world sees that the Jews



our lives in a way that properly reflects Hashem's Will. If Hashem were to answer the tefillos of peo-

daven for something and Hashem grants their request, it is a clear demonstration that Hashem favors Klal Yisrael. But this creates a kiddush Hashem only if we lead ple who do not follow His ordinances, it would impair the reflection of truth that Klal Yisrael was meant to convey to the world.

They spent some time with him, wished him and his daughter well, and left. When they were about to enter their car, Mrs. Heber suddenly remembered that they had not given Alex the Asher Yaztar magnet which they usually present to patients; they quickly went back upstairs. "We returned because we forgot to give you a present," said Mrs. Heber. "A present?!" exclaimed Alex. "You already gave me the greatest present in the world – a healthy kidney!" "No, that was from Hashem, not from us. We want to give you the *wrapping* for the present," replied Mrs. Heber. She then clarified the words of the *beracha* and explained that the more we appreciate the special present of a kidney from Hashem, the longer it will last and function well. We did not truly believe it would help, but we took it seriously. Two days later the doctor came in with a big smile on his face. 'Alex, what did you do? This is an absolute miracle! All the tests are fine and the kidney started working normally again. You can go home!' Rav Heber, I am calling to tell you that Asher Yatzar actually saves lives!"

What is Simcha?

Rav Shimshon Pincus would say that for *Klal Yisroel*, the *Yomim Tovim* are like the locomotive that keeps the train moving down the tracks. We just experienced the immense fortune of coming off an unbelievable *z'man simchaseinu*. How do we keep this "*simchadik*" state going? In order to do so, we must first understand: What is *simcha* actually? The *Olam Hamiddos* (written by my rebbe and mentor, Rav Moshe Don Kestenbaum) says the following:

There is a major misconception that happiness is a feeling that comes naturally. If something good happens, the person will be happy and if something bad happens, *chas v'sholom*, he will be sad. This is the furthest from the truth. Happiness is a *middah* that must be worked on, just like every other *middah*. The way to acquire *simcha* is through being satisfied with what we have, in addition to being *makir tov* for all the good Hashem provides for us. This is why Chazal instituted *berachos* to thank Hashem for each and every *chesed* He does for us. Right away, from the second we open our eyes, we say *Modeh Ani*, thanking Hashem for giving us another day to do His will. Then we continue with the *berachos* for granting us vision, clothes, walking etc.

To conclude, if we take a moment to simply recognize that Hashem does so much good for us, especially for giving us a body with all its intricacies, we will feel compelled to thank Him. Our lips are very important and we benefit from them in numerous ways. One of the jobs that our lips do is they keep our food inside our mouth. We need an opening in our head to get the food inside – but if we don't have doors in front of the opening that seal it shut, then some of the food will fall out while we are chewing it.

This is especially true for liquids; theoretically, this can be taken care of in a different way. If we would

> tilt our heads upwards after food is inserted, then the food would stay inside. Picturing this for a moment will heighten our appreciation for our lips.

The majority of the time we eat, we would have to be with our head bent upwards to a 45 degree angle, with our nose pointed to the ceiling. We would have to lower our heads between bites to find the food on our plates, take another bite - and then up again. That's a very inconvenient way to eat. With a present called lips, we can close our mouth after we bite and everything stays nicely inside.

Our lips serve as doors that close when we chew our food.

In addition to the point that we mentioned that this ensures that the food stays in our mouth, it also serves another purpose. This enables a person to eat in a dignified manner.



We are all taught that it's not polite to eat with our mouths open. But the ability to close our mouths when we eat is only possible with the lips that הקב"ה gave us. Pumping people up can take place at any time during any situation. You can turn your workplace into an Ahavah Rabbah factory by pumping your colleagues up in every way possible. You can do this by sharing with others how much you learn from their efficiency, sensitivity to others, or thoughtfulness and how their smile makes your day.

If you are in the bais medrash, you can turn your chaburah into an Ahavah Rabbah Chaburah by going out of your way to spread kindness. You can do this by sharing with people how much you look forward to seeing them, how seeing them brightens your day, and how you thought about them at night after you left the shiur.

You can turn your home into an Ahavah Rabbah playground. You can do this by sharing with your spouse that your favorite part of the day is when he/she walks into the room; or how you are still thinking about last week when they wrote you a thoughtful note; or how dedicated, kind, amazing, thoughtful, compassionate, and caring you think they are. You can share with your children that the best part of your day is when you see them. You can share with them how much you enjoy playing with them, hanging out with them, and spending time with them. You can share with your children how thoughtful, sensitive, kind, and giving they are.

• I walked into a school office and said, "Everyone in the room should be showered with a million brachos!" All the staff was pumped!

• I was in shul and I wanted to share with a woman that I noticed how thoughtful she was being to everyone. 

I took this picture on my walk this week! Hashem has made a stunning world for us to enjoy!



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

L'chorah, Hakadosh Baruch Hu does everything anyway and hishtadlus is zero minus, there's no cause and effect, nothing does anything, so why did Hashem make hishtadlus?

The point of hishtadlus, says the Michtav M'Eliyahu, is to be mesaken the cheit of Adam Harishon. The snake told Adam and Chava, "How do you think Hashem created the world? He ate from the Etz Hada'as and He created it. So, instead of having to be under Hashem's jurisdiction, you can eat from the Etz Hada'as and you'll have all the powers just like Hashem."


And that was the chet, that they wanted to be independent – without Hashem. So Hashem



said now you have to be mesaken the chet. How can you be mesaken it? By doing hishtadlus that looks like you're doing something but you're really doing zero minus.

That's why the Chovos Halevavos in Shaar Habitachon where he says that Hashem is doing everything and you're doing nothing there's still a mitzvah of hishtadlus. Why is there a mitzvah if I'm doing nothing? Because this mitzvah is to put yourself in a makom nisayon and to say, "Oh, it looks like I'm doing something, but really I know that I'm not. And now you were just mesaken the chet of Adam Harishon by realizing that Hashem is doing everything and we're zero.

That's what Hashem was showing. Hashem was showing that I make something look like you can't get to the Etz Hadaas, that's the nisayon. The nisayon is will you think that it's the Lahat Hamis-hapeches that's stopping you? But if you really chap, it's Me. There's only One koach and One koach only and everything in



this world is just one big test. And when human beings carry out dvar Hashem, when any human being does something to another human being, that human being is just a test, did he realize that it's Hashem or did he think it's the person? Everything is Hashem.

R' Moshe Feinstein says that when it rains it's a test. Do you think Hashem needs the rain for it to grow or you chap that it can grow because Hashem is saying grow? Everything in this world is one big test. That's what the Mesillas Yesharim says, that we're here in a world full of tests. What's the

test? The test is do you chap that we live in Olam Hasheker, that looks like there's cause and effect, or do you realize that behind it is Hashem Who's running the show?

The reason why the pesukim are written this way is to teach you that that's the way Hashem is running His world, as if He needs a sword to protect it, to see if you're going to be able to see past the sword. Like R' Avigdor Miller explains, why did Hashem create a sun? To give light. It was already light on the first day? Hashem said the first day "vayehi ohr." So what's the point of the sun? Says R' Avigdor Miller, the point of the sun is to give you a nisayon, to give you a test, are you going to think that it's the sun that's giving light or are you going to believe that it's Hashem? The goyim indeed fell in this nisayon, they used to worship the sun. Sh'hem mishtachavim l'hevel v'rik u'mispallelim el el lo yoshia – they worship the sun. V'anachnu – we serve Hashem!

Hashem made everything in the briaah as a test to see do you think there's any other power other than Hashem. The whole point of the nachash was that "Hashem ate from the Etz Hadaas, you can get the same where Hashem can get. By eating from the Etz Hadaas you can get all the power in the world." No! Everything is powerless! There's no power in the sun, there's no power in the moon, there's no power in a sword.

I had a talmid that was crossing the street and a car ran right over him, his whole entire body, and he didn't feel any pain, no scratches! The only thing that happened was that his shirt got tire marks so he saves it in his closet to show everyone the nes. The car doesn't do anything. Cars don't kill, swords don't kill. It's an illusion! The Michtav Me'Eliyahu calls it an achizas einayim, it's an illusion. Hashem is giving this illusion to test you.

So the pesukim in Torah are all set up in a way to give you a test. That's the point of the Torah, to make it look one way and you're supposed to see past it. You have to say, "No! Hashem I really know the truth! It's not the sun, it's You! It looks like it's the sword, that's only the way it looks like..."

Hashem is saying that's how I'm setting up the world, that's how it looks like, but it's not real. It's all a test. Everything is a test.



This is a test to see how devoted the person is; is he willing to stick it out even when it's hard. But a ger has to know that Hashem loves and admires him. 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Hashem Loves You!

Twenty-six-year-old paratroop commander Evyatar Zytuni, was critically wounded when he went, on Simchas Torah, to battle to help Klal Yisroel at Kibbutz Kissfuim, near to the Gaza border.

HaGaon HaRav Yitzchak Dovid Grossman of Migdal HaEmek who was visiting wounded soldiers at the hospital, stood by Evyatar's bed, who was lying unconscious, recited Tehillim and spoke words of Chizuk to his parents. He then took a special ancient coin from his pocket and briefly put it on Evyatar's head as a segulah. Rav Grossman had received the coin from his Rebbe, the Lelover Rebbe, z'tl, about 50 years ago.

A few hour later, Evyatar woke up and told his parents: "Rav Grossman was here, he put an ancient coin on me – I felt a boom and I

was pulled back to life." Evyatar later said that he felt that he regained consciousness from the power of HaRav Grossman's tefillah and love.

Evyatar's mother, Natalie said: "HaRav Grossman stood next to Evyatar, davened and cried out to Shamayim. Then the Rav took out a coin from his wallet, placed it on Evyatar's head, continued with his powerful tefillos, put the coin back and continued davening – all this while Evayar was unconscious. After he woke up, he said that he felt a 'thud,' a 'boom.' We've been in shock ever since."

After Evyatar regained consciousness, his parents called Rav Grossman to thank him. Evyatar told HaRav Grossman that due to the chizzuk in his emunah, he began putting on tefillin.

Hashem is doing Nissim, miracles for us every moment, both revealed miracles, as well as many hidden ones. The Gemara (Nidda 31a) says אין בעל הנס מביר בניסו 'The person who receives the miracles is not aware of the miracles that Hashem does with him.' It is worthwhile to learn this Gemara carefully inside. Everything Hashem is doing at every moment is complete Nissim and one thousand percent Chesed and pure רחמים. Rav Yosef there cites a story that illustrates man's partial vision, that sometimes only after a long time does man discover that things that once caused him sorrow were really done completely for his benefit.

The more we talk about how everything Hashem does is pure Chesed and complete kindness, including endless miracles both hidden and revealed, the more Hashem will show us openly his constant care and endless kindness. And the more He will open our eyes so that we will not be in the category of 'those who are not aware of the miracles that Hashem is doing with him'
