Chewing is more important for digestion than we think. Not only does chewing thoroughly mix our food with our saliva and digestive enzymes, but the act of chew-

ing causes an increased production of saliva and enzymes. Through this wondrous phenomenon, chewing is also indirectly helping the process of digestion.

In addition to the digestion that is taking place in the mouth, chewing also helps facilitate digestion in our other digestive organs. The action of chewing stimulates messages to be sent to the stomach and pancreas to get ready for the arrival of food.

In anticipation for the food that is on the way, the stomach and pancreas start producing acids and enzymes that will do the job of dissolving and digesting our food.

It is like an important guest that is supposed to arrive and everyone lends a hand to assure that everything is ready beforehand. So too, Hashem set up our digestive system to be ready beforehand to tackle the job that is awaiting it. We see how important chewing is for our digestive system in so many different ways.

The act of chewing, that Hashem cre-

ated us with, gives us an additional benefit which is both simple and important.

Chewing works as an extremely thorough and sensitive checkpoint.

If we would swallow our food in large chunks, we would not have the opportunity to carefully check and make sure that there is nothing inedible about to be swallowed.

Without chewing we are prone to accidentally swallow objects that are not digestible. This can c"v bring to great pain and discomfort. Even worse, this can possibly bring to life threatening situations, if something sharp or dangerous gets swallowed.

When we chew our food again and again, we transform it into very small particles. It gets sifted so many times to make sure there are no foreign objects hiding inside.

It's like setting up a metal detector outside an important building that's arranged to sound an alarm if anything dangerous is detected. So too our chewing works like a detector to sound the alarm and notify us if there is anything dangerous about to enter our sensitive digestive system.

Q. My husband is not on top of our finances, and everything is falling on my shoulders. I tried talking to him, pleading to him, encouraging him. However, no hishtadlus has proven to be effective.

I can't handle the pressure of having to take responsibility to pay bills and other expenses. Because of this, I'm starting to feel resentment toward my husband. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason you are feeling resentful is because you're thinking, "If only my husband would take responsibility for the finances, I would be able to relax. All because he's not taking responsibility, my life is so pressured".

You must understand; the basic principle of hashgacha tells us that Hashem is in complete control of all events that happen to us, and no human being can affect us whatsoever. There are no exceptions to this rule. Even your husband can't affect your life one iota.

If you are the one who has to deal with the financial responsibilities, it's because Hakadosh Baruch Hu sees that this is what's best for your tikkun haneshama. Even if your husband would want to take the responsibility, Hashem would arrange it so that you would be in charge.

When you take this lesson to heart, you won't feel any resentment towards your husband at all.

Regarding the pressure that you feel, why do you feel so much stress? Because you feel that it's up to you to come up with the money, and if you can't come up with a way to get the money you need, you won't have it.

Realize, these feelings are coming from the attitude, "My success is up to me". However, who is really the one running the world? Hakadosh Baruch Hu. He is the One responsible for getting things done.

There is only one thing that you are responsible for: Doing the actions of trying to come up with money. Once you did your hishtadlus, even if you did not see results, you did what Hashem wants from you, and Hashem will give you the parnasah he allotted for you on Rosh Hashanah.

When you realize that it's Hakadosh Baruch Hu Who is conducting your affairs, He will show you openly how He is helping you out, and will never leave you stranded.

Q. I am being faced with many challenges. I am struggling with shalom bayis, I have problems with parnasah, and the list goes on and on. In all areas, things seem to be going downhill. It seems that Hashem is upset with me.

A. The reason you feel this way is because of the attitude: 'The purpose of our existence is for Olam Hazeh. If the purpose is to enjoy this world, shouldn't I want everything to go smoothly and pleasantly? Since Hashem is making things turn out not exactly the way I want, that means that Hashem is angry at me.'

However, the Mesilas Yesharim teaches us that our true purpose in this world is to be able to enjoy Hashem's shechinah in Olam Habah.

The way we earn Olam Habah is by undergoing challenges. The more ordeals we undergo, the more opportunities we have to earn Olam Habah. A life without nisyonos would be a total waste.

When we undergo yissurim in this world, our neshamos are becoming purified from their stains and we will be entitled to enjoy our portion in Olam Habah. The more challenges you have, the better your Olam Habah is going to be, because your neshama will be more purified.

Therefore, any time a nisayon comes your way, you are getting closer to Hashem, earning a kappara for your aveiros, and getting a straight ticket to Olam Habah – that means you won the lottery!

When you internalize this, you'll understand that things aren't going downhill. Things

ally going uphill. With every challenge you're climbing higher and higher. Each additional challenge you face means that Hashem is showing His love for you more and more.

Q. I have several children with serious issues, medical and emotional. On top of that I have a lot of financial pressure. As much as I'm trying, it's simply impossible for me to be on top of everything, and I'm drowning in responsibilities. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about handling such a situation?

A. The reason you feel that you're drowning is because you think you're in control to help your children and it's up to you to come up with money, and you don't know how it's possible. Naturally, it can feel overwhelming.

However, the Chovos Halvavos teaches us that people don't have any effect on results. Results are Hakadosh Baruch Hu's department. We are just in charge of doing our hishtadlus to try to help our children and financial situation. However, after doing the necessary hishtadlus, what the result will be, is completely up to Hashem. With this in mind, there's no reason at all to feel pressure about not achieving the results you want. All you need to focus on is: what is in your ability

to do. After that, leave it up to Hashem. And when you rely completely on Hashem, He will conduct your affairs with even more bracha.

Q. My husband has many medical issues, and his doctor warned him to avoid specific foods. I try to help him out by preparing healthy food for him to take along when he leaves the house. However, oftentimes, he doesn't eat the food I prepare for him, and instead, he buys himself unhealthy food.

This situation is making me very distressed; firstly, I'm working hard to prepare food for him and many times he doesn't even eat it. More importantly, I'm concerned about my husband's health.

What's the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. Although a husband's wellbeing has a big impact on his wife, your husband's poor eating habits cannot affect you whatsoever.

Hashem conducts all events in such a manner that the way each individual is impacted is according to his individual cheshbon.

Therefore, your duty is to prepare healthy food, trying to make it as appealing as possible, and encouraging your husband to avoid unhealthy foods. Once you've done everything that is in your department, you've fulfilled your chovas histhtadlus in preserving your husband's health. Henceforth, your husband's decision to neglect his health will not negatively affect you whatsoever.

As far as your husband is concerned, it's true that in general Hashem set up the briah that eating unhealthy deteriorates a person's health. However, ultimately, it's not the food that's giving him health. It's Hashem who's commanding the teva to function according to its natural course.

It's not food that's running the world, rather Hakadosh Baruch Hu. If Hashem sees fit, He can cause a person's body to react positively to whatever foods he eats.

Therefore, when you prepare healthy food for your husband, whether he eats your food or not, you are achieving a great accomplishment! You're doing your role in fulfilling the mitz-va of V'nishmartem meod...

Hashem is able to grant him a healthy body solely in the merit that you are doing the best you can to fulfill the mitzva of V'Nishmartem meod...

The unbelievable power of a good word By R'Y. Friedman

In the last issue we discussed a fundamental concept that Reb Avigdor Miller zt"l brought out to us. He enlightened us with this perspective that each person needs to view everything in the world as if it is his. One example he gives is that when the sun comes up you should feel like its your sun, because everything was created for you.

However, one may think that if the world is all about me, it's ok to be selfish. So, we brought down from Reb Yisroel Salanter that although the world was created for you, your ultimate goal is to do things for people, and that is through Tzedakka and Chessed.

We also mentioned in a previous issue that we are compared to the stars. We explained that every Yid is tremendous like a star. It's just that from a distance they seem tiny, but in essence they are tremendous. It's the same with us as well. While we are viewed on a physical level we look limited and seem so small, but our Neshamos, which is who we really are, are unlimited.

Rav Yisroel Salanter poses a question. Why don't many of us feel joy when the sun comes up each morning. We know that besides for the obvious benefit of light that the sun offers us, there are hundreds if not thousands of other benefits the sun has to offer to the world. For example, it's through the sunlight that plants, trees and flowers grow. So why are we not jumping from joy with the

arrival of the sun.

According to Rav Avigdor Miller zt"l, we can say that if we would view the sun as "my sun", that the sun is coming up for my benefits, then this would bring us great joy.



Rav Yisroel takes us to the next level, and this is the discussion of this week's article.

He starts off by saying similar to what we said. That the reason why we don't have simcha is because we tend to view it that the sun is coming up for everyone, and this takes away from our joy. Now Reb Yisroel gives a new refreshing twist.

We know that there is a concept of "lev tov", and "ayin tova". This means that not only am I joyous with my successes and enjoyments, I am also joyful when other people are successful and have pleasure. This Midda is rooted in "v'ahavta lereiacha Kamocha".

Rav Shayala Keristerer personified the midda of "v'ahavta lereiacha Kamocha". Almost every story that you hear about Reb Shaya you will see the Ahavas Yisroel that gushed from this great Tzaddik. They say that whenever he would

serve food, he would stand there watching the people enjoy the food. This is called a lev tov. He enjoyed when other people were enjoying themselves.

Rav Yisroel Salanter says that when we wake up in the morning, we should acknowledge that not only are we benefiting from the sun, but all of Klal Yisroel is going to benefit from the sun. This should multiply our Simcha many times over. That is how someone with a Ayin Tova or a Lev Tov thinks.

There will be more food to feed mankind, especially our fellow brothers - Klal Yisroel.

This way of thinking is very encompassing. On one hand

we are building ourselves from being a simple person and realizing that we are a world, an "Olam katan." We are also reinforcing in ourselves that this world was created for 'me'. On the other hand, we are bringing everyone else into our world and we understand what Reb Yisroel Salanter said "that we are here in this world to help other people."

This can be compared to a benevolent king. While everything revolves around him, as he is the most important figure. On the other hand, the life of a king is all about his subjects. His entire day as king is taken up by constantly thinking of how to improve the lives of his subjects. This is the true king.

Then I asked myself this question: what would give Hashem more pleasure the night of Yom Kippur, me finishing Mesechte Yuma or being Mechazek these unfortunate people that went through so much. I decided that this was what was going to bring Hashem a greater na-

chas ruach.

This is one story out of probably millions of such stories of how our Gedolim were so meticulous in the Mitzva of loving and caring for another Yid. Living With Appreciation

Parashas Behar discusses the mitzvah of Shemittah.

There is a unique phenomenon we are told about regarding this mitzvah; something we do not see anywhere else. Hashem guarantees that when we observe it, there will be an abundance of produce, so much that one year will yield enough produce for three years! Why specifically does the mitzvah of Shemittah have this guarantee?

In explaining the reason for Shemitah, The Sefer HaChinuch (84) explains that there could be a natural tendency to think that our land really belongs to us and the produce comes as a result of our efforts.

In reality, all the land we have belongs to Hashem, and all the produce comes as a result of His kindness. By leaving our land fallow, we are recognizing that all the land we have is really His and all our food comes as a result of His tremendous kindness.

The Zohar (vol.159b) teaches that when we focus on Hashem's kindnesses and praise Him, we will be considered very beloved to Hashem and we will enjoy an abundance of blessing. When we realize that everything we have is really Hashem's and He graciously gives it to us in His great kindness.

it will bring down tremendous blessing. This is why Shemitah has this guarantee. So each time we thank and praise Hashem for His infinite goodness, we will receive more blessing!

The pioneering Moshav, Komemiyut, was committed to keeping Shemittah shortly after it was founded in the early 1950's, despite the very difficult factors involved. Their sole



source of livelihood came from agriculture, yet they internalized how the land solely belongs to Hashem and in His tremendous goodness He provides for them.

After the year was completed, they planned to renew their farming activities.

Seeds to sow crops were needed, but they were only permitted to use what was grown in the sixth year. All what they could find was a pile of old wormy seeds. No farmer, would normally even touch such seeds, with the chance of them yielding crops being very slim. The Rav of the Moshav encouraged them to plant them anyway, 'the One Who tells wheat to sprout from good seed can also order it to grow from inferior wormy seed as well' he told them.

That year, the rains were late in coming and the country's farmers were feeling very desperate and eagerly anticipated the rain.

The day after the Moshav finished planting their wheat fields with those wormy seeds, it finally rained.

Miraculously, their fields produced an unusually large and high-quality yield of wheat; no comparison to even wheat sown with high quality seeds!

At the same time, the surrounding fields who were not meticulous about Shemittah did not produce such a good crop. News of this miracle spread quickly, causing a tremendous Kiddush Hashem.

Some things in our lives seem to be not worth noticing, and we tend to ignore them and their benefits.

Let's try to get used to thanking Hashem for those "seemingly" insignificant things we have.

With a mindfully closer look, and after giving it a little bit of thought, we'll realize how much significance they truly do have in our lives.

Some of these things have the potential to make a useless nothing, into a useful something.

Handles!

Handles, knobs and straps, are our keys to interacting with many objects.



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
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
