

Continued Sometime later, on a Thursfrom front day afternoon, I picked up a page chareidi Jew, and he asked me not to take another female passenger along the way, because of tznius. "You won't lose anything," he told me. "Parnassah is miShamayim."

I rolled the words around on my tongue – "Parnassah is miShamayim." I sat in the car and stopped near the crosswalk. I had time to think and to talk to Hashem, and I said to Him, "Abba, show me that parnassah is really miShamayim!" I asked for this with my whole heart. I wanted to feel that He was there.

Several days passed, and on Thursday I got a message from my company: "Who wants to go to the bakery to bring bourekas? You'll get paid, and you'll also get bourekas." I took the job and set out. When I got to the bakery I opened the taxi door, left the keys inside, and went in for a moment to bring the bourekas back to the car. I got back to the sidewalk with the bourekas and...Help! No car in sight! They had stolen my car! And it's not even my car! It's worth 70,000 shekels! From where would I pay that? You

must understand, I don't have another source of income, just this car and the



jobs I do in it. You know what it means

when they say "the source of his bread fell apart"? That's exactly what happened to me, except that I was left with the "bread" – the bourekas – in my hands...

So, to make a long story short, I called the owner of the taxi to tell him what happened, and he told me, "If the keys were inside, then no one will pay for it. It's all your responsibility." The police came, took down details, and took me to the sta-

tion. I sat there for three-quarters of an hour without knowing why I was there and what I was waiting for, and then the police chief came in and pointed finger his upward. "Someone in Heaven loves you," the chief said. "I've been working here



for twenty years, and it has never happened before that within

0

three-quarters of an hour a stolen car comes back." He motioned to me to follow him outside, and I saw the taxi. Whole. In some corner of the car I had hidden 500 shekels, and that money was still there too. Everything came back safe and whole. Hashem had shown me that parnassah was from Shamayim!

The driver finished his story, and I was very excited about it. And one time, when I had an opportunity to inspire Yidden on Chanukah, I repeated the story of the taxi driver and his car, emphasizing that, "If Hakadosh Baruch Hu had

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brought him the money in some special way, the driver would have realized that parnassah comes both from work and from Shamayim, but when Hakadosh Baruch Hu took away his car and then gave it back to him, he saw tangibly that all of parnassah is only from Shamayim!"

Two years passed after I gave that talk, and one of the listeners told me he'd identified the driver from the story, and once he traveled with him and asked him, "If Hakadosh Baruch Hu had brought you money in some special way, would you not have understood that

> parnassah is miShamayim?" "I think not," the driver responded. "I would've thought that parnassah could come from all different places, but when Hashem took away my car and then gave it back to me, He showed me that only He gives everything. I deal with measurements. I don't measure people or clothing; I measure houses. One day

I nodded and then proposed an idea that was feasible for me. "I'll come during my regular work hours, but I'll do the work quickly and quietly, and I'll finish up within a few minutes. Agreed?" We agreed.

I showed up at his home, did my work quietly, and on my way out I saw the owner of the house speaking with someone in the stairwell of the building. I wanted to say hello, but I knew that if I wanted to respect his wishes that no one would know I had come, it would be best for me to disappear ASAP.

Half an hour later I got a call from the owner of the house, and he told me excitedly, "Do you know who I was talking to? I was talking to that neighbor who got the order to demolish my addition! I didn't want him to know that I had called you, and just as you were coming in, he entered the building too. I had to hold him up so he wouldn't see you going up to my apartment, so I started talking to him. We spoke for twenty minutes – until you finished. and hills that had formed between us over the past seven years. He explained his side to me, and I explained my side to him. We spoke pleasantly, and we finally made up with each other.

in the area soared, but my tenant continued paying the same price stipulated in his contract when he'd first entered the apartment. That was a one-year contract, but after a year passed, we did not renew it or deal with it, but we continued renting an apartment in Yerushalayim and renting out our apartment for the same prices as in previous years.

People who understood such matters were telling me repeatedly, "Why don't you raise the price? People are paying 2,600 or even 2,800 shekels a month in that area, and yet you continue to rent it out for 1,800 shekels a month!"



They were right, but I did not have the heart to raise the

rent. I knew my tenant was an avreich, and I kept pushing off raising the price.

Some time later, and with pressure coming from several different directions, I informed the tenant that I was raising the price. "I won't take the higher price they're paying in the area," I told him. "But from today on you'll pay 2,400 shekels per month. It's less than what everyone else is paying."

He agreed, and we signed a new contract.

What happened several days later? I got a call from my landlord in Yerushalayim and heard, almost like a recording, my own words: "You know that the prices in your area have gone up a lot, and for many years I've never raised the rent. From today on you'll pay an additional thousand shekels a month."

I tried arguing. We negotiated, and ultimately he compromised with me on an additional monthly sum of 600 shekels.

Six hundred shekels! The exact amount by which I had raised my tenant's rent!

I compromised with my tenant, and my own landlord compromised with me. I saw tangibly that I had only gained from my consideration for my tenant. Money comes and goes, and no one can make more than what was set aside for him in Shamayim. The numbers testify. [Kav Hashgacha Pratis]

My son and I were walking down a dark street approaching our car after Maariv, and we saw a doctor friend who was about six or seven cars ahead of us. And he stopped to open





Purim is a pure outburst of happiness. The simchah in the air is tangible, and it is a day that we wait for with such great excitement. Yet, what is the main avodah of Purim? We listen to the Megillah, have a lavish feast, give tzedakah and gifts to our friends etc. There for sure has to be an underlying message behind all of this?

Let's look at the words of Rabbi Avigdor Miller. 'First and foremost, our job is to thank Hashem. We're full of happiness, because the more happiness



we have in us, the more energy we have to thank'. This really sheds light on the essence of Purim. After all, it is very easy to get sidetracked and caught within the joyfulness of the day and we have to remember the purpose behind it. It is a tremendous outpouring of our gratitude to Hashem for the incredible miracles that occurred.

We were under a serious threat of being annihilated, and if not for the extraordinary salvation that happened, we wouldn't be here today. Everything we have is because of the Purim miracle and it is essential that we ensure that this is a day filled with gratitude.

The Sfas Emes notes that an allusion to this idea is when we recite א היית לנצח, 'You have been their eternal salvation', after the Megillah reading. We are exclaiming that the salvation was eternal. Since Haman wanted to destroy us, the miracle applies to all generations. The entire existence of the Jewish people is solely because of this salvation!

Chazal ask an intriguing question. Why on Purim do we not recite Hallel? After all, such tremendous miracles occurred. Certainly, none less than Pesach, Sukkos and Chanukah. Our lives were completely at stake, and due to a series of phenomenal miracles we were saved. According to one opinion in the Gemara, we don't recite Hallel since reading the Megillah is like reciting Hallel!

The essence of reciting Hallel is expressing our praise to Hashem. What more could express our praise than recounting the phenomenal miracles which occurred and how we were saved?

Another way of expressing our gratitude is during the Purim seudah. Chazal (Megillah 7b) teach us a seemingly mystifying comment, 'a person is obligated to become inebriated on Purim until the extent that he doesn't know the difference between blessed is Mordechai and cursed is Haman. This law is codified by the Rambam and Shulchan Aruch. Since Judaism disdains excessive drinking, what is the meaning behind this law?

One explanation for this is that we have to become so aware how Hashem was in complete control of every aspect of the Purim story, that in some respect there is no difference between Mordechai and Haman, because after all Hashem was completely manipulating events. We need to be so full of gratitude and awareness of Hashem's involvement that we should strive to reach this level. Our rejoicing on Purim is extremely powerful and can accomplish so much, as we see in the following story.

One time on Taanis Esther, the city of Amsterdam was in great distress. Fish had clogged up a certain dam, potentially resulting in a disastrous flood and placing the lives of thousands in grave danger. The king sent a message to the Rokeach, the Rav of the Jewish community at that time, stating that if this

danger continues in three days' time, all the Jews will be permanently expelled from Holland. Surprisingly, the Rokeach responded that he could meet this demand, on condition that the king provided many crates of wine.

The king was infuriated by this request, presuming that the Jews



were rebelling against him. He thought the Jews would be fasting and wearing sackcloth, yet instead they asked for a large amount of wine! The Rokeach reiterated that this was the

only way that they could meet the request so the king complied and a large amount of wine was sent to the Jewish community. That Purim, the Jews rejoiced like never before! Wine flowed and flowed and the simchah was on an entirely new level.

Not long after Purim, the king sent a message to the Rokeach that the fish no longer clogged the dam, ending the impending danger. (Marbeh Chaim, Rav Chaim Brim)

The Rokeach knew how powerful the simchah of Purim was and what it could accomplish. He therefore instituted that his community celebrate Purim like never before, helping arouse great Divine Mercy. When we rejoice on Purim, fueled by love for Hashem for His great miracles, the effects are truly immeasurable!

Lets thank Hashem for the power of prayer on Purim.

Purim is extremely auspicious for our tefillos to be accepted. This idea is alluded to in a well-known

halachah that on Purim, Kol haposhet yad nosnim lo, whoever stretches out their hand we are obligated to give them money.



Our Rabbis teach that Hashem also fulfills this halachah and whoever stretches out their hand to Him, will have their requests accepted



Just a few hours before it was so gloomy and hopeless, and now it was Simcha V'Sasson!

Hashem showed Klal Yisroel that, "I am the only Koach." He showed them the tremendous Ahava that He has towards them. "The Tzaddik Nistar"

There was a great Tzaddik by the name R' Asher Freind who lived in Yerushalayim. This Tzaddik was niftar about twenty years ago and he still has a big following of Talmidim in Eretz Yisroel. He was a great Talmid Chacham, a giant in Chesed who single handedly started one of the greatest Tzeddakah organizations in Eretz Yisroel "Yad Ezrah". At the start, he would personally go to the Shuk Machne Yehudah, at the end of the day and go through the huge dumpsters of dumped fruits and vegetables that were still edible, and in a "not so bad" of a state. He would shlep all the bags of goods to his house and then proceed to distribute them to poor people who were in need of free food!

When the store keepers, and owners of the big fruit and vegetable stalls, got hang of what was going on, and taking place, right under their noses, after closing hours, they started leaving out some better-looking fruits and vegetables, for him to take. They realized



that this man had no other intentions, other than Chesed! He really meant what he was doing, L'maan Hashem! It then turned into piles of boxes, until it became small truckloads of goods for Tzedakah, that were being picked up daily, from lots of goodhearted people who were selling their goods in Shuk Machne Yehudah.

Eventually his organization expanded, and he started helping people with clothing and even housing!

He was also a genius in healing brokenhearted people who came to speak to him, at all hours of the day. His famous greeting a person was by making him some scrambled eggs! He clearly understood the disturbed minds, and broken hearts, and offered them clear



solutions to their problems. His real underlying koiach was being an Ish Emes" L'maan Hashem!" He couldn't and wouldn't, do or decide on anything for himself or for any-one who came to seek his advice, with any self-interest or kavoid in his mind. He lived for Hashem!

He was also a tremendous Baal Emunah and Bitachoin. He took that, to a gevaldige great level, and to a madreiga that is seen by few. I read about him in a biography book, written by the famous Eretz Yisroel'dige writer, Rabbi Yair Weinstock. It still hasn't yet been translated to English, like so many of his other amazing books that he has written and were eventually professionally translated to English. There are some amazing stories, written in that book about his outstanding Emunah and Bitachoin, and (un)believable subsequent sto-ries of yeshuois and clear Hashgacha Pratis that he experienced in his personal life and with his talmidim. Ma-mesh Himmel'dig, and mind boggling!

I heard a vort from this tzaddik, an amazing new and novel teitch of the term "A Tzaddik Nistar". He said that this term could also very well mean a person who tries his entire life to build things, and they continuously fall apart. It may be in any aspect of life: Toirah learning, Davening, Chesed, doing Mitzvos, marriage, child rearing, Nachas, financial success, social life, health-emotionally-physically-spiritually-mentally, etc. The Tzaddik is being constantly tested with things becoming "Nistar"- Broken, shattered, crumbled, demolished, and destroyed. He nevertheless keeps on in his Avoidas Hashem restarting from scratch, over and over, again and again! He realiz-es that this is his mission in life, it's all from Hashem somehow for his benefit, and he happily keeps on picking himself up, gathering the broken pieces, and moves on in life. Nothing. . . no, nothing can stop this tzaddik, in his Avoidas Hashem!

He never gets broken, from all the things that are constantly collapsing all along the way in the course of his life! He arises dusty but smiling, from amidst the rubble of the destroyed magnificent edifices that he has pains-takingly built and then witnessed their sinking and toppling over into huge piles of total worthless crumbled mess. He happily shakes off the dust, and as he's still smarting from his bruises and pain, actually with joy moves on to start anew, building, and bettering, something in his life, that he's living for Hashem! WHAT AN AMAZING TZADDIK NISTAR!

Along the bumpy roads of his life twisting and turning sharply, he maneuvers his drive happily, accepting and enjoying the bumpy, shaky, rocking, winding, and sliding, tough driving test, downward and upward, throughout the challenging obstacle course of his life.

He firmly trusts Hashem, that what-

ever tough pitch Hashem sends his way, be it a curveball, cutter, or knuck-leball. A change-up, or a fast-ball, a slider, and, a breaking-ball, "Everything is for his personal best!" Even when he keeps on striking out, he's still happily in the "game", and he is the real winner! He is Hashem's, and the en-tire worlds congratulated Most Valuable Player! The entire world stands on the zechusim of such people, who happily accept everything from Hashem, and keep on going!

THE TWO MYSTERIOUS TZADDI-KIM

We can also maybe explain the teitch of the term "Tzaddik Nister" as someone who is a righteous person who we the onlookers cannot understand how they manage to accomplish the tremendous feat of what they are doing in their life! It is "Nister-Hidden" the way they stay Tzaddikim. It's a mystery for us the bystanders, not comprehending how in the world they do what they do, day in and day out!

Despite their handicaps they keep on with an Erliche Yiddishe life all the while smiling, to everyone! Going to Shul, Learning Toirah, doing Hashem's Mitzvois, some even raise families, not wavering in their commitment to serve Hashem, despite their obvious struggle. To us it's a "A Mystery-A Nister", How do they do it!? Myster Nister you are amazing! You are a mystery-nistery! There must be something much deeper in these Tzaddikim's soul, and psych, that we just "don't get it".

The Kensington section of Brooklyn, along with the Boro Park neighborhood, witnessed the ascent to the High Heaven's, of two such Tzaddikim Nistarim, on the same day, about a month ago. They are each deserving of at least one volume of a biography book, if not many more. I will iy"H dedicate an article for each of them, in the near future. Rabbi Papier, and Rabbi Fruchter, were two mysteriously functioning tzaddikim, who I'm sure these neighborhoods were protected in their zechus! Yehei Zichram Baruch!

THE EVERCHANGING 36 TZADDIKIM



NISTARIM

I once heard a shiur (I can't recall from who) about this idea, that the specific 36 tzaddikim on which the world stands on in their zechus, keeps on changing at any given time. Meaning to say that this world has in the



course of a day, many Yidden that for some amount of time they are mamesh acting in the ways of great tzaddikim. Therefore, one can never know at any given time who are the present group of 36 righteous people who are the ones that are keeping the world going, at that exact moment.

It's an interesting, and inspiring thought to have in mind, that y'never know, "who-that's doing what," is the driving force in upholding the pillars of the entire world. It can give you the chills, thinking about some extraor-dinary things that you have done, that "who knows" maybe for a few short minutes you were the one, that was keeping all the gears and cogs of the universe working intactly! AMAZING!

This idea is actually found in the Hei-

lige words of Chazal. "A person should always consider the world as being in half to half balance, of zechusim and the opposite, and his ma'asim are tipping the scale this way or the other way!" In essence we can be the deciding factor with our deeds! Maybe for some time you're the one tipping the scale in favor for the entire world!

I guess this way of thought keeps the tzaddikim nistarim unknown to anyone, only to Hashem Himself!

Boruch Hashem! We should be forever praising Hashem and thanking Him for the privilege to be part of Hashem's Chosen Nation, and to be part of this massive National Power Grid of Zechusim, who are the "Energy Turbines" with our Mitzvois we do for Hashem!

Every little bit, you find and see fit, to do and keep your Neshama lit, don't think and sit, commit, and just do it! Never quit! From your Zechusim everyone will benefit, when you"ll recommit, not to act as a hypocrite, but to be Emes'dig and admit, with nothing ever counterfeit. And to stay close-knit, with every Yiddishe misfit, or dimwit, dressed in any outfit. If what for a Yid to say is unfit, you"ll always skip and omit, rather kind & Toirah'dige words your mouth will emit, then all the Mitzvois you"ll submit, and all the Zechusim that you"ll transmit, will all be as is befit, and Hashem will keep the entire world - every tiny tidbit, and megabit, going strong and "Git"!



As we are getting closer and closer to the Yom Tov of Purim our anticipation and excitement is growing. We are already in



the second Adar and we had an extra month of preparation for this great day.

Let us discuss the mitzvos of Purim so we can get a glimpse at this amazing day that we are looking for-ward to.

We see that on Purim there is

a great emphasis on being joyful, and at the same time there is a tremen-dous emphasis on bringing joy to others. "Mishte v'simcha" represents the need to be joyful ourselves. Then there are the mitzvos of "Mishloach manos and matanos l'evyonim" which represent making other people joyful.

So, we see that on Purim we give ourself chizzuk and to others as well. On this day we spend hours and hours of giving ourselves and others chizzuk. Isn't that something special?

Mikra Megilla. The concept of reading the Megilla is to internalize Hashem's love to Klal Yisroel. The Megil-la demonstrates that even in the Galus, Hashem is behind the scenes paving the way for us with miracles. As we say in the Modim "v'al nisecha shebichol yom".

Chazal teach us that when Moshiach comes all the Yomim Tovim will be batel [disappear] besides for Pu-rim.

The Meforshim explain that Chazal don't mean that the Yomim Tovim will cease to exist. Rather Chazal are just telling us that the Yomim Tovim won't stand out, because every day will be like a Yom Tov.

However, what's still puzzling is why is it that Purim is going to stand out more than the other Yomim To-vim when Moshiach comes? How do we understand this?

The Vilna Gaon brings a Mashal. There was once a king who had a son that did something terrible. Seeing no choice the king needed to put him in his place and he banished him from the palace.



However, since this prince was the crown prince the king realized that he must be protected. Protection from the wild world and protection from jealous ministers who want to inherit the kingdom themselves.

So, the king devised a plan. He hired a group of body guards to protect the prince. However, they were given strict orders

that the prince should not see them. The king did not want the prince to get too com-fortable in his exile.

One day as the prince walked into a forest a ferocious bear lunged at him. All of the sudden a shot rang out out of nowhere and killed the bear.



The prince looked around but he didn't see anyone in the vicinity. Wow he thought to himself this must be a stroke of good luck.

The next day as he was strolling in the streets, a vagabond took out a knife to kill the prince, as he was hired by a minister. All of the sudden a shot rang out and killed the vagabond.

These incidents kept on repeating itself, and finally the prince understood that the king was behind this. With much feelings of love the prince returned to the palace and embraced his father, and promised to turn over a new leaf.

The Nimshal is pretty clear. Hashem sent us into Galus and it would seem to us that Hashem chas v'shalom not watching



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out for us. However, as the Passuk says "v'anochi hasteer asteer". Hashem is telling us that He will hide from us, but he is still watching us.

We see from the story of the Megilla that Hashem is paving the way for us and protecting us from our enemies. However, the story of the Megilla has repeated itself many times and we celebrate Ha-shem's involvement in all the events of our life.

There are many Hamans in each generation, but Hashem constantly saves us from their hands, as we say it in the Haggada.

When Moshiach will come Hashem's Rachamim and love will be open once again. Therefore, all the Yomim Tovim which represent Hashem's open love will not stand out as we will once again see the great open nissim very soon in the era of Moshiach.

However, on Purim we celebrate the deep love that Hashem showed us in Galus. The love and protection that Hashem did for us in Galus behind the scenes [so to speak]. This will have an eternal significance even when Moshiach comes.

Purim represents Hashem's love and protection that is spread out throughout the exile. Through the thick and the thin, He was always there for us.

On Purim we are celebrating Klal Yisroel's continuity that we still exist today, despite all our enemies plans to annihilate us. So, we make a few L'chaim's and a huge meal which signifies our own existence.



At the same time, we celebrate together with Klal Yisroel as we include EVERYONE in our joy. This signifies the continuity of our nation as a whole.

Let us hope that this Purim we will celebrate with the deepest of joy

and laughter of "Az yimale s'chok pi-nu". If we are still here in Galus on Purim, let us sing, dance, praise Hashem non-stop and daven from the bottom of our heart for the ultimate simcha B'shuv Hashem es Tzion b'meheira Amen.

Q. Am I allowed to kiss the boo boos of my babies and toddlers on Shabbos?

Is this considered doing Refuah on Shabbos?

THE GENEROUS DONATION

R' Shlomka of Zeville relayed a powerful analogy:



Suppose a man comes collecting for a certain cause, and before giving his donation the donor asks him for two-dollars change, what enters the collector's mind at that moment? That the donor is giving him a five-dollar bill. If he asks for five-dollars change, the collector expects he's getting a ten-dollar bill. If it would be thirty-dollars change, he'd expect a fifty-dollar donation, etc. In short, the more the change, the greater the donation.

This analogy he relayed to a heartbroken fellow, after losing a close family member and experiencing other challenges, and approached R' Shlomo with the following question:

Chazal say that upon losing a family member, one must make the brachah of Dayan Ha'emes, and that the brachah should be made with the same joy as one would have when making a brachah on good tidings, Ha'tov V'Ha'meitiv. But why is it that only someone confronted with challenges makes that brachah? Shouldn't there also be a brachah for someone who doesn't have any problems? That's also worthy of a brachah! Why is there only a brachah for one faced with extreme difficulty?

R' Shlomo answered, in the same

vein. Hashem follows suit. The more 'change' we have to give Hashem, i.e., the more we have to endure, the greater the 'donation' we can expect Hashem will give us. Thus, when one has to 'give Hashem' more, the more he can anticipate receiving.

"That is why one must make a brachah on the bad and not on just having tranquility and stability. Only the one who has bad has this extra good awaiting him, and that's the cause for this brachah. The other person doesn't have this excitement facing him, so how can he make this brachah? He doesn't have the assurance this awaiting him, and thus he can't make the brachah."

When one has a big challenge, in the light of his emunah, he can see the ultimate salvation coming. That is surely reassuring and exciting, as it means that extreme good is waiting for him. Hence, already at the time of the difficulty, he makes a brachah.

One day, a person told Reb Moshe Kliros, zt"l, the Rav of Teveria, about his many difficulties in life. Reb Moshe told him, "Why are you telling me only half of the story?" The man didn't understand. "You are in the middle of the story," Reb Moshe assured him. "Wait a bit, and you will see how everything turns out well."

THE CATERER'S MENU

One of the major parts of a simchah is the food one serves at the event. By many simchas, the baalei simchah hand over this task to a caterer, freeing themselves to be involved in the other elements.

If one would go into a simchah hall's kitchen, it isn't always evident what type of event they're catering for. But, by looking at the amounts of food being prepared, one can usually guess what they're catering for.

If he sees them making a pound of chrein, horseradish, then it's probably a family Shabbos meal, maybe a sheva berachos. If there's five pounds of chrein, then it's more likely a bar

mitzvah meal. Ten pounds of chrein are probably more for a chasunah, while twenty pounds would be more for a "Rebbishe" chasunah, and so forth. Again, the bigger the amount, the larger the party.



R' Elimelech Bie-

derman uses this mashal to explain a similar point to what we've brought above. When a person confronts a bit of chrein, i.e., bitterness in his life, then he could anticipate a nice Shabbos ahead. While it's certainly an enjoyable meal, it doesn't compare to that of a bar mitzvah. If there's more bitterness, he can look forward to something better. The greater the darkness, the better the salvation awaits him.

So, when someone feels like he is encountering the greatest darkness, you know what he should expect? He should expect extreme good. The greater the darkness, the greater the

THE ROSH KOLLEL'S QUANDA-RY

A Rosh Kollel from Bnei Brak found himself in a

quandary. He was faced with bills from the Kollel that were adding up, and he was un-



able to cover the Kollel's expenses. He was unsure how to proceed. He heard from other Kollel fundraisers that going to America didn't always bring them the necessary funding, and sometimes it barely covered the cost of their plane tickets and trip expenses.

He therefore went to the Chazon Ish and posed the question to him. The Chazon Ish responded that should go to America for the money.

"Does that mean that I'm getting a brachah that I'll get all the necessary funds in America?" asked the Rosh Kollel. "Are you saying that it'll be the salvation for my dilemma?"

"No," responded that Chazon Ish. "All I said was that you shall go. I did not predict the outcome." The Rosh Kollel accepted the Chazon Ish's words, and left his home.

After two weeks of humiliation in America, he saw in the end that he hadn't even raised the money to cov-

er what he laid out for his trip, certainly not to cover the Kollel's budget. He didn't quite understand why the Chazon Ish therefore suggested he go in the first place, and was plagued with disappointthoughts ed the whole way home.

When he landed in Israel, he took a sheirut, shuttle, to Bnei Brak. Next to him sat a man who introduced himself, and they started a nice conversation. The Rosh Kollel asked him why he'd come, and he responded that he had come because of his father. Eleven months ago, his father had passed away and had requested to be buried on the outskirts of Bnei Brak. Although he'd lived in England, he nevertheless was close to many rabbanim in Bnei Brak, and thus had a big yearning to be buried there. The son had fulfilled his father's request, and now was returning to put up the matzeivah, gravestone.

The man asked the Rosh Kollel where he could find ten people for the Kaddish that he wanted to say following the placing of the matzeivah. The Rosh Kollel replied that he would be happy to arrange it. And so, before placing the matzeivah, the Rosh Kollel took some of the Kollel yungeleit to attend and make the minyan.

After the placing of the monument and saying Kaddish, the man was so moved by the conduct of these yungeleit and their kindness in willing to attend this event despite their busy schedules. He offered the Rosh Kollel a donation toward his Kollel,



which the Rosh Kollel happily accepted. Upon looking at the sum on the check, he saw that it was written for the staggering sum of one million dollars! The Rosh Kollel had got-**Continued on next page**



ten the entire sum needed to cover the **L'CHAIM** Kollel's budget, and more.

He then understood what the Chazon Ish had intended for him. The sum he received was much greater than anything he could've anticipated from all the donations he had been awaiting in America, but he wouldn't have received it had he not been on that sheirut. (Heard on Stories to Inspire, from R' Duvi Bensoussan)

There are several lessons that can be learned from this story. One is that one should always follow the advice of gedolim; by following them, we will always gain. But another lesson, along what we've been saying here, is that this Rosh Kollel got the yeshuah only after it seemed that he had no way out. After seeing his "last ditch effort" go nowhere, that is when the yeshuah originated and he was able to cover his Kollel's bill.



Someone complained to Rebbe Sholom of Kaminka about his bitter lot in life. Rebbe Shalom told him, "Everything is sweet. You just think that it's bitter." The man replied, "How can you say my life is good?"

Rebbe Shalom answered, "Alcohol tastes bitter for those who aren't accustomed to it. But this bitter drink leads to joy... Similarly, although things seem bitter, it is really joyous. Something good will come from it."


This can be compared to a person



lost in a forest for a long time. Finally, after wandering for days, he notices a clearing in the distance. He rushes there and sees that it is a cemetery. He is overcome with relief because he knows he is near an inhabited area.

Generally, finding a graveyard isn't a joyous occasion, but for this person, it was a joyous sign because it signified he was near civilization.

The nimshal is that people don't generally associate hardships with happiness. Nevertheless, when you know that the difficulties are a sign that something very good will follow, you will be happy with the hardships too.





Purim: Joyful Servants of the King

The yeshivah bachurim were surprised when an elderly non-Jew approached them, but they were even more surprised by what he said. "You know, I've been meaning to tell you young men how much I appre-



ciate certain things about you," the stranger remarked. "Whenever I see you, you are always dressed in such a

respectful and dignified way. And the most impressive thing of all is that you are always smiling. I can see the satisfaction on your faces, and it really is such a pleasure for me to behold."



The mood and state of mind of a ben Torah are an important part of shaping the impression that others will have. The pesukim in Nechemiah (2:1-3) relate that Nechemiah, who was employed as a servant of the king, was


distressed over the destruction of Yerushalayim and the plight of his brethren. When the king noticed his unhappiness, he accused Nechemiah of being displeased with his status as a royal servant, and Nechemiah became extremely frightened, fearing that the king would punish him.

Rav Avraham Pam zt"l pointed out that this incident illustrates a very important principle in avodas Hashem. When a person who lives a life of Torah radiates unhappiness and displeasure, it reflects negatively on his life's pursuit — serving Hashem. When such demonstrate how wonderful a life of Torah truly is. The holiday of Purim is known as a time of simchah, but it is important to recognize the true nature and purpose of that simchah. On Purim, we have an opportunity to infuse our service of Hashem with joy. And as we have seen, bringing joy into our service of Hashem is a crucial part of our role as the purveyors of kiddush Hashem in the world.

Rav Yitzchak Hutner zt"l uses a mashal to explain the dif-



ference between the joy of Purim and the simchah of the other holidays throughout the year: Many people, upon recovering from an illness, hold a special feast in order to celebrate their recovery. At most of these celebrations, the degree of joy that the recovered patient demonstrates tends to be proportionate to the degree of danger posed by his disease and



a person is unhappy or depressed, others who observe him will conclude that serving Hashem is not a valuable or enjoyable experience. It stands to reason, then, that it is of vital importance for a ben Torah always to project an air of joy and contentment, in order to

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
to the efficacy of the cure. The more dangerous the disease and the better the prognosis, the more joy the person will display.

But there is one type of illness in which the degree of the patient's joy is not dependent on the severity of his condition. This is the state of depression, a con-



dition that itself limits a person's ability to experience joy. When a person recovers from this illness, the joy that he displays is more than merely a response to his recuperation. Rather, the joy itself is the sign that he has recovered. The more he is able to celebrate, the further he extricates himself from the morass of depression that his condition created; every increase in his simchah is a reason for even greater joy. Thus, the delight of a person who has recovered from this illness is limitless by its very nature, as the joy itself continues to increase of its own accord.

Rav Mattisyahu Salomon shlita (Matnas Chaim: Moadim) elaborates further on this discussion. Before the miracle of Purim took place, the Jewish people were in a state of extreme melancholy. They had lost the ability to find joy in their performance of mitzvos, and they turned instead to the feast of Achashverosh in their search for happiness. After their salvation from Haman's decree, however, they rediscovered the vast potential for joy in the observance of charged with absorbing this uniquely Jewish simchah, the joy in keeping Hashem's mitzvos, and making it part of our service of Hashem. The more we are able to feel



On Purim, each of us is



this joy, the more reason we will have to rejoice. This simchah, then, is an integral part of our status as the nation of mekadshei Hashem.

In Review: Purim is a time for us to rediscover and renew our simchah shel mitzvah — the joy we experience in performing mitzvos. That sense of joy is important for us to cultivate, because it enables us to convey the message that serving Hashem is truly a source of joy, and that there is nothing in the world that is more enjoyable.

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

One thing is called happiness. That is to feel loved, watched and protected by Hashem.

Realize that Hashem loves you, and He created the whole world just for you! Everyone and everything that you see is just for you to feel loved! "Bishvili nivra haolam."

As my Rebbe said over from his Rebbeim in Navardok, that people like to drink on Purim to become happy. You know what we do on Purim to become happy? We start feeling loved by Hashem! That is the ikkur way. Wine is a tafel. If you make the wine the ikkur it comes and it goes. It's not there to stay and it's not true, intrinsic simcha. The real true and intrinsic simcha comes from learning Bitachon. On Purim, they would spend more time working on Bitachon than drinking wine!

That is the ikkur simcha!

One Hundred Thousand Operations

We saw in the last issue that one of the best ways to be מרבה בשמחה and acquire the life changing *midah* of simcha is to pay attention to the myriads of constant kindnesses that Hashem is doing for us. At first, they may not seem so exciting, but if we imagine life without them, we will quickly change our minds. For example, did you ever sprain or hurt one of your fingers? Suddenly, buttoning your shirt became a daunting task! So, isn't it lots of fun to have fingers that move swiftly and painlessly?

Let us develop this idea with the following story (which hopefully never happened):

Little Yankel was crawling on the floor, enjoying his freedom after being cooped up in his crib. His mother was trying to prepare lunch and at the same time keep an eye on her little guy. Suddenly, she heard a squeal

of joy as Yankel discovered a small, glittery object. Knowing that little people discover the world through their mouth, she ran towards him, but he saw her coming. With supersonic speed he stuck it in his mouth and swallowed it. His mother picked him and tried getting him to cough it out, but to no avail. She called her friend who told her not to worry, as whatever it was will pass through his system. Unfortunately, it wasn't so simple, as Yankel soon began to scream in pain. His worried parents called *hatzalah* and they rushed him to the



emergency room. After looking at the x-rays the doctors told Yankel's parents that they saw a small screw lodged in his small intestine. He would need an emergency operation to get the foreign object out of his little body. After a several-hour operation under full anesthesia, the team of surgeons managed to get the screw out. They had to make several incisions and the recovery was not so simple, but Yankel's parents were thankful for the happy ending.

Rav Elya Lopian zt"l would say that in truth, this is what happens each time we eat. We are in essence putting



a foreign matter in our bodies, and if it would stay there, we would be in mortal danger. We really should run to the emergency room to have the waste product removed. Instead, Hashem created our bodies in a way that it is removed safely and painlessly. Rav Elya said that before we say Asher Yatzar we should bear in mind six wonders: 1) The best "Doctor" in the world 2) is removing a foreign object from our bodies 3) in the easiest manner 4) without anesthesia 5) without pain 6) and with no charge! Since Asher Yatzar was so dear to him, Rav Elya would always put on his hat and upper garment when saying it. He would add that really, a person should have so much simcha from the wonders that Hashem is performing for him, that he should put on his *streimel* and *bekesha* (or other

Shabbos clothing) before saying this beracha.

Let us do a little math. An average person uses the restroom six to seven times a day, which means 210 times a month and 2520 times a year. So, by the time he has reached the age of 40, he has undergone 100,000 operations without doctor visits, medical forms, pre-ops, fasting, recovery rooms, hospitalizations, morphine, pain killers, and follow-up visits! Let us try to use the above to not only help us say Asher Yatzar with simcha, but also to walk around with joy in our hearts all day long!

The Chovos Helevavos says that one reason is because Hashem wanted to test man if they will indeed earn their livelihood in a permissible way, following everything the Torah expects from them.

The Lesson: WHAT MAKES THIS IDEA SO INCREDIBLE AND AMAZING, is that if a person cheats other people Chas

V'Shalom or makes gets his parnassa in any way that is against Halacha or hashkafa then he missed the boat in life! The Chovos Helevavos is teaching us that one of the whole ideas of our involvement is so that we should do so in a kosher way! If we understand and realize this concept, we struck gold! If we live with Bitachon and understand and realize that it is all from Hashem and all the acts is because He wants us to do it, so do it in the correct way! And if we do – we WON the jackpot! If we remember this concept and act this way, we are fulfilling our tafkid correctly we can have the title of being an ehrliche Yid!



The Story: IN THE CHOFETZ CHAIM'S CITY there lived a man who would close his store very close to the onset of

Shabbos, and on מוצאי שבת he would quickly run to open it. The Chofetz Chaim told the Yid the following Mashal: There was once a simple farmer who filled his wagon with wheat and went to the large city to sell it. When he arrived, a group of people gathered around his wagon to buy the wheat. The farmer was concerned that the people would try to cheat him by paying for only some of the wheat that they had taken. To prevent that, he told his potential customers to put a cheap copper coin into his hat for every sack they filled with wheat. That way, when they finished filling their sacks, the farmer could count the coins and know how much they owed him.



The customers agreed and quickly began filling sacks with wheat, and the farmer's hat with coins. As the farmer saw the growing pile of money, he could not resist the temptation to pocket some of the coins.



The foolish farmer did not realize that for every coin he took he was losing money for an entire sack of wheat.

The Chofetz Chaim told the man, "Shabbos is the מקור הברכות and the six days of the week are blessed because of Shabbos, and the more honor you give the Shabbos the more blessing you will have during the week". The Chofetz Chaim concluded; "If you shorten your Shabbos to run to work you are also shortening the amount of shefa of parnassa that you will receive that week."

The Torah Obligation to Enjoy Olam Hazeh

Olam Chessed Yibaneh

Rav Reuven Garfinkel of Lakewood, New Jersey, offers the following insight, which demonstrates the world's inherent goodness:

Chazal teach us that Hashem created the world for chessed, and if we look around at the world, we can clearly see how this is true. Unlike animals, people have many needs. No one can provide himself with all of his own needs. From the day a person is born until the day he is buried, he must rely on other people to help him.

But how can we convince people to provide us with our needs? We do it by paying them money. And to get our money, we provide people with the goods or services that they need!

What comes out is that the world consists of billions of people busy from morning to night providing each other with their needs! The world is, in essence, a gigantic chessed organization!

Note: Chessed does not only refer to doing free favors. Our gedolim teach that any businessman, storekeeper, or service provider is constantly engaged in chessed, since he is providing goods or services to others who need them. The money he earns does not detract at all from the chessed. However, fulfillment of this mitzvah of chessed and reward for that mitzvah may depend on whether one had kavanah to fulfill the mitzvah. It's therefore vital to think about the mitzvah of chessed when engaged in business. Having this kavanah will transform each workday into a "treasure trove" of mitzvos! This is an unparalleled opportunity,

which one should surely not pass by. See Ka'asher Tzivah Hashem by R' Daniel Garfinkel, pp. 51 and 114, for an elaboration of this idea.

This truth of the goodness of humanity is sharply perceived when a person becomes seriously ill or frail with age. At such a time, one feels weak and vulnerable, and he begins to realize how many people are

available to care for him — not just his immediate family but the entire medical system: doctors, specialists, nurses,

therapists, and much more. He also recognizes and appreciates that he is the beneficiary of a tremen-

dous amount of medical research and technological innovation that has been ongoing since the beginning of history! In this way, he comes to realize that this is a world full of kindness.

However, a person should not wait to get sick to recognize this fact. Healthy people should think the same way. For example, when traveling by plane, a person should think about all the benefits he is receiving: spacious, beautiful airports, fast,

comfortable jet planes, air traffic controllers, government safety regulations, and much more. If a person trains himself to think




this way, seeing chessed everywhere, he will greatly increase his happiness and enjoyment of life.

Chazal Knew How to Enjoy Life

We find in the Gemara that the Tanna'im and Amora'im enjoyed the pleasures of this world.

The mishnah in Maseches Brachos describes the festive seudos of the people in that era. Although their homes were not nearly as luxurious as ours — for example, their floors were just sandy ground —they did enjoy some things that we do not. For instance, at the end of a seudah, they would bring out sweet-smelling incense to fill the house with a pleasant, enjoyable aroma. (See Brachos, perek 6, mishnah 6) Additionally, we find in the Gemara that




third-born calves were known to have the tastiest meat. (See Ta'anis 12b, Chullin 133a, Shabbos 11a) While today we have access to many delicious meats, we don't find any that list the birth order of the animal being sold! Yet Amora'im would serve this kind of meat at special occasions, and they certainly enjoyed it greatly.

Another example is the Gemara in Brachos, which says that sneezing during Shemoneh Esrei is a good sign. Why? Because a person's body feels a pleasant sensation after sneezing. Since Hashem caused him to feel this pleasant sensation during Shemoneh Esrei, this indicates that his tefillah is favorable to Hashem. The Amora Rav Zeira said that he was extremely happy when he heard this from the beis medrash of Rav Hamnuna because, as Rashi explains, Rav Zeira was quite prone to sneezing. (Brachos 24b; see Rashi and Hagahos HaBach)

We learn from here an amazing lesson. How many people can say that they have ever paid attention to the pleasure of a sneeze? But the Amora'im did, and they even viewed that pleasure as a special sign of affection from Hashem! (This may the silver lining of allergies!) It's reasonable to presume that the tzaddikim of the time also paid attention to many other pleasures that they were blessed with, in every area of life. It was surely a derech hachaim that did not just apply to sneezes. And they recorded it in the Gemara so that we can learn to have the same perspective! (There are many other physical pleasures that may go unnoticed, such as yawning, stretching, laughing, burping, scratching an itch, sleeping, etc.)

Just Look At What Hashem Made For You! It's a Stunning World! It's Full of Love! It's a Wonderful World! **Sruly Yelen** A GLIMPSE INTO THE PAST Lakewood, New Jersey



Hashem created a tremendous amount of different voices in the world. You can recognize someone you know by just hearing their voice. Recognition can be so crystal clear that it can be relied on halacha l'masa even for situations that require definite recognition. What differentiates one person's voice from another? The speed of the vibrations of our vocal cords affects the pitch of our voices.

But the range of vibrations in men's voices are around 60-150 vibrations, it's not enough to explain how we find millions of different voices.

The sounds we produce are also formed by the size and shape of the various cavities that the air travels through when we speak: the voice box, the throat, the mouth and the nasal cavities. Since Hashem created people with different sizes and shapes in these areas, it drastically changes the sounds that they produce.

Our voices are also highly influence by our articulation, which is contingent on the shape and size of our teeth, lips and tongues. Our voices can noticeably change by the removal of a tooth or a swollen lip. Hashem made these minute differences in our vocal cords, our respiratory cavities and our mouth, to amazingly create millions and millions of different voices. Let's continue examining the wondrous vocal cords that Hashem gifted us with and try to understand more about how they function.

We explained that sounds are produced through the extremely rapid movement that the vocal cords vibrate. The pitch is contingent on the speed of the vi-

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brations. So when the vibrations are faster, then the sounds come out on a higher pitch. We can see these variations from the sound of a fan. When you raise the speed of a fan, the sounds changes to a higher pitch.

Women speak on a higher pitch than men. The reason is because their vocal cords vibrate quicker. Why is this so? Hashem created women's vocal cords shorter, thinner and tighter than men's vocal cords. This causes that the vibrations of women's vocal cords is close to double the amount of vibrations that men produce with their vocal cords.

Answers for the Parsha Game page 17 Salt: Hashem told us to bring salt with the karbanos Flour: The karbon Minchos nedavos and on certain aveiros a poor man brings karbon mincha with flour.

> Even though women's and men's voices are quiet noticeably different, Hashem b'chachmaso arranged this with just small minute differences between their sizes. The lengths of men's vocal cords are around 20 millimeters and women's vocal cords are around 15 millimeters. That's just a difference of around five millimeters. The difference in their thickness is even minuter. The men's vocal cords are around 4 millimeters thick. And women's cords are around 3 millimeters thick.

> These minuscule differences in size affect the amount of vibration which produces different types of voices. Hashem gave men voices that are more fitting for their masculine role and Hashem gave women voices that are fit for their feminine role.

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Amazing Burrowing Frogs


Frog estivation (Hibernation that starts in the summer.)

The topic of estivation and hiberna-

tion is a topic full of miracles. Not all animals go through these processes, but of the many that do, each tells of a different miraculous process. For this article we will focus on what is known as Burrowing Frogs. Estivation is similar to hibernation and it takes place in areas where it gets VERY hot and VERY dry for long periods. All sources of water dry up and there's no rain from anywhere from six months to two OR

MORE years! Now, before we start, you must remember that these are frogs. They really don't know much. In fact, they "know" very little. Each frog is totally on its own.

As the heat builds up, the frog sees that all the local water lakes and ponds are basically pretty much dried up. So, what would you do? I doubt you would do what they do. They dig backwards, down into some still muddy earth. Low and behold, they have special back feet that have



"shovels" that are "digging imple-



what? So, here is a tail of two miracles. The first miracle actually takes place very frequently, nevertheless it's still a very complicated process. It called molting and by frogs it's called shedding or sloughing.

This is a very complex chemical process spurred on by select hormones that separates the outer skin of the frog relatively frequently. In some species it can be as often as every day, and other species wait longer. It's needed because, believe it or



not, frogs can breathe through their nostrils AND through their skin! In fact, they do a LOT of breathing through their skin. There's a very high concentration of blood capillaries right under this very thin skin layer. It allows air to flow through the skin, thereby allowing oxygen into the capillaries, and carbon dioxide, out of the capillaries through the skin to the outside air.

> Now, in order to keep the skin fresh and clean so that it can keep up this vital breathing process, every day or so, in some species a little longer, they shed their skin. With their front and back legs, they pull off the old skin and actually eat it all up!

> It works as follows: First a new layer of skin develops over the capillaries, but still under the old layer. Once that's in place,

there's a special fluid that is secreted in between the new and old layer, which then separates the two layers. Now that the old layer is separate, it can be shed. This itself needs numerous working parts and hormones for it to work properly. It's quite a miraculous process, but that's not for this article. Ok, now that you know this, we go back to our burrowing frog digging down under the ground. Ok, so what's next?

The frog just sits around, doing nothing. Now, what is the frog expecting to happen? Why did it go down under ground? Believe me, it has no idea what's supposed to happen. Hashem put in it instincts that it should dig underground. NOT a good idea if you don't have a game plan ready to implement, since there's no food (insects), air, or water down there. But "LUCKILY" low and behold, an important process starts to happen.

Firstly, as in hibernating animals as well, their system starts to shut



down. Their breathing slows down dramatically. Their heart is barely pumping. Most of their systems are basically shutting down. The less systems working the less energy needed, and the less wastes produced. The systems slow down as much as 75 - 80%. But one system goes into overdrive. The shedding system stops half way. The old layer is shed, BUT it is kept on the frog. Then a day or two later another layer is shed, but it is also kept in place, and from underneath it pushes up the older skin layer. The layers are very thin. As time goes on the layers really pile up and it forms a cocoon all around the frog! It closes all the openings, including their mouth and from where they excrete their wastes. HOWEV-ER, LOW AND BEHOLD, the cocoon has "brains" and it always leaves the nostrils open!! These layers continue to pile up, thereby making the cocoon thicker and thicker. It can have over 50 layers of shed skin.


Now, how in the world can dumb skin cells "know" to stop right by the two nostril holes? They cover the mouth from where they eat and they cover the opening where they excrete their wastes, so why not continue and cover the nostrils? Is there a stop sign on their nostrils? Do these skin cells know how to read the sign? I doubt you will find the answer to this question anywhere.

Trust me, I looked all over for one and I couldn't find one. This miracle clearly shows that there MUST be a G-d controlling things!

What's the purpose of the cocoon? The cocoon keeps the water in the frog from evaporating thereby causing dehydration which would be fatal to the frog. It's getting very hot and dry all over and the cocoon is a VERY effective method for keeping in all the moisture. In a short while it curtails the rate of water loss very significantly. frogs since they can have dry spells as long as 2-3+ years and they will stay underground that entire time without budging an inch!! Miraculously they survive, but not only do they "survive" but when it finally starts to rain again, they are up and running almost IMMEDIATELY! So, what's the big deal?

The big deal is that by humans and, lehavdil, animals that don't hibernate, even if they are immobile for a short amount of time, as short as ten days, their muscle mass starts to wither away. It's called muscle atrophy. Someone who is, chas v'shalom, bedridden for even a relatively short time very often needs to go to physical therapy to learn how to start using their muscles again, and if it was for a long time in disuse, serious muscle atrophy will set in. It's called the disuse (of one's organs) syndrome.

But low and behold, where it's Hashem that put into his creatures the instinct to hibernate or estivate, basically NO HARM occurs to any part of their body! It's an amazing miracle. The heart comes close to stopping, the blood circulation is almost at a halt, the other main organs are all running at 20-25% of normal capacity, and certainly, the muscles which have come to a 100% complete halt for such a long time should be in really bad shape. Nevertheless, since it's brought about through Hashem, the same Hashem made sure that the body should have various special mechanisms and controlling hormones and genes, that make sure everything will be in FULL functioning order when the hibernation or esti-



Now we will discuss another miracle found with not only burrowing frogs, but with almost all animals that either hibernate over the winter for about 6 months, or estivate over the summer months. But it's even more amazing with burrowing



vation comes to its end, in spite of the extremely long vacation!

As a side point, here's an interesting brief explanation how bears manage through their hibernation. To understand the miracle involved, you must



understand that if an animal were not be able to use the bathroom for a somewhat prolonged time, they would probably die from uric acid buildup in the kidneys, which is fatal.

Here's what a non-Jewish author writes in his book about how bears manage to go so long during the winter without "using the bathroom". "But get this: bears have special microbes in their guts that, during the winter months, (when they hibernate) SOMEHOW convert the uric acid to nitrogen, which goes




on to make new amino acids, which are the building blocks of protein (which are essential for the use of the body). With the protein, which is basically food, they are able to maintain lean body tissue in the comfort of their own dens

without eating or

eliminating waste. If that is not a miracle, what is?" This wasn't a word for word quote, but the end that asks, if that is not a miracle, what is? Is an exact quote! I couldn't have said it better! Basically, what should turn into urine, is SOMEHOW turned into food! That IS a miracle.

Burrowing frogs and the whole process of estivation and hibernation is a miraculous process made by Hashem! There's MUCH more to these processes, but it's not for this article.

Picture of the layers of cocoon skin, one on top of the other magnified many times.



MAZAL ADAR DAGIM

I was at an aquarium a few weeks ago and learned such a powerful lesson about pumping people up. I saw a fascinat-

ing dolphin show (see photo from the show). At the show, I realized that the dolphin trainers were all playing with the dolphins and rewarding them for doing their tricks. There was a real relationship between the trainers and the dolphins; they patted them and laughed with them. And this is with an animal! I was thinking how, a million times more so, we need to "pat people on the back." We need to play with them, have fun with them, clap "hurray," and pump them up if we want the people around us to be able to perform. This includes children, spouses, students, chavrusas, employees, neighbors, and friends!

Pump people up: 100 % Yes and Yes!!!

Saying the word YES is a form of pumping people up! Following are several fundamental points in regard to saying the word YES.

1. Rabbi Golombeck talks about seeing the Yeshuah already. Saying "Yes, I am better. Yes, I am able. Yes, I can." This YES is about focusing on relying on Hashem as the Kol Yachol and thinking, saying, believing, and feeling, that: Yes,

Hashem can do ANY-THING, YES, IT CAN BE right now, Yes, the BI-TACHON is the SIBAH for the Yeshuah. Yes, everything is the same easy for Hashem; everything is possible for Hashem and can happen with the blink of an eye. Oil can burn and vinegar can burn,

\$100.00 can turn into \$200.00, a 60-minute walk can take 15 minutes, a person's shidduch can immediately arrive with the blink of an eye, a person can get the money they need, and a sick person can be healed. Yes, it is all so, so easy for Hashem. We just need to turn to our loving, caring, Father and Best Friend, Hashem — knowing, believing, and feeling that: Yes, Hashem can do anything!

2. Did you know that "yes" turns on our part of our mind that makes us more calm and ready to be relaxed? The opposite is true of NO. There are a lot of experiments showing the benefit of using the word yes to help people feel better about themselves.

3. When one hears the word yes repeatedly it makes things easier for them. Did you know that when one hears the word YES, it activates a part of the brain that is ready to take action? For example, saying "Yes, you are strong enough to climb that mountain" activates that part of the brain. This is because when one imagines that something

happened, the same neurons wire as if it already happened. The opposite is true as well. When we say the word NO or CANNOT the neurons that are needed for that action don't kick in because they "think" they're not needed anyway. However, if you say YES and YES, I CAN, then all the neurons that may be needed come to the forefront and are all ready to be used. This is true even for things that are seemingly impossible! For example, if you say "NO, I can't climb up this mountain," all the neurons that are needed for such a climb take a back seat. And then actually climbing the mountain

becomes harder. If you say "Yes, I can climb the mountain," then even if it seems really hard, the neurons come to the forefront because they are getting all prepared to do the action.

4. It is important to believe in people, to believe that: yes, they can. Belief in someone means you really believe in the "yes, they can." For example, if your child comes home grumpy most days, do you expect he will come home

grumpy today? Or do you believe that: yes, today can be different, and yes, today he will be in an excellent mood? Your child will feel your belief in him and know if you are in the "yes" positive mindset.

5. Talking as if

another person did something, as they are contemplating the action, is really helpful. This concept is: yes, you completed it, yes, I believe in you! For example, the second I see a child deciding if he will follow the directions in the classroom, I may say, "Oh, wow! I see Moishy is bringing his chair to the table." I was once on a long walk with someone who was going through a difficult time. We were walking in a park and there was snow on the ground. As we got pretty close to the end the path, the person I was with said she couldn't walk anymore

—she was too cold. I took a few more steps and said "Look, we did it. We're at the end. See there is the end. We did this whole path." She then had a simpler time finishing the walk because she received the message that she already finished it. When the brain thinks we finished the action it gives the necessary directives to complete it. It is good to imagine and manifest the outcome you want, as it prepares us to have extra strength for that action.

6. "Yes" is also a word that helps people heal emotionally. It can help a person feel wanted, loved, and worthwhile. Having times that you respond, "Yes, you can have this" or "Yes, I love spending time with you" can really change a person's whole day around for the better.

7. Saying yes and meaning it genuinely is vital! A few years back, I noticed that when I asked one of my brothers Amush something, he answered "Yes, 100%." I noticed that this way of speaking really made me feel good, so I started answering clients and people with "Yes, 100%" or "sure, definitely." I noticed how good people feel when I do this. I started being more aware of this. When someone asked me something instead of saying 'Okay' (which can sound like you are doing it, dragging your feet), I try to say, "Yes, 100%." People feel so pumped with this wording because it makes them feel like you really mean it. For example, if someone asks "Can you go out with me now?" you can answer, "Yes, 100%." Another example is when a child says "Can I play with this toy?" you can answer, "Yes, 100%." Or if they ask, "Can you make me chicken for supper tonight?" and you answer, "Yes, 100%," or if a neighbor asks, "Can I use your shovel?" you can answer "100%, yes!"



answer is "no, can just as we time." For exa we play with t ner so he can saying "No, nu dinner," you say "Yes, 100" toys after din "Can we go out tired to go out tonight," you to go out with 8. You can also say "Yes" instead of no. Since the word "no" really turns off the brain in multiple ways, it's very beneficial to try to say yes even when you may otherwise have said no or no not now. If someone asks you something and the

answer is "no, not now," then the answer can just as well be "yes, but at a different time." For example, a child asks you, "Can we play with these toys?" It's time for dinner so he can't play right then. Instead of saying "No, not now. First we are having dinner," you can switch that to yes and say "Yes, 100%, you can play with those toys after dinner." Or a spouse asks you "Can we go out tonight?" and you are too tired to go out. Instead of saying "No, not tonight," you can say "Yes, I would love to go out with you. Does tomorrow night also work for you? I am so tired tonight."

Try to see how many times this week you can say yes instead of no. (It is important to note that we are not saying there is no place for setting limits and listening to a parent. However, that is a different discussion).

9. The word Yes can also solidify: Yes, it's true, as in the song below. This yes helps the truth that is mentioned become part of us and also opens up the yes part of our brain. The Yes helps us feel in agreement fully with the words we sing.

Hashem, I thank You so, so much YES YES YES! After I wrote this article, I listened to a Yesod #1803 on A Life with Bitachon. Rabbi Golombeck said that you can split the word ADAR into two words: ADAR is alef which is Hashem and Dar which means lives. Hashem lives with us all day all night every-



where we are — on a plane and in the rain and everywhere else! This knowledge that Hashem lives with us and is with us and protecting us is what brings us true joy. It was interesting to me that he gave the example that Hashem is with us when we are flying in the sky, because I had just had a related experience. The night before I listened to this Yesod, I flew back from Miami and the plane was very shaky. However, I felt so calm knowing that Hashem is the pilot driving the plane and He is watching me and protecting me. After I listened to this Yesod, I was singing this song:

Fishing for opportunities to pump people up in shul:

• I was in Florida this Shabbos and I went to my best

friend's house. If you are guessing that I went to Shul you are correct. I feel so joyous when I get an opportunity to go to shul! Klal Yisroel is so holy — Yidden love Hashem and come to daven. The women's section was packed, but there were not enough seats so I went to a pile of chairs in the corner and set up more seats. The ladies were pumped because then they could rest their tired feet while talking to Hashem! Then those chairs used up so I kept putting out more chairs so more and more people could sit. Finally, there was no room to put down another chair. One more lady walked in and I saw a spot between two people that we could squeeze a chair. I asked them if we could add a chair there and they said yes. Yidden love Yidden. We squeezed one more chair in so everyone had a seat!

A simple and genuine smile and Good Shabbos can pump people up to no end. After Davening; I try to smile and say a genuine Good Shabbos and compliment as many people as possible. Each person was so pumped. I told one person she has the cutest baby and she should have tons of Nachas, I told another person what a kind person they are and so on. It just takes a few words to make someone beam from ear to ear. During the meal at the shul, someone approached me and said "I see you have an Ayin Tova. How do you have an Ayin Tova on everything?" I replied "I mean what I say to people genuinely. Just notice all the good that people are doing around you. Think about it often, and tell people about. Most of all, notice how good every single Yid is internally, no matter what." When you see people doing things that maybe others would not do in dress or action, just see how amazing they are in other ways and pump them up for that. They will beam and feel strong and realize all Yidden love Yidden and Hashem loves us most of all!

• Clean the shul by putting away siddurim or throwing out tissues! After davening I put away the siddurim and the chairs and clean up a bit. I love making a shul look beautiful because I feel like then I have a part in Hashem's palace: A Mikdash Me'at. This is a great way to pump yourself up!

• Take others to shul! There was a girl in Miami who was hearing impaired and wasn't able to hear yet. She wanted to go to shul but no one wanted to take her because she could not follow along and kept asking where they were up to. I jumped at the opportunity to get a million dollars and I told her to come with me to Shul! Each time I was there

Purim is a time of joy! Hashem is always sending us love. Sometimes it is hidden and sometimes it is easier to see, but if we look out for Hashem's love, we will always feel it.

I invited her with me to Shul. I got to know this amazing person and she taught me so much. She was kind and wise beyond her years, so thoughtful and close to Hashem. To assist her so she knew what we were up to I simply kept my finger on the place

I pumped her up and told her how amazing she was — because she really was and she learned all the details of shul (like when to answer Amein, Brich Hu etc). If you are an adult, try to see if there is someone in your neighborhood that would be pumped if you take them to shul. Maybe someone who is struggling or someone who doesn't have a father living at home with them. You can really turn a person's life around!

• See how many people you can compliment in shul after Davening. It takes so little time and the effect is amazing!

Fishing for ideas to pump people up at the beach!

Look out for Chessed wherever you go.

In a matter of ten minutes, we were able to pump ten people up by:

Offering to take a picture for a mother and daughter who looked like they would appreciate it. Telling a mother what a refined daughter she has, telling someone how cute their baby is, telling a mother-in-law who brought her daughterin-laws away on vacation what a special thing it was for her, smiling at people, telling people how sensitive kind and caring they are, and telling a few different groups of people how amazing it is to see Yidden from all over!

Fishing for more ideas to spread the joy and pump people up!

• Spread the joy with your neighbors! Purim is a time of joy. How much joy can you bring to your upstairs neighbor, downstairs neighbor, neighbor on the side of you, neighbor down the block, your neighbor in shul, neighbor at your job, and neighbor at yeshiva?

• Spread the joy: Say the word yes often to your children, students, spouse, parents, friends, and most of all, yourself.

• Spread the Purim joy: How many letters can you put in the mail to people wishing them a Happy Purum?

• Spread the joy in stores: When I eat in a restaurant, or sometimes when I go to any store, I wrote a thank you note on the back of the receipt and leave it for the owner, cook, or staff. The owners of stores and their team are pumped! You can't image what this does for their day!

• Spread the joy: Thank people as often as possible. For example: Thank you for helping me clear the table; it made my day easier. Thank you for sharing that information with me. Thank you for sharing a piece of your heart with me. Thank you for being

with me. Thank you for agreeing to come to the suit store. I really appreciate it. Thank you for packing my bags at the grocery. Thank you for being the best cashier. Thank you for playing this beautiful music at this simcha.

• Spread the joy: Sing and dance in your home as often as possible.

Spread the joy: Thank Hashem all day long!

Idea: 100 laps = 100 thank yous. I went swimming and each time I got to the end of the pool, I said something that I thanked Hashem for. In this way, I included my senses with thanking Hashem! This means I included water- a sensory element which helps solidify the experience. You can do this while you are washing dishes. For each dish you wash, you can thank Hashem for one thing. Or while you clear the table, as you pick up each item, you can thank Hashem for one thing.

I just love to try to give people support and Chizuk. As an aside: Doing for others makes us feel so good ourselves and fills our own emotional bank account!

When we add change to something while we are singing, it helps solidify the feelings associated with it. The more times we sing and add a small change, the more neural pathways we have connected to what we are doing. This helps it become more integrated into our beings.

I was on the plane and I was in the mood of a ginger ale, so when they were giving out drinks I asked for a ginger ale. I received a ginger ale, but I did not see any kosher symbol on it. She then went to the bottom of her tray and looked though a bunch of cans of ginger ale. Most of them didn't have any kosher symbol. 

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A VISIT TO R' DANIEL!

Recap: A most amazing piece of information that is too good to be true, came to our attention! R' Daniel: I was actually in the middle of saying tehillim in my house. I think it was kapital מ"ד. I heard a voice calling out in Persian, "עשה" I went to the window to see what was happening and I couldn't believe my eyes. There was Haman giving Mordechei the greatest honor! It was too good to be true! It made no sense! The Kiddush Hashem was unbelievable! Everyone, Jew and non-Jew, clearly saw how Hashem wanted to honor Mordechai the Jew!

At that moment we were able to feel in our hearts that the yeshua was coming. But we never dreamed how fast it would be...

From one minute to the next, we suddenly saw Haman hanging from the gallows! The day before, he was the most feared man on earth and the next day he was dead hanging in public. We were in shock! It happened so quick! Just a few minutes before we were in the most impossible situation!

We couldn't stop thanking Hashem. I get the chills just thinking back to those moments.

The Spring Hill Times: How did the Goyim around you react to the situation?

R' Daniel: The Golyim all of sudden became very respectful to the Jews! Many many people even converted to Judaism! People were in awe of us Yidden!

It reminded me of what happened before Klal Yisrael left Mitzrayim, when all of a sudden our worst enemies became our best friends. It taught us a big lesson never to focus on the person. The gentile himself is not in control of whether he should love or hate Jews. It's all in the hands of Hashem.

Illuminating Words of Chazal

"Everything about Hashem, His Torah and His world is supposed to bring out positive emotions and help us have a healthy relationship with Hashem." Ray Yehuda Mandel Q: We know that Hashem is the One running the whole world. We hear all the time on 'A Life with Bitachon' that Hashem is running a perfect world and that every single detail is according to His will and is perfect.

There are so many people who are involved in sins, Jews and non-Jews. How can we view that as something perfect? Why would Hashem want people to distance themselves from Him?

Why would Hashem want to put people in situations where they sin and will incur heavy punishment? How is that perfect? How could people being born in secular families and it's 100% sure that they will do many sins as a result, be considered perfect?

In addition, Hashem Himself said, "Don't do this. I don't want you to do this." How can we say at the same time that Hashem wants it to happen and that it's perfect?

A. Reb Chatzkel Levenstein writes in his sefer on emunah that be-

chira is in the thought process. That's where bechira lies. But for the action and results, that's what Hashem wanted. Reb Moshe Feinstein in Darash Moshe brings the pasuk Kol haneshama tehallel Kah, all neshamos are praising Hashem. Reb Moshe asks the obvious question, less than 1% of the world is praising Hashem. Of the 8 billion people in the world how many are

praising Hashem? Less than 1%. So what does it mean, kol haneshama? Zagt Reb Moshe, that from every single action that happens is going to come out kvod Shamayim. Even from the worst aveira will come out great kvod Shamayim. Reb Moshe gives as an example what happened when Elimelech left Eretz Yisrael. He left because he didn't want to support Klal Yisrael, which Chazal say was a tainah, it came from the middah of stinginess. He was actually chayav misah for what he did, and his sons left with him and married Arpah and Rus, and they were also chayav misah. And what came out of Rus? Mashiach! Dovid came out! So what do you see from here? From aveiros that were so big that they were chayav misah for them, came out the biggest kvod Shamayim. Through this came Dovid Hamelech and Mashiach. So zagt Reb Moshe, we see from here that bechira is the thought process, but the results are from Hashem.

Hashem is Taking Care of You!

Therefore, a person has to understand and realize that we live in a world that whatever you see is exactly how Hakadosh Baruch Hu wanted it to be run and orchestrated, from start to finish and everything in between. And the Gaon writes that everything that happens in this world is all written and merumaz somewhere in the Torah. And the Torah is kadosh! That means that everything that happens is kadosh!

Therefore, that's how we can explain one of the most difficult Chazal that says that if you did an aveira and you do teshuva me'ahava then the aveira turns into a mitzvah. That means that let's say someone ate chazir and he did teshuva, and now the chazir turns into achilas korban. How in the world can you turn chazir into achilas korban? And the answer is very simple. Because Hashem wanted every action to be done. So just like a korban brings out kvod Shamayim, achilas chazir also brings out kvod Shamayim. So where's the aveira? The aveira lies in the thought process. But once you do teshuva on the thought process, so you corrected the thought process. So what are you left with? The action. The action turns into a mitzvah because that's what Hashem wanted! So it comes out that how you can turn the biggest aveira into the biggest mitzvah by just now having charata on the bad thought process. So now you're left with a good thought process, and with a maaseh of Hashem because Hashem wanted it to happen.

It's very important to note the famous story that Reb Yaakov Galinsky told my Rebbe. There was a gadol in Eretz Yisrael who had a daughter who had asthma and he was in charge of making sure

One time, she had an asthma attack and he didn't find the shot and she was niftara. And Reb Yaakov Galinsky went to be Menachem avel.

Her father was inconsolable because he felt that it was his negligence, it was his pshia, he should've been more nizhar, he should have always had it on him in his pocket...

Reb Yaakov Galinsky told him it's impossible that you could have changed what could have hap-

pened. Whatever happened is perfect. So your whole reason

to be upset was only because you thought that you caused it, but you have to realize that you didn't do it and it would have happened anyway, and that's what Hashem wanted. The father, one of the gedolim of Klal Yisrael, said that was the biggest nechama that he received, and it changed his whole perspective.



So we see that a person has to be able to balance both things. That yes we have bechira

for the thought process, but the actual result is from Hashem. And we have to focus and use these concepts in a way that will make us into a bigger, better, happier, healthier person, and give us more menuchas hanefesh and simchas hachaim. The general way to do that is that for the past we say don't become tzebrochen and tzeklopped because that was what Hashem wanted, but for the future feel that you have bechira and you can make a difference and that will motivate you to bring out the best in you.

It's also important to know that there's a Medrash Rabba that says "Hashem created tzaddikim and Hashem created reshaim and it's all bringing out kvod Shamayim." Sometimes we see it in the open, sometimes we don't see it in the open, but it's all to bring out kvod Shamayim. The Ramchal says Hashem wants Klal Yisrael to be in galus 2,000 years. Hashem wanted Klal Yisrael to be in the midbar 40 years. There's many maalos that Klal Yisrael were in the midbar for 40 years and there's many maalos that Klal Yisrael are in galus for all these years. Hashem wanted all of this!

Now, why are people born into non-frum families? That's all based on gilgulim, what they did in the past gilgul and this is what they need for their tikkun. Just to give examples how kvod Shamayim could come out of this is that Hashem made a world that most of the world do not follow Hashem. The way kvod Shamayim comes out is that Klal Yisrael, the frum people, are the minority, and still 2,000 years in galus when we're just a little dot on the map, and still we're thriving and shteiging! Even though most of the world do not serve Hashem, and even though most of the Jews do not serve Hashem, and the frum people are the minority, that shows our dedication, devotion and love for our Hashem, that's all kvod Shamayim. If everyone, if all the yidden, would serve Hashem, that would make it very easy and that doesn't show our love. So that's how they're causing the kvod Shamayim, by making us the minority. In addition, now that frum yidden are the minority, it helps us appreciate being a frum yid! We see that most yidden weren't born to frum families, yet we're frum! That will make us appreciate being frum instead of taking it for granted.

But why certain yidden were born frum and certain yidden were not, that's all based on gilgulim and that is ein esek banistaros, we don't have shaychus to understanding Hashem's hidden calculations. One thing we do know, is that everything is exactly perfect the way every person needs to bring out kvod Shamayim and everyone is in the exact situation that's perfect for them.

Now, this that it says in the Torah that Hashem hates avoda zara, is it going on the thought process or on the action? The answer is Hashem doesn't have real feelings of hatred. It's just how the Torah wants us to perceive it, to teach us that we are supposed to hate avoda zara, to motivate us to stay far away from it. So when you see that it says Hashem hates it, it's just how we're supposed to perceive it as an attitude to motivate us to hate it and stay away from it. But at the same time, we have to live with the emunah and bitachon perspective and realize that if it happened, that means it was perfect. If there was avoda zara done, Hashem wanted it to be done, because that's part of Hashem's perfect Master Plan. It's what Hashem wanted to happen, and will bring tremendous k'vod Shamayim. Like it says in the medrash, "tov meod zeh yetzer hara," because kvod Shamayim comes out of everything.

She got to the cleaners, and she saw that the lights were closed. The shutters of the cleaners were all closed. She got out of her





Q. I work very hard to please my husband. But since I'm human I make mistakes sometimes. Whenever I make a mistake, my husband is not pleased with me. As a result, I feel crushed and worthless. What's the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. Why do you feel bad when your husband is displeased with you? Because you think that your job is to please your husband, and you've failed.

We're not in this world to please our spouses; we're here to give a nachas ruach to Hashem. True, a woman's main form of avodas Hashem is being dedicated to her husband. However, like in all areas of avodah, what does Hashem want of us? To try to do our job as best as we can.

However, if despite our efforts we still make mistakes, that's how Hashem wanted things to turn out. And Hashem is pleased that we tried our best to serve our spouses.

Also consider: human nature is, when we focus on our shortcomings, we feel crushed and worthless, and when we focus on our accomplishments, we feel great.

Therefore, although your husband may be annoyed that you didn't manage to please him this time, remember how many times



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you did succeed in pleasing him. When you reflect on how hard you constantly work for him with all of your heart and soul, you'll realize how accomplished you really are.

Furthermore, if your husband is not happy that you make mistakes, it's not you who your husband is unhappy with, it's Hakadosh Baruch Hu! Because Hashem



is the one who made it that people are intrinsically imperfect. Tell yourself, 'My husband may be displeased with the way Hashem made me, but I am happy with the way Hashem made me'.

Finally, take this as an opportunity to perform הטבה במקום הקפדה – doing a favor in the place of a grudge. Go out of your way especially to please him. Give him compliments and praise. If you muster up the strength to do this, you'll be a truly accomplished person. Q. We know that the shechina only dwells in a house where shalom bayis pervades.

Unfortunately, I am in a marriage which includes friction and machlokes. But I, too, want to have the shechina in my house.

A. The presence of the shechina doesn't require having the result of shalom. It requires putting in effort to have shalom.

One exercise to achieve shalom is: put Hashem into the picture: When you wake up in the morning, say, "Hakadosh Baruch Hu, You are in charge of emotions. Please help us feel אהבה ואחוה towards each other".

Another exercise: in your mind, envision your shalom bayis is improving. Imagine that you and your spouse are speaking to each other kindly and respectfully. Positive thinking activates a koach in the briah that can have a concrete effect.

When you do exercises to create shalom, not only will the shechinah want to reside with you, but your efforts will also give you a special סייעתא דישמיא to restore shalom to your home.


