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

Chewing serves as a checkpoint to make sure that all the food that we are about to swallow is digestible.

This would appear to be quite important for previous generations who were not producing food in great mass and with the aid of different machinery. It would probably be common for stones, pebbles and straw to get mixed into their foods. For them chewing was a necessary protection.

In our generation, when we don't have dirt floors, we have electrical lights at night and we eat clean and shiny foods – this safeguard doesn't seem so important.

But the truth is that the protection of chewing is also important for us.

Did it ever happen to you that in the middle of eating you felt a piece a silver foil in your food? It could happen; what would that do to your digestive system?

And there is also the issue of fish bones, which is one of the most common problems of choking.

Pits can also be overlooked, and even small pits, like cherry pits can be very dangerous – not because of choking, but because of the toxicity that these pits contain. The process of chewing serves as a protection even for our generation to detect anything that we shouldn't be swallowing.

We can categorize the advantages of chewing as עשה טוב and also עשה.

Chewing serves as an important protection in various ways – this can be the σ of α – keeping us protected from choking or swallowing dangerous objects.

This is because tiny molecules are released from the food when you chew it, which gives us the ability to taste.

Chewing also stimulates cells in our mouth which increase our enjoyment from the food. The more we chew - the more molecules - the more enjoyment we have from the food and the more our mouth is ready to receive the enjoyment from the food.

Hashem created us with teeth to chew in order to receive ongoing enjoyment when we eat.

If we didn't have teeth to chew and we would swallow things whole we would taste much less of the food.

Let's try to think when we chew that Hashem is giving us more and more pleasure - with every bite more molecules are being released; every bite gifts us with another piece of chessed Hashem!

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Bitachon Perspective

Q. I find bedtime very challenging. When I try putting my children to sleep, they don't cooperate. They run around as if it were broad daylight, and they end up going to sleep very late. This makes me very frustrated, because I know how important it is for my children to get a full night's sleep so they should be well rested the next day.

Furthermore, during the time I'm trying to put my children to sleep, there is so much I could be accomplishing, but instead all the time gets wasted on bedtime. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason you get so frustrated is because you're looking at the world as if it works with cause and effect: If my children go to sleep on time they will have energy the next day, and if they go to sleep late, they won't.

Therefore, it's very aggravating, "All because my kids are not cooperating, they are going to be tired tomorrow. On top of that, all that time I spent trying to put them to sleep went to waste, and I wasn't able to accomplish all the things I wanted to do".

However, you must realize: there is no intrinsic power called 'cause and effect'. True, Hashem requires us to do our hishtadlus to be well rested, but ultimately, it is Hakadosh Baruch Hu Who is the נותן ליעף כח.

Therefore, you should approach bedtime with the attitude, "My mission is to do whatever I can to help my kids get sleep. Results are Hashem's department. He will give my children the exact amount of energy that He knows is best for them."

Regarding your frustration, 'all because bedtime was so time consuming, I couldn't accomplish others things in that time', you spent your time putting your kids to sleep because that was the right thing to do. There is an ironclad rule: A person never loses out by doing the right thing.

Not only will you not lose out, Hashem will even pay you back double for the time you spent doing the mitzva of taking care of your children and helping them be healthy.

Q. I've been faced with various difficulties. As a result, I started investing in creating a relationship with Hakadosh Baruch Hu. Every day, I daven that I should feel Hakadosh Baruch Hu's presence, and that He should show me that He's with me wherever I go.

But ever since I started, I've been faced with more challenges than before. Not only don't I feel that Hashem is close, it feels like I'm being rejected. It seems that Hashem is saying that He's not interested in having a relationship with me, and it's making me very discouraged.

A. The reason you feel discouraged is because you think, "If I feel close to Hashem, it's a sign that Hashem is happy with me. And if I don't feel His presence, it means that Hashem is distancing Himself from me."

However, the reality is exactly the opposite. Hashem actually gets a much greater nachas ruach from someone who works on avodas Hashem even though he's not 'feeling it'. This is the true demonstration of a person's devotion to Hashem.

Rav Yerucham Levovitz teaches that when we serve Hashem the best we can, even though it may be very lacking, in a certain bechinah, our avodas Hashem is even more precious than the avodah of great men many generations ago.

Therefore, even though you may not feel how happy Hashem is with you, you should know that Hashem is so proud of your efforts, and the difficulty that Hashem is giving you is just to make you an even greater person.

Q. We know that the point of a nisayon is to elevate a person and bring him closer to Hashem. I'm currently being faced with an overwhelming nisayon. Although I'm doing

my daily exercises

to overcome, I'm constantly stumbling and becoming further from shleimus. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The shleimus achieved through a nisayon is not necessarily by overcoming it with flying colors. Rather it's by reacting to the nisayon correctly. The way Hashem wants you to deal with it is by doing exercises to overcome it. Additionally, Hashem wants you not to fall apart if the outcome is not how you hoped, and to just continue exercising.

We find a similar concept with שעבוד מצרים. Klal Yisroel were sent to Mitzrayim to became purified – כור הברזל. Yet we find that Klal Yisroel descended to the לשערי טומאה.

It comes out, that although at times it may seem like we are losing out by the effects of a Nisayon, if we do whatever we can, ultimately, we will emerge even higher.

Q. I hear on A Life With Bitachon that when there are people in our lives who don't act properly towards us, instead of focusing our energy on changing them, we should work on changing ourselves, by learning how to get along with difficult people.

My question is, isn't there a mitzvah: הוכח את- עמיתך;

when we see someone doing something wrong, we should point it out and help them improve?

A. Certainly, there is a mitzvah to give tochochah. However, the principle behind this mitzvah is to help other people improve.

Therefore, if by showing him what he did wrong will motivate him to change his ways and improve, it's definitely a very great mitzvah.

However, nowadays, most people don't react well to criticism. When they are told what to do, they feel degraded, and the one who's giving them mussar thinks that he's superior.

In most cases, when people are told off, instead of improving, the results are counterproductive. In such cases it's a mitzva not to give them mussar.

Therefore, if a family member or friend does things which bother you, and after being told once or twice, the person still is not changing – drop the criticism.

Instead, the way to deal with the situation is to perfect your own middos and learn how to accept his behavior.

Ultimately, it's very possible that your behavior will help the other person change as well. When we perfect ourselves, others learn the proper way to act, and they will be influenced to change their ways.

This concept 'we are here to

change ourselves – not others' goes deeper, though.

Throughout our existence in Olam Hazeh, we must adopt the mentality that the only ones who truly exist are 'Hashem and I', and everyone else in our lives are the backdrop.

Therefore, although avodas Hashem includes helping those who are in our circle of influence, this responsibility should be understood in the context of fulfilling our responsibility in our avodas Hashem. After one-hundred and twenty years, we will stand alone in the beis din shel ma'alah and be asked 'What did you make out of yourself?'

If a person is busy changing others his entire life, it can very well be a distraction from changing himself.

Oftentimes, the reason Hashem puts unpleasant people in our lives is precisely to give us the opportunity to make something out of ourselves. This is because the more we have to work on ourselves to get along with challenging people, the more we are making something out of ourselves and fulfilling the reason we were sent to this world.

We are in the holy days of Sefira, which is a very joyous time, but at the same time we are mourning the loss of Reb Akiva's twenty four thousand students. Chazal teach us that the tragedy happened because they didn't give each other their proper Kavod.

We discussed last week that we are now preparing for Kabalas HaTorah. We mentioned that the one thing that's expressed in the Torah about Klal Yisroel when they arrived at the mountain, was that they were b'achdus.

Therefore, its appropriate for us to discuss this great Mitzva of, "Veahavta l'reiecha kamocha."

There is а Mitzva of V'ahavtem Es Hager"- to love a convert [Devarim 10:19]. The Torah is putting a special emphasis on loving a convert. Why is that? Since he is stranger as he is new to Judaism, therefore he feels out of place. He may feel like he is intruding as well. That's why the Torah puts a special emphasis on bringing the convert close and giving him the chizzuk that he needs.

Based on this understanding, I heard from an Adam Gadol who said that this emphasis is not limited to a convert. This includes any newcomer as well. For example, someone who joins a school or a shul. It can be a newcomer who moved from out of town to to a new city or someone who moved from one side of town to the other.

The common denominator between all these people is that they feel out of place, and they



may even feel like they are intruding. They need friendship and chizzuk, and it's our job to greet them, smile at them and make them feel comfortable and at ease.

Now it's important to note that this situation of being and feeling as a newcomer can last a few years. However, the good news is that it doesn't have to be like that.

You can change that. How?

The more you are consistent in showing friendliness and friendship, the quicker they will start feeling at home. Furthermore, the more people get involved in showing friendship and bringing him or her into their circle, the quicker they will start feeling at home.

I heard a story told over by Rabbi Zev Golombock about a Yerushalmy Yid who came to his house. He told Reb Zev that his wife asked him, why is it that when he comes back to Eretz Yisroel he comes home in such a good mood. He replied, that the Yidden in America not only give with an open hand, but they give with a smile. They make him feel so comfortable and they make him feel right at home.

Yes, Klal Yisroel in America show the heilige Meshulachim warmth and they feel right at home here in Lakewood and other cities at home.

I have watched first hand how they come into our shuls and they settle in. They are treated with royalty. I saw people greeting them heartily, and giving them nice donations. It's a beautiful sight to behold.

They say a story of Baron Hertzog whose hachnasas orchim was legendary. One day one of his regular, "guests" that, "resided" at the Barons home for a couple of years, came in with a young man. The Baron approached him and asked his, "guest" who this young man was. The guest responded proudly, "this is my new son in-law, and I promised him board for three years."

The Mishna in Pirkei Avos says, "Yehei aniyim binei Beisecha." The simple meaning is that not only should you feed the poor, moreover

the poor people should also feel like they are part of your household. In other words they should feel at home. [This doesn't mean that they should infringe on you privacy, but they should feel welcome and they should n't feel any shame to enjoy a hot meal].

Let's return to our new neighbor. Now that you greeted your new neighbor with some cake and welcoming words, it's important to keep it going. Some people may show friendship for the first month, but after that they stop. Perhaps they think that the newcomer has settled in and he doesn't need chizzuk anymore. In most cases it's not like that.

Let's explore some practical ideas in giving chizzuk to a newcomer. Firstly, you can ask them for their full name [if you forget, ask again, don't be ashamed]. When you talk to them (going forward) call them by their first name. Another suggestion is to inquire about their family [in a general fashion]. See if you can help them in any way that you can. For example, perhaps they are having difficulty getting a child into a Yeshiva. Perhaps you can pull some strings for them.

If you can make a seder to learn with him that would be wonderful. You can invite them for a Shabbos Seuda. If there are special shiurim in the neighborhood for men or women tell them about it and encourage them to come. Stop by their house once in a while to say hello.

Another nice thing is to inquire about his past. For example: where he lived before he moved here. Where he sent his children to cheder in the previous city. You can ask him about which Yeshivos he attended when he was growing up. All this shows that you are interested in him, and you should be. After all he is your brother, as the Torah tells us numerous times.

It's the same with the kids. We can train our kids to be mikarev and be mechazek newcomers as well. Children especially, may not realize how vulnerable newcomers can be, and how much chizzuk they can use. We can enlighten our kids and empower them not to be bashful and to overcome their bashfulness and be mekarev newcomers.

We mentioned earlier that the more people that get involved in showing warmth and friendship, the quicker he will able to settle into his new environment. We cannot wait for others to start. We need to get involved in this great Mitzva and even one good friend can make all the difference in the world.

I remember reading a story of a man that was smeared by the media as a thief and unfortunately, most people accepted the story as fact. As you can imagine this man's life was in shambles. His kids were ridiculed and shamed in school.

Baruch Hashem at the end the real thieves were caught and his name was cleared [at least partially for those that followed up on the story]. Baruch HaShem this story has a happy ending.

However, if you read this story (which is too long for this article), you will see that the only thing that kept him sane was because of a devoted friend that believed that he was innocent. He kept giving him constant chizzuk, and at the end it was through him that the thieves were caught. We see from here how vital it is to have at least one good friend. Yes, you can be that friend. As it says, "v'ahavta lireiacha kamocha."

In the zechus that we show love to everyone, and especially to newcomers, we should be zoche to be makabel the Torah with love, "k'ish echad b'lev echad." May we be zoche in this zechus to bring the Geula, and just like we show love to our fellow Yidden, Hashem will bring the Geula with love L'man shame - b'ahava Amein.

Living With Appreciation By: R' Daniel Shasha

Our Parashah opens with Moshe counting how many people were in each tribe, and then tells us our total count.

The Ramban asks why specifically at this stage, the Jews had to be counted?

He answers that this was in order to show us the incredible kindness of Hashem. When Klal Yisrael descended to Egypt, we consisted of only 70 people, yet just 210 years later we numbered in the hundreds of thousands! The formation of a large united nation in such a short period of time is really a tremendous miracle. Therefore, we were specifically counted at this time to remind us of this. Phenomenal!

Rabbi Simcha Zissel Broide points out that we see in this Ramban a fundamental idea when displaying gratitude: the importance of focusing on the bigger picture. For example, if someone is married with a family and financially comfortable, instead of saying "thank You Hashem that I am married with a family and have enough money", it would be far more meaningful to say "Hashem, I remember those lonely days when I was single, things were so difficult, not to mention my concern how I was going to pay my bills: thank You Hashem that I am married and have everything I need". Contrasting our current situation to the past is a tremendous way to highlight our appreciation and makes it much more meaningful.

One practical suggestion for anyone who witnessed a great salvation, such as getting married, having children, being cured from an illness etc., and would like to express their grat-



itude to Hashem in the most meaningful way, could be to write down how challenging things were before and read it every so often. Then, afterwards to say, "thank You Hashem that things are not like this anymore!" Rabbi Chaim Shmulevitz taught that each Jew should try and write their own Megillah, recording the miracles and salvations that they have experienced. Many have seen tremendous miracles by keeping this practice. This story is just one example

A girl living in New York was suffering from excess mucus in her airway to the extent that she was having difficulty breathing. She went to many experts, but they all said they had never seen anything like it before and didn't know what was causing the problem. The only advice they received was that she should go to Arizona, where the air is drier. She was there for three weeks, but it didn't seem to help and returned home, feeling frustrated and helpless. She then made a kabalah that every night, before going to sleep, she would write in a journal ten good things that happened to her that day; and thank Hashem for these favors. On the forty-first day of this practice, she recorded "I am breathing well and without pain. It is like I was never sick."

Recognize and feel #1538 a little bit of how much Hashem loves you as an individual.

Imagine that at a gathering of all the Gedolim and Admorim, you were called up, and all the Tzaddikim expressed to you how special you are and how much they love you.

"Bishvili Nivra Haolam" is literally true!



When someone ex- #1539 periences a "close call," if they live life without Bitachon, they will feel anxious and traumatized.

If they live life with Bitachon, they will feel so loved and cared for and appreciative that Hashem saved them.



If you are trying to #1540 have Bitachon for a Yeshua, but it is hard for you to believe and

feel that the Yeshua is possi-

ble, try to picture and visualize the Yeshua actually happening, and this will lead to the Yeshua.



When something seems #1541 to be going wrong, even in Ruchniyus, such as losing an opportunity to do a Mitzva, we should not feel like Hashem is upset at us C'V.

Instead, we should remind ourselves of Hashem's constant love, and that everything that happens is for our own good.

Acknowledging Hashem's love even when something goes wrong and being happy and appreciative regardless will give us the Z'chus to see Hashem's love openly.



A parent's primary job #1542 is actually not to take care of their children physically, but to give over to their children the belief and feeling that Hashem loves them and Hashem is taking care of them.

When a parent is less physically capable of taking care of their children, they can use the opportunity to spend more time giving over Yesodos of Emunah and Bitachon.

They can teach their children to appreciate all the various Brachos that Hashem gives them, especially their physical capabilities: two hands, two legs, etc.



On the second day of #1543 Pesach you should take the new crop and bring it as a Korban before Hashem, which is called Korban Haomer.

Part of bringing the Korban is doing a Tenufah, shaking it up and down,

left and right. This is the Korban that we mention every day when we count Sefiras Ha'Omer.
