On the other hand, he certainly didn't want to get sick! He fished a tissue out of his pocket, tore off one corner, and stuffed it into his right ear. Then he did the same for his left ear. Baruch Hashem, it really helped.

Twenty minutes later, at shul, R' Spielman recalled his "earplugs" and decided it was time to remove them. Out came the white fluff from his right ear, but the piece of tissue in his left ear seemed glued in place. He tried yanking to one direction and then another, but nothing worked.

Why? he asked himself. What message was Hashem sending him? There must be a message here. Nothing happens by chance!

Then it occurred to him. Ears — listening — newscasts...maybe it's that news hotline he often listened to. The hotline analyzed politicians' speeches to no end. There was never a word of thanks to the Ribbono Shel Olam for His nissim — even now, when they were happening day after day! And what about announcements for future events? Did they ever say "b'ezras Hashem"'? No!

Maybe that's what Hashem is warning me about, he thought. "Okay, Hashem," he said in his mind. "I undertake not to listen to it for such-and-such a period of time."

The following amazing story was sent in by a family in Monsey, New York.

We were in Brooklyn for Shabbos, visiting my parents for the first time since our seven-week-old was born. Everything was nice and calm until the end of the Friday night seuda, when my wife noticed that our baby was breathing deep and hard breaths. I ran across the street to a Hatzala member who wasn't so concerned, but he called a paramedic just to make sure because she was so little. When they arrived they also didn't think it was anything serious, but they were concerned that things can get worse quickly with babies, so they took us in to the hospital. Baruch Hashem, at that point it was still nothing; they took some tests and saw that she had RSV, but then sent us home.



Shabbos morning came, and our baby's breathing wasn't bad, but she wasn't eating much. As the day went on, the breathing stayed status quo, but she still wasn't eating, so after Shabbos we called our regular doctor and described how she was breathing. He wasn't concerned about her breathing, but he was concerned that she hadn't eaten all Shabbos, so he told us that on the way home we should stop by Columbia hospital and it will take time but they will give fluids and send us home. So we called a family member who would meet us at Columbia to take our other children home while we waited with our baby.

We arrived at the ER, and in the triage the excitement started. Our baby started turning blue, and the breathing got bad. Baruch Hashem we were already in the hospital, and the doctor and nurses moved quickly to get her on oxygen. It was difficult to get her started on IV fluid since her veins were so thin due to her young age and dehydration, but finally after calling in a specialist they were able to start her on the IV fluid. We were still calm about the situation as it didn't seem that serious, so my wife went home to unpack and put the kids to sleep and then return to pick us up. In the meantime, they took a chest x-ray, and the results were very concerning; she had a lot of fluid in her lungs. It was a bad case of pneumonia.

All alone in the dark room in the ER without phone reception, I felt so lost. They came in to have me sign consent forms to do a bedside procedure to put in chest tubes to help drain the fluid. Not knowing exactly what that meant, I felt even more lost and lonely. I began to cry and say Tehillim. Then came such a calming feeling that there is no one in the whole world with me and no one could help besides Hashem Yisbarach. That feeling was the springboard that would carry us through for the next two weeks.

While I was saying Tehillim in somewhat of a calmer state, knowing that Hashem was with us at our side, the surgeon came in to put in the tubes. She told me that before she does the procedure she will double check the situation with an ultra sound. The ultrasound showed a totally different picture. We still don't know if the x-ray was a mistake or if the situation actually changed, but either way it was clearly meant to get me to daven and realize that Hashem is with me running the show. The procedure was canceled, but the breathing was not improving, and the oxygen level was dropping.

At this point, my wife came back, and the team from the PICU (pediatric intensive care unit) come running in to assess the situation, which they said was very serious, so they immediately brought us up to the PICU. There we had phone service, so my wife and I called our parents to fill them in and they began saying Tehillim. In the PICU we were greeted by a doctor who told us very nicely and calmly that the situation wasn't good and they felt the only way was to put our lovely cute seven-week-old onto what they called a breathing tube (very

nice on their part not to scare us too much) which is better known as a vent or respirator. Of course, we gave

them the go ahead, and quickly told our families to daven. We went into the waiting room and began our tearful tehilim. About an hour later, the nurse came to inform us that all went well, and we can come to the room to see our baby. She was sedated and seemed to be sleeping very comfortably.

For a week we juggled our family at home and baby in the PICU, trying hard to keep everything normal. On Sunday we started learning more terms and facts but the situation was still very concerning. Even on the vent her gas levels were nowhere near what they were supposed to be. We also overheard that her left lung collapsed and she wasn't exhaling the carbon dioxide. It



was a hard day with lots of Tehillim and support from family and friends. We got a volunteer to stay overnight so that we could get some sleep and continue to function [I want to take a moment just to say how much chesed goes on in Klal Yisroel. The organizations that send volunteers and food and even arrange rides through people who just for chesed drive back and forth to the hospital is amazing! There were also many private people who offered all kinds of help. It is next level unbelievable, Mi K'amcha Yisroel!

Monday morning they were doing blood work hoping that results would change for the good but they did not. At one point on Monday afternoon I heard the doctor saying that the situation wasn't good and they could not figure out what the issue was. Again I got out my Tehillim and again felt this closeness to Hashem that I never felt before as I cried my heart out to Hashem to please save my dear daughter's life. A little while later, the team came in again and looked at the screen of numbers. The two main doctors gave each other a look and one said, "I don't know, but let's try bagging her." I later found out this is an old-fashioned way of getting the lungs the air it needs and helping them exhale properly. Baruch Hashem that helped, and it was a turning point from very critical to less critical. From then on we spent another week of ups and downs in the PICU and then a few more days on the regular floor. Baruch Hashem now we are all home together as a healthy family.

Chazal tell us על כל נשימה תהלל י-ה we have to thank Hashem for every single breath. After this experience this has a whole new meaning. I would like to share a Toras Chaim in Baba Kama 16a which I feel can be a chizuk for everyone. It's a beautiful piece if you want to look it up, but in short he says that chazal knew that on a practical level it's not possible to walk around the whole day thanking Hashem for every breath. So they were מתקן in which we thank Hashem for all that he does for us, and when we say ועל נשמותינו הפקודות לך we should have in mind every breath that we take throughout the day and night. This feeling of thanks must also bring a person to be מכניעה himself to Hakadosh Baruch Hu, and that's why we bow, we lower ourselves before Hashem in gratitude.

The goodness that Hashem has shown us in these two weeks is an eye opener and a reminder of all that Hashem does for each and every person all day every day. We should at least try to remember to thank Hashem during the bracha of מודים and think about how we really owe our whole being to Hashem and try to thank him by doing His Ratzon.

Shortly after, her neighbor came over with that toy and said, "You can have it, we got an extra one!"



The Curative Effect



The Gemara in Masechta Brochos promises, Kol ho'omer Tehilla LeDovid sholosh peomim bayom muvtach lo shehu ben Olam haBo: Anybody who says the kapital of 'Tehilah L'dovid' three times a day is guaranteed to be a citizen of the Next World.

Now how long does it take to say Ashrei? A minute? So for three minutes of work each day a person is granted such a gigantic promise?

The Dubno Maggid explained with the following parable about a fellow who came to the doctor complaining about a chronic illness. And the doctor promised him, "If you'll take this medication three times a day you will get better."

The fellow came back a week later, worse than ever.


The doctor said, "First of all, are you taking the right medication?" Yes, he checked the bottle. He said, "How do you take the medication?" he said, "I pop the first pill in the morning, I chew it, and I spit it out. I take the second pill later on; I chew that, and I spit it out. And then later on, I take the third pill; I chew it and I spit it out."

The doctor said, "That's not how you take medication: You have to take it with a glass of water; it has to get

into your system and distributed to the extremities of your body."

So the Dubno Maggid explained, that if we're going to chew the words of Ashrei and spit them out, it won't have its curative effect. But if we sip them like a cup of hot tea, Ashrei.. Yoshvei.. Veisecho.... Tov HaShem Lakol, VeRachamov al kol maasov, then it will have a transformative effect on the way that we think, and the way that we experience life. And we will be guaranteed to be citizens of the Next World.

Living With Mpprectation By: R' Daniel Shasha

The Sfas Emes brings a beautiful interpretation of how to read the first verse in our parashah. and Yehudah approached him...' (44:18). Although the simple explanation of this verse is that Yehudah approached Yosef, there is another way to read this verse, al derech remez. Yehudah is a reference to Yehudi the name given to every Jew, stemming from the word hodaah, to thank. This is because the hallmark of a Jew is gratitude, that is why we are called yehudim. So instead of referring to approaching Yosef, the word vayigash can be a reference to approaching Hashem. Accordingly, the way to read the verse is 'a Jew should approach Hashem with gratitude!'

This is in fact a very powerful way to beseech Hashem, to first focus on all the good that He does for us. Only than do we make requests, praying for what we need. The Sfas Emes writes that even in the darkest times, one should strive to use this method; thanking Hashem for His great kindnesses. Then the gates of Mercy will be opened and it will be a very opportune time to daven for what we need.


We were just fortunate to recite full Hallel each day during Chanukah. We might ask, since Hallel is devoted for praising Hashem for the salvations He performed, why do we add requests such as anah Hashem hoshiah nah. Is this really the appropriate time for this? In fact, this is really the most opportune time! This is because praising Hashem is so powerful, that it helps bring salvations. Therefore, after we have praised Hashem, we pray for salvations since our praise paves the path for this! (Rav Elya Boruch Finkel)

This idea also helps us understand the last bracha in the Shemoneh Esrei, Sim Shalom. Why is it that this bracha has so many requests? We ask for peace, goodness, blessing, life, favor, kindness and mercy; even though the last three blessings are not really dedicated for requests. We do this since during the previous bracha, modim we thank Hashem for His unlimited goodness. Therefore, the gates of prayer are opened and it is the ideal time to request from Hashem! (The Seder Hayom)

One time Rav Yitzhak Dovid Grossman, the grandfather of the renewed Rav of Migdal Haemek who was named after him, was traveling to Europe to raise funds. On his way back to Eretz Yisrael, his boat collided with a larger ship and the sailors weren't interested in saving the Jewish passengers. To everyone's amazement, the Rav remained calm. As Shabbos was approaching, he started fervently reciting Kabalas Shabbos and then began to dance with great joy! He was contemplating all the incredible kindnesses that Hashem did for him and he was so full of appreciation that despite the difficult circumstances, he was dancing with great happiness! The sailors were able to relocate to another ship yet they left the boat with the lowish passengers to sink. Mirasulovsky the boat

There is an amazing story that happened with Reb Avigdor Miller zt"l. One day one of his grandchildren that went to Eretz Yisroel was in an accident and r"l passed away.

That day, Reb Avigdor gave his shiur as unusual. His talmidim took this as a sign that he did not know about it.

However, the next day they found out that Reb Avigdor Miller had known about it at the time. They were amazed that he was able to give the shiur with his regular vigor and stamina. Someone approached him and mentioned his amazement that the Rav was able to keep his regular demeanor despite the tragedy.

Reb Avigdor replied that obviously when he heard about the tragedy it hurt him terribly, but right afterwards it became batul in all the chesed Hashem that he is constantly enveloped in. He told his Talmid that he feels so loved by Hashem and he is so enveloped by the chesed Hashem that he simply has no room for any negative or hurtful thoughts.

Now this seems to be a very high level in Ahavas Hashem, but yes, we can have connection to the ways of our Gedolim. After all that is the main purpose of recounting stories of our gedolim. Moreover, every person has a Gadol that's within them that's waiting to emerge.

In fact, the Mishna in Brachos tells us, "Just like one makes a Bracha on something that is good, one needs to make a Bracha the same way when something bad happens. The Gemara explains that this means that it should be with the same joy. The Mishna is talking to every Yid, so how can we understand this?

Mashol: A Bachur went over to his Rebbi to discuss his issues. At one point he started discussing his parents. The Bachur told him that when he was a child, his parents told him or did to him some things



that traumatized him until today.

His Rebbi smiled at the boy knowingly and then told him the following. I understand that your parents did some things that may have made you uncomfortable or perhaps even pained you, but let me ask you this.

Were you perhaps a difficult child when you were young, and your parents nurtured you? The bachurim answered, "Yes, I was difficult." Then His Rebbi asked him "are you aware how many nights your parents stayed up with you throughout your childhood?

How many times did they go to the doctor with you waiting endlessly for the doctor? The bachur started smiling and said, "wow I never looked at it that way", but the therapist wasn't done [as he wanted to finish the job].

Do you realize how many hundreds of thousands or perhaps even a million dollars were spent on you? This includes your insurance, your toys, your clothing, your tuition (which is pretty costly), your tutors, your food and miscellaneous [many other hidden fees].

The Bachur's smile is getting wider and his face begins glowing, as if his whole essence was beginning to overflow with love for his parents.

His rebbi continued. Do you realize how much worry and anxiety and tears your parents had over you that you should grow up to be an upstanding Yid and perhaps even a Talmud Chacham. These people are none other than your amazing parents.

The Rebbi concluded with the following insightful words. "Having said all that, if you are traumatized by the few things that they said and did that gave you same pain, how much more should you be overwhelmed by all the good that they bestowed upon you.

This my friends was the attitude of Reb Avigdor

Miller zt"I in regards to the Ribbono shel Olam, but a lot more. A parents chessed and Rachmanus pales in comparison to the billions of Chessed that Hashem bestows us each and every day. This is how we can understand the story.

However, the Chessed of Hashem is nonstop to each and every one of us. It's each and every second we are receiving numerous gifts from Hashem. In fact, every breath is a gift from Hashem. In fact, our parents that we just elaborated on, are also an amazing gift from Hashem.

The trick is to stay focused on all the good that we have in our life. If we have this attitude then we can understand what the Mishna is telling us, "Just like we bless Hashem for the good it's the same with the difficulties.

When we are focused on all the millions and billions of goodness that we have in our life then it becomes batul to the good. Everything blends in together with all the goodness.

Right now, we may not understand it but we believe that it's all for the good.

There is a famous story [that worth reviewing] that someone approached a famous Rebbe with the question that we alluded to earlier. How can we bless Hashem for the bad like the good. The Rebbe replied that he should go to the famed Reb Zisha and he will answer the question.

The Chassid traveled to Rebbe Zisha and he arrived at his rundown house/shack. Rebbe Zisha had

many difficulties but his poverty was well known as it was obvious from his home.

The Chassid asked Rebbe Zisha the question and Reb Zisha responded innocently, "I don't understand why the Rebbe sent you here, I don't know what it means to have difficulties. I have it all good. Everything is great."

The Chassid realized that he received his answer. If one looks at life with positive glasses, and he acknowledges all the goodness, then all the difficulties fall away as we explained.

There is a story that Reb Meilich Biederman brings with Reb Zisha that shows his tremendous ability to see the good in all situations.

Once Reb Zisha and his brother Reb Elimelech landed in a jail. To Reb Meilich's chagrin there was a pail in the middle that had waste substances and they couldn't learn or daven. Now one would have thought that in such a situation one can get down.

Not Reb Zisha. He started dancing as he told his great brother that now they are fulfilling Hashem's will by not learning or davening. The end of the story was that the jail warden heard the dancing, and when he saw that the pail was giving him much joy, he removed it. He didn't want to see the Jews in joy.

Again, we see how Reb Zisha only saw good in his life. He transformed the most difficult darkness into light.

Many people call Reb Yehuda Mandel with their share of Tzaros. Many times, they come with very serious tzaros and they want a Bracha and hadracha.

What Reb Yehuda tells them immediately is that they are going the wrong direction in life. Instead of harping on their problems that they have, why not focus on all the millions of brachos that they do have.



Usually, he tells them to make lists of all the chessed Hashem and generally these people see Yeshuos beyond the world of nature.

The Seforim teach us that when one focuses on the chessed Hashem he is activating the midda of Chessed of Hashem. This in turn causes more and more Bracha and chessed to come gushing forth, as Hashem's chessed is unlimited.

We see in the past two parshiyos how Yosef excelled in this area. Starting off when he was sold the Or Hachaim Hakadosh says that even while they were selling Yosef, he still loved them as a brother.

Yosef was a person that was overflowing with love. That's why he told his father about the things they were doing, as he could have minded his own business and stayed out of trouble.

Then when he went to the house of Potifar he was full of joy and upbeat although he was a servant away from his loving father. He obviously understood that all this is from Hashem as he focused on being positive.

He was then transferred out of Potifars house in disgrace, and thrown into a dungeon. Despite all this he didn't lose his Ruach and joy. In fact, he was so upbeat that he asked the butler and the baker why they seemed down. I mean they were in a dungeon and their fate was unknown. Shouldn't this be enough to get you down? Not Yosef.

Finally, in this week's Parsha Yosef reveals himself to his brothers. He doesn't show them any discomfort. He keeps telling them that all this happened for the best. It was a master plan and he doesn't have any grudge against them whatsoever. Again, we see Yosef's great positivity.

I would like to conclude with the following thought. If one would see his friend do something

that's not appropriate, this would pain him. Obviously, the more inappropriate the greater the pain.

Let's flip this around. If your friend does something amazing like a Mitzva, shouldn't this make us extremely joyful? The greater the Mitzva is the more joyful we should become.

When we are positive people then yes, we should and we will become joyful. Can we imagine living a life like this? This is the concept of "Lev toy".

We have just gone through the Yom tov of Chanuka and we can still feel the warmth of the Menorah. Furthermore, we can still feel the warmth of the Hallel that we sang together to praise Hashem for all the miracles and all the good in our life. This is what we are taking with

We are told by Dovid Hamelech in tehillim that there will come a time of "Az yimalei sichok pinu". Now we can understand why. Firstly, we will be full of gratitude and joy for all the chessed that Hashem has done and will do during the era of Moshiach.

Moreover, we will become full of joy when we do Mitzvos and when we see other people doing Mitzvos, thus fulfilling Hashem's will. Yes, we are looking forward to this time when we will appreciate the chessed of Hashem on a much higher level, as we will cry out together "Hashem yimloch l'olam vaed" very soon Amein.

Having to ask a nurse for everything he needed was too much for him, and he'd even asked the nurse for pills that would end his life!

R' Aryeh rushed to the nursing home and came right over to his room. After stirring up a conversation, he told him a profound idea:

The Torah requires that a man who is challenged with a lo sasei, a negative commandment, must give up all his money rather than transgress it. So, for argument's sake, if he has one million dollars, he'd have to give up all the money rather than transgress the lo sasei.

"Now," continued R' Aryeh,

"With that being the case," said R' Aryeh, "If, for instance,

you're confronted with a challenge regarding lashon hara, i.e., you feel the nurse did something to you and you want to repeat the 'news' to others, and nevertheless you withhold and don't say the lashon hara, you're safeguarding seventeen negative commandments! So think about this: By withholding just one piece of lashon hara, you're gaining seventeen million dollars! Isn't that a reason to remain alive?!"

"Furthermore," continued R' Aryeh, "had you been a robber who took away seventeen million dollars from someone, well that's a terrible thing to do to someone—all the more so if that person would be yourself! You are simply damaging yourself. You have million-dollar opportunities at your side, and you're ready to turn them down just like that? You're robbing yourself from priceless treasures." 
However, when Kivi heard that he was being asked to speak on Shabbos, he immediately turned down the offer.

THE DEVOTED CHILD

At times, we may feel that our mitzvos don't have such value, whether it's because there were times that we used to do them so much better, or because other people do those mitzvos much better than we do, and thus we think Hashem doesn't need ours. Here's an incredible story that shows the fallacy of this belief:

There's a man who currently raises funds for soldiers fighting in the Israeli army, reaching out to donors to contribute to the soldiers' many needs. One Erev Shabbos, as he was making calls in his office, he saw his nine-year-old dragging a table from the back of his house to the front, and in his hand was a stack of papers and some tape. He didn't make much of it and went back to his work.

An hour later, his son knocked on his office and handed him \$87.50. "Totty," he said, "I see how much you're doing for the soldiers, so I decided to do the same. I called out to the cars that were passing our house, handed them a cup of soda or cookies, and told them that I'm raising money for soldiers in the Israeli army. Many of them gave me five dollars and told me to keep the change.

Here's what I've raised!"

Now, let's think for a moment: This father was dealing with wealthy individuals for donations of much more than five dollars. And yet, here he gets \$87.50 from his son. Which of those donations do you think will make a permanent impression on him? The six-digit ones from the philanthropists or his nine-year-old's best efforts?

The answer is simple. His son's donation has a special place in the father's heart because his son's gesture was sincere.

This serves as incredible chizuk for us. Our madreigos might not be as great as those of the previous generations, but a father knows when his son does according to the best of his ability. That takes precedence over those previously "greater" efforts because these are being done out of sincerity and devotion.

The Gaon was wearing his tallis and tefillin, which he habitually wore all day, with the tallis covering his tefillin. As he stood before the judges, he uncovered his tefillin. The non-Jewish judges were immediately struck with terror. "Go free! Go free!" they shrieked. "We cannot keep an angel in jail!"

The Gaon returned home, and his talmidim were incredulous over the miracle that had taken place. But the Gaon dismissed their reactions. "The Torah itself tells us, 'All the

every year on Purim. The Vilna Gaon was once imprisoned on trumped-up charges, but he was so immersed in his learning that he was barely aware of his surroundings. Even in his own home, the Gaon had always kept the windows shuttered throughout the day in order to avoid seeing any improper sights, so there was very little difference between the prison cell and his home. The Gaon's talmidim, seeing that their rebbe was doing nothing about his plight, sent Rav Chaim Volozhiner to visit him in jail and urge him to act on his own behalf.

and meaning of the tefillin to permeate his thoughts. Thus, Taamei Haminhagim states that if a person wears tefillin without giving them any thought, it is as if he simply placed a stone on his head.

head," he explained. "The tefillin have the power to strike fear and awe into the hearts of those who see them." (This story was told to Rav Avrohom Chaim Feuer by Rav Pinchos Briskman of Yeshivah Torah Vodaas, who heard it from Rav Kamai while he was learning in Mir.)

In order to tap into the power of tefillin, let us endeavor to strengthen our own fear of Hashem at least at the times when we wear our tefillin. Let us channel all of our thoughts and desires at that time into yichud Hashem, and let us take care not to be distracted by other matters while we are wearing our tefillin. Some people take on the kabbalah to refrain from speaking about mundane subjects while wearing their tefillin; this will certainly help cause the Shechinah to rest upon us at that time.

The awe that is generated by the sight of a Jew wearing tefillin is awe of Hashem Himself; when a non-Jew sees the tefillin, he senses Hashem's Presence through the Jewish person wearing them. Rav Gedaliah Schorr zt"l (in Ohr Gedalyahu on Purim) quotes Rav Shimon Shalom of Amshinov, who used to point out that the pasuk quoted by the Gaon uses the phrase v'yaru mimecha, which literally means, "they shall fear from you." Rav Shimon Shalom explained this to mean that the non-Jews will fear Hashem "because of you" — i.e., as a result of the Jewish person wearing tefillin.

When we don our tefillin every day with the proper intentions, we have an incredible opportunity to spread the glory of Hashem's Kingship. Let us keep this in mind and tap into the enormous power of this great mitzvah.

But it is not sufficient merely to wear the tefillin; it is imperative that we internalize their message. The Sefas Emes notes that the Gemara in Berachos refers to the "tefillin shebarosh" — literally, "the tefillin that are in the head." This means, he explains, that in order to engender awe in others, one must not only wear tefillin, but actually allow the message

In Review: The sight of a Jewish person wearing tefillin has the power to strike fear into the hearts of the nations. But this fear is not the fear of the Jewish person himself; rather, it is fear of Hashem. In order to access that power of the tefillin, we must focus our own thoughts on fear of Heaven and the Oneness of Hashem while we wear them.

Did you know that when Hashem wrote in the Torah, "Hocheiach



tochiach es amisachea," give mussar to people, that's only if the person understands and realizes that the mussar is coming out of love. That's only if the person feels that you love both Hashem and him so much, that you want to bring him closer to Hashem and you want him to be happy.

Reb Yaakov Kaminetzsky says, that before Yaakov Avinu gave mussar to the shepherd, he said, "Achai." You are my brother. That's how you need to give mussar.

The heilige Chofez Chaim brings from the Marganas Hatava, that nowadays we are not on that level to really have so much Ahavas Hashem. We are not really on the level that the mussar we are giving is coming out of love. Therefore, nobody knows nowadays really how to give proper mussar. So nowadays as my Rebbe said, most times mussar can turn off people and bring them further away from Hashem, bring friction and sinah. That's not the point of mussar. The point of mussar is exactly the opposite.

So how do you get a guy to improve nowadays? My Rebbe gave me over a mesorah from his Rebbeim. Do you know how to do it? By focusing on his maalos; by appreciating the person and complimenting him. When a person feels good and appreciated, then he wants to do good. When you look down at a person, you're actually making it worse. Whether you say it out loud, or whether its in your mind, the person feels it. Therefore, if you love Hashem and you love the person so much and you want him to improve, you should always make sure not to look down at him and not to make him feel down, tzebrachen and tzeklopt. This makes it much worse. Anyone who loves Hashem, and loves another Yid, and wants to bring him closer to Hashem, should do it through compliments. They should do it through building him up and making him feel good.

By mussar too, one shmuz may be great for you to hear but for someone else it may be better not to hear. A person should take his avodah and focus on the ma'amarei Chazal for his avodah. He shouldn't be making an emphasis on ma'amarei Chazal that are for his friend's avoda.

R' Mandel says look at our avos, Avraham was chessed Yaa-kov was Torah and Yitzchak was something else.

The mitzvah of "Hocheiach tochiach es amisachea," is to bring people closer to Hashem, and to show the person how much you love and care for him. Just like if you tell someone that they have an infection and give them antibiotics, the person will thank you that you saved their life. They won't be upset at you! When you give mussar, it has to be in a way that the other person feels like you're giving them antibiotics for an infection and saving them. The person has to feel that you care for them and that you want the best for them. Nowadays, for most people, the way to do that is through positivity. (This is also from Reb Moshe Feinstein in Darush Moshe.)



Not only do we use speech constantly throughout the day to relay and share basic information, we also use the same ability to share new ideas and discoveries with each other.

Everyone over the course of time discovers something new that can enlighten and help other people. Without speech or writing which is an outgrowth of speech, this useful information would be trapped in the minds of the person who figured it out. It would not make it out there and enter other people's minds. Perhaps it would also be shared to those people who are around him and watch him but there it would end. This covers a whole wide spectrum of different realms.

Let's give some examples; if you would have a nice insight or a chiddush in a gemara, mishnah, pasuk of chumash or davening, how can you let other people benefit from it? If a scientist or doctor makes

a discovery or invention, how would other people become aware of it? Even if you just found out a good new recipe or a better store to shop in or a better item to buy, how do you share it with others? The speech that HKB"H gave us gives us the ability to enjoy and use everybody else's chochma.

The importance and prominence of speech in our lives, is tremendous. I would like to elaborate some more on

this.

Our life as Yidden who are Ovdei Hashem is only possible through speech. This is not limited to sharing a chiddush with someone else, it's the basis of the whole Torah and mitzvos that we have. Let's take a closer look at Asiyas HaMitzvos. First of all if there's no verbal communication then even if we watched our parents do mitzvos and we faithfully copy them, it would be dry actions with-





out any understanding. If the ability to explain something verbally or written didn't exist, how would we understand why and what we are doing? Everyone would have to guess for themselves.

Mitzvos would be plain rituals that we do robotically. For how many generations do you think that would last? And even if you would continue to precisely copy the earlier generations, this could only apply to Mitzvos which are visible to you. One who was not alive in the times of the Bais Ha-Mikdash, or even if he just didn't see it himself, would not know a large part of the Torah and many Mitzvos.

The problem is even deeper than that. Learning by example is a very strong tool, especially for the youth. But examples only work for something which is visible to others. Many Mitzvos like Ahavas Hashem and Yiras Hashem are

in a person's heart and cannot be seen. Therefore, it's very difficult to give

that over to others without speech. How would we know the 13 fundamentals of Emunah, which is the whole Yesod of the Emunah of a Yid,

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


The Amazing Carnivorous Pitcher plants -part 1

Another pretty famous carnivorous plant is the pitcher plant, so called because it's shaped like a thin water pitcher. Now, please look at the diagram and try to figure out how a regular leaf "somehow" has a relatively large pitcher plant, with all its different parts, growing out of it!

We will start from the top and work our way down. But first,

see how this big pitcher plant is held straight up by the tendril that grows out of the leaf of the



plant. It has to hold up a "pitcher" that can get heavy at times

when it fills up with liquids. The tendril has to have a lot of strength for it to do that.

On the top of most of the different types of pitcher plants (not all) there amazingly are lids! (See the picture.) They don't open and close. They stay as is. These serve two main purposes. One is to attract insects. It's colorful and very fragrant and it has sweet nec-

tar on it so it does a good job attracting insects. Secondly, it helps to keep out rain which we will learn is important for the plants.

There is one specific type of pitcher plant that also has a waxy surfaces on the lid. This can clog up the insect's feet that normally hold on tight to almost any surface with suction cups and hooks and other means with which to hold on tight to almost any surface. However, waxed up feet will make the feet loosen their grip. This happens suddenly, and very often while upside down, while eating

on the Continued on next page nectar

on the underside of the lid, it loses its grip, and the insect will just plop down into the water at the bottom of the pitcher. (More about that soon.) If it's a crawling insect it surely will go straight down, but even winged insects we will see have trouble recovering their balance, and typically can't escape once they fall into the bottom part of the plant.

Below the lid is the lip or rim of the pitcher, called a peristome. It is usually very colorful with sweet nectar all around it and below it, as well on the pitcher plants inner walls. Again, somehow it "knows" that insects are

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attracted to bright colors, to can't get a grip on. nectar, and sweet scents.

Along the edges of the rim are different structures that are shaped in different ways, to all help to ensure that the insect will not have a good grip, and they are all pointing downwards, which guides the insect downwards. It has very slippery substances like wax, which is made with special wax producing glands, and other chemicals to get it headed downwards. The idea is to have the insect slip down into the bottom of the pitcher plant. The walls of the plant also have very slippery surfaces which the insects

So, we see the plant has strategies how to get the insect to fall into the deadly liquid below.

This plant somehow "knew": (1) that there are insects that it can eat, and (2) that insects have hooks and suction and cups, other adhe-



sives on their feet, which allow them to grip tightly onto almost any surface and stand sideways,

upside-down, or however thev want.


never knew about these hooks and suction cups until I read about it in a book on insects — yet this "knew" plant it on its own "figured and out" a way to get around the problem.

Consequently, the pitcher plant developed wax secreting glands that secrete a very slippery wax to prevent the insect from "getting a grip" in spite of its specially designed feet, causing it to slide down the walls of the plant down into the liquid below.

So, here comes an insect, which lands on the pitcher plant. Then, ZOOM! — it slips on this super-slippery wax, which is on top of the sloping plant, and it slides down to the bottom of the plant, right down the chute, as if it were going down a slide. Of course, the insect doesn't give up yet. It tries to fly or crawl up the slippery walls — but lo and behold, the plant has the foresight to build a barricade (in many species, but not all). Toward the middle of the "pitcher", and often on top as well, there's a barricade stiff, downward-pointed, dagger-like hairs which line the narrow neck of the "pitcher," thereby thwarting the attempts of any insect to escape! If they try to crawl up, or fly up, they bump into these tough hairs that are pointing down at them like spears.

Again, a plant with no brains coming up with great strategies and the ability to implement them! Do, you think it's enough to come up with the idea to have

to make things slippery and to clog up their feet? No, you must come up with the method to make a wax gland that knows how to produce wax. Is that an accident? Do you know how to make wax? Then you come up with the idea to make barricades and actually implement that idea successfully with special downward pointing hairs.

How did that happen? Quite amazing, no? Now, not only do crawling

insects have

an impossible time getting out of the pitcher plant, but even



flying insects can almost never get out.

The reason is since most pitcher plants below the rim are pretty thin, so their wings really can't flap properly in such a narrow space. Then you have the slippery walls and the barricaded walls that hold the insect back as well. We will discuss how wider pitcher plants work in a way that even winged insects are captured, in spite of the extra room for the insect to fly out. To be continued.

The sheaths of wheat are very light in order that you can bundle it and transport it.

Flax is a plant that grows from the ground.

The kernel is made up of (at least) two parts, the grain and the shell (chaff) which is made to protect the kernel from spoiling.

Wood comes from a tree that grows very tall and has a big trunk that is quite strong unlike the stalk of the wheat.

The wood can be carved in different shapes without breaking and it is made into ridges to press on the wheat kernels.

119. It's a big miracle that the an-128. imal is domestic and listens to orders and is not wild and doesn't have big demands and is happy to go around in129. circles.

120. The person is heavy enough to put pressure on the kernels to separate the kernel from the chaff but not to crush it130. so that you can retrieve it.

121. Hashem made that the chaff is lighter than the kernel so131. when it is thrown in the air it gets separated easily.

122. Also, the good stays in one132. place and the bad part gets blown away.

123. The grain is thrown in the 133. air with the strength of one person.

It is thrown up with a pitchfork which is a tool made of metal and wood.

125. Thank Hashem for gravity or they would never land or the wind is not so strong to blow it away.

Afterwards, it is taken to a grinder which consists of two rocks that come from mountainous parts of the earth that aren't soft like dirt.

To carve out a rock you need a chisel which is metal and when it is shaped a certain way it can penetrate rock.

A hammer is made of wood and metal and you hit it on the chisel and it knocks away at the rock.

The rock has to be transferred to the grinding place so a wagon is made of a wooden box that is strong enough to contain a big rock.

The wagon needs wheels that are carved from wood in a

The wheel has spokes which displaces the pressure evenly so it shouldn't break.

Horses which are strong animals can pull heavy loads and are easily tamed.

The wheat kernel is put in between the rocks and they get crushed by the weight of the rocks since they are a softer material.

134. It doesn't get flattened

out like a piece of metal144. It gets spun with a wheel but it gets turned into powder/flour.

135. The flour is then sifted with a sifter which is an apparatus 145. made with thin metal that is a mesh. Even though it is quite thin it is still sturdy and strong.

136. The person shakes the sifter 146. and through that it gets separated.

Due to gravity, it separates. 147. 138. The good part is smaller than

the bad so it falls through and the bad stays on top. It is a that they aren't the same size.

139. The flour is put in packets of paper which comes from a tree. The bark is taken and transformed into paper - a whole process. Or they are 149. put into sacks of cloth made from cotton or flax.

Cotton is a plant that grows. After it grows it has a pod that opens up and you see a white puffy material.

It gets cut down with a sickle.

142. Afterwards it gets combed with a comb that is made with metal teeth.

The comb is capable of separating all the unwanted parts leaving the cotton by itself.

made out of wood that as it turns around it makes the cotton into strands

After that it is brought to a harp and woof which is a machine that has racks made of wood and you put two rows of string through them.

Then you have an apparatus that you throw from side to side.

You have a pedal which makes the two rows of string move up and down and it catches the string from side to side in between.

You have a wheel which turns the string which enables more string to come and the end result is a piece of cloth.

It is then sent to a warehouse for storage.

A warehouse is made from piles of wood.

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
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Q. Chazal in Makkos 11b says that Yehuda was not able to go into Gan Eden and his bones were misgalgelim b'aron (rattling in the coffin), until Moshe Rabeinu was melamed zechus on him. The reason was because a קללה and a יודוי (excommunication) of a chacham even if it's on a condition and the condition isn't fulfilled it still takes effect.

We hear on 'A Life with Bitachon' that Hashem is מולו חסד, כולו רחמים and Kulo love.

1. How can it be that Yehuda, one of the שבטי , who made this נידוי with good intentions in mind (to save his father and his family from the hunger) and kept his condition, should get so severely punished?

And for hundreds of years? And if not for Moshe Rabeinu being melamed zechus on him, it sounds like it would have continued... How could someone who did so much good in his life have to go through such a severe punishment for such a tiny sin?

- 2. In addition, what was Yehuda's sin? He said on himself. He didn't hurt anyone else?
- 3. How do we understand that Hashem made it that a chacham's כידוי should take effect even if it's the opposite of the intention of the חבם?


Where is the Chesed and Rachamaim? Where is the hatava? It seems like extreme harsh midas hadin...

What message are we supposed to take out of this Chazal?



A. The first point is, my Rav Reb Lazer Apter told over from Reb Tzadok Hakoken, we all know Targum Unkelos translates the words of the Torah, wherever the Torah says the word Elokim, which connotes Midas Hadin, Targum Unkelos translates it as yud-key-vav-key, Midas Harachamim. Reb Tzadok Hakohen explains that Targum Unkelos is coming to teach us that everything is only rachamim, only bracha, only chesed. As it says in the Pasuk, "Chesed Hashem malah ha'aretz." The only difference between din or rachamim is if it's open chesed or hidden chesed. So the alef-beis is that everything is chessed.

How was this also chesed? The Chofetz Chaim explains that Hashem is in charge of a person's mouth, a person's words. Hashem made Yehuda say a Niduy because he knew that would be the best for him because he needed a kapparah for his chelek of mechiras yosef. When we clean a child rolling in the mud, that's midas harachamim, not midas hadin. This that Yehuda's bones were "misgalgalin b'aron" was a cleaning



process to clean his neshama. Therefore, we have to realize, that this is all what Yehuda wanted, because it was to clean his neshama sparkling white. This that it sounds like if Moshe Rabbeinu hadn't been melamed zchus, Yehuda would still be outside, how can that be?

The answer is that of course, no person can affect anyone else. This is just how Hashem made it play out so that we can learn the importance of being melamed zchus on people, to teach us that when we go around being melamed zchus on people, that brings brachos and yeshuos, and of course middah

k'neged middah it will bring brachos and yeshuos into our own lives.

The second point is that this that it sounds so frightening, that Yehuda, who was such a great Tzaddik, needed such a lengthy cleaning process - yes, it might be chessed, but it's hidden chessed, and we all want open chessed - R' Aharon writes in Mishnas Reb Aharon regarding Nachum Ish Gamzu, when he asked that his hands and feet be amputated because he didn't go quickly enough to feed a poor person, why didn't Nachum Ish Gamzu just do Teshuva?

R' Aharon writes that Teshuva comes from Hashem's chessed, and many Tzaddikim don't want Hashem to deal with them with Middas Hachessed, they don't want favors, they want Hashem to deal with

them with Middas Hadin, because to them Middas Hadin is sweet.

There's a famous story with one of the gedolim that he said if Hashem would tell him to go to Gehenim, he would dance into Gehenim. He would dance like it's a chasunah. Why? If a person has the right perspective, they realize that everything is good. Gehenim is also good. Gehenim is bracha, it's love, it's Hashem cleaning a person from mud. It's not scary or frightening. Everything that we said that Hashem was noheg with Yehuda, that was because Yehuda wanted it like that. However, Reb Aharon says that if we're not on that level, if to us Middas Hadin does not seem sweet, we can ask Hashem to be noheg with us only with Middas Harachamim, with open chessed. Relying on Hakadosh Baruch Hu's unconditional love will serve as our cleansing process and our protection.

Yedidya Harush, a commander in Gaza, recently came to the US and spoke in the Shul that I was visiting for Shabbos. He shared that he experienced many open miracles in Gaza. One miracle was when he was leading his young soldiers into Gaza and they found themselves going deeper and deeper into enemy territory. They had a list of targets to strike and their next target was a house which they were about to enter. Moments before he led his young men into the house, he heard a dog barking. This surprised him, because he knew from experience that "there are no dogs in Gaza". He therefore contacted the IDF base who said they would send helicopters to aid his group. Finally, the helicopters arrived and they checked out the house that they were about to enter and discovered that it was full of explosives from top to bottom. The helicopters bombed the house and the entire house turned into a gigantic explosion. Yedidya emotionally explained that he and all of his

young twenty-year-old soldiers would have all entered this very house if not for Hashem opening his eyes by sending a dog to bark at that exact second. He literally felt like Hashem was watching him with GPS precision. I heard this story from him face to face and was deeply moved by his deep-rooted conviction that Hashem was and is guiding his every move.

I also heard another commander in Gaza share on a recording the following story which happened to his group: They were encamped in Gaza in a very large tent, when Hashem opened their eyes by sending them an intelligence report stating that there were terrorists directly under them in a web of hidden tunnels. We will refer to these terrorists as 'terrorist puppets' because their every move is controlled by Hashem and only by Hashem. These terrorist puppets could see tents and tanks and knew about their group. The Israeli soldiers secretly left their encampment and moved a few hundred feet away, but left their tent in place to make it look as if they were still there. They appointed guards around the clock to watch the area where their tent was standing. A day and a half later, in the middle of the night, a terrorist puppet emerged from the tunnel into their former tent, and Israeli soldiers shot him on the spot, and he died but also exploded, since his entire body was full of explosives. A few seconds later, there was a super gigantic explosion, as this explosive was connected to an entire string of many more explosives.
