This happened a few days ago here in Eretz Yisrael, on a Friday shortly before Shabbat, in a large 'Yochananof' supermarket in Ramat Hasharon.

It was a stormy day, and an hour before closing, there was a power failure. The supermarket was bursting with shoppers - with their carts packed to the brim for erev Shabbos needs. The registers were down, and it was impossible for customers to check out.

The supermarket manager had to make a quick decision. Seeing the people with their Shabbos

purchases, the manager, Tzvi Abraham, announced to customers: "Take your groceries and pay next week."

Nearly one-hundred customers left with their purchases unpaid.

On Sunday, most of the customers came to pay for their shopping, with the rest coming over the next few days.

The store manager who was interviewed said that he couldn't believe it: Customers came back with lists they had prepared, and photos of their purchases with the barcodes.

More than 37,000 shekel worth of goods were paid for, and the supermarket didn't lose a penny!

WRITE DOWN HASH-

EM'S CHASSADIM

Hi. I was just listening to a Thursday-night-shmooze by Rav Simcha Bunim and he said over from Rav Shlomo Zalman Auerbach zatzal that a Rosh Kollel once came to him and said that he was stressed out. He had chovos for something. So he came to R' Shlomo Zalman to ask him what to do.

R' Shlomo Zalman told him, "First, you have to get rid of the pressure.

What you should do, is take a small notebook, and keep it in your pocket. Write down every time you see that Hashem helped you, Hashem cheered you up, or, you saw hashgacha."

He told the Rosh Kollel that he is mavtiach that he would have yeshuos, and that the stress would go away!

When we chew our food, we break it down into small pieces. This is important, because in addition to the necessity of preparing our food to be safe for swallowing, it is

also important for our digestion.

Digestion begins in the mouth. This process happens through special digestive enzymes that Hashem put in our saliva. Our saliva contains enzymes that have the ability to break down starches. It also has different enzymes that dissolve fats. These special enzymes mix with our food and start the digestive process of breaking the food down to its small components.

If our food was not chewed the saliva and enzymes would only have contact with the outer, exterior part of the food, which is a very small percentage of the food. Chewing exposes the food to connect to the digestive enzymes to an incomparable degree. This can be compared to making a potato kugel with whole potatoes. All of the oil and spices would only reach the outer surface of the potatoes and not mix with them. We would not end up with a very good potato kugel. Hashem gave us teeth with the ability to chew to help our digestion.

As we mentioned, we use our teeth

to make sure our food is the right size for swallowing so it doesn't pose a danger. Young infants, who don't have teeth and don't know how to chew, don't eat solids, so this is not a problem.

Sometimes, accidentally, a solid object makes its way into an infant's mouth whether it's a food or a foreign object. This creates an obvious danger. Hashem, in His chochmah, built in an automatic protection. When a hard object enters an infant's mouth, he automatically pushes his tongue forward, making it hard for the object to enter his mouth. This is medically referred to as the 'tongue thrust reflex' this reflex works automatically, like all reflexes that we have, it pushes the danger away. The infants are too small to protect themselves so Hashem protects them. This reflex is not found by adults. If an adult has this reflex it is a problem that needs treatment. This reflex will impair his speech and the growth of his teeth.

Only infants who don't speak and don't have teeth have this reflex. It miraculously disappears between 4-6 months. The time that the child's teeth begin to grow in. He begins to have the ability to chew solids by himself. That's when he loses this reflex of pushing solids away.

Hashem's ways are truly wondrous!

Bitachon Perspective

Q. Our car broke down, and we can't afford to buy a new car. There are so many things which have to be taken care of, and while I used to be able to take care of ten errands a day, now I can only take care of two. I feel so stuck and frustrated. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

WITH R' ZEVY GOLOMBRI

A. The reason you feel stuck is because you think, "In order to accomplish things, I need a car. But now that I don't have a car, I'm not able to carry out all those things that I could've taken care of."

Now, if the world would work with cause-and-effect, you would indeed be stuck. However, we know that Hashem is the One who is in control over every event that happens. And the 'laws of nature' are merely the means in which Hashem uses to carry out His will. However, in truth, a person is not impacted at all by cause-and-effect. Rather it's Hashem's will which has effect on events.

Therefore, it would be a mistake to think that the reason you can't accomplish as much as you would like is because of your car.

Hashem already decided on Rosh Hashanah exactly how

much you will be able to accomplish through the year.

If Hashem decreed that you will be able take care of something, He will make it get taken care of even without a car. And if there is something Hashem did not decree that should be taken care of, then even with a car, Hashem will not allow you to take care of it.

When you understand that Hakadosh Baruch Hu is really the one who is taking care of every detail in your life, and the help from your car is just an illusion, Hashem will show you openly that He is there for you, and you will see extra bracha in your life.

Q. The wallpaper in my house needed to be replaced, and I wanted to hire a professional worker to do the job. But mv husband said that he knows someone who could do the same job for much cheaper. So we used my husband's worker, but he ended up doing a very lousy job. Now I look at the wallpaper, and my heart sinks. It looks terrible. If only my husband would have agreed to use my worker, we would have beautiful wallpaper.

Now the house looks even worse than it did originally.

A. Try to zoom into your emotions and see what's bothering you. You're upset at your husband, because you think that all because of him your house doesn't look nice.

You have to realize that the way your house turned out has nothing to do with your husband. It came out that way because that's the way Hashem wanted your house to look. And if you had used the professional worker, it also would've happened.

Regarding your disappointment over the way the house looks, the Stiepler teaches: every bit of tza'ar and agmas nefesh that we are deserving of was already nigzar on Rosh Hashana. It could have happened through car accidents and trips to the hospital, R"L. You should be grateful to Hashem that you were yoztei your allotted tza'ar through lousy placed wallpaper.

Q. In A Life With Bitachon I hear that any tza'ar and agmas nefesh that a person experiences saves him from car accidents and trips to the hospital, R"L.

derstand that these inconveniences take the place of minor yissurim. But why should it take the place of major yissurim such as car accidents or trips to the hospital?

A. Rabbeinu Yonah teaches that when a person is mekabel minor yissurim be'hava, it is such a tremendous z'chus and makes him so close to Hashem, that he receives his kapparah through minor yissurim, and he no longer needs major yissurim in order to cleanse him.

Q. I'm presently redesigning my house. There are many details of the house that I want the house to look a certain way, but the contractor has a different idea how the house should look. And we end up going back and forth about many small details.

Should I be busy with sorting out all the details to make the house look exactly the way I want it to. Or should I not make a big deal over the details, and leave it up to the contractor's discretion. And if it doesn't come out perfect in my eyes it will be a kappara for my aveiros, and the agmas nefesh will save me from car accidents and trips to the hospital R"L. Which is the correct approach?

A. If you are going to be able to be mekal besimcha the way the house comes out, even if it doesn't come out exactly the way you wanted, and you'll tell yourself that not everything in life has to be exactly the way you want it – that would be the best. And yes, it will serve as a kappara for your aveiros.

But if you're not on this level, and you're going to be constantly kicking yourself, 'I should've told the contractor to do things differently', in that case you should do whatever is going to give more menuchas hanefesh in the long run.

Q. I'm a very busy mother and there are so many things that I need to accomplish every day. My day feels like one big marathon running from one errand to the next without ever getting to the end of the list. What's the correct perspective about having such an overwhelming schedule?

A. You have to remember: Everything about your year was already nigzar on Rosh Hashanah. It was already nigzar what you will accomplish each day and what you won't. Which errands will go easily and which ones won't. It was nigzar exactly how much or little stress you will have to go through each day.

Now, your job is only to make a checklist and try to do whatever you can. Results, outcomes and accomplishments are not in your control.

However, what is in your control, is how you will go about doing your chores. Will you do it with the feeling of יכוחי ועוצם ידי, "The more I frantically run about trying to get things done the more I will accomplish?", or will you have a healthy state of mind and do whatever you can without stepping over the boundaries of menuchas hanefesh and simchas hachayim, and leave the rest up to Hashem.

When we study wildlife with all its thousands of amazing creatures that were created for us, our hearts will be bursting with love for Hashem. When we study the world of trees and the vast assortments of plants and flowers it will bring us so much joy.

When we see how much wisdom Hashem put into this creation, that even a small ant has unlimited amounts of wisdom, this will bring us to praise Hashem non-stop. As we see Dovid Hamelech in Tehillim praising Hashem non-stop for the beautiful world as he bursts out with the famous words "Ma rabu masecha Hashem." I believe that he wasn't merely thanking Hashem for creating all these beautiful creatures, he was also thanking Hashem for everything that Hashem created for him. This is a whole new dimension, and a refreshing outlook as well.

Therefore, we cannot live in a shell. We need to do chessed with others, as it says "Olam chessed yibane".

We are currently standing in the Yemai Sefira. These days are a mixture of joy and sadness. On one hand these days are the elevated days between Pesach and Shavuos as we count to Matan Torah. These are the days that we got back our world our freedom through receiving the holy Torah. The Ramban says that these days are like Chol hamoed.

At the same time these days represent the fact that the great Talmidim of Rav Akiva didn't give their friends their proper due. Our Sheleimus comes when we recognize our greatness as we strive to grow, and at the same time we are "k'ish echad b'lev echad", as they achieved at Har Sinai. The Talmidim of Rabbi Akiva were giant but they did not give the proper chashivus to their fellow chveirim.

Therefore, as we go full gear ahead as we build our relationship with Hashem, by coming to the realization that everything in this fantastic world was created for us. Additionally, Yetzias Mitzrayim and all the Torah and mitzvos was all for me personally as well. We will treat our family and friends with the utmost respect and love as we pump them with chizuk until they feel so elevated. This will bring us a tremendous shelaimos and this will for sure bring down the Bais hamikdash speedily on the highest level bimiheira biyameinu Amein.

Living With Appreciation By: R' Daniel Shasha

Our parashah discusses the mitzvah of bringing the korban omer. Each year, on the second day of Pesach, we were commanded to bring an offering of barley to the Beis Hamikdash. Only afterwards it is permitted for us to eat the new crop of grain. What is the reason behind this mitzvah?

The Sefer HaChinuch (302) explains that it is in order to contemplate the tremendous chessed that Hashem does for us each year, always providing us with new produce! We bring a portion of the new crop as an offering, to recall the great kindnesses of Hashem for giving us produce, before we benefit from it. After all, each bite of food we eat has so many factors involved in its production and consists of numerous miracles. Food is what keeps us alive, and Hashem in His loving kindness causes many miracles to occur in its production.

Rav Chaim Freidlander zatzal lists some examples. He explains, let's explore how such a tiny seed has so much potential to produce tons of fruits. This seed is minute yet contains an incredible amount of potential and has the ability to produce a countless amount of produce! What's more, this tiny seed first decays until it is basically non- existent; it then miraculously begins to sprout, providing us with an abundance of produce.

We refer to phenomena like Techiyas Hamaisim as a miracle. Asks Rav Freedlander, is the production of our produce any less of a miracle? After all, this seed, which almost completely decayed miraculously went on to produce delicious



crops! Many other miracles occur too. For example, how rain is formed and then helps our produce grow, is also miraculous. For this reason, Chazal instituted that we praise Hashem for rain specifically in the blessing of the Shemoneh Esrei which deals with Techiyas Hameisim (Based on Sifsei Chayim Moadim 3 p. 29-36).

Rabbi Avigdor Miller was mesmerized by the incredible phenomenon of seeds. "They are more amazing than finding a free coupon inside an apple for another apple", he would say, "since each seed is ingrained with so much information that it could produce an entire apple tree!"

He had a collection of all different types of seeds in his study, in order to contemplate these incredible objects. There was a time when he even carried seeds in his pocket, to be constantly inspired by these wondrous items.

One time he excitedly called over his grandchildren, saying, "look I have a special gift for you." To their surprise he didn't pull out a chocolate bar or a toy but rather a bag of seeds and a microscope. "I benefited so much from these" he said "and I have no room to keep them so they are yours as a gift. To think that each seed is a library and a factory! It has all the information to produce a fruit bearing tree, all in this tiny seed" he exclaimed passionately. (Rabbi Avigdor Miller, His Life and His Revolution p.270)

wisdom in creating a good sturdy and innovative bottle.

It's a chochma that Hashem gave us humans.

To create containers, or "Keilim "-utensils.

It should be a good enough to hold, and continue to contain it's contents in a way that will be spill free, non leaking, fresh, secure and safe.

It should be able to stand up to a certain level of use or abuse.

It should stand balanced straight and not tip over when placed on a flat surface.

The old fashioned way of making pottery or the hard work that was once needed to create containers of wood or metal, is something that is so abstract, that it's hard to imagine that way of life as being the norm.

Hashem opened up a wellspring of knowledge to mankind in the last few hundred years that transformed the world into a "different world".

The massive amount of machine produced materials of glass, plastic, tin, and aluminum, have taken over the market.


They are now the most popular and available raw materials with which to make utensils, primarily for short term life of storage and uses.

There's plenty of glassware and metal ware, that are produced with more style and strength.



Understandably, those are intended for long lasting use.

Even nowadays that this chochma is already known, it's still needed to be studied and learned, to understand the process of creating vessels that can be used for different types of needs.



There are actually a few types of professional courses that can be taken to learn how to construct a proper bottle that is strong enough and properly designed to stand straight, and to ultimately satisfy the needs of the person that will be using the product.

I have a friend who is an architect. When he went to architecture school, he was surprised to find that in the next room to where he was taking his course, there were classes on bottle - making.

He listened in, and was fascinated by the amount of information that was being taught, just to acquire the knowledge and the "know - how" of making a single simple bottle!

It's not a simple matter at all!

Let's introduce a little bit of careful inspection of a simple looking bottle.

Take a look at the bottom of a container.

Notice the hardened edges at the bottom of the container or bottle.

There is also more strength at the edges of the square container going upward until the hardened handle, and the tough top and cover or cap.

This way the bottle won't sag, bulge, burst, or spring a leak, when being handled or even mishandled.

Take a look at the indentation on the underneath of the bottle.

That's for balance!

How tall is the bottle, and how wide?

Calculate that with the weight of the actual container and it's contents. That'll all be included in designing the correct balanced thickness, and shape of the bottle, so that it won't easily shake, bulge, or tip over.

We once again shouldn't take these seemingly simple things for granted.

Just because they are so easily available and are even disposable that doesn't diminish their importance, and the ongoing comfort and convenience, that they give us each and every day.

Thank you Hashem!!

The materials for creating the bottle are B"H so abundant and cheap that we tend to forget to appreciate the fact that they're all presents from Hashem.

Crystal, glass and chinaware, are materials that were hard to come by years ago.

The process of turning rock, sand, and clay, into fancy glass and earthenware was very lengthy and tiresome.

In result, they were very expensive and were usually used only by the upper class rich people.

Nowadays they are so cheap that everyone can afford



them, and even feel free to throw some types of them away in the recycling bin.

We don't even think twice about them, as being a good thing to have, and maybe hold on to, and save, at least for a little while.

There's a Rebbe that I know who wants to bring across the point of the worth of even disposable plastic spoons.

He is on a mission to make sure that his talmidim appreciate the little things too.

He reuses the same plastic spoon for his daily coffee, that he takes into class.

He keeps it up for a very long

time, just to make sure that the children learn how to appreciate a simple disposable spoon more.

They are basically, for the most part, designed to be used for any short amount of time, and alot are intended to be for a one time use.

In essence, as time goes by they keep on increasing the new reality of the "Age of the Disposable"

All that said and done, still doesn't mean that we should thank Hashem less!

To the contrary, we have the obligation to thank Hashem that many times more!

We are so lucky to have such a tremendous amount of utensils, in such abundance, that we can even feel free to dispose them after using them just once!

We should be thankful to Hashem for all that.

As the days of Sefiras Ha'omer pass we feel the intense joy and pride filling the air, awaiting for the day that we stood at Har Sinai. We thank Hashem for giving us the most valuable, treasured and dear gift: the Torah and mitzvos.

I would like to share an astonishing and breath-taking story that I saw. It will give us an appreciation for the value of the many mitzvos that we're privileged to do.

R' Elchanan Wasserman zt"l approached the Chofetz Chaim with the following dilemma:

They were living through a harsh depression, and there was simply no food for the bnei ha'yeshiva. What could they do to provide them with food to eat?

R' Wasserman suggested that since "One moment of Olam Habah is worth more than all the pleasures of this world," he was willing to give away one second of his Olam Habah in order for them to have food to eat.

The Chofetz Chaim replied, "The exchange is simply not worth it, and in Shamayim they wouldn't let it go! Even all the bnei ha'yeshiva receiving food doesn't come close to the value of one second of the next world."

The Chofetz Chaim continued with the following mashal:

"Imagine that you walk into a grocery holding a valuable and priceless diamond. You ask the cashier to buy a sugar cube, and you want to pay with the diamond. The owner says that he can't accept the diamond as payment. You tell him to just give you the change. "I can't give you change," he says, "because the diamond has so much more value!"

The Chofetz Chaim explained that one second of Olam Habah is far greater than supplying all bnei Torah with food. Therefore, Hashem would not allow exchanging one second of Olam Habah - for anything on this world.

This lesson applies to each and every mitzvah that we're fortunate, privileged and lucky to fulfill.

There's one additional point worth mentioning.

The level of our generation makes our mitzvos even more valuable. Because of our generation's level... our mitzvos are so much more valuable and more special, as we shall see from an unbelievable story of the great Chofetz Chaim:

Before the war, the Chofetz Chaim saw the town baker one day looking down and broken. He asked him if there was anything he could do to help him?

He responded: "Every day I make fresh bread for the city, but all I hear are complaints and criticisms. Each and every person has a different reason why he dislikes the way I bake: this one says that it's overdone, this one says it's underdone, the next says it's too salty... — I can't handle all the moaning and grumbling!"

A short while later, the Chofetz

Chaim again met the baker, but this time he seemed much happier. "What changed?" asked the Chofetz Chaim. "Did you change your recipe since the last time we spoke?"

"Not at all," the baker responded. "Now that there's a war, and bread is hard to come by, everyone who gets even a simple piece of bread is happy, and therefore no one complains anymore."

After hearing this, the Chofetz Chaim said that the same is true with our generation. In comparison to the previous generations, who were giants that were very particular with their avodah, we might believe Hashem doesn't consider our avodah anything of note. However, as we approach the end of the long galus, we must remember how Hashem is happy with any avodah we do, big or small.

Even if it is not on the level of the previous generations, Hashem nevertheless is still very happy with them.

This is an astonishing chizuk for us. We must remember that WHATEVER type of mitzvah we do is cherished, adorned, loved and admired by Hashem. After doing a mitzvah we can't let the yetzer Harrah double guess us: was it done properly, your missing... and ... and...! EVERY mitzvah done is amazing!!

There are situations where we have resentment and as a result find it very difficult to have an ayin tova.

One such situation is when we have been slighted or let down by someone we had previously benefited in a significant way. For example, if Reuven helps Shimon to move apartments, and spends hours shlepping boxes and furniture, he expects that in the event that he needs a favor from Shimon, his request will be received in a respectable manner.

When Shimon balks at the request, Reuven will have to work extra hard to overcome and judge Shimon favorably. The following story (1158 איש לרעהו גליון) will hopefully give chizzuk for anyone who had such an experience.

There was a woman who was trying to get her son into a good Yeshiva. Her son was not from the top students, but was a diligent, hard- working boy with very good middos. The problem was that he applied somewhat late, and most of the yeshivos had closed registration.


The mother turned to a highly respected community leader for help. This man gave all kinds of free advice to many of the Yeshivos where this boy had applied. The Yeshivos had benefited tremendously from his sage advice. He told the mother not to worry as he was certain that all doors were open to him. He was therefore surprised when door after door was closed on him. Had he been trying to push a challenging boy into the yeshiva, he would have been more understanding, but that was not the case here. He believed that for everything he had done for these institutions, they should show him הכרת הטוב

This man went to speak to Rav Aharon Leib Shteinman to help him understand how these institutions could turn their back on him. He told the man that although his own Yeshiva, "Orchos Torah" was full, he would consider taking in the boy. He told this man to be in touch.

The next week, this man received a phone call from the Rebbi who oversaw accepting new boys. He was told that the boy was being accepted if this man fulfilled a condition that Rav Aharon Leib specified. He was pretty sure that meant a monetary commitment to the Yeshiva, but went to meet with the Rebbi to find out what this mysterious condition was.

When he was seated in the office, the Rebbi told him that the boy was accepted as long as... this man would forgive all the Yeshivos that closed their doors on him and that he would commit to continuing to help those Yeshivos!

When the man heard this condition, he began to cry and fulfilled the condition!



In the tefila of Adon Olam that we say every morning in davening and again before we go to sleep, it says: "וצור חבלי בעת צרה" - Hashem is my Rock Who helps me in time of trouble.

Hashem is always there for us. Even when things don't seem so good we know that Hashem is right by our side taking care of us. He never leaves us alone.

The following is an exclusive interview by the Spring Hill Times with Tzvi, a truck driver for the CR England trucking. He tells the world for the first time, his amazing story of how Hashem performed miracle after miracle to save him from a certain death.

Tzvi:

First let me tell you a little about myself.

I'm a simple religious Jew. I'm 59 years old and I live alone. I'm a truck driver for the CR England trucking and I deliver in a number of states. When this story took place, I was driving a brand new 2023 Truck & Trailer with a sleeper cabin in the back and a trailer totaling 73 feet long.

Spring Hill Times:

Okay Tzvi, we want to hear your incredible miracle. First of all we are very thankful that you agreed to be interviewed by the Spring Hill Times. We understand that we are the first news outlet to interview you.

Tzvi: Yes, thank you! I got calls from others and I refused to be interviewed. However, I agreed to do so for a paper dedicated to spreading



Hashem's kindness and miracles because this is about Hashem's glory, not me. I am very interested in spreading this story as I know it will help bring others close to Hashem.

Spring Hill Times: Wow, thank you! Please tell us how did it all start?

Tzvi:

Well, it was close to Purim. I made sure that my runs were in the Colorado area so that I would be close to Denver where I would be able to celebrate Purim. It was Wednesday, March 1st, and I was driving my truck, in blizzard conditions, in Glenwood Canyon, which is a dangerous road in the Rocky Mountains even when weather conditions are ideal..

All I can remember was that I was driving and I suddenly felt like I was being attacked by a flock of big black birds. I was trying to push them away. Now, really there were no birds. What was happening was that I was beginning to lose my eyesight and my eyes were seeing black dots, which my brain interpreted as black birds. I am left handed and with my right hand I was trying to push them away but they weren't going away. Then I tried pushing them away with my left hand which was holding the steering wheel, but then I realized that my left hand wouldn't budge. It was paralyzed and stopped working. I didn't know then was that I was experiencing a stroke.

So, I was driving with no cargo in 50 mile per hour winds, making it much harder to control the truck, and there were other cars and trucks on the road too. It was severe blizzard weather and I started to lose control of the truck. The truck started swaying and it started to what we call in truck terms to "jack-knife," that means that the truck and trailer started turning different ways. I remember that at that time my body started to feel cold like ice and I was losing it.

Spring Hill Times:

Oh my, that must have been scary, what did you do next?

Tzvi:

I remember that I just started to daven to Hashem and this what I remember saying. "Hashem if it's my time to go then I'm prepared to die. But there are so many innocent people on the road and if the truck starts to jack-knife then I would chas v'shalom take 20 people off the mountain with me. I don't want to kill people on my way out. Even if it's their time too, please don't use me as the messenger for that."

I saw the Edwards exit and that is all I remember. Because I had a stroke my brain wasn't working.

Spring Hill Times:

So what happened, where was the truck and how were you not injured?

Tzvi:

So this is exactly the biggest part of my miracle. I have no recollection of anything that happened after I said my prayer. The next thing I know, the truck is safely off the highway parked calmly in a safe and secure spot with me lying on the floor.

In fact, what's amazing is that the trucks have a route map. It records the exact route that the truck takes. If you look at the route (see picture) it says that the truck went off the next exit and went through three traffic circles which trucks as big as mine aren't supposed to go through. Then it parked at a safe and secure spot. All in blizzard weather. I have no recollection of how this happened.

Spring Hill Times:

You mean to say that somehow you got the truck off the highway during your stroke and you were in a safe spot and you have no idea how you did it?

Tzvi:

No! It is hard to believe but that is what happened. Hashem sent an angel to guide the truck safely off the highway which is extremely complicated even without a stroke during blizzard conditions.

My boss reviewed the dash-cam and even told me afterwards that I should get an award for driving the truck in a most heroic way. But I told them that it was G-d, because there is no way I could've done that and I have absolutely no recollection of any of it. It was an impossible act of driving. It was Hashem, just like He did קריעת ים סוף.

Another amazing miracle is that the truck was left running and it was registered on the company computer log as on standby, idle, (which is why

the company wasn't alarmed that anything was wrong). All the safety breaks for

the truck and trailer were in place, a process that typically takes two hands, as if someone who was healthy and had a brain to think made sure every last thing was done perfectly. This was a major part of the miracle for it was 18 degrees below zero temperature and if the truck wasn't turned on, with the heat set at 70 degrees, I would've frozen to death chalilah. It had to be a shaliach from Hashem, there is no other explanation.


Spring Hill Times:


Wow! This an enormous miracle! So what happened when you awoke. How long after you blanked out did you awaken?

Tzvi:

When I awoke, I noticed my phone a foot away from where I was lying. However, being that I only had my right hand working, it was like a million miles away for me. Most of my body was paralyzed. I could not get up and reach for the phone. But I started to try to pull myself up with my right hand. It seemed liked hours until I finally was able to get a hold of it.

When I finally got the phone, I didn't know what to do. Remember, my brain wasn't working. It took time until I finally realized that I had to call for help. I somehow got the phone to turn. Since my left hand wasn't working, I was only able to touch the phone while holding it in my right hand (which was shaking) by touching the buttons with my nose. I then hit a button and I opened my friend's last conversation with me. He is actually from Denver. I then somehow recorded a voice note to him which transcribed my message to him. It wasn't perfect but it was clear that some emergency was happening and I was able to send him my location too. Now this is all documented on his phone and mine so there is witness to this part which





is amazing!

Spring Hill Times:

Wow! The miracle is getting bigger by the minute. So, what happened next, did Dan realize that you were in trouble?

Tzvi:

We will put Dan onto the interview soon for he could fill in many of the details that I cannot, since I was in the middle of a stroke. But after I contacted Dan I was still going in and out of consciousness, I remember davening at one point to Hashem that I didn't want to die alone lying in the truck.

As I lay there and felt my body shutting down, I said the י"ג מדות של רחמים (thirteen attributes) and the Ist pasuk of the Shema. All of a sudden I was talking to my mother a"h. She passed away in 2007.

I never had a dream before about her since her passing. I remember as clear as day just as I am talking to you now. My mother was right there in the truck, she was talking to me and she called me, "Tz-vialeh," as she did when I was a young child. Her arms were around me and she kept saying to me, "Tzvialeh its okay. It's not your time and they will come get you."

If you look at the company computer log it's recorded that I pulled off the highway on March 1st at 3:15 pm. When I contacted Dan it's recorded on my phone that it was after 5pm on March 2nd! The doctor's say that there is no medical explanation as to how I'm alive after a full stroke and so much time elapsed. You could even see on the CAT scan that my right side of the brain was all dead tissue and now it's starting to reroute itself from the left. We will talk more about this later

Spring Hill Times:

Wow! That is truly amazing! We will now introduce Dan to fill in details to this part of the story.

So Dan where were you when Tzvi contacted you?

Dan:

I was about 20 minutes east of Vail, 40 minutes from Tzvi's location, at a condo, in a sauna, listening to music, half asleep after a long ski day when my contact came up on Tzvi's phone. He had no idea I was even on vacation. This is Hashem's workings!

Spring Hill Times:

Wow! The miracles don't stop!

Dan: I was alone in the sauna where I was staying so I had my phone with me with some music on. This was miraculous because if others were there, I would have left the phone outside of the room. The music stopped and I knew the battery was very low so I was sure it was dead. The phone buzzed, as it does when it powers down.

After a couple of minutes it played a ringtone. I looked and it had 3% power (not enough to make a call) and it said Tzvi was calling. Now, he does not remember; but I spoke to him and he told me he was in bad shape and thought something was wrong, he cried out that he can't feel his legs and arm.

He actually said he thinks he may be having a stroke and had taken the Edwards exit near Vail. I asked him why he is calling me and not 911, his reply was odd, he said he didn't know. I remember thinking I have to do something and told him to hold on and I would head his direction. He said something about being careful in the blizzard and I just assumed his condition was confusing him since the storm had passed the day before and the roads were clear.

As soon as I hung up the phone, I tried to call out on my phone but the battery was too low. It was at that moment I saw he had sent me a confusing text ("I am in trouble i need . Thinking might have had a strokyoou. e I lost feeling anduse Legs side3of body") and his location.

I had left the charger in the car. I went out of the sauna and to my condo, I dressed and went back down to my car (clearly, Hashem did not want me hanging out waiting to see if the phone would work in the condo). I jumped into the car, in underground parking, connected the phone and headed for the garage door. The very second it opened, I had a signal (Hashem again) and called 911.

The emergency service person was very patient with me. I asked if Tzvi had called them to tell them he was suffering a stroke... she said, "No, no one had called." I then told them where he might be and that he was in a "big red truck." You see, Tzvi had sent me a photo of his truck some months earlier and all I could recall is that it was big and red. She calmly said something like, "Okaaaay, do you have a better description?" At that moment, I remembered the photo among hundreds on my phone. I stopped the car and looked at my photos... in one or two swipes, there was his truck! I had the company name and number of the truck in my hand in seconds (again, Hashem!). I gave over the information and was told there is someone who was already close to the Edwards rest area (another miracle) and she was sending emergency services as well.

In less than 10 minutes of Tzvi calling me, I knew someone would be there to help him. I drove toward him from the text he provided. While driving, I called my Rabbi and relayed that I was heading to help him but did not know if he was at death's door or not. I asked him if there was something I should be doing. He said I should try to contact the rabbi in Vail and gave me his number. I called the Vail rabbi and he told me he had just left to Go to Denver and was well on his way. He told me the location of the hospital so I headed there. I arrived and was in the emergency room area about 3 minutes before Tzvi arrived.

When Tzvi saw me, the surprise and relief on his face was clear. He said "How is it you are here?" I would like to think I smiled and said "Hashem!" But I don't really recall. I just knew I was happy to see him alive.

Tzvi:

That was nothing short of miraculous too. It says מלאכו לפניך, Hashem in His infinite kindness arranged that Dan be my angel and sent him there to the medical center to be there and help me, to be my advocate before I even arrived!

And I happened to be in Colorado doing a run and not in a different state. The last time that I was in Colorado was 2 months prior. That is another amazing miracle!

I saw Dan as I entered the medical center, I was surprised because I didn't know that he was even in the area. It was a tremendous source of comfort for me, for he is a friend and he took care of me.

When I got there the doctor's weren't sure that I even had a stroke because I was able to talk a drop.

They then called a technician to do a CAT scan and they confirmed it to be a full blown stroke. The right side of my brain was total dead tissue. What's miraculous is that I am a lefty and by a lefty not only does the right side of the brain control the left hands which is why I was paralyzed in the left arm but it also controls the speech. I did truly have difficulty speaking but I was able to speak somewhat. What's more amazing is that the technician was an Israeli named Yochai which means Hashem will give life. What are the odds of having a Jewish Israeli tech do the scan in way out Vail?! We talked in Hebrew a little.

Spring Hill Times:

So what happened next, after they got the results from the CAT scan?

Tzvi:

They tried to get me to a proper hospital in Denver using a helicopter but it was too windy. They drove me there and I went to the neurology department. While there I received a call from a friend who I have known for nearly 30 years. The doctors were trying to figure out why I was able to speak to them since the damage to the language center of my brain was very extensive. I didn't understand what the doctors were saying and handed my phone to them. My friend explained to the doctors that we had studied Gemara together over 25 years ago in Hebrew, Aramaic and Yiddish. He also recalled I spoke Spanish as well. The doctors had their answer, the mitzvah of learning with a Chavrusa had literally allowed me to speak when it should have been impossible. Hashem has performed yet another miracle!

They told me the damage would be permanent. I had missed all the windows of recovery of stroke being that it was so long since it had started. I remember thinking, "That's what they think... they aren't Hashem..." They tried to get me to a proper hospital in Denver through a helicopter but it was too windy. They drove me there and I went to the neurology department. I was there for 8 days. The first few days I couldn't move a thing, I didn't talk either. Then in middle of the night I remember feeling twitching in my leg. I started to move it and the next day I was able to walk. Then my arm started working. This is a tremendous miracle. They had told me that I wouldn't be able to do a thing!

Spring Hill Times:

Wow! That's incredible! What inspiration would you want our readers to take from your story?

Tzvi:

There are two points that I think stand out and that I would want them to understand.

The first is that any Jew should realize that we are all children of Hashem. He is our father. He loves us unconditionally, no matter what our struggle in life may be. Even if you are a simple truck driver like me. Hashem's love is boundless. Just think like a mother and Father that have several children and one is a big tzaddik. The other a successful business man and one is a simple person that never became successful. They love every child the same because they are their children. That's what I felt with my story. When Hashem took the Yidden out of Mitzrayim they were on the 49th level of Tumah and he didn't just take out Shevet Levi he took out the entire nation.

The Gemara says אפילו חרב חדה מונחת על צאורו של אדם אל ימנע עצמו מן הרחמים Even if a sharp sword is one

the neck of a person, they should not despair from crying out to Hashem for help. I was at death's door step and my blood was already dripping from the knife. All I did was call out to Hashem and he listened to me. People have to realize that Hashem is with every Jew every second of the day. Every Jew is worthy of miracles. He wants us to feel his love. If we don't feel loved then we won't want to be a better child - a better Jew. Davening for a miracle isn't just a concept. It's real and that's how I feel now that I witnessed it first-hand. It's all recorded on the company's dash cam, imagine if Yetzias Mitzraim would be recorded on a dash cam! It's recorded in the Torah!

Additionally, we can't take the daily gifts Hashem gives us for granted. Just the simple thing as grasping something in your hand. I couldn't do that with my left hand. There is another thing I see now, you know that every time we eat something and swallow we are being saved from drowning! We have something called the epiglottis which is a flap that covers our esophagus when we eat or drink so that nothing should go in our breathing pipe. Otherwise we would suffocate. Every time we eat a miracle is happening. I realized that only now, because my epiglottis is only working at 80%. It got damaged in the stroke. So every time I drink I have to mix in a powder in the water to thicken it so it will help close the epiglottis. I took the beracha of Asher Yatzar for granted, now I don't! We have to realize like they say in nusach sefard www, even in a second everything can be taken away. Take this from a simple trucker, the beracha of Asher Yatzar is one of the most important and if taken seriously it will guard you.

Just the other day I was in physical therapy and there was a grandmother there with her daughter and granddaughter. We were doing an exercise where they put cones in an order and we have to navigate walking in between them and also tap the cone with a cane. It is similar to a driving test where you park in between the cones. I overheard the daughter telling the granddaughter: You see the things you could do without thinking? Some people have to think before they can do it.

I now appreciate every step that I take and it's all a gift because according to the doctors I should be dead now. It was a real-life changing experience. I cannot let this fade from my memory. It wouldn't be fair to Hashem for saving me. I have to strengthen my belief in Hashem and learning Torah and doing Mitzvos, and spreading His glory to the world.

Spring Hill Times:

Wow, what an inspiration! Tzvi! You don't seem like a simple Jew at all! Really there is no such thing as a simple Jew!


Tzvi:



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



He decided to bring some copies of the Spring Hill Times to Shul and the whole Shul grew together!



"It's the latest news," he said, not waiting for Dovid's response. "This guy in Nebraska figured out how to change any metal into gold! Isn't that amazing? He can make all the money he wants, whenever he wants! Boy, I am so jealous of him, he is so lucky! Just imagine being able to make gold whenever you want! I just can't believe it..."

Eliyahu stopped to catch his breath so Dovid quickly said, "Eliyahu, I have a little secret to tell you: you are actually richer than this guy! In fact, your abilities are way more amazing than his!"

"Dovid," said Eliyahu, "what in the world

are you talking about? I'm a simple person. This guy is worth millions if not billions! I'm not even in his league!"

Dovid said, "Do you remember the conversation we had before Pesach? The one about kavana b'mitzvos?"

Eliyahu brightened. "Sure, I do! I totally forgot to thank you! This past Pesach was a totally different experience for my entire family! It was so elevating!"

Dovid beamed. "You're very welcome! You see, Eliyahu, you have your very own 'manufacturing plant' for real wealth! At any given moment you can produce a spiritual wealth worth way more than that guy in Nebaska! A wealth worth more than trillions of dollars!"

Eliyahu was still confused."Sorry," he said. "Can you please explain what you mean?"

"Sure" said Dovid. "You see, at every single moment of the day, you have the opportunity to do many, many mitzvos, with

barely any effort!

"For example, you can do the mitzvah of chesed to any person you meet simply by saying "good morning" or even just smiling at him! You just need to think beforehand that you are doing the mitzvah of chesed, 'Ka'asher tziva Hashem', and you will have then created for yourself a treasure of spiritual currency that will be yours forever!

"Another example: You can fulfill the six constant mitzvos at any moment since these mitzvos are fulfilled in the mind! Or you can merely look at your tzitzis and think that you are fulfilling the mitzvah to 'see it (the tzitzis) and remember to do the 613 mitzvos' as Hashem commanded. Or, when you pass by a mezuzah, you can fulfill the mitzvah of Ahavas Hashem (loving Hashem) or the mitzvah of Yichud Hashem (thinking about Hashem's Oneness) as the Rambam says to do.

"Another example: At any moment, you can think about Hashem and thereby fulfill the mitzvah of 'Uvo Sidbak – the mitzvah to be constantly connected to Hashem! Or you can say a quick tefillah for yourself or for someone else and fulfill the mitzvah of davening to Hashem!

"Eliyahu," Dovid continued, "Do you understand how wealthy you are?! You can manufacture your own mitzvos! That is way, way greater than all the money in the world! Do you understand what I'm telling you? We are so great, we can do mitzvos all the time! All we need to do is just think that small thought, "I'm doing this mitzvah Ka'asher tziva Hashem!"

For a moment Eliyahu was speechless.

Then he said, "You know what? I never thought about this before! What you are telling me is are absolutely correct! I am much greater than that Nebraskan guy. All I need to do keep in mind 'Ka'asher tziva Hashem' and I can just start creating mitzvos all day! And I have another example of a mitzvah I could do at any given moment: I can thank Hashem for giving me so much good - clothing, my eyes, my ears and I can have in mind the mitzvah of 'Zichron chasdei Hashem', remembering Hashem's kindnesses! Dovid, you just gave me the greatest treasure!

"You know what?" continued Eliyahu, "I am going to share this message with as many people as I can! Why should they lose this fabulous opportunity to become spiritual billionaires? That's the currency that we'll need in the World to Come! I can't believe that I was jealous of alchemist, even for a moment! We are way greater than him! Besides, I heard he is forced to hire bodyguards to protect him from criminals wherever he goes. But we can accumulate all our spiritual wealth without anyone coming after us! 
