So he told himself, "I'll sit in the waiting room and I'll put on the song from R' Ephraim Wachsman on 'A Life with Bitachon'!!!"



Everyone enjoys a good chocolate or a rich ice cream. What is it that attracts us so strongly to these foods? What makes it so enjoyable?

It's our taste buds!

Nobody has a sweet tooth, like the expression goes, because there are no taste buds on our teeth. Rather people have a sweet tongue.

Actually, not all of our groups of taste buds are created equal! There are more taste buds for the sweet taste than the taste buds we have for any other types of taste.

Perhaps the reason why Hashem created us with more sweet taste buds is because sugar is the core source of our energy. Sugar is vital for us to function. Therefore we have an abundance of sweet taste buds to encourage our intake of sugar.

Obviously, this has to be in the right healthy amount and not in a damaging quantity. This can be compared to a strawberry flavored medicine that children are very happy to take because they like the taste. So too, we as adults consume sugar because we like the taste and Hashem wants us to get the important energy which is so perfectly packaged inside.

Did you ever look carefully inside your mouth and try to count how many taste buds you have? Actually, taste buds are like tiny hairs that are invisible to the human eye. A person has approximately between 3,500 to 5,000 taste buds that are distributed all over the surface of his tongue and his mouth.

This ensures that a person can enjoy his food without having to direct it to any particular place in his mouth.

Even though we have different sets of taste buds for the different types of tastes, contrary to what was once believed, today we know that all of the types of taste buds are found all over the mouth.

If a taste bud would be only in a particular section of the mouth, it would make enjoying our food a complicated procedure. We would have to remember every time we eat to position the food in the area where that set of taste buds is found. For example, the salty fish we are eating would have to go to one place in the mouth, and the bitter chrein on top of it would have to go to another place. When we would want to wash it down with a sweet drink we would have to remember to direct it to a third place.

Hashem, in His kindness, made this all simple and automatic by distributing all of the thousands of taste buds, with all the different types of tastes, all around the mouth. Wherever the food is in the mouth, it will be able to be enjoyed in an easy and uncomplicated fashion.

Q. When we speak about sad things, is it acceptable to use the word 'unfortunately', which implies that what happened is unfortunate and bad?

A. Harav Yisroel Falk responded, if you use the word 'unfortunate' to mean that it's actually bad, then of course it's a problem. But many times, people just use it as a figure of speech to express sympathy for another person's suffering. In that case it's not a problem.

Q. I have a nature to be very curious. When I hear about current events, I have an urge to find out exactly how it happened, why it happened etc. I know that curiosity is not necessarily a good middah. Which exercises can I do to control my curiosity?

A. The reason we like to find out why things happened is because we think that the world operates according to cause and effect, and it's interesting to understand exactly what caused things to happen and how they happened.

However, the truth is that everything that happens is only because of one cause: Hakadosh Baruch Hu. This is the true answer to all questions; Who caused it to happen? Hakadosh Baruch Hu. How did it happen? Hakadosh Baruch Hu made it happen. Why did it happen? Because Hakadosh Baruch Hu wanted it to happen.

All the technical details reported in the news is just Hashem's cover-up to make it appear as if it had natural causes.

Therefore, if you want to do an exercise to work on your curiosity, whenever you feel the need to know how and why things happen, tell yourself, 'I won't be drawn after the 'fake news' – what the reporters attribute the events to. Rather, I know that Hakadosh Baruch Hu is responsible for the event. And He made it happen because He saw fit that this is the best thing'.

What if a person knows that Hashem is the One who causes all events, however, he simply wants to find out details about what happened. How can a person suppress his curiosity?

It is good for a person to be informed on a general level about what's going on around him. But when it comes to the details, the Brisker Rav teaches that whatever information is important for him to know, Hashem will make him hear about. And whatever details a person doesn't need to know, Hashem will make sure he does not know.

Therefore, there is no room to live with a FOMO [fear of missing out] when he's not familiar with the details of current events.

Q. I grew up in a certain neighborhood,

school I go to, and I have lots of friends. **Recently**, my parents decided that our family is going to move to a new neighborhood.

I am very apprehensive about the move: I'm concerned that I won't adjust to the new community and I'll have a hard time acclimating.

What is emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason you're nervous is because vou think, 'the reason I'm settled where I am is because I 'happen' to enjoy the school and I 'happened' to have found friends. Now that my family is relocating, perhaps I won't be able to adapt to my new community'.

However, the truth is, the reason you were settled in your prior community is not because of the circumstances. It was because Hashem, your loving father, was looking out for you and gave you friends and a good school.

Hashem is not limited by circumstances. Hashem is directing your family to move to a new neighborhood, and he will continue looking after your needs and find you wonderful friends, just as he did in former neighborhood.

And the more you realize that all the good in vour life is orchestrated by Hakadosh Baruch Hu, the more relaxed you will be. And Hashem will reward you by helping you adjust in the smoothest way possible.

Q. I have a cataract in my eye. All my life I preferred to 'go natural', but now I have no choice and I must undergo eye surgery. I'm very uneasy that I have to go 'under the knife'. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason people prefer to 'go natural' is because they would rather put themselves

in the hands of the wonderful bri'ah Hashem set up rather than subjecting themselves to human intervention.

However, we have to understand, that when human intervention is called for, it's not the human who is controlling the outcome, rather it's the same Hakadosh Baruch Hu who set up the marvelous bri'ah.

Therefore, if you are in a position that the correct hishtadlus is undergo surgery, to remember, it's not the doctor who will determine your fate. You are being treated by the top-surgeon, the designer of all natural medicine, your loving and caring father, the רופא חולי טמו ישראל.

The unbelievable power of a good word By R' Y. Friedman

We are heading toward the amazing day of Purim. A day that is so big yet so short. Therefore, in order to access the great light that descends on Purim we will need to prepare ourselves.

We discussed in previous articles how every Yom Tov is a gift from Hashem. But every Yom Tov has its unique avoda to that Yom Tov. That's because of the unique light that descends during that time. For example, Pesach has the light of redemption of bondage from the Yetzer Hara. Shavuos brings us into new heights in connecting to Hashem, which came through Kabbalas HaTorah.

So we need to know what's unique about Purim, so that we can properly prepare ourselves to receive this tremendous light that is descending upon us .

We know that simcha is the primary theme of Purim. We see that after the story of Purim it says "Layehudim hosa orah vesimcha visason vikur", and we see that our sages instituted this day as a day of immense joy and gladness.

Therefore, we can understand why our Chachamim proclaimed "mishenichnas Adar Marbim besimcha. That's because the Segulas hazman of Purim is to walk away with a tremendous Simcha. So if we attain the ultimate simcha on Purim, then it will spill over into the uplifting thirty days before Pesach. Can we imagine how our Pesach will look after that?

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Let us draw some chizuk so that we can revert ourselves into the simcha mode.

So for starters, if you are reading the Spring Hill Times



then you are already on the right track. But I would like to digress a bit into the Yom tov of Purim, so we can get a deeper understanding why we are so joyous on Purim. Hopefully this will help our preparation for this awesome day that is arriving at lightning speed.

The most basic reason what we are celebrating is the continuity of Klal Yisroel. Haman schemed to wipe us off the map and the decree went through. Even more crucial and frightening was the fact that Hashem signed on this decree as well. So we celebrate this great event that Hashem annulled the decree that He signed on.

The truth is that in history, Purim was a day of victory over many other Hamans who tried to harm or kill us. So we see that Purim is a day of Hatzala, and that in itself is definitely a reason to celebrate. However, it goes even deeper.

The Arizal say something fascinating. The Arizal says that Purim stands higher than Yom Kippur. Now this statement is astonishing. How can this be possible? Also what does Purim have to do with Yom Kippur that there is some sort of juxtaposition? They seem to be total opposites.

Perhaps we can suggest the following: Yom Kippur is a day that Hashem showed us His tremendous love, that even after we sinned He took us back and we were merutza by Hashem. Purim was a day that not only did Hashem show us His great love and forgive us, but also that Klal Yisroel got a tremendous level of Ahavas Hashem.

We see this by the fact that on Purim Klal Yisroel accepted the Torah with love. They took this love that they felt for Hashem at that moment, and they accepted the Torah with love. What happened then that triggered this.

Obviously it was from the fact that Hashem spared us. Furthermore, I believe that it was through the story of Purim that they came to the recognition that even the events that seem so fearful and dark, are all for our benefit. They understood that Hashem is our loving father and everything He does is for our benefit.

Therefore, they accepted the Torah out of love as well,

because they realized that all the Mizvos are not just commandments that a master gives his servants. Rather they are all there for our benefit so that we can become closer to Hashem (as we explained last week). Hashem will not give us a nisayon that is beyond us (like Rava told the heretic).

All this comes from our deep and broad understanding that Hashem is our loving father, no matter how bleak and dark of a situation we find ourselves in. Therefore, we love Hashem unconditionally, because we are His loving children that trust in Hashem's judgment.

I heard a story from Rav Avi Weisenfeld about the Holy Barditchever, who was once traveling, and he stopped at an inn for the night.

At Chatzos the Rebbe sat down on the floor and he wept bitterly on the loss of the Bais Hamikdash.

The innkeeper a pious but extremely ignorant man came running when he heard the Rebbes sobs. "Rebbe," he cried, "what's the matter? Why are you crying?"

Reb Levi Yitzchok explained to him patiently about the beautiful Bais Hamikdash that we had and the closeness that we had with Hashemat that time. Then he told him about the Churban of the Bass Hamikdash.

As the Rebbe was talking

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to the innkeeper, he realized that the innkeeper with his simplicity looked like he was about to have a heart attack. So the Rebbe shifted gears and explained to the innkeeper that the Churban was the best thing for Klal Yisroel, because without the Churban Klal Yisroel would cease to exist.

When the innkeeper heard this, he got up and started dancing. Reb Levi Yitzchok joined him in the dancing. This caused a commotion and people came running and they asked the innkeeper why he was dancing. The innkeeper replied. "Didn't you hear? The Bais Hamikdash was destroyed.

Reb Avi Wiesenfeld concluded that the Kedushas Levi says that this is what the dancing of Purim is all about. We are dancing with the understanding that all the Tzaros is all for our benefit. Yes, at times it may be hidden from us but we have Bitachon that everything is ultimately for our good. This is precisely what we said earlier.

So Purim is not merely a day of Simcha, it's a day of Simcha that comes from a tremendous Ahava for Hashem. When one truly feels that Hashem loves him, he will be able to dance even with the Tzaros, because he knows with an ironclad Emuna that Hashem has his best interests in mind. In fact Hashem's love for us is greater than our love for ourselves! This kind of simcha is similar to the simcha that we will experience when Moshiach will come. It will be a simcha understanding that all the hardships that we went through were all for our benefit. That is the sincha we can achieve on Purim.

How do we prepare ourselves to acquire such a level of delo yada bein arur haman and Baruch Mordechai?

It's with the strength of Bitachon. Trusting in Hashem by acknowledging that Hashem is only out for our good because like we say three times a day "Tov Hashem lakol", and that includes you.

To wrap it up Rav Tzaduk Hakohen brings from his grandfather, that the word Adar comes from the word "dira". What's the significance? He explains since Chodesh Nissan is the Chodesh hageulah, therefore in the month of Adar it arouses the desire for Hashem to dwell amongst His people. Therefore we need to arise within us the love and desire for Hashem and to serve him with all our heart. May we all have a joyous Adar and through that Hashem will dwell amongst His beloved children once again Amein!

The Rav of Lisa, R'Yaakov Loberbaum (The author of Nesivos HaMishpat) was lodging in Brisk, at the home of E Leib Katzenelbogen. It's a completely absurd story. But it does help explain why it is that we don't know exactly what's going on.

The rabbi understood in a moment what happened, and he spoke to both of them: the problem is that one of you came late, and one of you left early. But neither of you heard the entirety of the Possuk—"Shomer HaShem es kol ohavov, ve'eis kol horesho'im yashmid." And the great challenge is that few of us are in this world long enough to see a full sweep of justice.

And a few moments later, another call comes,

LIVING WITH APPRECIATION

The Zohar teaches that Purim is called by the name Yom Kipurim.

Our Rabbis explain that this means that Purim is even holier than Yom Kippur; Yom Kipurim, Yom Kippur is a day like, but not as holy, as Purim.

How is this so? Can a day when we eat delicious food, drink wine and rejoice tremendously really be as holy as Yom Kippur when we fast, daven the whole day and are compared to the angels?

Rav Dessler explains that Yom Kippur is a day that symbolizes yirah, fear. We spend the whole day fasting imploring that Hashem in His great mercy will forgive our sins.

However, Purim is a day of ahavas Hashem, a day dedicated to focus on all the incredible wonders that Hashem does for us and His unconditional love.

So, our Rabbis teach that Purim is even greater than Yom Kippur since through ahavas Hashem, we can achieve greater levels than yiras Hashem.

This idea is echoed by the Sfas Emes who explains the teaching of the Zohar that through rejoicing, we can achieve even higher levels than afflicting ourselves and thereof Purim By: R' Daniel Shasha

is greater!

It is easy to get sidetracked in the celebrations of this day and we have to remember the purpose behind all this.

It is a tremendous outpouring of our gratitude to Hashem for the incredible miracles that occurred. We were under a serious threat of being destroyed and if not for the extraordinary salvation that happened, we wouldn't be here today. Everything we have is because of the Purim miracle and it is essential that we ensure that this is a day filled with gratitude.

The Sfas Emes notes that an allusion to this is when we recite השועתם היית לנצח, 'your salvation was forever'. We are exclaiming how the salvation was eternal, since Haman wanted to destroy us, the miracle was to all generations. Our entire existence is only because of the Purim miracle! We cannot estimate the power our simchah on Purim has.

One time, on taanis Esther, the city of Amsterdam was in great distress. Fish had blocked up a certain dam, potentially resulting in a disastrous flood placing the lives of thousand in grave danger.

The king sent message to the

Rokeach, the Rav of the Jewish community at that time, stating that if this danger continues in three days time, all the Jews will be permanently expelled.

Surprisingly, the Rokeach responded that he could meet this demand, on condition that the king sent many crates of wine.

The king who was infuriated with this request presuming the Jews would be fasting and wearing sackcloth, complied when the Rokeach insisted this was the only way he could meet his request.

That Purim, wine flowed and flowed and the simchah was on an entirely new level.

Not long after Purim the fish left the dam and no longer posed a danger!

Upon hearing the name "Adar" we feel the chills of simchah going down our backs. We feel the love of Hashem in our bones.

This happiness is not limited to the month of Adar, or to any situation. This is something that can be accessed at every time, by every person.

The first thing is to read "The Spring Hill Times" from cover to cover. This will do an adequate job. Not only will you read how Hashem has given other people great things, you will also start seeing how much Hashem is taking care of you on a constant basis.

The second thing is: by appreciating the great gift of LIFE!! This gift has the power to infuse us with great joy. This we can learn from the following story:

Shimmy*, an 18-year-old-boy had undergone a great amount of treatment due to an illness. After finishing many treatments the doctors had told him that they were at a loss. There weren't any more treatments with which they could offer.

After further investigation, they were told about a hospital that had different treatments available for the boy.

After consulting with the doctors from this hospital, the doctors told them that this treatment could only be administered with the consent of the patient, as this is a relatively new treatment which entails great discomfort. Its success is not guaranteed to lengthen life more than a few weeks.

With that, they consulted their Da'as Torah to see if he was obligated to undergo this treatment which holds only a small chance of survival.

Hearing all the facts of the particular case, the Rav had confirmed that this decision was entirely up to the boy. It was his decision if he would undergo this in order to have a chance of survival.

With that, the boy had requested to call R' Ezriel Tauber.

While speaking with R' Tauber he explained the following; "It seems that my time in this world is nearly over, and I am happy with the will of Hashem. Yet, my question stands: Am I obligated to undergo this great treatment in order to extend my life for another few weeks."

With a trembling voice he continued; "My family wants to do this in order to extend my life span by these few weeks - but" - he explained, "My life is not a life. I am unable to perform most of the mitzvas, due to my illness, and I am unable to accomplish what one should be accomplishing in life."

"So," continued the boy; "Should I go ahead with this treatment"?

Hearing this intense question, R' Tauber responded, "Let me ask you a question! What is the MOST important mitzva in the Torah?"

"The most important?!" asked the boy? "I don't know!"

"I'll tell you," responded R' Tauber. "The most important mitzva is the mitzva to LIVE. This is the greatest mitzva that we were commanded. This commandment overrides the other mitzvas, (with three exceptions to the rule).

"Now," questioned R' Tauber; "If there was a person that was an elderly paralyzed person in a coma, and in order for him to live ONE more minute it would require that all the Yidden would have to forsake all the mitzvas on his behalf, what is the ruling in this case?

"Should we extend his life by having all the Yidden transgress the Torah? Or - should we let him die one-minute-earlier, in order to prevent many Yidden from transgressing the prohibitions of the Torah? What do you say?" asked R' Tauber?

The boy was speechless.

"The halacha in this situation is that the entire Klal Yisroel must transgress the entire Torah in order to keep this one-person alive. Even if this would be for the duration of just one-minute!"

"This teaches us the value of oneminute-of-life". With this, he concluded; "I can't tell you that you must undergo this treatment, as the Rav has previously told you that this is not an obligation. Yet you must understand what we are dealing with."

"With that being the halacha," continued R' Tauber "If you undertake this treatment, you will be showing the world the price of LIFE. By accepting this great test, you will be My-Rebbi-For-Life, as you will be teaching me and the world the true price to pay for life." And with that he hung-up the phone.

A few days later R' Tauber received a call from the boy's father telling him that the boy had accepted to undergo this treatment. Also, ever since that conversation the boy's smile never left his face, despite what he was going through. This powerful story teaches us the immense value that we are all truly gifted with! - Everything is a present from Hashem. He decided it is not good anymore for her to possess these earrings.




