mentioned children have an exsensitivity to treme the taste of bitter and this serves as an extra protection from poisonous or toxic foods.

Adults don't have this extra sensitivity, but nonetheless, Hashem also arranged for them a special protection.

Although the taste buds for bitter are found all over the tongue, just like all the other taste buds are found all over the tongue, the back of the tongue has extra sensitivity to the taste of bitter. Therefore, if something poisonous or toxic, which very often has a bitter taste to them, gets near the back of the mouth, the bitter taste buds sound the alarm. This is a warning to the person to be aware and careful not to swallow it and not allow it to come into the internal system and bloodstream because it can be very dangerous.

Just like there is extra security by the entrance to any sensitive location, like an important government office or a bank, so too Hashem put an alarm system by the entrance of our body – the food pipe – to protect our important and sensitive bodies.

There is a fact about taste buds

that many people don't know.

Taste buds are temporary; they are constantly disappearing and being replaced.

Taste buds last for around two weeks before they are finally finished. Only two weeks, that's a very short lifespan, which means we can go through 2,000 sets of taste buds in our life - that's a lot.

Perhaps the wisdom of Hashem in creating us this way, is that the taste buds are tiny, invisible hair like creations. They can be easily be damaged or destroyed, especially in a busy place like the mouth.

When a person burns his tongue, for example, the taste buds in that area get damaged. If we only had one set of taste buds for our lifetime, just like we only have one set of ears and eyes for our lifespan, it would be the end of our taste buds for life when they would get burnt or damaged.

Therefore, Hashem made them constantly renew themselves. That way we have working taste buds for our whole life. What a wonderful chessed Hashem!

Q. I've been faced with various difficulties. As a result, I started investing in creating a relationship with Hakadosh Baruch Hu. Every day, I daven that I should feel Hakadosh Baruch Hu's presence, and that He should show me that He's with me wherever I go.

But ever since I started, I've been faced with more challenges than before. Not only don't I feel that Hashem is close, it feels like I'm being rejected. It seems that Hashem is saying that He's not interested in having a relationship with me, and it's making me very discouraged.

A. The reason you feel discouraged is because you think, "If I feel close to Hashem, it's a sign that Hashem is happy with me. And if I don't feel His presence, it means that Hashem is distancing Himself from me."

However, the reality is exactly the opposite. Hashem actually gets a much greater nachas ruach from someone who works on avodas Hashem even though he's not 'feeling it'. This is the true demon-

stration of a person's devotion to Hashem.

Rav Yerucham Levovitz teaches that when we serve Hashem the best we can, even though it may be very lacking, in a certain bechinah, our avodas Hashem is even more precious than the avodah of great men many generations ago.

Therefore, even though you may not feel how happy Hashem is with you, you should know that Hashem is so proud of your efforts, and the difficulty that Hashem is giving you is just to make you an even greater person.

Q. We know that the point of a nisayon is elevate a person and bring him closer to Hashem. I'm currently being faced with an overwhelming nisayon. Although I'm doing my daily exercises to overcome, I'm constantly stumbling and becoming further from shleimus. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The shleimus achieved through a nisayon is not

necessarily by overcoming it with flying colors. Rather it's by reacting to the nisayon correctly. The way Hashem wants you to deal with it is by doing exercises to overcome it. Additionally, Hashem wants you not to fall apart if the outcome is not how you hoped, and to just continue exercising.

We find a similar concept with שעבוד מצרים. Klal Yisroel were sent to Mitzrayim to became purified – עור הברזל. Yet we find that Klal Yisroel descended to the מט' שערי טומאה.

It comes out, that although at times it may seem like we are losing out by the effects of a Nisayon, if we do whatever we can, ultimately, we will emerge even higher.

The unbelievable power of a good word

We recently went through the Yom Tov of Purim and there are truckloads of lessons to learn from this Yom Tov. However I would like to focus on one thing that applies to our preparation for the great Yom Tov of Pesach.

In the previous issue we discussed many of our great luxuries that Hashem has bestowed upon us. Now I would like to focus on something which we have in tremendous abundance and that is the vast amount of food that Hashem has bestowed upon us.

Now, before we start, the purpose of this article is not that we should get involved in constant eating. Rather, it is important that we recognize the wide varieties of foods that we have so that we should appreciate and understand Hashem's love for us.

A good start would be with the wide assortment of Mishloach Manos which we have [or had]. As you look at the wide assortment you can get a small glimpse of Hashem's love as He gives us such a variety.



If you want to get a broader glimpse, pay attention when you go shopping for Pesach. Firstly, look at the abundance of food that is found in our local stores, with so many different kinds of foods, produce, and spices. This will transform your shopping experience into the world of shira which is the essence of Pesach.

Rav Yisroel Brog delivered an eye-opening shiur, in which he said that if one could hear Hashem's Voice, he would hear Him saying, "Sheifelach, do you like your food? Do you want it with onion, garlic, white pepper, or black pepper?" The list goes on and on. There is such variety of different types of meat, of wines [as we experienced on Purim], and so much more.

[Rav Avigdor Miller zt" related that for a long period of time, he would stand each morning outside an Italian bakery for a few minutes each morning, waiting for a city bus, and he would just marvel at the numerous kinds of bread showcased in the front window.]

Now, the purpose of this is not that we become carried away in eating. Rather, we are looking to see how Hashem is such a Giver, and He wants us to enjoy our food. This will give us the opportunity to thank Hashem for His constant gifts.

As we prepare our homes for Pesach, we will be rummaging through our pantries, refrigerators, and the

like. It is recommended to stop and reflect on all the bracha that Hashem has bestowed upon us.

Look at the quantity and quality of food that we receive from Hashem, and this will get us started in thanking Hashem. This will also transform your house-cleaning from stress to serenity as you move from cabinet to cabinet full of gratitude to Hashem for all the food that He gives us.

We said in the Yotzros of Purim, "Haman did not remember that Shaul spared his grandfather's life." Amalek has no Hakoras Hatov because they are the epitome of wickedness. Therefore, when we rid our homes of chametz which represents the evil of Amalek, and we fill ourselves with gratitude at the same time, this is the true destruction of the Amalek which lies within us.

Rav Shimshon Pinkus zt"l related that when he was a young man, he

was an average Yeshiva bochur. There was one incident which propelled him to the awesome heights which he achieved.



One year, as he was finishing the bedikas chametz, he realized that he hadn't checked the attic. His first reaction was, "It probably doesn't need to be checked." Additionally, he was very worn out. However, he then realized that this was the Yetzer Hora talking.

He took hold of himself and climbed up to the attic and did an extensive bedika.

When he was finally finished he felt content. Moreover, he felt

uplifted. That year, at the Seder he felt exhilarated and joyful as he had never felt before. Rav Shimshon recounted that this Pesach was his "elevator," as he climbed to tremendous heights.

We can explain that the reason for this was because the love and devotion which he showed for Hashem by this special bedikas chametz wiped away the last vestiges of Amalek, and this enabled him to shine.

As we head toward the end of Adar and into the Chodesh haGeulah, we can also get into the elevator which is the Shofar Shel Moshiach. How can we do this?

By showing love for Hashem, His mitzvos, and His children. The pasuk states תצאו and we can explain this to mean that through the koach of Simcha and gratitude we will leave this golus - Amen!

Sitting next to the man was R'Yisroel of

Chortkov who turned to him and said: I do not envy you over this mitzvah because it will lead to great honor. I do envy you, however, for the mitzvah you performed secretly, the one that led to this one (see Avos 4:2). For that must have been a flawless mitzvah if it was capable of leading to a mitzvah as great as this one."

# LIVING WITH APPRECIATION

Parashas Pekudai teaches us that the structure of the Mishkan consisted of 100 sockets.

The Ba'al Haturim explains that Chazal instituted the recital of 100 berachos a day, based on the fact that the Mishkan consisted of 100 sockets (adanim). What is the connection between the mitzvah to recite 100 berachos daily and the sockets of the Mishkan?

The Chidushei HaRim explains that although nowadays we don't have an actual Mishkan, really every Jew is their own Mishkan! So just as the original Mishkan had 100 sockets that were its foundation, so too the blessings we make are the foundation on which the Shechinah rests within us! The Hebrew word for socket is adan, connected to the word adon, master. Each time we recite a berachah we are recognising Hashem as our Master, causing the Shechinah to rest upon us!

The Tur writes that in the times of David Hamelech there was a plague that caused 100 people to die each day. David Hamelech

saw with rauch hakodesh that this plague could be stopped if the people would recite 100 berachos daily. Shortly after the enactment, the plague indeed stopped! Due to this outcome, Chazal instituted the recital of 100 berachos daily.

Why did this institution have the power to stop such a deathly plague?

The Levush explains that the plague was caused by a lack of gratitude for our constant blessings. Bnei Yisrael were taking for granted the countless gifts that Hashem showered upon them each day. Therefore, to recite 100 berachos, expressing our gratitude constantly throughout our day, is the perfect rectification! After all, Hashem loves us more than we can possible imagine and each second He showers upon us countless gifts. After all we are alive! Each second Hashem gives us this incredible gift. Not to mention the numeorus other benefits we constantly gain from. We can see walk, talk, the list just goes on and on.

Reciting berachos is a greatway to express our gratitiude to Hashem for all our gifts and has a tremendous affect in Shmayim, as we see in the following story:

The Ohr Zarua writes that a man who recently passed away appeared to a Rav in his community in a dream. The man was wearing a beautiful crown and told the Rav that he was faring very well in the next world and was regarded in Gan Eden with the highest respect.

The Rav was surprised as this man was known for being very simple.

He explained that he was always particular to say his morning Berachos in a pleasant voice.

Due to this, he merited a high place in Olam Haba with a beautiful crown with leaves from Gan Eden.

The Ohr Zarua commented "I am publicizing this story in order that people will internalize the importance of saying berachos pleasantly, thereby meriting Gan Eden."

Lying in my night table is a remnant of the covid days.

It's called an oximeter.

Lot's of people bought one, in those days, to check out the oxygen level in their body.

The oximeter has a dual function setting, that allows you to see your pulse rate too.

All you have to do is clip it onto your finger.

I love to use it "just for the kicks", of checking out my vitals.

At the same time I'm also fascinated by the way it can get my life essential information of my oxygen and pulse so easily.

It's also a revealing experience for me, to realize what is going on inside of me, a whole day and night.

I breathe and I don't think about the oxygen that's being extracted from the air I'm breathing in.

Do I ever think about my life dependancy, on the extraordinary function of my lungs?

I'm breathing now as I'm writing this article, but am I really thinking about this important body function?

Barely!

Why? Why shouldn't I think about it, being that it's so essential to my life.

This entire minute I was.... Breathing. Breathing. Breathing...



I breathed every breath, without even having taken notice.

I breathe 24/7, and it's constantly being controlled, and continuously working.

When I look at the oximeter, it let's me.. let's call it.. "give a peek into my body".

The oximeter actually feels and detects the oxygen level in my blood stream, and the oxygen level being absorbed into the muscle tissue, and even into the skin of my finger.

Somehow that clicks in my mind.

Aha, so it's takeh true, and happening to me, now.

Same with the pulse.

Everyone can check their pulse, but when a tiny machine gives you your heart rate, and you even see it fluctuating, it sometimes hits you more, the factual, actual thing that is going on.

Maybe it's something psychological, like "if this little piece of plastic says witness to the miracle of being alive and breathing, then I can also agree to, and acknowledge the fact that, "I'm a breathing miracle ".

I sometimes like to play a little game with it.

I'll do something with a little more movement and I watch the heart rate go up a bit.

I'll do something more strenuous and that'll mediately send a clear message to the pulse detecter on the oximeter monitor, hereby driving the numbers updward.

You can see it all on the screen, as it monitors move by move, play by play, pulse going up, pulse going down.

I like to play the same little game with my oxygen level.

I can make manipulate the level oxygen

Continued in my body, depending on how much air I inhale, and how deep I breathe.

I can easily see a difference between the air in a closed room to the air coming in from outside the house.

I watch the oxygen level numbers, going up and down on the screen.

It's fun, fascinating and interesting to see, what's going on in my body.

Most importantly it's a great idea for me to remember, to say thank You Hashem for the oxygenated air, lungs, and the whole package, of the completely complex, pulmonary and respiratory systems.

My heart is pumping day and night, circulating the blood in my body.

Before it pumps it throughout the body, it sends it to the lungs to get some freshly absorbed oxygen, that the lungs extracted, from the fresh air that I breathed.

You can even see that "double pump" as it shows you a double jump on the graphlike format on the screen, of the oximeter.

One pump to the lungs and next to the whole body.



All the while there are various valves operating in an awesome fashion of opening and closing perfectly. In order to make sure that there isn't any backflow of blood.

Perfect performance.!

The story is told of a Yid living in Morocco whose neighbor was the son-in-law of the king. From time to time, the king would visit his son-in-law and daughter, though he'd come in the middle of the night to avoid fanfare and to minimize security issues.

One day, the Yid asked his neighbor if he would be able to meet the king for a few minutes when he next arrived, and the king's son-in-law said he would try to arrange it.

A few weeks later, the Yid got a knock on his door from one of the king's officials, informing him that he would be able to meet the king when he next visited, and that he must come promptly at 11:30.

At the scheduled time, the Yid knocked on the door, and the king greeted him warmly. The two conversed for a while, discussing various aspects of life and religion. In the conversation, the Yid mentioned that his son was turning thirteen years old, explaining the concept of a bar mitzvah and how at this age he becomes obligated in the fulfillment of the mitzvos. He continued by explaining the different customs that are celebrated at a bar mitzvah.

After the conversation ended, the king said, "I want to give your son a gift for his special day!" The king took out his checkbook and wrote a check in the sum of

\$50,000.

The father was stunned—fifty thousand dollars!

"Your majesty," the Yid said, "had you given him \$2,000 for his bar mitzvah, that would be an exceptional gift. But \$50,000?!"

The king waived his hand dismissively. "\$2,000 may be a generous gift for a wealthy person, but not for a king. When the king gives a gift, it calls for \$50,000. Any less would be an embarrassment to my status!"

If this is true regarding a human king, how much more so does this apply to Hashem, who has all the money and power in the world! Not only that, he yearns and wants to shower us with all the brachah that He has to offer! We just have to call out to him.

This concept we see from an inspiring story:

A man from the United States came to visit R' Shlomo Zalman Auerbach a few days before Rosh Hashanah to receive a brachah for the new year. Rav Shlomo Zalman asked the man if he knew anyone who was Struggling financially.

"Yes," the man replied. "I'm aware of several."

"Tell me," Rav Shlomo Zalman continued, "have you ever heard them davening that they should merit purchasing the Ford Motor Company (at that time, the com-

pany valued \$140 billion)?"

"Of course not! That's not realistic! Instead, let them ask that Hashem should cover their month's rent and tuition..." responded the man.

R' Shlomo Zalman then continued to explain his response was mistaken:

In the haftorah of Rosh Hashanah, we read the story of Chana. She was childless and pleaded to Hashem to have a child. When she davened, she asked that her child be equal to Moshe and Aharon (Brachos 31b).

How can she be so brazen and ask for a child equal to both of them, if the Torah states that there never was and never will be a person as great as Moshe Rabbeinu? Here she is, waiting to have a child, and when she's asking for one, she asks for one as great as Moshe and Aharon?

R' Shlomo Zalman went on to explain that this wasn't foolish, as Hashem has no constrictions, and therefore a person can daven for whatever he wants without limitations. And therefore, the poor could just as well daven to get such riches.

We are so lucky that we have such an outstanding advantage. Hashem has all the power in the world, and therefore when we daven we can daven for anything we want, even if it's out of realm (Ohel Moshe, R"H, p. 493).















































# YES! HASHEM LOVES YOU!

# Reaching Out to One Another

Hashem is the best boss to work for! Working to fulfill the will of Hashem is much easier than working to try to fulfill the will of human beings! To impress another person, one needs concrete results. Putting in effort is not enough, one must produce a final product, but Hashem does not need a final product! To impress Hashem all one needs is to attempt to do Hashem's mitzvos. Regardless of the results Hashem will be glad. Indeed, Serving Hashem is always a win-win situation! This is a powerful lesson that can greatly enhance our joy in serving Hashem, but it needs lots of review so that it sinks into our hearts!

So many of us have dreams and great ideas about how we can help other yidden both in ruchniyus and gashmiyus. What stops us from actualizing them is our fear of failure. What if we devote our time and energy and we don't succeed. That would be such a wasted effort and embarrassing as well. The way we can help ourselves navigate these concerns is by first reminding ourselves that there are no wasted efforts when it comes to avodas Hashem. Secondly that a yid does not need to impress other people he only needs to impress Hashem!

In Yeshivas Navordok they took it a step further and would combine 'working for the klal' together with working on their middos. They would encourage the talmidim to specifically jump into these kinds of projects in order to train themselves to fearlessly serve Hashem without needing to impress others. Doing something proactive is scary as it puts our 'kavod' at stake lest we

fail and is therefore a golden opportunity to work on only seeking Hashem's approval! This is a most powerful way to work on our middos but one must have a rebbe who knows him to guide him.

R' Golombeck has a talmid Yehuda\* who started a beautiful learning program in his shul for bein hazmanim. Besides bringing a hot breakfast every morning, he offers a stipend to whoever learns for the full morning seder. Many have testified how his program greatly enhanced their bein hazmanim and thank him for arranging everything. Yehuda said that although building Torah is always a great endeavor, his true motivation to open this program was to work on his midos and overcome his nature! Yehuda said how his comfort zone is to stay far away from the limelight due to his fear of failing. But R Golombeck gave him a Navordok'eh chinuch and encouraged him to work on overcoming his need to make a good impression on people! Although in the beginning stages of the program Yehuda was still quite nervous and concerned about what people would say about his Kollel, over time having to deal with many people and situations he has developed into a secure and courageous servant of Hashem. He is much less anxious about what other opinions of him are!
