what do you suggest we do?" I asked my father-inlaw.



"I suggest that

This seemed like an impossible request. Why should I move the date? I had set a date before him, and I had already hired all the professionals. I was sure that everything was finalized. How exactly was I supposed to deal with this? But my father-in-law knew exactly why he was turning to me. He explained that for my brother-in-law it was much more complicated than it was for me. There were different issues there that made it much more difficult for him to switch the date. "Try," my father-in-law said. "Make an effort. For me."

I told him I would see what I could do, and I hung up the phone with a deep sigh. I was angry at my brother-in-law. Why did he have to do this to me? And why did I have to be the one to give in? Why hadn't he asked me when our wedding was going to be? Why make it so difficult for the grandfather? Why, why, why?

I didn't want to give in, didn't want to make an embarrassing phone call to the mechutan, or to apologize to all the professionals who – bottom line – need parnassah. But I thought to myself, "If I don't give in, then what will be? The entire family will be talking about how my brother-in-law was inconsiderate and set a wedding date without looking into some basic information. If I don't at least try to do something, mv in-laws will be torn between two different weddings and won't

really enjoy either one of them.

I decided to get over the unpleasantness of it, and I started a series of phone calls. The first, of course, was to my mechutan. He thought for a few moments and finally said, "I have no problem with you switching the date, as long as you handle everything. If you work it out with all the professionals, then I'm okay with it." I thanked him. I knew that even this was not an easy concession once the date had been set in his mind, but I went forward, since he'd agreed. I davened to Hashem to help me for the sake of shalom. To work it out with all the parties involved and to enable me to move the date of the wedding easily.

Indeed, I had special siyata diShmaya, and everything worked out in the best possible way, with relative ease. The round of phone calls took less time than I had surmised, and b'sha'ah tovah, the wedding date was set for the thirteenth of Kislev.

my neighborhood. 3. I learned from a Rosh Kollel that the more Torah the better. Here we have another chaburah, so that means there will be more Torah, even if he takes one or two guys from me. Writing this all down really helped me get over it. I didn't tell anyone about it – not even my wife or my Rosh Kollel out of concern for lashon hara. I even went a step further: I tried to do 'hatava bmakom hakpada'. I called up that Rosh Chaburah and I asked what I could do to help him and offered different eitzos.

Baruch Hashem, his chaburah took off and mine continued as usual. I realized that on the first day we started Maseches Yuma, we had a tremendous turnout. I attributed it to the way I held myself back from getting upset or saying anything. I am sure that I was only able to overcome this challenge because of the Spring Hill Times. I know that the reason why more people joined my chaburah is because I bit my tongue and didn't say anything or express how frustrated I was. Baruch Hashem, Hashem granted me success.

As I deal with the extra work involved in having more people join my chaburah, including raising more money and working out chavrusas, I realize that Hashem is with me every second. Even if I would lose out, I know it would all be from the Ribbono Shel Olam. Thank You, Hashem, for giving me the koach to overcome this challenge!

Harav Hagaon R' Tzvi Kushelevsky Shlita had a baby at the age of 88, and his wife at the age of 56. There was a big, big, big happiness in the olam hatorah. Then they danced in the street, and they walked the Rosh Yeshiva home

very late at night. It really brought a tremendous amount of achdus, but it didn't end there.

The bris took place Sunday morning, and it brought together Jews from all walks of life, from all over Eretz Yisrael. A long time before Shacharis, people were already in the yeshiva, with their Tallis and Tefillin. The Yeshi-

va building was jam-packed, so they locked the building. They decided to make a hook-up so people could watch the screen from the streets. Thousands of people were standing in the street throughout the bris. They were standing and listening and being part of the simcha from the street. It wasn't just his talmidim, who for sure came in from all parts of the world. There were Yidden from all walks of life; it was massive achdus.


R' Tzvi Kushelevsky Shlita announced that right after he says Shehecheyanu, right after the actual milah, the olam should say the yud gimmel middos three times with the chazzan, as a zchus for all yidden in captivity and in tzaros. After that the whole olam sang acheinu. Then the whole olam greeted R' Tzvi, and he greeted everyone with a warm smile, and gave each person a bracha. Then there was the massive seudas habris which took place in a huge hall.

Aside from this, there was a man in America, a frum Yid, who had his first child, a ben zachar, at 66, just a few days after R' Tzvi had his baby.

Also, R' Moshe Blumberg told another recent story, that on Sunday, there

was a lady who had a baby after a seventeen-year gap! Nineteen years ago she had a girl, two years later she had another girl, and did not have any children since then, and this past Sunday ahe had a boy. She's forty-five years old. Baruch Hashem for all these Nissim!





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

tenant's window. We were going to pay for it, but our cousin said, "I want to make Hashem hap-




py, I will pay for it." I called the store where I was planning to buy the new window, and the man told me how much it was going to cost.

Not Just Leftovers




Many years ago, I went to pick up Rabbi Neuschloss, the Rav of New Square, on Motzoei



Shabbos, to bring him to Monsey for a Bar Mitzvah. But before we left his house, he put in front of me a piece of kugel. Before I ate the kugel, he told me about the yichus of this piece of kugel: that it came from sherayim, that came from sherayim, that came from an admixture of sherayim, that went all the way to the Baal Shem Tov, if I'm not mistaken.

So I asked him, "What's the source of Sherayim?" it was a week before Purim, and he gave two answers. Number one, the Gemara says that if somebody eats from something that a mouse ate from, it causes forgetfulness. And there's a concept as mida tova meruba: how much more so in the positive direction, if someone ate from something that a Tzadik ate from, that it causes an enhancement of the mind.

Secondly, it says in the Megilla, "Vayeitzei Haman - bayom hahu, and Haman went out on that day, samei'ach vetov - leiv, with a joyous heart." Now how did Haman achieve such a spiritual height? The Beis HaMikdash was destroyed tachas asher - Io avadta es Hashem Elokecho besimcha - uvetuv leivov! The answer is, he was exiting the Seuda of Esther. It wasn't anything that Haman did—it was the Sherayim of Esther! **Good Shabbos!**

One of the korbanos listed in our parashah is that of the korban todah, the korban offered to express gratitude to Hashem for being saved from a dangerous encounter. There is a unique law that the korban todah needs to be eaten with loaves only in one night. Why is this so? The Netziv explains that the only possible way to finish eating the korban with so many loaves in one night will be by holding a large meal with many friends and family; ensuring that the salvation



will be publicized. This is really the ideal way to express our gratitude to Hashem: instead of simply expressing our appreciation personally, we make a public display and share our feelings of appreciation with others. This helps inspire them to be grateful for your salvation.

Something else we see that is unique by the korban todah, is that it is the only korban that won't be nullified when

Mashiach comes. Similarly, the perek of Tehillim that is said when it is brought, mizmor l'todah, will not be nullified. The Shulchan Aruch rules that since this perek will not be nullified when Mashiach comes, it has a unique significance and one should sing it with a pleasant melody. This practice has such tremendous power as we see in the following story.

A shaliach tzibbur in a netz minyan in Bnai Brak learnt the halachah that one is supposed to sing mizmor latodah with a pleasant melody. He decided to institute this practice and the tzibbur in his minyan began singing mizmor l'todah together, adding great meaning to their Shacharis. After over a year of this practice, the Chazzan began experiencing different pains and after visiting doctors, the cause of this was unidentified. He was recommended to visit with a top specialist who nervously told him that he didn't

know where these pains were coming from and he will have to do more tests and scans. As difficult as this situation was, he tried his best to stay positive and focus on all the tremendous blessings in his life. He also sang mizmor l'todah in davening with even more fervor.

The day before one of his most important scans, he decided to travel to Tzefas and daven by the kever of Maran HaRav

Yosef Kairo, author of the Shulchan Aruch. He davened with a lot of sincerity and thanked Hashem for all his blessings in his life and pleaded that he will hear good news the next day. He then emotionally exclaimed how Rav Yosef Kairo compiled numerous halachos which are universally accepted, yet one halachah isn't as widespread: to sing mizmor l'todah. He took upon himself to do this and established that the men in his

> minyan do this together, each day singing this praise to Hashem. He davened that everything will go smoothly and he will be able to continue this practice and inspire others to sing their appreciation to Hashem, being Mekadesh Shem Shamayim. He concluded his heartfelt prayers by singing mizmor latodah and erupted into a dance around the kever out of gratitude for all the blessings in his life.



There is a fascinating halacha when it comes to eating the meat of a Karban: The Torah only allows a person a day or two to eat the meat. When this time period is up, the meat becomes nosar, leftovers, and he's commanded to burn it. Let's understand, what is the message and lesson over here? Isn't the Torah very strict about wasting food? If so, why does the Torah give only a day or two to eat the meat and command us to throw out the rest? How can it be that the Torah wants us to take yummy delicious scrumptious meat and burn it?! How can we understand this?

The Chinuch (Mitzva 142) tells us an answer to this perplexing question. He explains: Why do people save their food? Because they're worried about the future. How will they get food for

tomorrow? So they save up food. People like to save. But the halacha comes to teach us that where is the worry to store food coming from? Because people take life into their own hands, and so they're worried about the future. But who was taking care of you up until now? It is not you! It is your loving, caring Father, Hakodosh Baruch Hu. The same Hakodosh Baruch Hu who has provided for you until now will eternally care of you. So sit back, relax and enjoy the most delicious, yummy, scrumptious world.

That is how the Chinuch explains Pshat in this Mitzva to burn the leftover meat. This mitzva is to teach us the yesoid to live with bitachon and never to be anxious and worried about the future. Just remember that the same loving, caring Father who has taken care of us until now will forever take care of us in the best possible way.

When we live with this mindset of not taking life into our own hands, we will never, ever lose our menuchas hanefesh and simchas hachaim. We'll never be anxious and nervous. And when we live like this, then we'll be living Lemaala Miderech Hateva. Here are two stories to illustrate this idea.

A Yiddishe Mamme shared: "I have a son that needed therapy, and I heard that many kids were helped with a particular method. However, I could not afford it and was at a loss. I called Rabbi Golombeck to ask for guidance. He responded by saying, "If you feel like you're in charge of paying for the therapy, then you indeed have a problem. Instead, realize that the same Source that provided you up until now will continue forever to

provide for all your needs, You have nothing to worry about."



I took his advice and signed up for the therapy program. Everyone told me how they paid out of their own pocket, and I was prepared to do that. However, when I came the first day, the therapist informed me that she started a new program, and the government will be sponsoring every last dollar. I didn't have to take a dollar out of my pocket!"

Another message that was left: "I am a Yungerman, living on a Kollel budget. On Purim, the most I can afford to give is

a dollar or two to every collector. This year, I really wanted to give more. However, I knew that I can't afford this, and I wouldn't be able to pay my bills the coming month. But then I said to myself, "One second! Who is the one that pays my bills? Hashem! He will take care of me, and I can be more generous this Purim!" With that, I gave everyone who asked, ten or twenty dollars, instead of my usual dollar or two. The very next day, I got a phone call from someone who wanted to come look at my basement which was sitting empty for many months. He liked what he saw, and in no time at all, he

signed a lease. He even paid a large sum of money up front and when I counted it, I realized that it was the exact amount that I gave out on Purim!"

"I MUST ATTEND!"

The Avnei Nezer was very busy. Questions from all sides of the world came to his desk, and he was also involved in many of the issues facing Yidden during his time. Because of this, he wasn't able to attend many simchas; they were simply too much. Therefore, when he did attend one, you can be sure that he had a good reason for going.

Once, a simple tailor invited him to the bris of his firstborn child, born after fifteen years of waiting. The Avnei Nezer told the tailor that he would certainly attend, much to everyone's surprise.

His gabbai asked him, "The Rebbe doesn't usually go to any bris, especially if it's far away. Here, you're not



only going, but to that of a simple tailor? What makes his simchah so unique?"

The Avnei Nezer replied, "This father made a kiddush Hashem, therefore I want to participate in this bris."

"What kiddush Hashem did he make?" asked the gabbai.

"This father told me that after his wife had been barren for fifteen years, 'Hashem, with His great mercy performed a miracle.' This was the first time someone said that it was Hashem Who made the miracle. Generally, people say that it was the Kotzker Rebbe or the Radzaminer Rebbe who performed the miracle, not Hashem. This father testified to Hashem bringing about the miracle, a kiddush Hashem, and I want to participate in this bris."

This story reminds us how we must view all the good we have as coming from Hashem. It wasn't "the power of my hand," my wisdom, or any of the other explanations; it's all from Hashem. We must remember this even by the miracles tzaddikim perform; they are also from Hashem, the result of their tefillos to Him. THE POTENTIAL DONORS

Rav Elchonon Wasserman, zt"l, once traveled to

America to raise the



much-needed funds for his yeshiva. At one of the shuls there, in front of an audience of potential donors who had the means of donating generously, he delivered a passionate speech about the value of supporting Torah. The entire congregation was visibly moved.

The Rabbi of that shul, however, was from a different school of thought, and after Rav Elchonon's speech, the Rabbi added a few words, saying that even a few dollars would suffice, since this was not a very worthy cause. With those words, the crowd went from potentially giving thousands of dollars to not even giving a total of one hundred dollars. Afterward, the rabbi was worried that Rav Elchonon was angry at him, and he thus went over to R' Elchonon to apologize. However, Rav Elchonon told him that what the rabbi had done didn't bother him in the least.

"When Hashem commanded Moshe to build the Mishkan," Rav Elchonon said, "Hashem told him that the actual builder would be Betzalel ben Uri ben Chur from shevet Yehudah. Moshe then went to search for him. He must have gone to the tribe of Yehudah and asked the first person he saw, 'Are you Betzalel ben Uri?' If the man said no, Moshe would then have gone to another person and asked him if he was Betzalel ben Uri. And if that man said no, Moshe would have continued until he found the person he was looking for.

"If those people replied they were not Betzalel, did Moshe get angry at them for not being the person he was looking for? Of course not. Those people were not zocheh to be Betzalel.

"The same applies here," continued R' Elchonon. "I came to America looking for Betzalel ben Uri to support my yeshiva. There are certain people who will be zocheh to be the Betzalels and support the yeshiva, and others who won't. It is clear that the members of your congregation are not from those people who are going to be Betzalel ben Uri. Should I be angry at that? For that reason, when you told the congregants that this was an unworthy cause, I understood that the Lietonere ware ware Continued on

Bnei Torah and Derech Eretz

Rabbi Matisyahu Salomon shlita once quoted a Gemara in Berachos (17a) that conveys a powerful message. Rav Ashi states that the non-Jewish residents of the city of Masa Mechasya were abi-

rei lev, literally "people with strong hearts." Massive Torah study took place in that city twice a year, but despite the vast display of kavod Shamayim, not a single res-



other people. The Gemara explains that when a Torah scholar acts in a pleasant way, it causes people to admire those who study Torah. On the other hand, if such a person is unpleasant to others, it evokes ridicule toward those who study Torah. In short, when a person is outwardly identi-



ident of the city ever converted to Judaism.

If not for the fact that they were abirei lev, the sight of multitudes of Jews immersed in talmud Torah would have inspired the people of Masa Mechasya so much that they would have turned their entire lives around and become Jews. Such is the impression that sincere, dedicated Torah study automatically engenders on a non-Jew! The Gemara in Eruvin (54a) states that the Torah endows those who study it with "chein," making them beloved to others. But if that is the case, why do we find that nowadays, when there are cities where Torah study takes place on a constant basis, there is often indifference and even outright hostility toward the bnei Torah?

The Gemara in Yoma (86a) states that the mitzvah to love Hashem requires us to make Hashem beloved to



fied by his Jewish appearance, his behavior reflects on the Jewish people and, as a result, on Hashem. If he acts appropriately, he brings honor to the Jewish people and to Hashem, but if he acts inappropriately, the opposite takes place, Heaven forbid.

Rabbi Shapiro was once shopping in a department store when an elderly non-Jewish man approached him and exclaimed, "L'chaim!" When Rabbi Shapiro did not respond, the man told him, "Do you know where I learned that word? Fifteen years ago, I had a friend who was a religious Jew, and he taught me the word. He was an incredible person!"

At this point, Rabbi Shapiro's interest was piqued. "What was so incredible about your friend?" he asked.

"We worked together in a factory," the old man related.

"One day, our boss told him that he had to lie to a customer in order for a sale to go through." The old man's eyes filled with tears and he began to shake with emotion. "Do you know what my friend did? He quit his job right then, that very day, to avoid dishonesty. What a man!"



That frum Jew made such a deep impression on his coworker that the man still remembered it fifteen years later. He shared the story with Rabbi Shapiro simply because he associated that virtuous act with the Jewish religion. A person who is visibly a ben Torah can bring much more honor to Hashem through his actions than a person who is not so obviously a student of the Torah, for his appearance will link his behavior with the Torah.

But this enormous potential is mirrored by the danger of bringing disgrace, chas v'shalom, to Hashem and His people. When I was learning in Lakewood, Rav Matisyahu Salomon used to remind us regularly, "As you rush to seder every day, keep in mind the ultimate purpose of your Torah learning. You are coming to the beis medrash to spend four hours immersed in learning, in order to create a kiddush Hashem. If you spend the five-minute drive to the yeshivah acting in a way that is not befitting a ben Torah — if you honk your horn rudely, cut off other





drivers, tailgate, and act in other disrespectful or impolite ways — you will be doing the exact opposite of kiddush Hashem. Those five minutes could negate the effect of the next four hours of learning!"

Rav Matisyahu added that often when bnei Torah incur the animosity of our non-Jewish neighbors, it is because we have failed to act with derech eretz. If we do not take care to be

respectful and courteous in our interactions with the world — when we drive, when we park, when we shop, and whenever we come in contact with other people — our actions become inextricably intertwined with their perception of religious Jews.



The Mesillas Yesharim (ch. 11) states that the more learned a person is, the greater responsibility he has to conduct himself in a way

that is beyond reproach. Part of honoring the Torah, he explains, is for a person who studies it to excel in behaving in an upright, refined way. A person who fails to behave appropriately brings disgrace to Torah study and creates a chilul Hashem, for Hashem gave us the Torah as a vehicle for the attainment of perfection.

This is also how we can understand the concept of

derech eretz kadmah l'Torah . How is it possible for anything to take precedence over Torah? The answer is that the purpose of Torah study is to bring about kiddush shem Shamayim. A person who lacks derech eretz cannot create a kiddush Hashem. His Torah study would be for naught if its ultimate purpose is not realized.

As we pursue our Torah study and mitzvah observance to the best of our abilities, let us take extra care to preserve our derech eretz in our interactions with the outside world, so that we will never lose sight of our true ultimate goal of being mekadesh shem Shamayim.


BE THE ONE TO INSPIRE TENS OF THOUSANDS OF YIDDEN!

Asher Yatzar - A Segulah for Everything!

Recently, I had the *zechus* to pick up HaRav Hatzadik Rav Shimon Galai shlit"a from the Tel Hashomer hospital. He told me that he tries to visit the sick people there every week to give them *chizuk*. Even after going around the hospital for over two hours, he did not have much rest. The entire car ride, people were calling for *berachos* for all types of issues. It was amazing to see how he gave every person encouragement and showered *berachos* upon them. One person asked what they can be *mechazek* as a *zechus* for a successful double knee surgery. Rav Galai answered that they should say Asher Yatzar with *kavanah* from inside a siddur. I showed him our Asher to the Yatzar leaflets and told him that we began them as a result of his advice to ask people to say



Asher Yatzar as a zechus for a *refuah sheleimah* for our daughter, Esther bas Sara Miriam, may Hashem send her a speedy recovery.

I then asked him if he could share something about Asher Yatzar with our readers. He told me that saying Asher Yatzar is not only a *segulah* for a medical recovery or for staying healthy – it is a *segulah* for *yeshuos* in every area of life. The reason is that saying Asher Yatzar is the greatest declaration of *emunah* in Hashem. By doing so, we are *zoche* to all the *berachos*!

This was a real eyeopener for me! I knew that Asher Yatzar helps for good health, but why does it also help in every area of life? Perhaps we can explain that we pointed out in the past that this is the only *berachah* where we mention Hashem's throne of glory. We brought the words of the Gra that this is to teach us that Hashem is not only involved in lofty matters – He is even involved with our plumbing system. Now I realized that the Gra was revealing to us a very deep matter. This *berachah* shows us that nothing in the world can exist or function without Him. This is the greatest statement of Emunah a person can make.

We also discussed in the past why Hashem created us in a way that we must use the restroom several times a day, and not just once a month or once a week. Since we are so involved with our personal lives and matters it is very easy to forget about Hashem, *chas v'shalom*. In order to prevent this, we daven three times a day and strengthen our *emunah* by asking Him for all our needs and placing ourselves in His Hands. However, that would not be enough, because it is very easy to leave Hashem inside the siddur! Therefore, Hashem made us in a way that several times a day we must use the bathroom, giving us the opportunity to instill in ourselves the great truth that nothing in our lives can work properly without His direct involvement.

Since I was driving, I began thinking about how many things can go wrong in a car. The more one uses it, the

more maintenance it requires, and after not so many years of daily use, it gets sent to the scrap yard. The body, on the other hand, is so much more complicated, and yet, usually, things do not go wrong for many, many years. Even then, if one takes care of this wonderful present, it continues working non-stop throughout old age. This can only be happening because Hashem is taking care of every aspect of our body, every moment of the day. The Asher Yatzar that is said after these thoughts makes Hashem much more real in every aspect of our lives. Once we are so strongly connected to the Source of all *berachah*, we can hope for *yeshuos* in all areas of our lives!



Let's examine an additional point about the vocal cords and the wonders of Hakadosh Baruch Hu in their development. We know that when boys enter the stage of adolescence, one of the distinct changes is the tone of their voices. The pitch of their voices moves over to a much lower and deeper note. How does this happen? Is it just some chemical change?

What's going on is actually quite straightforward. We explained that the vibrations of a longer and thicker vocal cords create a lower pitch, as opposed to the vibrations of shorter and thinner vocal cords. When children are at the beginning of adolescence, it's not only their feet that grow longer their internal organs are also growing longer. Their vocal cords grow 60% bigger during this period.

The vocal cords get longer and thicker, which automatically causes the vibrations to produce a lower note. A girl's vocal cords also expand and her voice changes at this period, but size of the growth and the change of the pitch are much more subtle. When a boy becomes a gadol and begins manhood, he's entering a stage of leadership and responsibility. Hashem gave him the tool of a voice that sounds more strong and confident. He did not need these tools when he was a katan. So Hashem did not give it to him.

We mentioned that thicker and longer vocal cords produce a lower pitch and shorter and thinner vocal cords produce a higher pitch. Men have thicker and longer vocal cords, so they speak in a lower pitch, as opposed to women. Shouldn't this mean that men and women should are al-



ways be speaking the with same pitch based on the size of the vocal cords? Yet, people do not speak only at one pitch.

People are constantly changing the pitch of their voices when they speak. And especially, they're changing the pitch when they sing. How is this possible? Aren't the vocal cords a thick size which should produce a permanent number of vibrations?

The explanation is that Hashem b'chasdo created a number of tiny muscles next to the vocal cords that expand and contract the vocal cords. This causes the vocal cords to be various sizes. Sometimes they are shorter and thicker, and sometimes they are longer and thinner. If not for those tiny muscles, then not only would we not be able to sing, we would not be able to talk with expression and emotion. Communication would just be in a mono-tone, so boring and lifeless.

It's the contractions and expansions of these tiny muscles which change the vocal cords to many various sizes, which enable us to speak and sing on various notes. Not only did Hashem give us the ability to change tones, but He enables us to make these changes quickly, in a fraction of a second. We don't have to pause to change the pitch. This makes singing and speaking with emotion smooth and seamless.

The Starfish

You are probably wondering what's so amazing about a starfish. It typically just stays in one place. What's the big deal? Well, in this article we will get an understanding as to why some scientists have said 'Starfish have been called the strangest animal on Earth...they are built like nothing else on the planet!!!" As we shall see, there are two aspects of the Starfish that NO OTHER creation on earth has and there are a few other aspects that a few other creatures have, nevertheless, they are still quite unique and we will discuss them.

Because of the unique structures of the starfish, to do justice to the topic, we will need more pictures than usual. (Scientists have changed its name to Sea Star since it's not a fish as it has no fins.)

I think we should start with its pretty unique (there are 4 other creatures that have a similar system) water vascular system.

Sea stars basically have no blood. It mostly exists in seawater, and it lives off seawater.

(They do not live in freshwater rivers, only in seawater.)


These two pictures (A & B) will explain a lot. In picture B – the white center is the madreporite. It's where it all starts off. It's a tube covered by a sieve-like material where the seawater enters to start the process. The sieve of course keeps out dirt etc. The other things around the madreporite will be explained later on.


In picture A the water then goes down into what's called the stone canal. It's made of a hard calcium type of material; hence it's called the stone canal. (It's not that easy to see it in the picture since it's a relatively short pipe.)


From the stone canal, the water continues into the ring canal. From the ring canal the water continues to go through the 5 arms (rays) through what's called the radial canal. The radial canal is a pipe that carries the water across the full length of the arm. Attached all across the length of the radial canals are what's called lateral canals. (Not shown in picture A but you can see it in picture C) Picture a capital T. The radial canal is the long part of the T and the lateral canals are like the top of the T going out the right and left side of the radial canal. They are 2 very thin tubes and they carry the water to the all-important ampulla. The ampulla is the top part of the tube feet. Picture C is a picture of what we just described.

Picture C:

The below pictures are pictures of the top and bottom of the ampulla. The bottom part of the ampulla is the podia, otherwise known as the tube foot. The blue line being shown is the radial canal carrying the water to the ampulla, but it's missing the thin hard to see, lateral canals that are really the last piece of the puzzle that carries the water from the radial canals to the ampulla and then to the tube foot. The lateral canals are extremely important since they each have a valve in them that holds the water in the ampulla from going back into the radial canal. If there was no valve then there wouldn't be any vac-









uum and suction capabilities between the ampulla and the feet. This suction process is called Hydraulics. Hydraulics is a mechanical function that operates through the force of liquid pressure. In hydraulics-based systems, mechanical movement is produced by contained, pumped liquid, just like we have here in the forcing of liquid into the tube feet through the pressure exerted from the ampulla bulb/sac which compresses the water downwards into the tube foot. It works as follows.

Picture of water going down the madreporite through the ring canal and then through the radial canal (through the lateral canals – not seen) down into the ampulla and into the tube feet.




It works as follows. The podium (foot) is stretched to full length by the contraction (squeezing) of the circumferential muscles in the ampulla bulb which is full of water. This action generates pressure that sends out the water from the ampulla, into the podium (foot). It works similar to the way a dropper works. (See the picture in the box with (f) in it.) Then relaxation of the ampullary muscles, together with the contraction of the podium's longitudinal muscles, and together with the contractor muscles, causes the podium to retract (to become skinnier) and it thereby sends the water back up from the podium into the ampulla. This takes place when the feet are ready to go back into its body cavity when it wants to stop walking. The feet retreat into the cavity on the bottom of the arms. It also takes place to a lesser degree whenever any step is taken. When the foot needs to move forwards there's also a little amount of the tube foot retracting. The longitudinal muscles are also the cause of the bending of the feet in whichever direction it needs to bend in order to follow the leading arm.

The below picture depicts how the activation of ampulla muscles and the podia lead to contraction, extension and the bending of the tube feet. The below picture shows how the tube feet aren't simple structures at all. They have various muscles working in them as we just explained.


The feet release their grasp of the ground when they reach a certain length that is preprogrammed into their nerves. If the foot would be extended too long it would rip. Now, what grasp of the ground are we talking about? Well, amazingly enough, there's two ways how the end of the tube feet grab onto surfaces it's walking on. One is with the lavador muscles (see picture) which causes a curvature in the bottom of the foot thereby creating a suction from the sucker part of the foot. But there's another amazing way it holds on tight to surfaces.

Amazingly, it has glands towards the bottom of their foot that uses special chemicals to



they pick up their feet!)

HOWEVER, there's one little problem. I didn't mention this until now, but the starfish has no brain!

Yes. You read that correctly! Therefore, scientists have no idea how the hundreds and thousands of feet can all walk in such synchronization, and coordination without a brain. You must realize that there's one arm that leads the way. Usually, it's the arm that detects the scent of potential food. Now if you see the way the feet are set up, each arm must have their feet facing

a different direction than the other feet since they are all on a different angle to each other.

What amazing coordination it takes to have all the feet going in the same direction, all without a brain! There's MUCH MUCH MORE to discuss about the amazing starfish which IY"H we will get to in the next article or two.

Ray Yehuda Mandel Q: The Gemara Brachos 47a says that if a person doesn't answer amen in the most perfect way, his children will become yesomim; he will die young.

How do we understand that Hashem, Who is the ultimate Rachaman, would give the death penalty to a person who doesn't say amen the perfect way? It seems like extreme middos hadin, not the way a father would treat a son. It sounds as if a father would sentence his



son to death for not standing up for him quickly enough... We would say that the father is very cruel...

In addition this Chazal gives me great anxiety every time I answer amen, is it too fast or is it too slow...

A. R' Yehuda Mandel taught me, that the first and foremost point is that every time you see a Chazal which refers to a punishment for dong something wrong, the point of the Chazal is that you should say mida tova meruba, so that you realize how incredible the reward is for when you do it correctly! For example, it says mevayesh chaveiro brabim ein lo chelek l'olam haba. R' Yehuda Mandel learned from this to go around praising everybody, to be mechabed everyone b'rabim, and like this you get the same olam haba as the person you praised! So R' Yehuda goes around and looks for opportunities to praise yidden, for example he says, "Oh, you're learning amazing!" and he says it b'rabim, in front of everyone, so he earns the olam haba of whoever he praised!

The ikar of every negative chazal is to teach you that mida tova meruba. So the same principle applies here. The gemara is coming to teach you that if you're maarich amen, if you say amen with a geshmak, freilich, then you'll get arichas yamim. So really the ikar focus of this chazal is to realize that the point is to show you how gevaldik to say amen the right way, and then you'll get arichas yamim. Yiddishkeit is so easy! How long does it take to be maarich amen? An extra second? In one extra second, boom, arichas yamim!

Now, the second most important yesod is, as R' Avigdor Miller says, that when it comes to Torah and mitzvos, when Chazal tell you to do a mitzvah this way that way, it's not to give you anxiety, worries,



OCD. Everything in yiddishkeit has to be diracheha darchei noam. It has to be pleasant, it has to be fun. So if you look at halachas as, "Oy it's so hard, if you do it this way – gasp! It's so hard, so hard... It's so difficult, oy, it's so scary..." Then it's not diracheha darchei noam, then it's like a thorn bush. The Gemara says that's why we don't use a lulav with thorns, because anything that's poky is not diracheha darchei noam. So if you look



at a mitzvah as poky and pricky, then it's not diracheha darchei noam, that's not the mitzvah. So obviously, you're getting the mitzvah all wrong. So let's figure out what is yes the mitzvah. What's this whole dagesh, this whole focus, on if you say amen this way or if you say amen that way? What's amen all about?

The translation of amen is emunah. We're in this world to feel Hashem's love. We're in this world to feel Hashem's care. We're in this world to feel Hashem's protection. We're in this world to feel Hashem is watching us. By emphasizing how crucial it is to say Amen properly, chazal are trying to teach us about Emunah. Emunah means that we believe Hashem is running every step of our life. A person's emunah shouldn't be Hashem is only running half my life, Hashem is maybe running my life... Just like when it comes to emunah we don't doubt things, it has to be crystal clear and appreciate everything Hashem is doing for us. That's the point of amen and that's the point of emunah. Emunah has to be crystal clear. You can't get up and say, you know Hashem

No, no, no! Chas veshalom! Hashem is perfect! So just like we want to say Hashem is perfect, when we say amen perfectly, we are also saying Hashem is perfect.

So that's the point of all these halachos. Like don't say an amen chatufa, a quick amen! You know why? It's like getting up and giving a shmuz – Hashemrunstheworld. Noooo. You say Hashem made a beautiful world! That's why Spring Hill Times is full of pictures and designs. It's not black and white. We do it right! That's emunah. Emunah has to be done right. So you don't make a quick amen. And you don't do an amen yesoma, rush to say amen before the end of the bracha – I don't want to hear the whole bracha, okay just stop talking to me about Hashem, okay amen amen amen I got the message. So amen yesoma is like saying okay, I don't want to hear any more, I got the message. Amen ketzara, you don't pronounce the word, am-. We don't even know, are you

saying Hashem's name or are you saying a different name? Who you talking about?

It's all lessons of how we have to live with Hashem. We have to live with Hashem with love, with a passion, with feeling. Yes, Hashem, I want to speak about you! Hashem, I want to talk to You! Hashem, I want you to be part of my life! That's the message and that's the lesson of all these halachos. These halachos are fun, these halachos are geshmak! It's coming to teach you that be maarich in amen. What does it mean maarich in amen? Be maarich in emunah! Dedicate your life to emunah! Speak about Hashem, don't be embarrassed! When you see someone go over to him and ask him, how did you see Hashem today in your life? Make Hashem part of your life. Make Hashem real. Make Hashem tangible.

That's why there are so many halachos of how to say amen properly. Because this is the yesod of yiddishkeit, this is the yesod of leben, is to feel loved. And if you don't put Hashem into the picture and make a big deal out of Hashem and do emunah the right way, then you missed the boat in this world. So that's the point of all these halachos.


What if someone will come and say, "But it's so easy to mess up!" It's actually almost impossible to mess up! Because only a person who doesn't care about amen, doesn't care about emunah, yes for him he'll mess up. He's not interested in the bracha, he'll just say amen without even thinking when he's saying amen, to who is he saying amen to. If emunah plays no chashivus and plays no role and Hashem plays no role in his life, so his amen won't play any role. So as long as you do a daily exercise, like every yid is doing, of thinking about Hashem, it's so easy! In general, Yidden DO say amen properly! We very rarely say an amen yesoma, amen ketzara, amen chatufa. We say amen hundreds of times a day and we say it properly! It's not a big deal to say it properly. It's not a hard thing. If someone once in a while makes a mistake and says it the wrong way, Hashem doesn't look at the actions, He looks at machshava kmaiseh, He looks at the ratzon. Oh, you wanted to do it properly? Good, so you did it properly!

So the bottom line is that we're not walking on eggshells that if you step on something wrong uh oh, who knows what I can crack... No, the taryag mitzvos is not eggshells. We don't look at yiddishkeit as eggshells. Torah is easy, Torah is fun, Torah is

geshmak! It's an easy halacha to keep and the point of keeping the halacha is to teach you what's the point of these halachos. Like R' Avigdor Miller said, the ikar of mitzvos is the message behind the mitzvos. That's why it's called chovos halevavos, the chov of the lev, because that's the yesod of yiddishkeit. Yiddishkeit is the lev. And chazal say different halachos of practically what to do just so that you should internalize the message. So to internalize, you have to make amen the ikar and you have to live emunah the right way. Don't take any shortcuts in emunah, don't take shortcuts in Hashem's love. Hashem wants you to feel His love, speak about His love, dedicate your life to His love. And there's absolutely nothing to be worried or concerned about. It's an easy halacha to keep and as long as you want to keep it, it's as if you kept it. And the mida tova meruba is that when you



want to do emunah the right way you'll have arichas yamim. So yiddishkeit is fun, fun, win, win, geshmak, geshmak! It's going to bring arichas yamim. And there's only good to walk away from such a Gemara that we should all jump for joy that we say, wow, okay now I said amen properly, now I'm going to live longer!

Q. My wife makes decisions without consulting with me, even major ones. As the husband, I'm supposed to be the leader, and I feel bad that my wife decides things on her own. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The ba'alei mussar teach us that whenever something is bothering us, we have to zoom in to our emotions and discover what's the root.

Ninety-five percent of the time we will discover that what's really bothering us is that our kavod was hurt.

In your situation, the main thing that's bothering you is that your wife doesn't value your opinion. In other words: your kavod was injured.

The way to stop caring about your kavod is by, internalizing that הכבוד אבל הבלים. What is kavod after all? Nothing at all! It doesn't give you money and it doesn't give you health. It doesn't make you happy. It doesn't make you calm. It's just an illusion.

If you're worried that your wife is making major decisions without you, and could cause you harm, remember: no human being can affect you one iota. Whatever was nigazr for you will happen



regardless of your wife's decisions.

Q. Whenever there is an event which

my wife and I need to attend, my wife

about this?

cause you think that you are supposed to show up to events when they are scheduled to begin, and when you're delayed because of your wife, you are arriving later than you were supposed to.

However, the truth is, you're actually supposed to arrive whenever Hashem wants you to reach your destination. If you arrive late, that's because Hashem knows that it's not good for you to get there any earlier. That's why He made it that your wife should delay you.

When you remind yourself that it's not your wife who's causing you to come late, rather your loving and caring father, Hakadosh Baruch Hu, you won't get frus-

trated with your wife.

Q. In A Life With Bitachon I hear that any tza'ar and agmas nefesh that a person experiences saves him from car accidents and trips to the hospital, R"L.

I can understand that these inconveniences take the place of minor yissurim. But why should it take the place of major yissurim such as car accidents or trips to the hospital?

A. Rabbeinu Yonah teaches that when a person is mekabel minor yissurim be'hava, it is such a tremendous z'chus and makes him so close to Hashem, that he receives his kapparah through minor yissurim, and he no longer needs major yissurim in order to cleanse him.

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Hashem Loves You!

Asher, a yungerman who learned in Kollel, received one hundred dollars from his Kollel every month. He gives one tenth of his Kollel check, ten dollars, as Maaser to

Lev L'Achim, an organization in Eretz Yisroel that brings Yidden closer to Hashem and to Teshuva.

Asher's Kollel began a Shemiras HaSedarim program and began paying an extra ten dollars a month to those yungerleit who come on time to seder. When Asher received his additional ten dollars, he imme-



diately phoned Rav Eliezer Sorotzkin, the director of Lev L'Achim. "Can I please raise my monthly recurring donation from ten dollars to eleven dollars monthly?" Asher requested. This extra dollar was the Maaser for the additional income. Rav Sorotzkin was intrigued and asked Asher why he wanted to add one dollar to his monthly donation. When Asher told him the details, Rav Sorotzkin was stunned! He updated the recurring

amount to eleven dollars as requested, and was highly impressed that Asher wanted to account for every single Maaser dollar with such Ehrlichkeit.

When Rav Sorotzkin flew to America with יבדל בין חיים לחיים , Rav Uri Zohar ZT"L, he shared this story on the plane with Rav Zohar. They arrived and ate supper by their host. As they prepared to leave, their host graciously handed them a check for five thousand dollars. They thanked their host profusely. Rav Uri Zohar then asked Rav Sorotzkin to share the story of Asher. When their host heard the story, he was so blown away that he immediately doubled his donation to ten thousand dollars! Rav Sorotzkin phoned Asher to share with him the great impact of his seemingly small donation.

A few months later this same fellow phoned Rav Sorotzkin and Rav Zohar and shared that he is coming to Eretz Yisroel for a simcha with two of his friends, and would like to arrange for everyone to meet. At the meeting, he asked Rav Zohar to kindly share the story of Asher with his two friends. Rav Zohar shared the story, and one of the friends became very emotional and handed him a check. Rav Zohar looked at the check and saw that it was for ninety thousand dollars!!

They later shared this story with HaGaon Rav Aharon Leib Shteinman ZT"L who responded that since this yungerman gave his extra dollar with real dedication and Mesirus Nefesh, Hashem made sure that it would have the greatest possible impact and would literally change Klal Yisroel in an unprecedented way! Hashem wants our hearts and when we wholeheartedly desire to do





good Hashem accepts our Ratzon with open arms!

We see from this story how precious every single Mitzva we do is to Hashem!

Every word of Torah, every dollar we give to Tzedaka, and every seemingly small act of Chesed builds entire worlds!
