NO YID IS UNACCOUNTED

FOR

In the spring of 2010, there was a group of bachurim who were traveling on a road trip with their Rebbi from Chicago to Florida. They were traveling by coach bus on the 95 when their bus started smoking and they realized that they had to stop and get help.

They were near Yamasee, South Carolina a real hick town in the middle of nowhere and they got off the exit. The driver was supposed to make a right turn by the exit to get to the nearest gas station but by mistake (by the hand of Hashem) he made a left. After realizing that he made the wrong turn he wanted to turn around, so he pulled into a side street and entered a parking lot of a store called Le Creuset Outlet Store. The bus then made a K-turn, however on the way out the bus got stuck on a hill and the wheel was turning in the air but the bus wasn't budging.

At that time the bachurim got out, and the owner – a lady saw them and asked them who they were and where they were from. When the owner learned that they were Jewish she said "oh my husband is Jewish". The husband came out and they davened mincha together with him, put tefillin on him and spent some time connecting with him.

They then got their bus fixed and went on their way. On the way back from their trip, they stopped off at the store again and this older man said that he wished he could have a pair of tefillin as he never heard about

tefillin until they came.

The Rebbi then said to him that if he promises to put on tefillin every day (besides Shabbos and yom-tov) then he would give him his own pair. The man happily agreed and the Rebbi gave him his own pair.

The next year they were doing the same trip and they again stopped off by this Yid's store. He was so happy to see them, he joined them for a bar-BQ in the park. He shared that he indeed had been putting on tefillin every day. He then wanted to bring them hot cocoa (milchigs). So the Rebbi and bachurim taught him the laws of Basar bechalav which he hadn't been exposed to. Since they were having a BBQ, they couldn't have the hot cocoa together.

This is a powerful story where we see that Hashem doesn't lose sight of any Jew even if they are so far gone in a hick town in the middle of nowhere, married to a non Jew. Hashem orchestrated a group of bachurim with their Rebbi to have mechanical issues to go and bring this Jew closer to his father, Hashem.

Editor's note: Last year I printed the following amazing story I heard first hand from the Rav. We are reprinting it now with a follow up.

WE NEVER LOSE BY DOING A MITZVAH

Rabbi Chaim Schwartz* a Rav in Los Angeles, CA, went shopping on Chal Hamoed to buy pekelech for Simchas Torah, for the children in his shul. The store owner agreed to give him the

The next day, Rabbi Schwartz got a call from someone he hasn't spoken to in some time. The person told him, "I went to R' Chaim Kanievsky (zatzal) for an eitzah. He told me to sponsor the nosh given out to children on Simchas Torah."

Rabbi Schwartz asked the 'surprise sponsor' how much does he want to donate, and the response was - yes, you guessed it - \$500!!!

Follow up: This year, right before Simchas Torah, Rabbi Schwartz happen to receive an email from this same person. So he asked him if he would like to sponsor it again. He said, "Sure!"

Worst of all, we wouldn't be able to properly read the words of the Torah. We wouldn't be able to be mekayim so many mitzvahs...

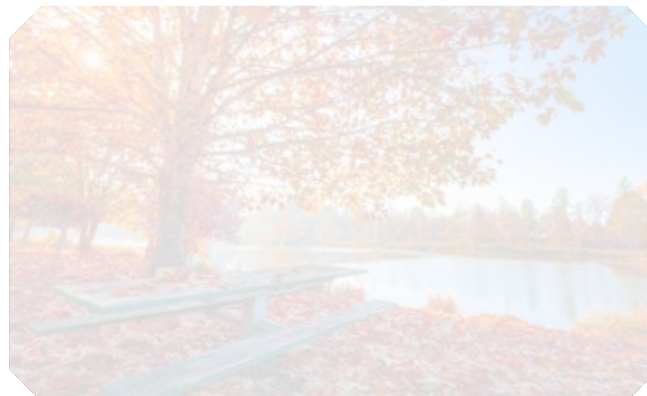

Q. My family lives in a house which is in poor condition. This situation is taking a toll on our quality of life. My wife and I decided that in order to preserve our yishuv hada'as, the right thing is to do renovations.

Now, construction is at its peak, and I'm deeply involved in redesigning the house with all its details: which tiles to install, deciding on colors, choosing lighting, etc.

Although this is something I have to do, I feel that being so involved in all the mundane details is attaching me too strongly to Olam Hazeh.

How can I make sure that my involvement in building will not be at the expense of my inner relationship with Hashem?

A. When a person is involved in construction, he will inevitably experience heartache: things drag out longer than planned. Deadlines aren't met, materials do not arrive on time. When the order does arrive, often it's not what you thought it was. The workers don't always build exactly the way you wanted. After you made a certain choice

you regret your decision etc.

There is one underlying cause for all of the above frustration. The mentality that, "This is my house. I'm taking charge of how things should come out, and it needs to be exactly the way I want it."

When someone approaches construction with this mindset, if anything doesn't go exactly the way he wants or if things don't progress to his satisfaction, it will cause him great aggravation and he will lose his peace of mind.

To bounce yourself back into juxtaposition, don't lose sight of the original purpose of the renovation. Say, "Hakadosh Baruch Hu: Why am I renovating my house? Not because I need a beautiful house for myself. Rather, it's in order to give my family harchavas hada'as to be able to serve You in the best way we can. I want a house to be a place in which the shechina will reside."

When you constantly remind yourself that the ultimate purpose of renovating your house is for Hashem, you won't be bothered when things don't go exactly the way you thought. You know that your job is to do hishtadlus to cater to the needs of

your family.

Therefore, continue selecting and deciding what will be the best for your family. But throughout the process, remind yourself: "I don't operate with 'kochi v'otzem yadi', that it's my house, and everything has to come out the way I want. Rather, it's Hashem's house and He wants me to do whatever is in my ability to make it beautiful and nice. However, regarding anything that is out of my control, I am leaving it up to Hashem to make it turn out the way He knows to be best".

When you go through the renovation with this mindset, not only will you experience complete menuchas hanefesh throughout the renovation, but it will also prove to be a period of growth and connection with Hashem. You will actually be zeroing in on the essence of all avodas Hashem: The pursuit of acquiring emunah in Hashem, and the realization that He is in control of all events.

The unbelievable power of a good word

Anyone who learned some history most probably heard of The gold rush. There was a certain area in California where they discovered lots of gold, and everyone dropped everything and scrambled over there to make it big. Imagine if people that are money driven would hear about a “diamond rush”? People would go mad and there would be a stampede to that area. You can just picture the chaotic scene.

Well guess what? Giving Chizzuk is more precious than diamonds and you don't even have to dig it up. They are practically on every street and in every corner.

There are treasure troves of priceless gems in hospitals, nursing homes as there are bedridden Yidden that are starving for Chizzuk.

Many people live near these places and they may not enjoy entering these facilities. However, it's worth it. Wouldn't we go there for the right price? Furthermore, Chazal teach us “lefum tzara Agra”. The reward for doing this despite our discomfort increases the reward immensely.

However, what's even more available is in our homes and schools. Whether it's parents to children, one sibling to another or Rabbeim and teachers to their students. The opportunities to give Chizzuk are endless. We can build them to the sky and make them to be great people with a compliment, a good word or

even a smile.

A number of years ago, there was a young Rebbe that had twin brothers in his class (there were no parallel classes then). One of the brothers was every Rebbe's dream. Intelligent, diligent, respectful



and everything else in-between. The other brother was also every Rebbes dream, but the type of dream that we call a nightmare. He failed in all his studies and was always looking for trouble.

It was before Yom Kippur and the Rebbe was teaching the class about the two twin goats that were brought on Yom Kippur. He explained to them that there was a lottery and one goat was offered on the Mizbe'ach, while the other one was pushed off the cliff l'azazel. All of a sudden the Rebbe heard a voice coming from the back “and I am the goat that is l'azazel”. The Rebbe did not need to look up. He knew right away who said that comment.

After class, the Rebbe called over the boy and said the following. “There is a great difference between you and that goat. On that holy day there was a lottery that determined

who will be chosen l'azazel. That goat did not choose to be l'azazel. You on the other hand chose to be l'azazel. It doesn't have to be like that. It's all in your hands”. With that he dismissed the boy to his break.

Flash forward forty years. This Rebbe was an older man and was attending a family wedding. At the Chuppa there was a very distinguished Rav that was Mesader kiddushin. After the Chuppa this Rav approached this elderly Rebbe and asked “Do you recognize me”? He responded - "No I don't. "I will tell you, I am the goat of l'azazel. In my entire life I never forgot those words you told me. It really gave me a whole new refreshing look at life!"

Obviously, we see from this story how far words of Chizzuk can take a talmud. But we see from this story that while we need tremendous siyata Dishmaya for everything, we can decide what our future is going to look like. As Chazal teach us “Biderech She'adam rotze leilech molichen oso” All we need to have the will, the drive and the decision

ings of connection as in previous years. I started feeling a bit down to put it mildly. I needed Chizzuk urgently.

I had a pile of Seforim in front of me. So I rummaged through the Seforim and I took out, by Hashgacha, a Sefer from Reb Tzvi Meir Zilberberg. Reb Tzvi Meir is a giant in giving chizzuk to our generation. I opened the Sefer to one spot, not turning pages, and I came across a page that was literally talking to me, directly. I felt like I got a hug from Hashem, and I will share the idea that he says, but I need you, dear reader to open your hearts. Even if you feel like you don't have a heart, listen closely because he is talking specifically to us.

He quotes the Arizal that says, that there will come a time before Moshiach comes, that Klal Yisroel will enter the fiftieth level of Tuma. The consequence of this is that we won't feel any connection to Hashem. This can cause a person to fall into depression and wonder what is my Avodas Hashem worth? Says Reb Tzvi Meir, this is the talk of the Yetzer Hara! He wants you to fall short of your duties. You have to respond to such talk with azus of Kedusha and say "I won't budge" I don't care if I don't feel anything I am going to serve Hashem with all my strength and with the tiny sparks that I have". Furthermore, says Rev Tzvi Meir you are upholding the Mitzva of veahavta es Hashem Elokecha bichol levavcha. This

means "Even if Hashem takes your heart."

Then he continues with Chizzuk, that should make us dance! He says that in a certain sense if a person serves Hashem even though he doesn't feel anything he is bringing a greater Nachas Ruach than someone that feels connected and doesn't have this struggle. Obviously this doesn't mean that we shouldn't try to connect ourselves to Hashem. But if one finds himself in a situation in life that he doesn't feel the love and connection, don't despair. We can still bring Hashem a tremendous Nachas Ruach. This should bring joy into our Torah Tefilla and Mitzvos. What can be sweeter knowing that we are bringing Hashem the greatest Nachas Ruach. That's why we are here on this world.

I would like to say the following Chizzuk.

Hashem is showing us clearly that He wants to bring the ultimate redemption. However, to some people when they think about Moshiach they think about chevley Moshiach, which may bring not such good thoughts. How can we get Chizzuk?

Chazal say that in order to be saved from chevley Moshiach we should get involved in Torah study and Chessed. Additionally there is a Chazal that says that one who is scrupulous in eating the three Seudos on Shabbos will be spared.

Having said that, we have nothing to fear!! We are so attached to Torah! Torah is flourishing today more than ever in the history of golus! We all spend so much money on seudos Shabbos! Hashem has made it so easy for us to be mekayim this mitzvah with such hidur! Our Emuna and Bitachon is getting stronger day by day!

Getting involved in Chessed is so easy!!! There is no chessed like Chizzuk and the opportunities are endless!

WONDER OF THE WEEK

Have you ever seen a freight train flying in the sky? I like to think of the clouds passing over my head as freight trains carrying their precious cargo of water to thirsty creatures around the world. While you've probably spent some time marveling at the impressive sights above your head, have you ever wondered how Hashem makes clouds and rain?

There is usually enough water in the air to make clouds because it evaporates from oceans, trees and other bodies of water and is distributed around the world by way of the wind. The reason why clouds don't always form is because the air is often too hot. With hot air, the water molecules are moving around too fast to hit the cloud seeds.

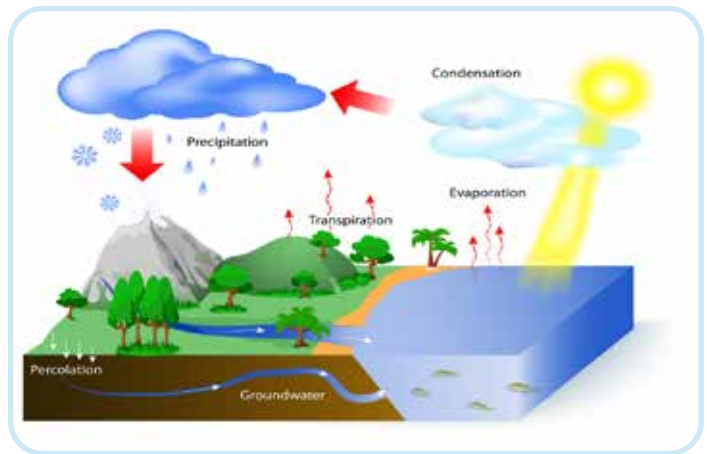
When the air cools down, the water molecules move much slower and stick onto the dirt and dust in the sky when they run into them.

It all starts from the 'seeds' that clouds grow from, which are teeny tiny pieces of 'stuff' high up in the sky. They are referred to as cloud seeds and come from many places including giant sand storms, volcanic eruptions and car exhaust

that makes its way up to where clouds are formed. Just like any seed, to grow into clouds they need water.



To get the air to cool, Hashem makes it rise. Air rises when it runs into something big like a mountain, gets heated by the sun, or when two large air masses run into each other and have nowhere else to go but up.

The cooling of air as it rises is a process referred to as adiabatic cooling. Once the air is cool enough, water molecules begin latching on to the cloud seeds forming the

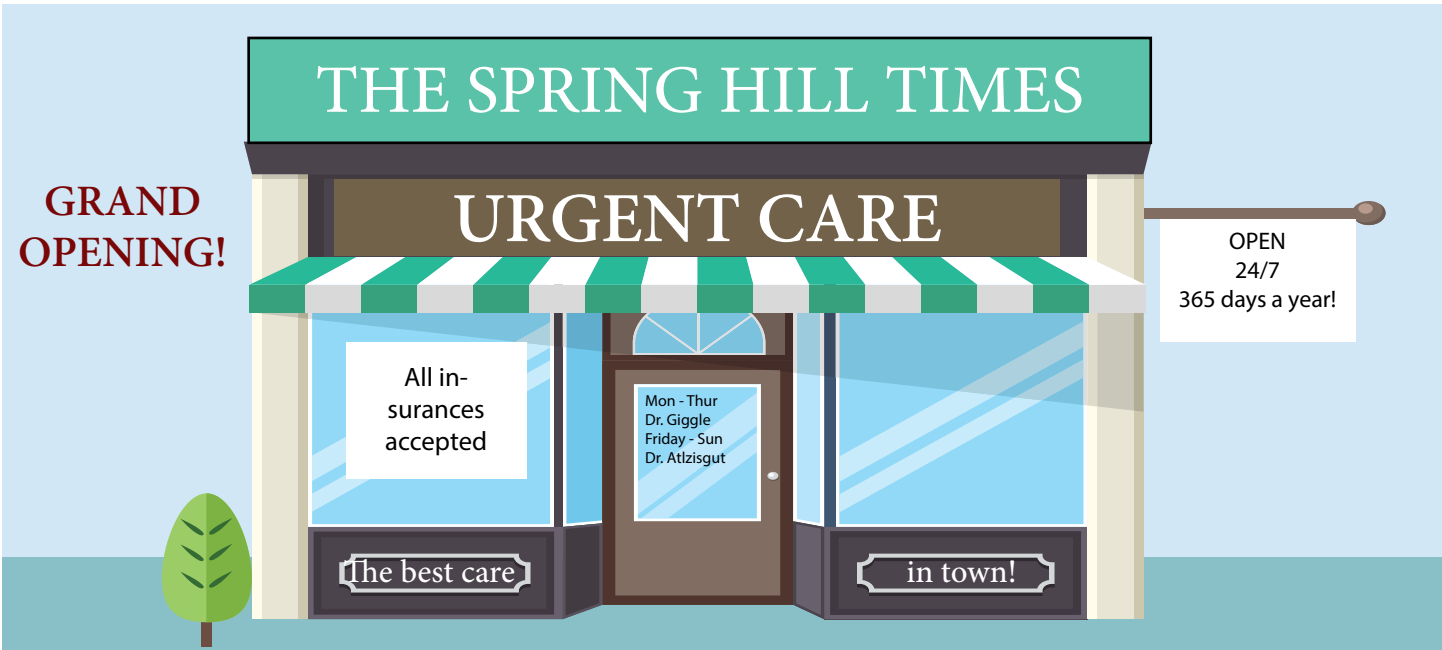

- While it is a very frustrating situation, Rina could instead choose to focus on the fact that she is zocheh to be able to visit her children and Eretz Yisrael.

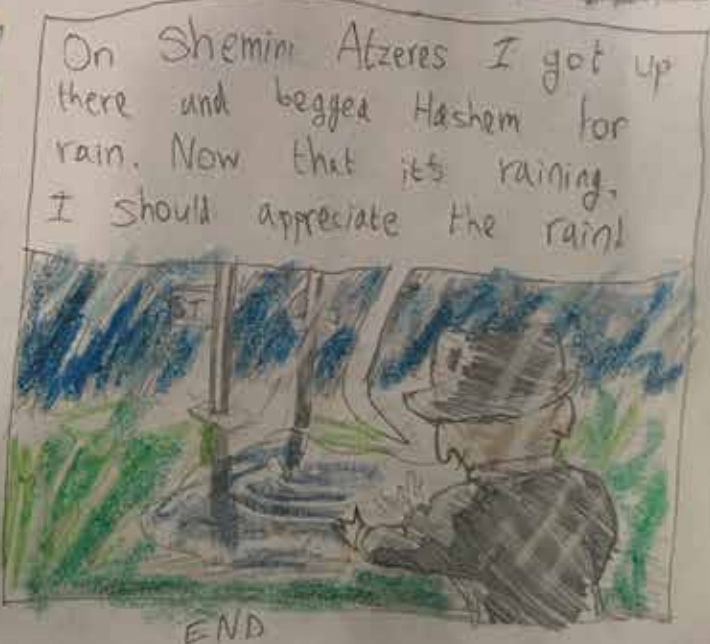
Case of the Week:

Rav Yisrael Salanter zatzal said beautifully that Yiddishkeit is like holding a bird. If one opens his hand, the bird will escape, but if he squeezes his hand, the bird will die. The same applies to serving Hashem; on one hand one must be careful to do what is right and not to make mistakes, but on the other hand one cannot pressure and strain himself. Doing so will not motivate him. Instead, it will just stifle one's emotions and will prevent him from properly connecting to Hashem, chas v'shalom. My rebbe, Rabbi Golombeck, gave me the mesorah that Yiddishkeit is always supposed to be something that a Yid enjoys and looks forward to experience. One's drive to serve Hashem should come from a positive place, not one from anxiety or pressure. In Navor-dok yeshiva, this idea was one of the main things they focused on - trying to free themselves of any distress and nervousness, thereby allowing them to fully focus and feel Hashem intellectually as well as emotionally.

One year during Yamim Noraim, a youngster decided to take upon himself a ta'anis dibbur, a resolution not to speak anything besides Torah and tefilla during these holy days. When the mashgiach, Rav Nosson Wachtfogel zatzal, found out about this, he quickly phoned the youngster. "This kabbalah is nothing but the advice of the yetzer hara!" He exclaimed. "It is assur for you to make a ta'anis dibbur. It is not for you! Instead, find a geshmake chavrusa and learn Torah together!" The youngster was insistent, "But it is such a holy kabbalah!?" Rav Nosson responded, "Indeed it is, but you and I are not ready for these things! Do not be extra frum! Doing so will make you a nervous wreck! Your wife will end up throwing you out of the house, and I will take

her side! This is the trap of the yetzer hara! Instead, focus on doing more mitzvos and learning more!" (Sefer Leket Rishimos on Elul, page 14).

This past Rosh Hashanah, I experienced firsthand how getting rid of tension can assist one in connecting his emotions to Hashem. On Rosh Hashanah, many shuls have a small break between Krias HaTorah and Tefillas Mussaf, at which point the shofar is blown. Typically, as the start of Mussaf approaches, the atmosphere gets quite intense. The anticipation and the seriousness of the moment always leaves me feeling stifled and pressured. This year, I had the privilege of davening by Kahal Shaar Bitachon Navor-dok, Rav Yehuda Mandel shlita's shul. Precisely at this time, I saw Rabbi Mandel leave his seat and stroll over to speak with the people in shul. In good spirit, Rabbi Mandel gave them words of encouragement and asked them to have him in mind during their prayers. As the chazzan was about to start Mussaf, Rabbi Mandel smiled and waved his hand, wishing shalom to everyone, and then he returned to his seat, making all the mispallelim feel calm and relaxed! Incredibly, not only did I see Rabbi Mandel go on to daven Mussaf with great kavanah (and plenty of tears), I myself was able to daven better! Seeing Rabbi Mandel smiling before Mussaf had rid me of all my nervousness and tension! Feeling relaxed and comfortable allowed me to daven with a profound connection, an open mind, and an open heart!
