

He was chozer b'teshuva and he kept up the connection with his father and his father's wife. From time to time he would come to visit them in the kibbutz. He would tell them words of chizuk and speak words of emunah. He especially emphasized how Hakadosh Baruch Hu sees everyone and is mashgiach over each and every person. "I heard the sirens, and a moment later the booms. A sense of fear grabbed hold of me and my entire body grew hard as a rock. I couldn't move! I tried moving lips, and saw that I was able to do that, so what did I say? I said vidui, and I asked Hashem to forgive me and to watch over me.

I remembered all your good words, and I said, 'Ribbono shel Olam, You love me. You are with me. You're watching over me. I have nothing to

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fear.'

I said this again and again, until I felt that my body softening and I was able to move.

I got up and took something to eat, and the whole time I was hearing the sounds

#### A YID RETURNS TO HASHEM

Rabbi Weingarten\* was walking near Tel Hashomer hospital. A Yid came out and saw him with his beard and peyos. He seemed to be looking for someone religious.

"My son is injured," he said.

"He is hospitalized here, and he has something to say that will be of interest to you."

Rabbi Weingarten went in to the injured man. He was in pain and he was emotional. It was obvious that he had endured a far-from-simple experience.

"I was called to a specific place in the South," he said. "A difficult battle was raging there, and they called me to come in and help. I came to the place, close to one of the settlements. There is a memorial monument there on which is written, "It's not the tanks that will win, but only Hashem." There were four of us up against 12 terrorists. I fought under fire from close range.

Suddenly, there was a bullet in my back. It had hit a main artery, and I lost tons of blood. I recalled that in my left pocket I had a tourniquet, but because the injury was on the left side, I couldn't reach that pocket. I lay on the ground and quietly rolled in the direction of the monument, so that no terrorist would notice me. Let them think they had finished me off...

"The monument was round, and I was able to find shelter underneath it. When I got there, I lost consciousness.

During those moments I was not in this world at all. Blue, pure skies spread over me.

I felt enveloped in a profound love, the likes of which I had never felt in all my life.

'I am not so perfect!' I thought.

'Why am I so beloved? What have I done, that this is how I am being embraced?'"

As he related this, tears flowed from his eyes, and he continued:

"I felt myself disconnecting from this world, and I understood that I was dying.

'I have a family,' I said, 'I need to go back.'

I sensed that someone was listening to me.

"You can go back,' they told me, and I then regained consciousness on the hard concrete under the round monument.

New strength and vitality rushed through me, and I managed to pull out the tourniquet and stop the bleeding.

I felt very thirsty, and in order to survive, I needed to imagine myself taking a canteen and drinking lots of water. It was clear to me that I would be saved, since I had received permission to come back.

"I lay in total silence along with some friends who were also hurt, so that the terrorists would not notice us, and we anticipated yeshuas

Hashem.

"After eight hours of lying there with the tourniquet, a helicopter landed 300 meters away from us. How could an injured person like me tra-



verse this distance? I have no idea, but it's a fact. I got up and ran toward the helicopter, and there was...water!!

"My life was saved. Everyone who was in that structure with me survived.



"I am pained at how I led my life until now. I did not believe in Hashem enough, but today, I believe in Him completely. There is a Hashem! Yesh Elokim! He causes people to die and revives them, He watches over me in the most personal and exacting way.

Do you see me now? Today, I am a believing Jew." [Kav Hashgacha Pratis]


Not Too Much



When my older boys were younger, one of the things I used to do on a daily basis was to take phrases from the Talmud and repeat them with them one hundred and one times. The Gemara in Chagiga says אינו דומה שונה פרקו מאה פעמים לשונה there's no comparison between when someone learns something one hundred times and when they learn it one hundred and one times. And whatever we repeated is etched into their psyche until this very day—especially if it was accompanied by some kind of a clear, visual story.

# Living With Appprectation By: R' Daniel Shasha

Our parashah opens with Yaakov sending malachim to Eisav, in an attempt to make peace. Chazal explain that Yaakov sent actual angels, though the word malachim can also mean messengers. Rabbi Moshe Feinstein asks, why did Yaakov choose to rely on miracles by sending angels when he could have sent humans? Was he not afraid that by relying on miracles it would take away from his zechusim? Didn't Chazal teach that we are not allowed to rely on open miracles?

Rav Moshe answers with something beautiful. He explains that there are two types of miracles. There are open miracles, such as the makos and krias yam suf. Also, there are hidden miracles which we experience each day, under the veil of 'nature'. The Ramban explains that really there is no such thing as 'nature' and everything is a miracle. The fact that Hashem, in His kindness, sustains the world and we have so many blessings, such as being able to breathe, walk and see is nothing less than miraculous. So really, we are constantly surrounded by miracles, and they happen all the time. As we say in modim, "we are grateful to You... for Your miracles which are with us every day." However, we need to try and remember that they are miracles and not just 'nature'.

Rav Moshe explains that Yaakov was on the level at which it was so ingrained in his mindset that everything is a miracle, that it made no difference to send angels or humans. Therefore, this would not detract from his merits! (Kol Ram)

This explanation helps answer a famous question. Why is Chanukah eight days, since the oil burnt for seven days extra? The Alter of Kelm explains that really the fact that oil burns is miraculous! We are just used to this, and so don't perceive it as being a miracle. Yet the fact that oil burns, giving us light, helping us cook and being used for fuel, is solely because Hashem wills it. We see this in the following fascinating story.

One time, Rabbi Chanina Ben Dosa observed that his daughter looked rather sad one Friday evening. "Why do you look so sad?" he asked her. "I mistakenly lit my Shabbos candles with vinegar instead of oil and they will be extinguished soon" she told her father. Rabbi Chanina Ben Dosa told her, "Why does it make a difference? Surely the One who decreed that oil burns, can make vinegar burn as well." Indeed, the vinegar burned the entire Shabbos! (Taanis 25a)

Even though relying on open miracles can subtract from one's merits, Rabbi Chanina ben Dosa was also on the level at which he perceived everything that happened as a miracle. Therefore, it made no difference if oil or vinegar burned! (Ben Yehoyada)

Chanukah is really a great time to thank Hashem for all the miracles we constantly experience. As we specify in al Hanissim, 'Bazman Hazeh'. The Levush teaches that this refers to the miracles that we experience nowadays!



A repairman came to work in the home of R' Baruch Ber Levovitz. R' Baruch Ber respectfully greeted him with a warm "good morning" in Polish, as the repairman didn't have any outward signs of being a Yid. Had he thought he was a Yid, R' Baruch Ber would've instead greeted him in Yiddish.

The man told R' Baruch Ber,

"I'm a Yid, and you don't have to greet me in Polish." R' Baruch Ber felt terrible that he had greeted him as if he thought he was a gentile and asked her forgiveness.

R' Baruch Ber pulled up a chair and sat there for a full hour, while the repairman was working. For the entire hour, R' Baruch Ber talked with him about the chashivus of a Yid.

At the end of the job, R' Baruch Ber revisited the initial, mistaken greeting, and asked him forgiveness for not addressing him respectably as a Yid.

He responded: "I've already told you that I forgave you. There's no reason to appease me further."

R' Baruch Ber went on to explain his actions with a story:

There was a wom-

an who hadn't had children many years into her marriage. Eventually, she gave birth to a single daughter. When the daughter was older, her mother took out a ring that she received from her grandmother and gave it to her daughter, the great-granddaughter.

Sometime later, the great-granddaughter's neighbor asked to borrow the ring for a simchah she was attending. She was happy to lend it to her, and so she did.

The next day, the neighbor came and informed the lender that the ring had been misplaced and was nowhere to be found. "Not a problem," she said. "I got the ring from my mother, who got it from her grandmother, who didn't have a lot of money. It probably wasn't worth very much, so don't worry about it."

The next day, the mother heard that it was lost. She said: "That ring had been passed down to me from my grandmother. It was very valuable. Please ask your neighbor to search better for it."

The daughter returned and asked her neighbor to look for it again because she hadn't known its real value. The neighbor looked, but to no avail. The neighbor returned to tell her that the ring was nowhere to be found and ask for forgiveness yet again.

"I already forgave you," the lender said. "You don't have to ask again."

The neighbor responded very logically. "The first time you forgave me, you thought the item was very cheap. But once you knew that it had more value than you'd originally thought, maybe you wouldn't

be so quick to forgive me. That's why I ask again."

After relating the whole story, R' Baruch Ber said to the repairman, "Till now, you hadn't known the value of a Yid, and therefore when you forgave me, it was an easy forgiveness. 
"I'LL PAY \$5,000,000"

R' Arieh Shechter was one of the founders of Arachim Seminar, a program that works to return Hashem's children to the right path.

Appreciating the gift of being a Yid protects us and gives us the ability to use that great gift and bring forth the most kavod shamayim.

## CHASHIVUS OF EVERY MAN!

Hashem cherishes the avodah of every Yid, despite his level; similar to a father who cares for each of his children, no matter what state he is in. Hashem cares and has an interest in the Torah and mitzvos of every individual, no matter where he's holding. There's an inspiring episode that clearly illustrates this point:

In 1960, the Emunas Avraham from Pittsburg was traveling on a plane. On his jour-

ney, he was accompanied by eight individuals. On the way, the plane encountered a mechanical problem and the pilot had no solution for the problem. They were informed to expect the worst; they weren't sure if they would even make it to the closest airport.

At the last moment, they were able to land and they were saved, Baruch Hashem. It was time to daven, so they sought a place to daven at the airport they'd landed in. They found one of the people who worked there for and asked where they might find an appropriate place to daven. Upon hearing their question, the man became pale, fainted, and fell to the ground.

After he was revived, the Rebbe asked him what had prompted him to faint. He responded, "Although I seem to be a non-Jew, I nevertheless am Jewish. I was brought up in a religious home, but over time I dropped out, and moved far away from a Jewish community where no one knows me.

"Last night in a dream, my father came to me and instructed me to say Kaddish for him, as it was his yahrzeit. 'What's my Kaddish worth?' I asked him. 'I'm so far from anything.' But my father insisted that I say Kaddish.

"I questioned him how I would say here, so far from any Jews. 'If I send you ten people, would you say Kaddish?' he asked me. I replied yes, and then I woke up. Now I see you nine men here. That is why I got so emotional."

The end of the story is that the man returned to Yiddishkeit and started serving Hashem once again. What he took from their arrival is that even the Kaddish of a frei Yid still has value, and this gave him the motivation to continue on.

#### PERSONAL IDENTITY

The grandchildren of a survivor once made a grand party for their grandfathers' ninetieth birthday. At the birthday party, each of the grandchildren brought a present to their grandfather.

The grandfather was enjoying the gifts of each of his grandchildren and showed each one personal affection.

The grandchildren bringing the presents lined up in age order. At the end of the line was a young child who took the present he had been holding in front of him and put it behind his back. When it was his turn, he hesitated to give it to the grandfather.

"Why are you hesitating?" the grandfather asked him.

"I just saw how my cousin made the exact box that I made, and I thought that you really don't need another one, so I'm hesitating to give it to you."

"It's true that I just got a box, but I don't have a box from 'you.' The box that your cousin gave me is not a box from 'you,' and therefore I'm happily waiting to receive this box that you're holding."

This applies to serving Hashem.

Hashem has many Yidden doing mitzvos: yet he wants "our" mitzvos. What He needs is that "we" should do the mitzvos. He wants it from us. It's the connection that He wants. and that He can't get from anyone else.

It may seem

at times that there are so many more people that are serving Hashem. It may seem that "they are serving Hashem better than me..., so why should I bother doing mitzvos?" But this will only bring us to a new understanding. We know that Hashem wants our mitzvos, and the fact that others also do mitzvos doesn't undermine the value of ours. It will allow us to properly cherish our mitzvos.

If Hashem is looking for the mitzvah itself, then the most special one is valued and the rest not. But since Hashem seeks to have a connection with each of us, the fact that He has a connection with one doesn't undermine the other. Each of them is greatly admired. 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#### Just a Smile

About one year after the passing of Rabbi Moshe Sherer, the legendary president of the Yisrael Agudas of America, his son Reb Shimshon entered the towering office



building that housed the organization's headquarters. Near the entrance sat a nonJewish receptionist. Rabbi Sherer stopped by her desk to wish her a good morning and inquire if she had known his father.

"Did I know him?" the woman repeated emotionally. "I certainly did! When your father was alive, he would come into this building every morning in a hurry and rush to push the button for the elevator; it was clear that he was very busy. But while he was waiting for the elevator, he would come back to my desk and wish me a good morning with a huge smile. And I could tell that he meant it!"

Indeed, Rabbi Sherer recalled from his own childhood that his father was in the habit of greeting every Jew they met on Shabbos morning as they made their way to shul through the streets of Boro Park.

A simple smile, a friendly greeting, or even a word or two of encouragement are all easy ways to rake in the merits of the mitzvah of kiddush Hashem. With almost no effort, and no expenditure of time, money, or other resources, a person can accomplish a tremendous amount and make a deep impression upon others. Often, we will never know just how farreaching are the effects of these simple actions.

In Aleinu Leshabeach, Rabbi Yitzchak Zilberstein relates that a baal teshuvah once admitted that his return to Torah and mitzvos was triggered by the congenial behavior of a religious neighbor. He lived in an apartment building in Haifa that was occupied by an overwhelming majority of irreligious families; only one of his neighbors was religious. Yet that religious

neighbor was always particular to greet the man warmly every time he encountered him in the stairwell. Eventually, the man realized that if his religious neighbor could constantly radiate such joy,

it must mean that his life was filled with meaning and fulfillment. He resolved to explore that life for himself, and that is how he became a baal teshuvah.

In Pirkei Avos (1:12) Hillel states, "Be among the disciples of Aharon, loving peace and pursuing peace, loving people and bringing them close to Torah." Avos d'Rabbi Nosson explains further that whenever Aharon encountered a wicked person, he would extend a greeting to the person. The next time the person was about to sin, he would remember the greeting he had received from Aharon and be too ashamed to commit a sin. Thus, Aharon's habit of greeting everyone he met served to "bring them close to the Torah." The Tiferes Yisrael infers from the wording of the Mishnah that Hillel's admonition is to love all human beings, even nonJews. By addressing them in a warm, pleasant way, one can draw them close to the Torah, as well. (Tosfos Yom Tov adds a note of caution, however. Although Aharon extended warm greetings even to evildoers, he still maintained a rigid separation from them so that he would not be influenced by their ways. We must remember the importance of preserving our kedushah even as we strive to grow in this area.)

Why is a smile such a potent force? The Torah prohibits a judge to demonstrate partiality to either of the litigants in a din Torah. Rashi explains that if a litigant observes that the judge is partial to his opponent, he will become flustered and lose the ability to argue his case. Rav Wolbe (Alei Shur vol. 1 p. 191) points out that a litigant generally engages in painstaking preparation before a court case; how can he become so flustered that he will forget his arguments?

The answer is that the demonstration of disfavor from another human being can be so disheartening that it can throw even the most organized thoughts into disarray.

If this is true of a negative disposition, imagine the impact of a positive disposition. It can easily be seen that babies are extremely sensitive to other people's facial expressions. A smiling face can immediately evoke delighted laughter, whereas a mere frown can bring them to tears. The emotional nourishment from positive interactions such as a parental smile may be even more important for a child's development than physical nourishment. Certainly, a baby who is


even adults are sensitive to the emotions others display. Every human being thrives on positive interactions. A smile can go a long way, and it can certainly generate untold waves of kiddush Hashem.

For those of us who live in large cities or heavily populated areas, it may not be practical to greet everyone we see or even smile at them all. However, we can at least attempt to make some improvements in this area. We can commit to smiling at a stranger at least twice a day. We can at least resolve to be pleasant and congenial to everyone with whom we interact — bus drivers, cashiers, storeowners, employees, clients, and the like. Even by taking a small step in this direction, we will demonstrate the inner joy that accompanies a true life of Torah, and we will truly be able to bring honor to Hashem.

The other day, I was outside Yeshiva when a Bochur approached me and asked, "The Pasuk says, 'Vameich Kulam tzadikim.' What does that mean? Are all Yidden really tzadikim?"

Absolutely! We Yidden are tzadikim!

In an enlightening Shiur by R' Daniel Kalish (Torahanytime Shiur #738), he emphasizes how every Yid possesses a holy Neshama, deeply connected and thirsty for Hashem. While this holiness may be readily apparent in some, in others, you might need to look a bit harder - but it's there! Every Yid is a piece of Hashem, a fiery soul yearning for Hashem! Though we all have areas to improve, those imperfections do not define our true essence. To the contrary, our mistakes occur when we forget and lose touch with our inherent holiness. The Yetzer hara tricks us into missteps, whereas the Yetzer tov gently guides us to embrace our genuine meaningful selves.

It is important to firstly recognize this Kedusha in ourselves and then we will be able to see the kedusha of every Yid as well! Allow me to share two recent examples of where I witness this.

During a casual conversation with a friend, he expressed to me his anticipation for Mashiach Not only because he personally will be happier and safer etc. But because he earnestly desires to witness Emes being upheld worldwide and in the media. He told me "This resonates with me on a more profound level right now!"

Another bachur shared a personal struggle. He admitted that sometimes, when it's time for Seder, fatigue tempts him to linger in bed. However, when the Rosh Yeshiva comes to wake him, he immediately springs into action and heads to the Beis Medrash. He told me how it bothers him that for Hashem, he struggles to rise from bed, yet for his Rosh Yeshiva, it's done effortlessly.

I was so blown away by this bachur's close relationship with Hashem! The more we look, the more we'll find remarkable Yidden everywhere! Shabbat Shalom U'mevorach!

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

#### What Do The Words Mean? Part 6

גלוי וידוע לפני כסא כבודך שאם יפתח אחד מהם או יסתם אחד מהם אי אפשר להתקיים ולעמוד לפניך

"It is revealed and known before Your Throne of Glory that if but one of them were to be ruptured or if but one of them were to be blocked it would be impossible to survive and to stand before You."

Why do we seemingly say the same thing twice, just in different words - that it is *revealed* and that it is *known*? And why is this only known to Hashem? Rav Yitzchok Pinchos Goldwasser in "Avodas Leivav" explains that the word "revealed" refers to a situation when you don't actually know what will happen, but you can understand from what you see what the result will probably be. On the other hand, "known" means something that happened already and is a fact of life. Only Hakadosh Baruch Hu sees everything that is going on inside in our bodies in such a clear manner that firstly, it is revealed to Him what is going to happen based on what He sees. But it doesn't stop there – since Hashem knows everything that will happen, it is crystal clear to Him what will happen if one of these holes or cavities would open or close. Therefore, it is a given fact, as if it happened already!

Until recently, much of the wonders of the human body remained hidden not only from the average person, but also from the greatest doctors and scientists. Now, even in the 21st century, where the modern medical field has made colossal discoveries in understanding the wonders and intricacies of how our bodies work, they have only found the tip of the iceberg. Only Hakadosh Baruch Hu knows how much wisdom is in our bodies, and what everything is needed for.

Let us take, for example, the tonsils. It used to be that the medical world believed that they were unnecessary, and that they should be taken out. However, recently they realized that the tonsils are actually very important and are part of the lymph system. Rav Avigdor Miller *ztrl* compared this to bringing your car into a garage to be fixed and the mechanic opens the hood and starts rummaging around. After a few minutes he pulls out a part of the engine and exclaims with joy: "I found the problem! This part here must've been put in by mistake – I can't see any reason why the manufacturer installed it." Needless to say, you will quickly find a new mechanic. Obviously, if they put it there, it has a purpose.

This is what we are saying. We dare not say that we understand even a fraction of the wisdom and purpose of everything in our bodies – that is only revealed and known to You, Hashem. Therefore, we thank Him even for what we don't know!



There's a whole different area that our lips play a central role in - the world of music. Hakadosh Baruch Hu created a whole world of Shirah and Zimrah, which adds a lot of richness, flavor and happiness to our lives. An event that we would like to make special or lively, for example a wedding, we do so by

providing live music. Even the enjoyment of recorded music is only possible from live music.

A large piece of the live music we enjoy is only possible because Hashem gave us lips. Almost all of the wind instruments are based on the grip we hold onto it through our lips.

Our lips tightly grip the instrument to create an air tight environment which enables us to produce the music.

With our mouth and teeth alone this would work. not Without lips, would we not have any of the wind instruments.

for example, flutes, clarinets, saxophones, trumpets etc. This would greatly compromise the world of music that we are familiar with and that we enjoy.

Likewise, our lips play a role in our Avodas Hashem. Not only without lips would we be missing a major part of the Shiras HaLeviyim in the time of the Beis HaMikdash, we would also be missing an important Mitzvah day. We would be missing the important Mitzvah of Tekias Shofer. For anyone familiar with the hands on of blowing a shofar, it's only possible through placing it in the exact tight place on our lips.

Our lips also serve as a scout and a guard. It's very important for our health that we don't swallow anything which is dangerous or inedible. Even a food or a beverage which is too hot can cause damage or pain,

like burning our tongue. HKB"H B'Chasdo created a built in protection system to pick up if there's something harmful about to enter our mouth. The detection system is our lips. Our lips are the most sensitive part of our body.

Hashem also made our fingertips very sensitive — they are much more sensitive than other parts of our body- but their sensitivity is incomparable to the amount of feeling that we have in our lips.

The simple reason for this is that the sensitivity in our fingers is there to help us perceive and pick up our surrounding through the sense of touch. As opposed to the sensitivity in our lips - which we need for our safety and protection which is much more vital.

Our lips contain more than a million tiny nerve endings which give them

their special sensitivity. If anything sharp, jagged, pointy or too hot touches the lips, we realize imme-

diately. Even if something foreign that we shouldn't be eating like a piece of silver foil or a small piece of plastic touches them, our nerve endings let us know.

What a special shemirah!

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#### More Amazing Carnivorous if they can't digest them? Plants Aha! So, that's where Hash-

Hashem has made a whole bunch of different types of amazing carnivorous plants. One of them is called the Roridula gorgonias (Rg). It is in many ways very similar to the Sundew plant that we discussed last week. It too has numerous tentacles, small sticks, coming out of its vertical stems. It also has VERY sticky "glue" that comes out of their tips and it can catch very large insects because of its strong stickiness. However, there's one big difference. While the Sundew plant (and most other Carnivorous plants) have special digestive enzymes that digest the insects that they catch, thereby getting the necessary nutrients that they need, the (Rg) does not have any digestive enzymes at all. So, what good does it do them that they can catch insects

Aha! So, that's where Hashem made another amazing miracle! Hashem put on it a special Insect called Pameridea roridulae (Pr), otherwise known as the assassin bug. (See pictures.) So, even though the plant is full of the very sticky glue all over it, this bug can miraculously walk all over the plant without getting stuck. (We will get back to this point later.) Now, this bug lives on this plant its whole life. It is born there and dies there. This bug lives by eating the bugs trapped on the plant. That's its whole diet. It has a special fang that is like a long tube with a very strong, very pointy tip. When not in use it folds up under its head. When in use it is unfolded and brought down as a long stinger. It stings (pierces) the insect that is stuck on the glue and it has special enzymes that first paralyze the insect and other enzymes that then digest the insect. The enzymes turn the insides of the insect into liquid and then the bug sucks up the liquified "food". The tube works like a straw to suck up its meal. Very interesting, but how does that help the plant? The plant needs the nutrition that the



carnivorous plants. Regular plants typically have the ability to take nutrition out of the ground/soil where they are growing. Specifically, they need a good amount of Nitrogen. However, carnivorous plants are often found in areas that do not have fertile soil so they are lacking the crucial nutrient Nitrogen. That's why Hashem made them have amazenable them to catch in-



ridea roridulae, that is only found in this plant and nowhere else, should eat the insects. (There are similar types of assassin bugs, but they aren't this special type that only lives on this plant.) But how does that help the plant?

The answer is that after it eats the insects, the bug then excretes a liquidly excretion (which came from eating the insects) onto the stem of the (Rg) plant. Then the excrement is absorbed through the plants thin outer layer of its stem! In the excretion there's is a lot of Nitrogen! This Nitrogen is then transported through the plant to where it is needed.

Now, lets go back to the big question that we had bety soil if it can't fore. How is it that this bug is able to avoid getting stuck to the

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



As we started to discuss in previous weeks, Ahava Rabba is all about pumping people up! Who can we pump up? We can pump up every single human being. This week, we will highlight the importance of employers pumping up their staff, teachers pumping up their students, and family members pumping up each other.

If you are an employer you can pump up your employees in so many ways. You can leave them notes about how amazing they are. This can be done with paper, through text or through email. You can shower your staff with compliments and Brochos every time you see them. You can tell them how they are helping you do whatever it is that you are doing. You can share with them how they are actually doing a Chesed. For example, if they are running the bookkeeping department of your clothing store explain to them how it is because of them that the store runs smoothly. And it is because of them that Yidden have nice clothes to wear; so, their job is a real cheesed.

My grandfather zt"l used to say to people who were working, that if they have in mind they are doing a Chesed, even if they are getting paid, they get the Schar of a Chesed. You don't have to be an employer to share this concept with someone; I say this to people at many different types of jobs and they are pumped. Any yid who is doing any job that eventually helps another yid function better is doing a huge Chesed.

If you are a Rebby or teacher you have many opportunities to pump up your students. You may be changing their life forever with just one smile

or one compliment. Even just one time of saying to your student that you believe in them can change their life. You can make it a habit of telling every single student what a

shining star they are and giving them a lot of internal compliments such as: you are compassionate, kind, wise, friendly, fun, energetic, and you persevere. You can pump up your whole class by saying how they are the best class by far and their Achdus is amazing.

Preschool Morahs can pump up all children by sharing with them how amazing they are. If you do this with any child over a few months of age, you will watch their face light up. If their face doesn't light up, keep going because they may need more compliments or may need to be pumped up in another way.

If you are a therapist, mentor or coach, see how many times a session you can pump up the child, parent, teenager, spouse, or adult that you are with. A mom was observing the session with her 12-year-old. Later the mom reflected that during the session she counted 40 times that I pumped her child up! I told her that she is the best parent in the world for noticing. This child had an immediate turn around B"H!

If you are seeing couples, make sure to pump each one up 100's of times and tell each spouse how the other spouse loves them. (I learn from Ahron Hakohen.) We see miracles happen when we find the good in spouses and teach them ways to communicate with each other.

If you are a parent, pump your child up all the time by telling them how you love spending time with them; that they are like a shining star, compassionate, kind, thoughtful and pure sweetness.

Rabbi Golumbeck has shared many times: If you

that I ever met is an amazing person. Every client that I ever met is an amazing person. I learn so much from each person that I meet. There are

so many parents that call to have sessions with children that cry to me saying that the past therapist said whatever is happening with their child is their fault (the mom's fault).



One of my biggest jobs is reassuring the mothers that it is not their fault. From an Emunah perspective Rabbi Golumbeck teaches us how results are in Hashem's department. The mother can't do or say anything that will affect her child without Hashem willing it to be.

I explain to the moms how they sound like the most amazing mother in the world! (Every single parent I ever met is amazing). Only once the mom hears this and believe that I really feel it, can any of the therapeutic work happen! Telling moms it's their fault doesn't have a place in helping build relationships with moms and children or helping moms learn how to build the development of their children.

Many years ago, I got a call from a clinician who said she wants to send me a mom who is dysfunctional and really is not a good mother. She said because of the dysfunction the children were all doing very badly. Before I could continue to listen to another word, I interrupted and asked her to stop for a second, "Can you please tell me one good thing about this mother?" To my utter shock and disbelief, the clinician said, "No." I said "OK I will find the good things when I meet her."

I hung up the phone and davened to Hashem to talk for me when this mother would arrive at her appointment the next week.

The second I met the mother, I realized she was in a tremendous amount of emotional pain. During the first meeting I found so many מעלות of this amazing mother and told them to her. I told her she loves her children and I pointed out to her

how I realized this. I told her that she is sensitive and kind to people and how she is such an amazing person. I didn't see dysfunction in this moth-

er at all, I saw an amazing Yiddisha mama who also had pain and suffering and we had to help her. B"H within a few months this mother had a great relationship with her

children and felt much better overall.

At school meetings, I start every meeting where everyone goes around the table saying something they enjoy about the child or progress they see in the child we are talking about. Once in a while I get some push back saying "we don't have time for this" - but I say "this is the most important part of the meeting."

It would be hard to walk two hours with only a five-minute break however I knew how much it meant to this person. As I was leaving, I caught a glimpse of the clock hanging in the dining room and it said 9:15. 

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Q. It says in the Chumash that Yitzchok Avinu was afraid that the plishtim would kill his wife Rivka, and therefore, he said that she was his sister. We find the same thing by Avraham Avinu.

We always hear on 'A Life With Bitachon' that we should never be afraid of people. They can't do anything. So what was they afraid of? Why did they need to do the hishtadlus of saying, "It's my sister."

**A.** The Netziv writes, and R' Yaakov Kamenetzky also brings this down, that there are two ways to serve Hakadosh Baruch Hu. One mehalech is to say, "Hashem, I'm going to leave the world up to You,

You do everything, I'm going to sleep, You don't need me to do any hishtadlus whatsoever." That is one derech in avodas Hashem Yisborach.

The Netziv explains that Shevet Binyamin went with that mehalech; that's why with Mordechai HaTzadik, when everyone said do hishtadlus and bow down to Haman, he said, no, I don't do any hishtadlus, Haman can't get angry at me, he can't do anything to me. That's why with Mordechai's bitachon the whole Klal Yisrael got saved, because Mordechai was from Shevet Binyamin, and Shevet Binyamin went with the derech of no hishtadlus.

On the other hand, the Sandhedrin paskened that it was proper hishtadlus to bow down, so obviously there was another derech of doing hishtadlus.

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
Put Yourself in a Good Mood Right From the Start!



Start Your Day with a Hearty Delicious Davening! So we have to figure out, what's the point of hishtadlus?

R' Yaakov Kamentesky writes in the beginning of Parshas Bechukosai that the whole point of hishtadlus is to place yourself in a makom nisayon, to go through the actions of hishtadlus and still believe that it was all Hashem. You take medicine and feel better, but you say the medicine was just an illusion. You eat food and feel nourished, but you say the food didn't do anything, it was just an illusion. You believe that all your hishtadlus was just an illusion. That's the purpose of hishtadlus, to give you schar by doing all your actions of hishtadlus and saying that it's not me, it's Hashem. This is the second derech in avodas Hashem.

The Michtav M'Eliyahu explains that the reason why Hashem wants us to go with derech of doing hishtadlus and still attributing everything to Hashem is because this is a tikkun for the chet of Adam HaRishon. Adam HaRishon, at his level, thought that there was a possibility of him being



able to effect the briyah. Therefore, Hashem wants us to go to the opposite extreme by doing actions of hishtadlus but believing it's nothing.

That's why Avraham and Yitzchok did hishtadlus, to create a situation where it seemed like their actions saved them, but to believe despite everything that their actions were meaningless and it was all Hashem. That is the point of hishtadlus. Hishtadlus is to give you an opportunity to believe it's really all Hashem despite the hishtadlus, and thereby give you zechusim.

There were four kings who used different levels of hishtadlus to fight their enemies. David Hamelech,

when he went to battle, he went with weapons and warriors, with all the hishtadlus. At the other extreme, Chizkiyah went to sleep in his bed and said, "Hashem, You fight the war." (Yalkut)

These are two different ways of having bitachon. There's the kind of bitachon where you go to sleep, (which is actually one of the purposes why we go to sleep, to show Hashem I'm not doing anything in this world, You're doing everything, You're watching me, protecting me and the world will go on while I'm sleeping) and then there's the derech of doing all the hishtadlus and believing it was all Hashem.

So the answer to the question is that the Netziv says there are two ways of serving Hashem, there's a way of doing no hishtadlus and there's a way of doing hishtadlus but believing it's all from Hashem

anyway. Either way, the point is to connect to Hashem. Some people connect to Hashem by just thinking about emunah and bitachon, and some people connect to Hashem by putting themselves in a makom nisayon and saying, "It wasn't me, it was Hashem."

Practically speaking, we have to learn out from here that there are two different mehalchim how to serve Hashem, to focus on either bitachon alone or bitachon together with hishtadlus. Everyone should serve Hashem however it makes them into a bigger, better, happier, healthier person. Whichever mehalech brings them more menuchas hanefesh and simchas hachaim and whatever brings them a healthier connection to Hashem. There's no one right derech. Like the Netziv says, there are different derachim in how to serve Hashem and everyone should do whatever works for them.







# Bitachon Perspective

Q. I try to be mechanech my children to the best of my abilities. I try to transmit the importance of emunah and yiras shamayim. However, when my husband speaks to the children, he conveys the opposite message. He communicates to the children that what I say is not so important. It feels as if all my efforts are being undone by my husband. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

**A.** The reason you feel frustrated is because you think that chinuch works with cause and effect; if your children get a strong chinuch, they will come out good, and if they get a poor chinuch they will

come out weaker.

You have to understand that when Hashem assigned to you that task of being mechanech vou children, He did not demand of you results. Your obligation of chinuch is to do the actions which are in your control to have a positive effect on your children. However, the way your children will turn out is not determined by the quality of chinuch they got. The impact your chinuch will have on your children is entirely in the control of Hakadosh Baruch Hu.

Understanding this, you'll realize that your husband is not undoing your chinuch. It's only possible to undo an effort when the purpose of the

effort is to achieve results. However, since the mitzva of chinuch is to do the actions of chinuch, it's impossible to undo an action that was already done. Certainly, as far as the result of your children's chinuch, your husband is not affecting them. They will be influenced exactly the way Hashem wants them to be influenced, and your husband can't negatively affect them one iota.

If you want to do a hishtadlus to help your children turn out the best way possible, turn to the One who is really responsible for results.

Say, "Hakadosh Baruch Hu, I know that You are in control of all results, and I'm turning

to You to make mv children turn out to be ehrilche yidden and yirei shamayim."

Hashem will say, "Because you are turning to me, and you understand that I am the One in charge of results, I will show you how I am in charge of how your children will be affected. In this z'chus, you will see tremendous yiddishe nachas from all your children."

Q. Recently I was having a discussion with my married daughter regarding a certain issue she is going through.

During the course of the

conversation my daughter told me, "All my anxiety and other emotional issues are all because of you", and she went on a diatribe blaming me for all her issues. And after hearing a mouthful from my daughter, I feel like I utterly failed in my role as a parent.

**A.** The reason you feel so guilty and upset is because you think that you're in control over results, and if your child has an issue, it's because of you.

You have to internalize. there's no such thing as a human being affecting another human being. All results are from Hashem. Whatever happened to your child is exactly what Hakadosh Baruch Hu wanted for your child.

If there is something that you should be doing differently for the future, that's not a reason to feel bad. We're human beings. Hashem made humans intrinsically imperfect. If your daughter has good advice to offer, you would be happy to hear and learn what you could do in the future. That's why we are in this world – to learn and grow!

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

Once, after learning, R' Duvi went back to the dormitory and saw many Hatzala ambulances and paramedics racing to Rafael's room. They rushed him to the Emergency Room.
