IN THE ZCHUS OF TEHILLIM

Seven years ago, R' Rabinowitz* traveled to Meron for Lag Ba'omer. He traveled with a heavy heart. He was waiting for a yeshuah in a certain matter, and he hoped to open the gates of Shamayim. He hoped



that in the zchus of davening by the kever of Rabi Shimon, his tefillah would be accepted.

R' Rabinowitz came to Meron and started to daven with concentration, doing all the necessary actions, but his heart did not open up. The davening was dry, as though closed up under lock and key. The words emerged from his mouth, but the tears did not come, although they were very necessary, considering his situation. He was left with the feeling that this was "not it."

After three hours, he got back on the bus to Yerushalayim feeling the bitter taste of a missed opportunity. He felt that his tefillah had not been accepted.

On the bus going up to Yerushalayim, a Yid from Monsey settled into the seat next to his. A pleasant conversation ensued between them, and the Yid started telling stories of tzaddikim and hashgachah pratis. Among other things, he described an incredible series of occurrences.

He related: "My neighbor had three children at home in need of shidduchim. The oldest was 26, the next one was 25, and then there was a 24-year-old daughter. They were all great – excellent bachurim and a wonderful daughter, but no shidduchim in sight.

One day I asked him, "Do you say Tehillim as a zechus for your son to get engaged?"

"I daven for him a ton," he said, "but not specifically Tehillim."

"Say Tehillim for him," I proposed. "One perek every day."

He took my idea seriously and started saying a perek of Tehillim every day as a merit for his oldest son. Two weeks passed and I got a call from him: "My son got engaged!"

I came to the engagement and wished him mazal tov. He poured tremendous brachos on my head, filled with emotion and joy. "What an amazing piece of advice you gave me! Amazing! From now on I'm going to say two perakim of Tehillim every day as a zechus for my second son to find his zivug."

He kept his word. Two weeks later he called once again, happy and excited. "My second son just got engaged!"

Once again we met and shook hands warmly. Once again he bentched me with all the brachos one could find in the Torah, thanking me again for my good advice, and he said, "From now on I'm going to say three perakim of Tehillim every day as a zechus for my daughter to find her proper zivug."

Two weeks passed, and the story repeated itself a third time: His daughter was engaged. Mazal tov!"

The bus arrived at its destination. R' Rabinowitz parted from the Yid from Monsey, and as he got off the bus, he said to himself, "It's not possible that the tefillah in Meron didn't accomplish anything. In the z'chus of my tefillah, this Yid was sent to be my travelling companion to arouse me to the importance of reciting Tehillim!"

R' Rabinowitz took upon himself to say one perek of Tehillim every day for his personal yeshuah.

He started perek aleph on Sunday, beis on Monday, and so on. His yeshuah came quickly.

Three weeks later, the matter that had disturbed him so much was resolved, Baruch Hashem!

HASHEM PROVIDES APARTMENTS

R' Yosef* and R' Binyamin* had apartments in Beitar. Their Rebbe lives in Yerushalayim, so they preferred to rent out their apartments in Beitar and use the rental money to rent apartments in Yerushalayim. Initially, this was a comfortable arrangement for both of them. However, as their families grew, their rental apartments became too small, and they concluded that a change was needed. How? They had no idea. "The best thing would be to buy an apartment in Yerushalayim," R' Yosef told R' Binyamin.

"I think so too," R' Binyamin answered, "but it doesn't seem realistic to me. Where would I get the money to pay the outrageous prices for apartments here?" "I have no idea," R' Yosef answered, "but we can certainly daven."

The two friends decided to daven, each for the other, to find an apartment. They chose perek 76 of Tehillim, which includes the passuk, "And he was in Shaleim...and his dwelling in Tzion," which they would say with kavanah every day, and ask Hashem to arrange an apartment in Yerushalayim for them.

A half a year of reciting Tehillim passed, and Hashem put an idea into Yosef's head. The apartment he was renting belonged to someone who owned the apartment next door as well. He called the owner of the two apartments and proposed that he would buy both apartments from him and combine them into one large apartment of 105 square meters. The owner of the apartment was interested in selling, but his price was quite high: 2,600,000 shekels.

"I have no way to come up with such a large sum," R' Yosef explained. "I own an apartment in Beitar which I can sell, and I can add a little extra, but the amount you're asking for is much more than I can afford."

The owner of the apartment, a Yid who does not keep Torah and mitzvos, answered in a completely unexpected way. "As you know, I am not religious. My children are also irreligious. What will be with me in the World to Come? What merits will I have? By now I've known you for fifteen years. You've acted honestly with me all the years. You've always paid rent on time, you have a large family, and you'll buy the house and do mitzvos in it. This will be a zechus for me. I'll sell you both apartments for the price of 1,400,000 shekels.



Let's close the deal."

R'Yosef joyously related to R' Binyamin that his prayers were answered, and he'd found an apartment to buy. This roused R' Binyamin to do some more hishtadlus in the matter. He checked out every potentially suitable apartment but did not close a deal on any of them, due to the high prices. At one point he went to look at a four-room apartment, and he saw, hanging in the dining room, a picture of a great tzaddik, his wife's grandfather. He asked the elderly woman who owned the house, "What is your connection to this tzaddik? We are his grandchildren!"

She related that the tzaddik had a connection to her family. "Twenty years ago, after my husband passed away, this tzaddik advised me to move to Eretz Yisrael. I did so, but now I've decided to move back to

MI K'AMCHA YISRAEL!

A team of volunteers have rolled up their sleeves to clean the houses of southern evacuees. They come from all over the country to clean the houses of the residents who were evacuated from Sderot and the south, and who have not yet returned to their homes. They clean the refrigerator, empty bins, wash dishes, and air out the house, to remove all traces of the traumatic moments of leaving. The manager of a Sderot hardware store has provided all the cleaning products and Sano sent 30 boxes of products to supply the teams!

The volunteers go to the hotels where the evacuees are staying to collect the keys to the house, and then drive south to start cleaning. In every home they enter, they can see the panic and haste in which it was abandoned: Pans of food, food left on plates, refrigerators full of perishable products, toys and games scattered all around. The houses have been left for over six weeks and you can imagine the sights and smells of the rotting food. The volunteers work hard to make a lovely, clean home for the families to return to. America. It would be a zechus for me if his grandchildren would purchase the apartment. How much are you willing to pay?"

This was a very expensive apartment, worth more than 2,500,000 shekels, but the woman was so happy to sell it to the grandchildren of the tzaddik that she agreed to sell for only 1,600,000 shekels.

TRAFFIC JAM MINYAN

> called their They friends in the other car. which was a little ways ahead of them, and they explained that there was construction on the road, and that's why they were allowing travel in only one direction at a time. Now it was the other lane's turn. What to do? In another twenty minutes the sun would set, and who knew how long the traffic jam would last?

Ten minutes passed and their lane opened up. They started moving along nicely, but when there was only one car ahead of them, the traf-



fic cop closed the lane once again. They started to feel quite pressured. There were only five of them in their car. How would they daven Minchah with a minyan?

The Rosh Kollel tried asking the traffic cop to let them go, because they had to make it to Minchah before sunset, but he claimed there was no possibility of doing so, since cars were now traveling in the opposite direction on this lane. Suddenly, one of the avreichim came up with an idea. He went over to the traffic cop and asked him to let them all get out on the side of the highway and walk to nearby Yishuv Nili.

He agreed to this.



At the entrance to the shul in Nili they were amazed to discover seven people who wanted to daven Minchah but didn't have a minyan. They were very happy that the avreichim had arrived. They joined them and davened together. Now they understood that Hashem had arranged the traffic jam in order to send them to the place where they were needed. [Kav Hashgacha Pratis]


he was passing by. He was disoriented, and he was talking to somebody thousands of miles away. He summarized the general frustration by saying,

Each day Yisro's daughters went to the well to draw water but it was always a challenge. They were constantly taunted by the local shepherds and would arrive home late and exhausted. Yet one time they come home much earlier. and in much better spirits. Yisro was very surprised by what had changed and they explained "an Egyptian man saved us (2:19)." Although the simple explanation is that they were referring to Moshe, the Midrash (Shemos Rabbah 1:32) explains that they were also referring to the Egyptian taskmaster whom Moshe killed.

Living

The Midrash brings the following mashal. A man was attacked by a wild donkey and ran to the nearest river to wash his wounds; he saw a drowning child and was able to save him. The child thanked him profusely stating "if not for you I would


have died." The man responded "no, it was because of the donkey that you were saved." So too, the daughters of Yisro were able to focus on the bigger picture and appreciate all the events that led up to their salvation. They knew they were saved by Moshe and this was because Moshe had to flee Egypt since he killed the taskmaster and therefore went to seek refuge in Midian. Therefore they had some gratitiude to the Egyptian man whom Moshe killed!

This is a powerful idea in the importance of gratitude. There are often many different factors that help cause our yeshuah and we should try and appreciate them. We could also learn from here the importance of appreciating those who help us, even if they didn't mean too. The daughters were thanking the Egyptian man since he helped cause Moshe to go to Midian, even though this wasn't his intention.

Towards the end of his life, Rabbi Isser Zalman Meltzer was visited by a former student who came to invite him to his son's Bar Mitzvah. "I don't expect the Rabbi to come", the student said, "we live across town and our apartment is very high up". 

When Moshe Rabbeinu was first sent to order Pharaoh to release Bnei Yisrael, he was warned that his mission would appear, on the surface, to be an exercise in futility. Pharaoh would refuse to comply, and throughout the period of the ten mak-



Vaeira) questions Rashi's explanation: Why was it necessary for Pharaoh's heart to be hardened in order for Hashem to achieve this purpose? Even if Pharaoh had repented, Hashem would know that his teshuvah was insincere. Wouldn't that

kos, Hashem would repeatedly "harden" Pharaoh's heart, endowing him with supernatural strength to withstand the pressure of the makkos so that he could continue denying Bnei Yisrael their freedom. Why did Hashem do this?

Rashi explains (Shemos 7:3) that even if Pharaoh were to submit to Moshe's demands, it would not be the result of wholehearted repentance. Perhaps Pharaoh would have released Bnei Yisrael from servitude due to the makkos, but in his heart, he would never have fully submitted to Hashem's sovereignty. Hashem therefore chose to continue to harden Pharaoh's heart so that He could inflict all ten makkos upon him and the Egyptians.

The Shelah Hakadosh (Torah Shebichsav, Parashas

have been enough of a reason for Hashem to inflict the makkos upon him?

The Shelah explains that, in fact, Pharaoh was given these Divine infusions of fortitude in order to prevent a chillul Hashem from taking place. Indeed, Hashem could have punished Pharaoh for his lack of genuine teshuvah, but the rest of the world would not have recognized the fact that Pharaoh had been insincere. To observers, it would have seemed that Pharaoh had repented for his misdeeds by letting the Jewish people go, and the Divine punishment that he would suffer would have seemed to be unjustified. In order to avoid this chillul Hashem, Pharaoh was given the ability to continue defying Hashem's commands, thus making his ultimate punishment understandable to the rest of the world.

Incredibly, we see that Hashem Himself goes to great lengths, as it were, to avoid even an unfounded chillul Hashem. Obviously, Hashem does not punish human beings without a reason, and if the nations of the world had "suspected" Him of a miscarriage of justice, chalilah, they would have been mistaken. Yet Hashem still saw to it that Pharaoh's downfall came about in such a way that it was clear to the world that he was deserving of punishment.

If it was important to Hashem Himself to avoid not only actual wrongdoing, but even the suspicion of wrongdoing that may lead to chillul Hashem, then that is clearly a mandate for us to do the same in the course of our own lives.

The Shelah (ibid.) cites another example of the great care that must be taken to avoid a potential chillul Hashem: When the Jewish people sinned by worshiping the eigel, they approached Aharon and asked him to fashion the idol for them. Why did he comply? Chazal teach us that a Jew who commits the sin of avodah zarah is punished even if he sinned only in his thoughts (as opposed to other aveiros, for which Hashem punishes only for actions). Had the Jews not had an actual idol to worship, they still would have been punished for harboring thoughts

of worshiping avodah zarah, but the non-Jewish nations would have wondered at the calamity that would befall them. Not being aware of the fact that they had fallen into the abyss of idolatry, those nations would have speculated that Hashem had brought a tragedy



upon the Jewish people for no reason, perhaps because He lacked the ability, chas v'shalom, to bring them to Eretz Yisrael. In order to avoid this chillul Hashem, as baseless and unfounded as the non-Jew's suspicions would have been, Aharon felt that it was necessary for him to fashion the eigel hazahav, an act that was a transgression in its own right but that he still deemed preferable to the possibility of creating a chillul Hashem.

Chazal teach us (Yoma 86b) that we are enjoined to "publicize the chaneifim" in order to avoid a chillul Hashem. Rashi (ibid.) explains that "the chaneifim" are people who are actually wicked but pretend to be tzaddikim, and that Chazal direct us to expose these pretenders so that, when they are punished by Hashem



for their sins, others do not question Hashem's ways. The need to avoid chillul Hashem is so great that we are even taught to publicize the wickedness of certain people in order to prevent a chillul Hashem.

In the sefer Barchi Nafshi, Rav Yitzchak Zilber-

stein shlita relates that an influential Jewish man in another country once consulted him regarding a yeshivah bachur who had been sentenced to a lengthy imprisonment after committing a reprehensible act. The questioner felt that he could use his connections to secure the boy's release from prison. At the same time, the man's connections were still unaware of the case, and he feared that they were likely to conclude that all bnei Torah were capable of such deplorable actions.

Rav Zilberstein ruled that the matter should not be brought to the attention of these government officials, even though it meant that the bachur would have to languish in prison. Bringing their attention to the bachur's misdeeds, he explained, would be forbidden, and

> the Chazon Ish had taught that chillul Hashem is an even more severe offense than the three cardinal sins of avodah zarah, giluy arayos, and shefichas damim.

> Most of us do not contend with issues of this nature on a day-to-day basis, but we certainly find ourselves in many situations in which there is a potential for chillul Hashem. How hard do we work to avoid desecrating Hashem's Name? How careful are we to see to it that our own actions are a credit to Hashem and that we do not create even the slightest trace of a negative impression? Let us take a lesson from the hardening of Pharaoh's heart and make the avoidance of chillul Hashem a goal of paramount importance in our lives.



Did you know that the Nesivas Shalom, the heilege Slonimer



Rebbe who Rabbi Yehuda Mandel always quotes, says that an essential part of Emunah and Bitachon is that you have to believe that there is no difference in how much Hashem loves you before you did an

aveirah and after you did an aveirah. You have to always feel the same love from Hashem.

That shows that you have a healthy relationship with Hashem. That shows that you feel that Hakadosh Baruch Hu is your loving, caring, father and that you're His child, and that Hashem's love is unconditional. If a person says after an aveirah, "Oh, Hashem doesn't like me, He's unhappy with me," then chas veshalom, that means that the person don't have a healthy relationship with Hashem.

When someone thinks a friend is unhappy with them, they won't have positive feelings towards their friend, and they'll go in the opposite direction. So too, if a person feels that Hashem doesn't like him, he's not going to have positive feelings. When a person feels that Hashem doesn't like him, it's nothing more that the trick and trap of the Yetzer Hara. Shovavim Tat and Asher Yatzar

We are now after Chanuka, and being that there is an extra Adar this year, Purim is a long three months away. But not to worry - on the contrary! Since it is a leap year, we have a special opportunity for strengthening our connection to Hashem. The *Seforim* reveal to us that in a leap year we have the special days of *SHOVAVIM TAT*. This acronym, created by the first letters of the *parshiyos Shemos* through *Tetzaveh*, refers to the special eight-week period that we just entered, where a person can achieve great levels of *tahara*. *Rav Chatzkel Levenstein* would say (see *Ohr Yechezkel Emunah* page 245) that this is specifically through working on *emunah*. This is because when we read the *parshas hashavua*, those events occur again on a smaller scale (see *Shar Ruach Hakodesh 527* of *Rav Chaim Vitah*. During this time of the year, Hashem is once again fortifying us with *emunah* through the Ten *Makkos* and *Krias Yam Suf*. We stand again at *Har Sinai* and see the purpose of the world through *Matan Torah*. And finally, He gives us the ability to keep that revelation with us by means of the *Mishkan*. Thus, these are weeks during which we clarify to ourselves that Hashem created the world and is still totally and completely in charge.

Besides for making sure to internalize the lessons of these *parshiyos*, there is another very important way to work on our Emunah. Rav Chatzkal says that we all believe in Hashem, but that is not enough. Emunah means that Hashem is so real to us that it changes every aspect of the way we live, so much so that we would be willing to give everything away for Him. The reason why it is so hard for us to reach this level is because we don't see Hashem with our eyes, and what we see in this physical world actually blinds us and hides His presence. But Hashem gave us the ability to "see" with our intellect and that can be even stronger than physical sight. We need to use our minds to "see" the presence of Hashem in this world, and make Him more real to ourselves.

Let us take Asher Yatzar as an example. A person who doesn't use his intellectual sight may view this a purely animalistic act. However, we, who have been working on bringing the *bracha* of Asher Yatzar to life, know that that nothing could be further from the truth! If a person uses his intellect, he realizes that the process of digestion is so complex that if not for Hashem's constant involvement he would be in serious trouble. After he "sees" Hashem's greatness, he will come to "see" Hashem's kindness, and involvement in his personal life. With a little thought a person can come to so much *Emunah* from something that most people in the world overlook! Let us put special effort to say Asher Yaztar during these weeks of Shovavim Tat in a way that it makes Hashem more real to us!

We spoke about how without speech our lives would be unrecognizingly different, lacking so many of the basic things that we live with.

In Chazal, we find an additional depth in the lack of functionality that would evolve from the lack of communication through speech. People, instead of being an asset to each other, would turn into a danger – turn into an adversary.

This we find in the Medrash that Rashi brings down in Parshas Noach in regard to the Dor Haflagah. The Dor Haflaga rebeled against HKB"H - they built a big tower, and Hashem punished them with mixing up their languages. Rashi explains: one person would ask for cement, another person would give him a brick; they would end up killing each other. Not only does a lack of communication make unity not productive and useless, but we see from this Chazal that the lack of communication leads all the way to murder.

When people interact and work together, there are going to be different opinions and misunderstandings. But if a person has the ability to explain himself, difficult situations can be worked out and resolved – or at least, it can be sufficiently diffused and it won't escalate into an intense argument that

can become life threatening. Without speech, people are not just lacking the advantages of interaction, but their interaction and proximity would be the cause of friction and danger.

In addition to all of the practical advantages that we receive from the ability to speak, speech and communication are very important functions in their own right. This is even when we're not receiving new information or discussing anything important. HKB"H created people sociable.

It's important for us to interact with other people. This is one of man's basic needs; something he must have for his emotional health.

One of the harshest punishments given to captives and prisoners today is solitary confinement. It's a punishment that's greatly feared and also very effective in forcing people to bend to their captors.

Democracies that are restrained by law from using tor-

> ture to get information out of terrorists or using physical punishment to keep wild prisoners in line, turned to solitary confinement as the tool to do the job. Even though this is a passive punishment and doesn't seem overly cruel, solitary confinement for more than fifteen days has been found to cause permanent psychological damage. Therefore, according to international law, solitary confinement for more than fifteen days is defined as torture.


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Underground Genlisea (Corkscrew) Carnivorous plant.

Now we will explain a very different type of Carnivorous plant. This plant is called the Genlisea plant and it has a nickname of the corkscrew plant (and the Eel plant) simply because the part that the bugs go into are shaped very similar to a corkscrew. (I have just one more Carnivorous plant to write about, then we will BE"H move on to other extremely amazing Niflous Haborei!)

So, here's how it works. The part of the plant that does the insect eating is all underground. It also acts as roots for the



plant acting as an anchor for it. If you see the pictures, you will

have a much better idea of what I am writing. The leaves on top (not in the picture) are out of the water and below the leaves is the trap stalk which is the "rope" connecting the top and the bottom.

Now let's jump down to the bottom of the picture since the part of the trap that catches the insects are from the bottom, working their way up to the final destination of the vesical. The Helically (it means spiral shaped) twisted trap arms (see picture) are where the insects get in. This trap doesn't need any colors or scents to attract insects since it's in the earth where there's plenty of insects and other very small living creatures that it can capture without those lures. Hashem doesn't waste any material where it's not needed.

In the next picture you can see where in the twists are the holes


for the creatures to enter. Once they

enter,

they are forced to go in a one-way direction. How's does that work?

As you can see in the next picture, there's specially shaped hairs that allow the insect through, going up towards the vesicle, but they can't


go back out the wav they



in since the hairs don't allow it. It's like a one-way door. So, with no other choice they continue on their way and eventually get to the tubular neck which then leads to the vesicle area. In the vesicle area are special Quadrifib glands that secrete the digestive enzymes. The vesicle is typically full of digestive fluids around the clock. The creature enters the vesicle area and is

guickly suffocated and the digestion process begins. Once digested, the nutrients are absorbed in the walls of the plant and sent to the places where they are needed. This is the process in a nut shell.

So, here we have a totally new method of capture. Once again, we have the brainless plant coming up with unique methods of



capture, and then retention of the prey it has captured. This method of the one-way hairs is a very well "thought-out" plan that no accident could have thought of. Then of course it needs to know how to actually make it happen. Then there's the vesicle digestive area.

As we have mentioned in previous articles about carnivorous plants, its mind boggling how all these unrelated plants can somehow make special glands to emit special super complicated enzymes that can properly digest the prey that it has caught.



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

word for everyone. She once remarked that she made a meal for herself that came out tasting delicious. Since it was so delicious, she decided she would give the whole meal away. In this way she pumped someone else up so they could enjoy it,

three times a day to pump at least one person up by saying a compliment to them, giving them a Brocha or telling them we are thinking of them.

I learned this from my aunt A"H who recently went to be next to Hashem in the Olam Haemes. My aunt A"H was my role model in Ahavas Hashem, Ahavas HaTorah, and Ahavas HaBreiyos. She truly held up the world as it says Al Shlosha Divorim Haolum Omed: Al HaTorah, V'al HaAvoda, V'al Gemilus Chasodim. My aunt exemplified these three ideas! She pumped people up who learned Torah by encouraging them and making sure they had what they needed to be able to learn. She was so pumped to be close to Hashem. This past Sukkos when I went to Eretz Yisroel to visit her although she was physically very sick, her Ahava for Hashem and people was as strong as ever. We can learn from my aunt A"H that pumping people up all day includes giving of our smile, of ourselves, and thinking about other people. May all the things you do to pump people up be a zechus for my beloved special Aunt A"H.



Ray Yehuda Mandel Q. The gemara Shabbos 30b says that the Malach Hamaves couldn't take away Dovid Hamelech's neshama because he was learning Torah. There is a similar gemara, Bava Metzia 86a, about Rabba bar Nachmeini.

We hear many times on 'A Life with Bitachon' that there is no such thing as the Malach Hamaves; it's all Hashem. How could it be that Hashem can't take away the neshama when the person is learning Torah? Hashem can do anything.

A. The answer is that of course Hakadosh Baruch Hu can do everything and anything! However, Hakadosh Baruch Hu said that Torah is matzil umagein. Since Hashem said that, so that's why Hashem wouldn't take away Dovid Hamelech's neshama while he was learning. Now what's

the lomdus? Why is it that when a person is learning Torah, he can't die? The answer is because Hakadosh Baruch Hu is the source of all chaim. Va'atem hadveikim baHashem Elokeichem chaim kulchem hayom. Whenever a person clings to Hashem, automatically he's going to be davuk to chaim. Torah is the way that we cling ourselves to Hashem. Torah is the marriage; it's like the ring Hashem gave us. Torah is how we cling to Hashem. So as long as you're learning Torah, you're clinging to Hashem. If a person is clinging to Hashem, Hashem is the source of chaim, so if you're touching the source of chaim, automatically a person is going to live.



Therefore, Hakadosh Baruch Hu said that when a person is learning Torah, He won't take away a person's life, because you're being misdabek to chaim. That's how Hakadosh Baruch Hu runs the world.

However, if Hashem want something to happen, obviously Hakadosh Baruch Hu has ways to make anything happen. So, when Hakadosh Baruch Hu wanted to take away Dovid Hamelech's life, He made it that he wouldn't be able to learn that second, He made a whole setup.

He told the cashier that the sticker in the gemara says a different price than what he paid for. He paid five dollars too much, and he was asking for a refund. The cashier said, "Thank you for coming in. The price that I charged you is really the current price. I have stock here from years in the past, so the old price is many times on the label. I do honor the older price if the label has it." So he proceeded to give the gentleman back the five dollars.

After the gentleman left the store, the cashier told me, "I want to tell you a story. Hashem always helps me make sure that I don't steal from people. A few years back, I had a bachur who worked for me; he was an alte bachur, and he worked for me for about six or seven years. After six years of working for me, he begged me to teach him how to roll up mezuzahs l'halacha. So, eventually, I showed him how to do it. The day after I taught him how to do it, I went to New York to pick up something. When I came back the next day, this bachur told him that he sold a bunch of mezuzahs while he was gone. I asked the bachur to please show me how he rolled the mezuzahs. So he showed me, and it was taka wrong. I was so distraught. In those days, the receipts had the person's last name on it, and the person paid by credit card. I was on the phone the whole Friday morning trying to locate the person. I wasn't matzliach. Earlier, my wife asked me to go to the grocery to pick up something for Shabbos. This was unusual, because I never went to the grocery; my wife took care of all the shopping. I left the store and I forgot about the grocery stop; I went back to my bungalow. When I got there ten minutes later, I realized that I hadn't gone to the store. I turned around and I went. When I came into the store. someone came over to me and said, "Oh, I missed you at the store yesterday. I went to buy some stuff." I asked him, "What did you buy?" He said, "A bunch of mezuzahs!!" I said, "Really? Baruch Hashem!" I went to his house and unrolled, then re-rerolled, all of the mezuzahs. If my wife hadn't asked me to go to the store, I never would have met him. In addition, the fact that I went home first, and I was delayed, caused me to meet this fellow at the store. It was such hashgacha that I was able to fix the problem!"

I said to the cashier, "You should know, I read the Spring Hill Times. When I read it, I'm always amazed that when a person has proper Emunah and Bitachon, Hashem makes things happen for them. You're telling me this story of hashgacha, I just had a story now with hashgacha!" I told him the whole gemara story. As I was telling the story, there was another person who was standing behind me. He was the one who had been blocking the aisle. He heard the story, and he said, "You know, I'm also looking for a Rosh Hashana Alef gemara!! I wasn't going to ask because I figured that you didn't have it! Now that I heard this story, I'm going to ask you if you have another one!" The cashier went looking in some other boxes, and he found the gentlemen another Rosh Hashana Alef gemara!!
