> and Our tongues our mouths are from the most exposed places of the internal parts of our bodies. It is a place that is internal, it is the inside of our body, like the stomach, the heart and the lungs; but it is exposed, it is open. The mouth is also a very active place; we are constantly eating, chewing, talking and exposing it to other people. This makes it particularly vulnerable to all types of germs, bacteria and small injuries. For example, canker sores, and other various small infections. besides for the occasional biting of the tongue that we mentioned earlier. Therefore

Hashem in His kindness created, that the mouth heals itself quicker that the rest of the body. That means that even though in the whole human body Hashem created a self healing process, that whenever there are any injuries or damage, the body heals itself over time. But the mouth is unique, it has a special advantage that it has a speed healing, it heals any injuries and infections much quicker than usual, therefore any damage that happens in the mouth will not be around for long.

Q. I am a secretary in 'Refuah Medical Center'. My job is to take calls from patients, listen to their medical conditions and then direct them to appropriate care.

WITH R' ZEVY GOLOMBR

Day-in and day-out I listen to reports of illness and suffering, and my heart goes out when hearing how so many people are suffering. How can I deal with this in a healthy way?

A. You must realize that for every person who tells you about a medical condition he has, there are ten thousand people who don't have that illness!

In fact, says Harav Avigdor Miller Zatzal, when Hashem makes an individual sick, in addition to Hashem's specific reasons for making him unwell, one of the chief purposes is to remind all of the healthy people not to take their good health for granted!

When a person hears about someone who is sick, certainly his first reaction must be to feel their pain and to daven for their full recovery. However, subsequently, he is expected to focus on how fortunate he is that he is spared from that form of illness!

He must be full of gratitude to Hashem Yisborach for keeping him healthy, and for the joy that comes along with good health. He should realize further, it's not only him who Hashem made healthy. Hashem made a world full of people, the vast majority of whom are enjoying a life of good health!

If you want your joy to be complete, and you don't want that person to suffer either, turn to Hashem and say, "In the z'chus that this person's sickness caused me to feel how much You love me and are caring for me, please give him a refuah shleima and restore him to perfect health as well."

Q. Until now, I ran a very successful business, and I was able to bring in a comfortable parnasah for my family. I was even able to support my sons-in-law who are all sitting and learning, Baruch Hashem.

Over the last few months, though, my business collapsed, and now I'm broke. I don't know how I will be able to support my own family – let alone to support my sons-in-law.

I know that my family and

my sons-in-law are all relying on me for their basic needs, but I don't have the means to support them. It's so embarrassing, and I don't know how to deal with this situation. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason you are concerned is because you think that you were the one supporting your family and sons-in-law. Therefore, now that you don't know how you will support them anymore, you're worried, "How are they going to manage without me?" This is also very embarrassing, "How can I tell them such news? How can I leave my sons-inlaw stranded?"

However, you must understand that in reality, even until now, it was not you who was supporting your family and sons-in-law! It was Hakadosh Baruch Hu who was supporting them, and you were nothing but His shaliach in doing so.

When you realize that the welfare of your family and sons-in-law has nothing to do with you, you will realize that you have nothing to be ashamed of! Embarrassment is only warranted when you do something

wrong. If you do

an aveira, you should be ashamed over what you did. However, in your scenario, did you do anything wrong? Until now, Hashem knew that it was good for you to have extra money and to have the means to support your sons-in-law. Now Hashem decided that it's best for you not to have extra money.

However, as far as their welfare is concerned, nothing changed! Up until now, it was Hashem who was taking care of them, and in the future it's the same Hashem who is taking care of them.

All Hashem wants from you is to do whatever you can to provide for your family and sons-in-law. The same way you've been trying up until now, you can continue now as well to try to help them according to your means. However, regarding the results – that is strictly Hashem's department, and has nothing to do with you.

Therefore, take yourself out of the picture, and put Hakadosh Baruch Hu there instead. Say, "Hashem, I know that just as You took care my family and sons-inlaw until now, out of Your love and kindness, You will forever take care of them." And when you do that, Hashem will say, "You realize that I am the one taking care of you, and it was not you; now I will show you openly with chessed and rachamim."

Sick Days

Q. I am a mother to a large family of young children, Bli Ayin Harah. It often happens that one of my children isn't feeling well, and I have to take off work and stay home with them, because I don't have another arrangement for them.

Whenever this happens, I call my boss and tell him that unfortunately I won't be able to make it to work because one of my children is sick. However, my boss doesn't like hearing that. He tells me, "Again?! You have to take off again?!" It's so embarrassing each time this happens.

Now one of my children is sick again, and I'm so embarrassed to call my boss. How can I overcome these feelings of embarrassment?

A. The reason you feel un-

comfortable taking off work is because in your mind you are working for a 'Fisher-Price' boss.

Since you are working for another human being, even if you must take off work, he's still going to be annoyed. Your boss is not thinking about you. He's thinking about himself and about what's best for his company. Therefore, if you have to take off, he is not going to be happy.

However, you must understand: Why do we go to work? Because Hashem wants us to do hishtadlus to make money to support our families. It comes out that you're actually working for Hakadosh Baruch Hu! Hashem is your true boss, and he is the one who we have to please.

What does the Grand Boss, Hashem, expect of you? Certainly, he expects you to do your hishtadlus in trying to come up with an arrangement which will allow you to go to work. However, if after your best efforts you still can't find another arrangement, you should know that is this what 'The Boss' wants from you.

Who made your child sick? The same boss that hired

you! The one who

hired you is telling you to stay home and take care of your sick child.

As far as your human boss, show him that you are a responsible person and that you are dedicated to your job. Express how much you don't want to miss work, and that you are open to any ideas. Perhaps together you can think of an idea how to make things work.

However, if you can't find another arrangement, you can stay home with a light heart. You can be confident that your true boss, Hakadosh Baruch Hu, is beaming with nachas that you are doing your best to support your family and take care of your children to the best of your abilities.

Meaningful Illness

Q. I have the flu and I desperately need to take antibiotics. However, there currently is a shortage of antibiotics, and there is no pharmacy that has it. I feel stuck, I'm sick and I am unable to take the medication I need. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this? A. The Gemara says that in the times of old there existed a 'Sefer Re'fuos' – a book that had written in it the cure for every sickness. Chizkiyahu Hamelech came along and hid that book, and the sages praised him for doing so. Why did Chizkiyahu hide that book? Isn't it valuable to know how to cure sicknesses?

Rashi explains that Chizkiyahu Hamelech saw that when people fell ill, instead of becoming humbled and trusting in Hashem to heal them, they simply took the medicine written in the book, and the sickness did not serve its purpose.

Now that the 'Book of Cures' was no longer available, when people became ill, instead of running to check the book, they started running to the true doctor! They started building a connection with Hashem and trusting in Him to heal them.

We learn from here that the reason Hashem makes people fall ill is not in order for them to take antibiotics! Hashem makes people ill in order to help them grow and gain a closer connection to Him.

If there is medication avail-

able, Hashem wants a person's bitachon to be accompanied by doing the appropriate hishtadlus to take care of himself.

However, when medicine is not available, the only thing Hashem expects from a person is to direct his attention to his loving and caring Father, Hakadosh Baruch Hu. Hashem wants him to think: Who is the One who gave me the sickness? What is the purpose of the sickness? And who is the One who can heal me?

Hashem is the one who made you sick – not in order for you to pop a pill, but for the purpose of bringing Hashem into your life. And Hashem wants you to trust that the restoration of your good health is in the hands of the 'Healer of all flesh'.

By using your sickness to grow in your relationship with Hashem, you will have made your illness purposeful and accomplishing. When you do this, you will see that this will bring you more bracha than any antibiotics can bring.

Chizuk from Yosef Hatzadik

Introduction: In the past few Parshiyos we learned much about Yosef Hatzadik. I would like to revisit some episodes of Yosef so that we can learn from his amazing acts and to study his approach to his challenges that he encountered throughout his personal Galus. I believe there is much Chizuk that can be used in our personal lives to stand up to the challenges in our galus as well.

The Torah starts off by telling us that he would be mekarev the children of Bilah and Zilpah. It seemed from Yosef's point of view, that the children of the maidservants were not getting their proper respect. Therefore, Yosef made it his business to be mechazek them.

The Torah relates that Yosef would tell his father about any misconduct that he saw by his brothers. Obviously, if you look at this with a negative eye, you would say that Yosef was out to get his brothers. However, as we will see it was just the opposite. It was because Yosef loved his brothers so much, he went to his father so his father could be mechazek the brothers to stand up to their challenges.

Afterwards, the Torah relates that Yosef told his dreams to them. This seems a bit strange. Why did he tell it to them? What was he trying to invoke? The Ohr Hachaim clarifies this. He says that Yosef was trying to show his brothers how much he loves them. One is supposed to tell his dreams only to someone that is beloved to them.

A while after that, Yaakov sends him to search for his brothers to see how they are doing. Some commentaries are baffled, what was the point of this mission? Some say that since the brothers went to Shechem and Shechem was a dangerous place for them, The unbelievable power of a good word By R' Y. Friedman

therefore he sent Yosef to check up on them.

Yosef comes for their good to check up on them and what happens to him? They stripped him from his special clothes and they threw him into a pit.

I once heard a fascinating thought on this. Let me be



makdim a story to properly appreciate the greatness of Yosef.

There was a tremendous Tzaddik, a zealot for Hashem whose name was Rav Amram Blau. It was during the earlier years of the Zionist movement and there were lots of problems with the government. Rav Amram would make demonstrations with Mesiras nefesh to stop the Chilul Hashem. His children followed in his footsteps as well.

I heard this story from someone that was there. At one demonstration, his children, who were middle aged, were demonstrating and the police stormed over and reigned blows upon them. This person (who is telling the story) noticed that as the police were beating them, they didn't fight back. He asked them why didn't they fight back? "You have the right to defend yourself." They responded, "the police are nebach a tinokos shenishbau. They don't really know that we are their brother. However, we realize this and we won't raise our hand to hurt our brother." What a powerful insight.

Similarly, it would seem from the basic words of the Torah that Yosef did not resist. The only thing that we do know from later on is that he pleaded with them, but he didn't hurt them. We know from the Midrashim that Yosef was very strong.

However, he knew that these were his brothers and he would not want to hurt his brothers Chas V'shalam.

This fits very well with the Ohr Hachaim Hakadosh on the Passuk, "ani Yosef achichem asher mechartem osi Mitzrayima". Yosef is telling them that even when you were selling me as a slave I still loved you like a brother. I didn't want to hurt you because I still loved you.

How is that possible? It sounds so extreme.

The answer is that he knew and understood that everything in his life is orchestrated from Hashem, as Dovid Hamelech said when he was cursed from Shimi "Elokim Amar kaeil".

Furthermore, when the circumstance is very strange you can see Hashem in the picture even more. It's very unusual for brothers to sell their own brother.

We can learn from Yosef and these great people that we should avoid afflicting pain on any Yid, because they are our brothers.

Even if we feel that they gave us pain. That's their problem. Our job is to make sure that we don't cause another Yid any pain, rather we should judge them favorably by putting loads of positivity into our life. We also understand that all this is coming from our loving father Hashem, and this will help us abolish sinas chinam.

However, there is an interesting question one may ask. Why

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was Yosef telling them this? Was he trying to brag to them that I am not like you ch"v?

I believe that Yosef was trying to soothe them and give them tremendous chizuk, as we see in this week's Parsha. We see that the brothers were nervous that Yosef still bore a grudge and that one day he would take revenge.

Therefore, as soon as Yosef revealed himself, he immediately clarified that this is not so. He explained to them that even during those moments when they sold him, he felt no grudge, only love. Now many years later and he has become the king, they saw that everything was planned by Hashem. Obviously there wasn't a shred of hatred in his heart.

We can learn from this that sometimes we may have some type of friction and we know with certainty that the other party is guilty, not only could we forgive them as we mentioned, but we could give them chizuk and make them feel that they really didn't mean it. We will tell them that everything is from Hashem and this was meant to happen. This will put them to ease, and will bring Shalom to our midst.

The Tzaddik Rav Kalman Krohn zt"l, personified this trait of giving chizuk. I still remember when he would call me for his annual campaign to raise money for almanos and Yesomim and poor people. I remember the warmth, the love and chizuk in his voice. When I told him one year that I was very tight, he bombarded me with Brachos for Parnassa. His chizuk came from his tremendous Ahavas Yisroel that he possessed.

There is a famous story, that Reb Kalman once gave someone that was going to Eretz Yisroel a lot of money to deliver for all the Yesomim and Almanos. Reb Kalman called the party that was supposed to receive the money and he found out that they never got the money. The shaliach had misplaced the money and it was lost.

Reb Kalman unfazed waited for this person to return. When this man returned, not only did he not have any complaints, he took out a beautiful cake and on the cake it said "hinneni nosein lecha es brisi Shalom." To tell him: "I have no complaints against you as everything is up to Hashem."

One final point. When Yosef was thrown into the dungeon after the incident with the wife of Potifar, the Passuk seems to say redundantly, "vayehee sham biveis hasoar."

Rav Meilich Biederman Shlit"a brings down a fascinating concept. What these words indicate is that Yosef was in jail willingly, with all his heart and soul, because he believed that this was Hashem's will.

I would like to add to this, that Yosef made the best of the situation and he tried making life easier for the people around him. Instead of sitting in his corner, he went around giving chizuk. We see that he went to the king's butler and baker to cheer them up, and ultimately this was the way he got out. If he wouldn't have asked them why they were down that day. he wouldn't have known about their dreams. However, although he settled down in jail he didn't become one of them chalila. Rather he stood proudly by his identity

We find by Yaakov the concept that when a Tzaddik leaves a city it makes a roshem. One reason we can say is because a Tzaddik, wherever he is, tries to make a difference in people's lives. How? One way is by giving chizuk to the people and smiling at them, making them feel like a million dollars. We can just imagine how the prisoners felt after Yosef left the jail. Their light was extinguished.

A few years ago, on Zos Chanuka we celebrated the release of R' Shalom Mordechai Rubashkin. Obviously, to get a small appreciation for his situation one needs to read the book. We can see clearly that he went in the footsteps of Yosef Hatzadik. He accepted Hashem's will with love and he settled in. The way he was so friendly to everyone and how he really affected everyone there in such a positive way, is mind boggling. At the same time, we see how he kept his Jewish identity and didn't give in to anything.

Yes, we can make a difference in people's lives. Starting with our family and spilling our positive energy and chizuk into our friends, shuls, neighbors and our neighborhood. Wherever we go, even to a different country, we can make the best of this Galus which is in a certain sense a jail.

Just like Yosef gave so much chizuk and made the best of his stay, yet didn't blend in to his surroundings rather he stood proudly by his identity and he was released very quickly and became the king. We can also exit this Galus in the Zechus of giving chizuk to everyone we encounter but at the same time being proud of our identity. May it be the will of Hashem to exit this Galus very quickly Amein.

Reb Ovadia's Tears

Every morning, Tzvi Chakak, the assistant of Rav Ovadia Yosef zatzal, would give him his Tefillin to put on, and in his later years, he would help him put them on. Rav Ovadia's custom was to make a beracha on Tefillin according to Rashi's shita before shacharis, and he would put on Rabbeinu Tam Tefillin after chazaras hashatz without a beracha. One morning after shacharis, Tzvi Chakak realized that he had mistakenly switched the pairs of Tefillin, and instead of giving him the Rashi Tefillin to make the beracha on, he had given him the Rabbeinu Tam Tefillin. Tzvi felt terrible, but he felt that he had no choice but to admit his mistake to Rav Ovadia. He told Rav Ovadia what had happened, and he waited nervously for Rav Ovadia's reaction. Rav Ovadia was quick to reassure him, saying "It's not a big deal." Rav Ovadia told him that there is one opinion in the poskim that according to kabbalah one may make a beracha on Rabbeinu Tam Tefillin once in a person's lifetime. If so, he had fulfilled that opinion that day, and he told him not to worry about it.

Tzvi was relieved that Rav Ovadia had not gotten upset at him, but later that day he was surprised to see that Rav Ovadia's eyes were full of tears, and he had a pained look on his face the whole day. Tzvi noticed that when Rav Ovadia would start crying, he would murmur something to himself, so he decided to lean in closer to hear. He leaned in closely to Rav Ovadia and he heard him saying to himself, "The Tefillin, The Tefillin!





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

chew and then deliver my money?" asked Avi quietly to himself.



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

We all know that following the Torah is the only way to an enjoyable Olam Haba but what about Olam Hazeh? Can one live a happy life and enjoy Olam Hazeh without the Torah? the alter navordok (madreigas haadam tikkun hamidos perek beis) explains that Hashem gave us the Torah to teach us how to have a happy enjoyable experience in Olam Hazeh! Hashem gave us the Torah to teach us how to overcome our natural struggles, to fix our middos, trust in Hashem and thereby live happily in Olam Hazeh and Olam Haba! Someone who doesn't love Hashem chas"v and holds onto his bad middos will not have an easy time! The Torah's ways are not something disconnected with this world, it's the guidelines that help us navigate and thrive in this world!

By working on our middos we access the enjoyable life of the Torah in this world! This is done by learning the chazals and mussar that directly address one's personal struggles. Rabbi Dovid Bliecher (talmid of the Alter Navorodk) explains in his sefer Divrei Binah U'mussar page 132 discusses how just like in a pharmacy one must take the medicine that is prescribed for his specific illness so to with Torah one must find the Chazals that cure his specific flaw! Someone who naturally feels haughty should help himself by learn the Chazal's that inspire him to respect others while many people who have the opposite tendency toward low self-esteem, they should focus on the topics and seforim that are very positive like bitachon and gadlus haadam. This will lift his spirits and give him the boost he desperately needs! Keep in mind though, this can take time, and Hashem doesn't expect us to be perfect overnight. As long as we are trying, we are already a success in Hashem's eyes!

Rabbi Mandel gave an illustration of three friends Reuven, Shimon and Levi.

Reuven was a successful businessman and big ba'al chesed. He was always a little stressed about parnasa and everyday life but recently his neighbors have been causing him some real heart ache. Although his chesed programs were doing better than ever, after a while he realizes he must find a way to help himself calm. He found some outside help and techniques to help himself and his symptoms somewhat improved but much of his frustrations were still present.

Shimon learned in yeshiva and was a real masmid. He always was somewhat stressed, but when his children started acting out and making trouble his tension doubled. Shimon decided to cope by trying to ignore his plight and keeping up his sedarim. After the z'man, Shimon finished the mesechta and was so happy however, he would still get bent out of shape when his children made mischief.

Levi was not a businessman like Reuven and not quite shtark as Shimon but when he felt like the tension was getting to him, he took the time to think about what is causing him the hurt. Sometimes he would help himself by learning about bitachon other times when he was angry, he would use a sefer on ka'as to calm himself down. Levi still felt distressed, but due to his mussar sessions, much of it was alleviated. Who was the most choshuv in Hashem's eyes? By far Levi! For he is using the Torah to heal himself and develop a practical relationship with Hashem!
