I live in Boston, MA. This past Shabbos, I was planning to go to the Bris of the son of a friend of mine. It was called for 10:30 am.

I was looking forward to attending the Bris and davening during the eis ratzon when the baby cries during the mila. I usually cannot go to a Bris during the week as I teach in the mornings, so this was a special opportunity for me.

My husband came home from the shalom zachor on Leil Shabbos, and told me that based on what he heard at the shalom zachor, the bris would not start on time and it would probably start at 10:45.

With my husband's advice in mind, I left my house with enough time to get there at 10:45.

I walked in the door at 10:45 and found out that the bris had just ended. I felt very bad that I missed the opportunity to daven during the eis ratzon of the Bris.

I had in mind to come home and tell my husband that his advice had been off base and that thanks to him, I missed the bris.

Then I thought about "Lo Sonu Ish es Amito" and that one must avoid giving others pain, even (or especially) your spouse.

Furthermore, what would be the point? He would just feel bad, upset that I made him feel guilty, upset that I sounded like I'm blaming it on him etc. And it wouldn't change anything - I still would have missed the Bris.

I also thought to myself -Hashem is in charge, Hashem decided I shouldn't be by that bris.

I decided that when I'd come home, I wouldn't mention that I missed the bris.

Here's the interesting part --

Which dvar torah did my husband pick to say by the shabbos table? He asked why Yaakov was upset with Shimon and Leivi for killing the city of Sh'chem. Wasn't Yaakov there when they told Chamor that they all have to have a bris mila? Wasn't he aware of their plan? At this, my eighth grade daughter piped up and said "Totty, in parsha, my teacher said that Yaakov was upset that they used a mitzva of Bris Mila and made something bad come out from it. Hashem doesn't want something bad to come out of the mitzvah of Bris Mila."

I saw this as a clear sign that Hashem was happy with my actions. That He didn't want me to get angry. He didn't want that something bad should come out of the mitzva of Bris Mila.

Ramban in Parshas The Bo, teaches us a very important concept. From the big nissim and the clarity that we get from them, that Hashem is involved in our lives, this strengthens our realization of the hidden, 'small' nissim that Hashem is constantly doing, which are not so apparent. The Ramban is speaking about Emunah, but we can also take from here a lesson about Hoda'ah, thanking Hashem. From the famous nissim that are clear to everybody, like the nissim of Chanukah, this can bring us to praise Hashem for all the wondrous chassadim that we live with constantly, like the human body, the tongue, the saliva, the food pipe, the wind pipe etc.

Let us take the special yemei Ho-

da'ah of Chanukah and use them to thank Hashem for all the regular gifts that we live with, during the regular nussach hatefilah. Chazal gave us Pesukei D'zimra and Birchas Hashachar, where we recognize and praise Hashem for the constant amazing chassadim that he is giving us.

The Bais Yosef asks the famous question, when they found the pach shemen it contained enough oil to light for one day. So the nes of the oil lighting was only for 7 days. Why then, were Chazal masaken the Yom Tov to light the menorah for 8 days, if the nes of the oil burning was only for 7 days?

The Alter of Kelm answers with a chiddush. That 7 days we celebrate for the nes of the oil burning against the laws of nature, an additional day we celebrate for the oil that burned naturally, just like Hashem let the oil burn for longer than it usually does, it's also Hashem Who makes the oil burn at all. Therefore Chazal set aside one day of Hoda'ah to focus

on all the regular nissim, the ones that we call 'laws of nature'. Nature is also a nes, it just happens regularly and constantly, so we get used to it.

For example, isn't it phenomenal that a person is able to taste with his tongue? This is all part of the Hoda'ah of Chanukah, the days of Chanukah are to praise Hashem for all the unusual, special nissim and for all the regular, constant nissim that Hashem hides behind 'laws of nature' like the wondrous functions of our bodies.

Q. I am a perfectionist by nature. I try to keep my house very organized, and I am meticulous about returning items to their appropriate places when I am finished using them. This is the way I was raised, and this is the way I want my house to function as well.

However, my wife has the opposite nature. When she finishes using an item, she often doesn't put it back, or she'll return it to a place where it doesn't belong.

I keep telling her how much it means to me that items should be put back in their correct places. However, she constantly forgets, and I constantly find items misplaced. I find her behavior to be very aggravating, and I find myself feeling resentment towards her. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. What's bothering you is that because you are a perfectionist, it's very important to you that things should be 'perfect'.

Accordingly, when your wife puts things in the wrong places or leaves things around, you consider this to be imperfect.

However, let's explore the meaning of 'perfect'. The true definition of perfect is not that things must be the way you think they should be. Rather, 'perfect' is decided by how things should intrinsically be.

The basic principles of emunah tell us that Hashem is the One running the world and that no human being can interfere with Hashem's will to affect another person's life. Additionally, we know that Hashem is perfect, and everything He does is good.

Therefore, if you can think of a method to help your wife be more organized, certainly you should do so.

However, you have found that asking her to change is proving to be ineffective, and you realize that there is no other hishtadlus that you can think of to change the situation. Now you must understand that when you find an item misplaced, it is not because your wife misplaced it. It was Hashem Who caused you to find it in that place. Your wife's carelessness can't affect you whatsoever, just as no other human being can affect you if Hashem didn't allow him to do so.

If you find an item out of place, it was Hashem Who wanted this to happen – along with whatever time or effort you had to spend looking for the misplaced item. Perhaps it was meant

as a test to see if you would recognize that it was Hashem Who caused it – not your wife. Perhaps it was meant to help you work on the middah of patience, or for any other reason that Hashem has in mind.

When you program your mind to understand that wherever you find your items is exactly where they are supposed to be at that moment, you will be able to enjoy a house in perfect order – Hashem's order.

Regarding the fact that you are upset that your wife fails to return items despite your repeated requests and that your wife still doesn't listen, this feeling is coming because you have expectations from your wife. You hope that she will start acting more orderly, and each time you find something misplaced you grow disappointed anew.

The Chovos Halvavos teaches: Hashem wants us to recognize that He is the only source of our welfare, not people. Hashem wants us to rely solely on Him for our needs, and never to place our hopes on human beings.

When you learn to rely only on Hashem, and not to depend on humans, you are not going to feel let down when your wife misplaces things. For all the positive

things she does, you will be full of appreciation towards her, but will not blame her when she fails to live up to your expectations.

My husband had a strong will to move outof-town. He felt that he would be able to influence others and bring out his talents. Being a devoted wife, I wanted to do whatever would be the best for my husband, and so we moved out-of-town.

Now we are living in a small community, far from the rest of my family. Whenever I speak to my parents and siblings, they tell me about simchos that the family will be celebrating and about family get-togethers. Since we live so far away, we are not able to participate in many of the family events, and I feel left out.

Now, I'm starting to feel negative feelings about the decision to live so far away from everyone. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. What's bothering you is that you think: "Had I insisted on staying in-town, I would have been able to participate in my family gatherings. All because I went along with my husband's

desire to move out-of-town, I'm not able to attend all the family events."

However, you must realize that your husband's need to move out-of-town has nothing to do with how much you will be with your family! Your destiny is not in your husband's control, and his decisions can't affect you one iota.

The One who is controlling your life is your loving and caring Father, Hakadosh Baruch Hu. If Hakadosh Baruch Hu does not want you to take part in a family gathering, even if you would be living next door, Hashem has plenty of ways to stop you from attending ways that you wouldn't even want to think about. And if Hashem sees that it's good for you to participate, then even if you would live at the other end of the world Hashem would make sure that you would be there.

Once you realize that it's Hashem who is running your life, you can be sure that Hashem put you in that situation for your best.

What could be good about being far from family? The Chovos Halvavos teaches that if a person finds himself away from family and friends, he is presented with a unique opportunity to create a tangible relationship

with Hashem.

When a person is surrounded by family, he is constantly distracted, and it's very difficult for him to focus on Hashem. However, when a person is alone, he's afforded a much greater opportunity to think about Hashem.

We must not underestimate the importance of this function. Thinking about Hashem is the very purpose of our existence! When a person makes it a priority to think about Hashem and create a relationship with him, he is thereby fulfilling the reason for which he was created. You should actually consider yourself very privileged that Hashem selected you to create a relationship with Him and is enabling you to realize your true potential.

When you invest in connecting with Hashem, you will not feel that you are missing out when you can't attend family gatherings. You will realize that genuine simcha comes from having a relationship with Hashem. The more you attach yourself to Hashem, the more intrinsic simcha you will have.

The unbelievable power of a good word By R'Y. Friedman

We discussed the powerful message and chizuk that Chanukah gives us, not to give up no matter how dire and bleak the situation seems.

This week we will focus on another chizuk that we take from the story of Chanukah, and that's the concept of Mesiras nefesh.

Mesiras nefesh comes from a tremendous awareness of all the chessed that Hashem does for us every second of our life. It stems from a deep love that we have for Hashem. Let's begin.

We spoke about the Chashmonaim, how they didn't give up. Moreover, they went to war against the mighty Greeks with courage and self sacrifice which we call Mesiras nefesh. It's interesting to note that it was the Kohanim specifically that stood up and took the stance. The truth is that we say in the Haneiros hallalu the words"al kohanecha hakevedai doshim". It would seem to indicate that there is a significance that it happened through the Kohanim specifically.

So I would like to point out two elements that were outstanding by the Chashmonaim in the Story of Chanukah.

- 1. Their tremendous Bitachon that they had as we mentioned previously.
- 2. Their Mesiras nefesh self sacrifice that they displayed was legendary. It was with these two ele-



ments that they were successful in their war.

Truthfully, Kohanim in general excel in these two areas, as these two traits are needed for Kehuna. Let me explain. A Kohen doesn't have any salary or a regular source of income. He doesn't know when he will receive his matnas kehuna. Therefore, he lives a life of Bitachon. In regards to mesiras nefesh, a kohen who serves in the Bais Hamikdash has to be extremely cautious and scrupulous in his Avoda. They do the Avoda with tremendous alacrity. Therefore, we can understand why they were the ones that stood up with Bitachon and Mesiras nefesh to confront the mighty Greek armies.

Be"H we would like to give some insight how these two tremendous traits helped them overcome the enemy. Hopefully this will give us chizuk to work on ourselves as well, and be"H we will get the chizuk we need to overcome our greatest enemy - the Yetzer Hara.

Bitachon: Bitachon is a very broad subject and it's so easy to attain. Reading the Spring Hill Times is definitely a great start. One of the fundamental principles of Bitachon is realizing that Hashem is all powerful. He can do anything, as Hashem told Avraham Avinu when Sara laughed "Hayipalei M'Hashem davar"? Furthermore, we also understand and feel that we are totally in Hashem's hands and no one can harm us.

With these thoughts the Chashmonaim were able to have the courage to go to war with the Greek's huge army. We also need to understand that as difficult our challenges and circumstances in life are, we could still win the battle. That's because we understand that Hashem can do anything and we also know and feel that we are in Hashem's hands. This should give us a tremendous menuchas hanefesh and Simcha, knowing that

we are in the best hands possible.

Mesiras nefesh - This means that we have tremendous loyalty to Hashem, that we are willing to do anything for Hashem. These feelings usually come from an overwhelming amount of gratitude and a deep love for Hashem. Essentially a person is willing to be Moser nefesh for someone that their life revolves around. For example a family member. If we live our life for Hashem then we will be able to live a life of mesiras nefesh for Hashem.

We all know the story of Shimshon Hagibor. I believe that most people when they come to the end of Shimshon, they end off on a sad note. However I would like to present you a novel approach that will give some tremendous chizuk and some insight into Chanukah as well.

Shimshon was a Nazir from birth. The Torah describes a Nazir as a Nazir L'Hashem. That's because a nazir gives himself over to Hashem by separating himself from worldly pleasures for Hashem's sake. This causes his life to revolve around Hashem. This sums up the life of Shimshon, a true Eved Hashem.

We see from the end of the story that Shimshon's great strength came directly from his Nezirus. It came from his subservience to Hashem, his bittul, his self sacrifice. Therefore, all his wars were one hundred percent for Hashem. So, when he caused his nezirus to be broken he lost his strength.

The Plishtim poked out his eyes and he was in bad shape. They brought him to their tumah and they were praising their idols for delivering Shimshon into their hands. Shimshon was in a terrible state. He was going to be killed, he had broken his Nezirus, and no one was coming to his rescue.

At that point he could have thrown in the towel and he could have sunk into misery. However, he got up like a lion to daven. What's fascinating is that he didn't daven for his own salvation. He davened to get his strength back for Hashem's name was desecrated. That is extremely powerful, and his request was granted.

This is how some commentaries explain the words of Yakov Avinu when he davened for Shimshon, "Lishuascha kivisi Hashem". I am davening for Your yeshua Hashem (so to speak). This is because Shimshon lived a life for Hashem. His whole life revolved around Hashem, which is the essence of a Nazir as we explained.

The Chashmonaim were people that lived their life for Hashem as we explained earlier. Therefore when Hashem's name was desecrated by the Greeks it was they who stood up to the Greeks and proclaimed "Mi lashem" - eilai, should come to me. We are going to war totally for Hashem and they achieved the impossible, because when you are fighting for Hashem's honor nothing is impossible.

This is precisely the message of the Menorah as well. The Yidden wanted very much to serve Hashem and show their gratitude to Hashem. However, they were met with obstacles by the Menorah as well, as they didn't have pure oil. Not fazed, they searched high and low and Hashem helped them find what they needed. Then there was another obstacle: that there wasn't enough oil. Once again Hashem took care of it, and it burned for eight days.

What's the basic message here? If someone wants to do something for Hashem

with all his heart, nothing will stand in his way, as the Yetzer Hara will fall away. You will achieve the impossible, because you are tapping into Hashem's world, and in Hashem's world nothing is impossible.

As we are going into Zos Chanukah, we are infused with tremendous chizuk. We will be"H walk away with the great light of Chanukah and all its messages burning in our hearts. We will walk away with the Yesodos of Bitachon that we mentioned earlier.

We are mechazek ourselves in this area of becoming subservient to Hashem, and the way to get started is by making Hashem a focal part of our life.

We realize that Hashem is our father and Hashem is everything. Our mindset is "what can I do for Hashem now, or what does Hashem want from me right now, because I feel so much love and gratitude." This will help us live a life of mesiras nefesh for Hashem.

Then, there is the ultimate, like with Shimshon and the Chashmonaim, that despite there difficulties they faced, they davened for Hashem's sake.

If we get to the deep love for Hashem then we would daven and plead to Hashem for the Geula for Hashem's name that is desecrated in the world that we live in. Such a Tefilla is so powerful that it can bring the ultimate redemption, as we will see from the following story.

There is a story brought down in the Sefer Chovas HaTalmidim about a simple person whose family was suffering from extreme poverty. It came to a point that it was Pikuach nefesh and he went searching for food, but he hadn't eaten for days and all of a sudden he collapsed.

As he lay there, he poured out his heart to Hashem. He begged Hashem to bring the Geula for the sake of all the people suffering for the Shechina, and he passed out. When he awoke he felt very strong as he smelled the fragrant smell of a beautiful flower.

To make a long story short, he realized that this flower gave him energy, so he took it home with him for his family. However, the Yetzer Hara got it out of him, by exchanging it for food. His father came to in a dream and explained to him that he had been given the flower of techivas ha-

meisim (that was about to happen) to the Yetzer Hara.

What we see from this story is the power of a tefilla one has when one takes himself out of the picture and davens for Hashem and his fellow Yidden. It makes such waves in the heavens, that it can bring techiyas hameisim.

So when we sit by the beautiful candles on Chanukah, a time of Nissim, and in front of the Menorah which has tremendous Keddusha, the light of Moshiach is burning as it's brought down in the Bnei Yissaschar.

Let us reflect on all of the above. We should get an overdose of chizuk seeing Hashem's love that he showed us then and He hasn't stopped.

As we say bayamim haheim bazman hazeh, let's say a heartfelt Tefilla to Hashem to bring down the brilliant light of Moshiach once and for all, for Hashem's name, that everyone will acknowledge that Hashem Echad Ushemo Echad. Amein.

Rav Gedalia Moshe Goldman ztz"l, the Zhviler Rebbe (Born: 1887 in Russia, died: 1949 in Yerushalayim) was sentenced to forced labor in Siberia. The commandant told him, "You are hereby free to go. Sign this paper, and you may leave." Rav Gedalia Moshe told him, "It is Shabbos today, I may not sign." He was willing to suffer there for a few more years rather than be mechalel the heilige Shabbos. The commandant told him, "This is not a joke! If you don't sign, you will stay here for a long time!" Rav Gedalia Moshe did not budge, he refused to sign. The commandant turned to the elderly Jew and told him, "Sign!" Seeing that the rebbe didn't sign, the elderly Jew refused to sign too. When Rav Gedalia Moshe saw that, he jumped up. "I will sign for him! It is too dangerous for him to stay any longer, so I will sign on his behalf!" When the commandant saw how Rav Gedalia Moshe cared so much about another Yid, even more then himself, he was so impressed that he let them both go free without signing anything



You Must Fast!

Rav Ovadya Yosef ztz"l said over the following story. One day, Rav Yehuda Tzadka ztz"l, the rosh yeshiva of Yeshiva Porat Yosef in Yerushalayim, heard that a certain Yid took his children out of the frum school that they were in and enrolled them in a secular not religious school. Rav Tzadka went to the father and started to plead and beg him to put his kids back in the frum school. He tried to impress on him the importance of raising children according to the Torah and teaching them to live a torahdik lifestyle of shmiras hamitzvos. The father was so overwhelmed by Rav Tzadka's pleas, that he burst out crying. He sadly told Rav Tzadka that he really wanted to keep them in the frum school, but his wife insisted that they take them out. Parshas Mikeitz: The Power of Positivity

Have you ever started a project and wonder if it will succeed? Or after davening, thought, "Did Hashem accept my prayers? Maybe I did not have enough kavana." Would it not be amazing if there was a way that one could cause successful results?

By simply thinking and speaking positively, once causes positive results. The reason life works this way is because, as the Gemara in Makkos 10b says, "Where a person wishes to go is where he is led." A positive word or thought creates an angel that leads one towards positive places, while a negative word or thought can chas v'shalom cause negativity (Having Bitachon is an even greater level, as it includes turning to Hashem together with having positive thoughts. Nevertheless, positivity even without Bitochon is very effective).

For this reason, Rav Avigdor Miller zatzal would say that Hashem wants a person to try to always speak positively, even if it seems more like wishful thinking than reality, as doing so creates positive outcomes. Criticism and negativity should only be used for a productive purpose, as that is being used to cause a positive result. In general, the more one insists on only seeing the good in his circumstances, himself, and even in others, the more he will bring out the goodness.

Rav Yehuda Mandel shlita says that whenever he gives a speech and then feels unsure of its success, he says, "This was the best speech I ever gave! Hashem will help make this speech have the greatest impact!" He explained he does so for several reasons. Firstly, positive speech causes positive outcomes. Also, he is having Bitachon that Hashem will help him. A third reason he says such comments is that it is his nature to be critical, so to work on his middos, he is extra positive.

My friend Avromi* told me that he has been working on putting together a sefer to be published. After a few months, he had most of the materials prepared, but for some reason, his progress stalled. For a few weeks, he kept on running into brick walls. When he had time to work on the sefer, he often did not feel up to writing, and when he did have energy, something would come up to keep him too busy. Recently he started using positive speech. He told himself that this sefer is going to be completed right away, and it is going to be very popular. That exact night, Avromi found that he had a pocket of time to work on the sefer, and for the first time in weeks, he was back to putting the final touches on his sefer!
