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## The True Oved Hashem Is a Happy and Content Person Who Is Missing Nothing

Upon his first entry into the *Kodesh HaKodoshim* on *Yom Kippur*, the *Cohen Gadol* would scoop a **full** shovel of burning coals from the top of the *Mizbeach*. He would also take: וּמְלֹא חָפְנִיו קְטֹרֶת his hands **full** of *Ketores*. We can suggest that a "full" handful symbolizes a person who is **full**, like *Yaakov Avinu* who said: יָשׁ לִי כֹל וֹישׁלֹח לֹג יֹא have EVERYTHING (my hands are **full**, and I'm a happy and content person); not like *Eisav* who said: יָשׁ לִי רֶב l have plenty (i.e., "I have a lot, but not enough").

# Difficulties Are Opportunities for Growth, And Opportunities for Growth Are the Real "Having" Dovid HaMelech said: ה' רעי לא אֶחְסָר תַהִּלִּים כֵּג א Hashem is my Shepard (so) I will never be lacking. The true Oved Hashem is missing nothing (despite all Dovid's horrific Nisyonos). Yaakov also had unusual Nisyonos, yet he

Hashem is missing **nothing** (despite all *Dovid's* horrific *Nisyonos*). Yaakov also had unusual *Nisyonos*, yet he said: יָשׁ לִי כֹל וישׁלח לג יא I have EVERYTHING. RSRH *Zatzal* says that this is because by *Yaakov*, "having" means the opportunity to grow, and therefore he even welcomed his difficulties, since they are all opportunities of growth.

#### To Rejoice with Another Person's Success, You Must Feel Fulfilled and Happy with Yourself

The: מַּחְתָּה shovel was also full (of burning coals), and *Chazal* say that the *Kodesh HaKodoshim* became "full" with smoke (of the *Ketores*). And *Ketores* is: מַּצְשָׁבֶּת a major *Segula* to become rich! *Ketores* symbolizes having everything, and: אֵיזֶהוּ עָשִׁיר הַשָּׁמֵחַ בְּחֶלְקוּ Who is truly "rich"? One who is *Sameach B'chelko*, i.e., content with what

he has. Who is the only person who may enter the Kodesh HaKodoshim on Yom Kippur? Only the Cohen Gadol (Ahron). How did Ahron become Cohen Gadol? בַלַ Because his "heart" rejoiced with his brother's greatness, so he received the Choshen on his "heart", which had 12 אַבְנֵי מִלּוּאִים Avnei Milu'im (stones that filled their boxes).

Each Shevet filled his golden box with his unique precious stone; so too should every person feel fulfilled with his unique Avodas Hashem without having any Kin'ah of others. How does a person become happy (Ahron) when his younger brother (Moshe) gets a higher position then himself? When he is himself a fulfilled happy person!

Chazal say that Ketores also symbolizes Simcha and Bitachon. The Gr"a explains that when the Gemara says that the Churban Bais Hamikdash happened because of Sin'as Chinam, the Gemara really means that they did not have

#### **Learning Bitachon Saves a Family**

A Yungerman who is a major Masmid, Talmid Chochom, and Rosh Chabura would come home full of stress, since he had a difficult childhood. He now learns Shaar HaBitachon and other Inyanei Bitachon for over an hour daily. As he learns Mussar, he gets happier and happier, and his wife and children are overjoyed. I was asked: תּוֹרָה מֵה תְּהֵא עֶלֶיהָ "But what will be with all the learning he is losing out? He is wasting so much precious time by working on Simcha and learning Inyanei Bitachon! Do you know how much Torah he could have learned instead?? Such a major Ben Torah should lose so much Torah on a regular basis??

Do I need to decide such a *Shayla*? Take your pick: Do you want to be a bigger *Talmid Chochom* and keep hurting your wife and kids (and yourself) and quite possibly end up in the hospital, with physical or mental issues, and be *Nichshal* in either *Kin'ah*, *Ta'ava*, *Kavod*, *Ga'ava*, יבָּהַמִּי lowliness like a loser, and all kinds of unhealthy complexes and depressions (or all of the above, *Rachmana Litzlan*) ... or not?!

It is obvious that Hashem wants this *Yungerman* to take care of: אַבְּיַרַת הַמְּדוֹת chis main purpose in life; i.e., שְׁבִירַת הַמְדוֹת *Shviras HaMiddos*. And if a person does *Ratzon Hashem*, there is no doubt that he will come out ahead, even in his learning

Bitachon, which is the root cause of Sin'as Chinam! And Bitachon means being a Sameach B'chelko. The Kiyum (support) of the Bais Hamikdash is having an Ahron type of Cohen Gadol, whom everyone should emulate. The first Avoda of Kodesh HaKodoshim on Yom Kippur is filling the Kodesh HaKodoshim with Ketores.

#### Sameach B'chelko Comes BEFORE Any Other Area in Avodas Hashem

You don't start any Avodas Kapara (i.e., the blood of the Korban) until you first take care of Ketores. So many people suffer throughout their lives despite their greatness in Torah and Chesed. And like Chazal say that during Bayis Sheini they were Osek in Torah and Chesed, and despite this there was a Churban because of Sin'as Chinam and lack of Sameach B'chelko (Bitachon), so we understand how the finest Bnei Torah and Y'rei Shamayim can suffer physically and mentally, and their lives can be ruined since they never had time for working on the #1 issue; i.e., Bitachon!

עליך הַמְּלַאכָה לָגִמוֹר אבוּת ב סיד You are not responsible to get it all done! אָיזֵהוּ עַשִּׁיר הַשָּׁמֶחַ בְּחֵלָקוּ Who is truly rich? One who is content with what he has. Before the Cohen Gadol starts shechting an ox and a goat, etc. he takes care of Ketores: הַמְעֵשֶׁרֶת which makes him (truly) rich; i.e., first comes the Sameach B'chelko issue! If Gedolei Yisroel like the Shomer Emunim and Chofetz Chaim believed that's it's K'dai to lose lots of Torah and Avoda to cheer and be M'chazek a Yid, כָּל שַׁכְּן וְקֵל וְחוֹמֵר surely you are obligated to be M'chazek yourself! וְחֵיֵיך קוֹדְמִין And you come first! If you don't address this part of your life, by learning Shaar HaBitachon more seriously, or other Eitzos for Menuchas HaNefesh and Simcha and Bitachon, by at least trying to work on it, then all kinds of Ruchaniyus and/or Gashmiyus issues are up and coming, Chas V'shalom.

### Novardok

A friend of mine who knew R' Chaim Halpern Zatzal helped him raise money for Novardok in the USA. He told R' Chaim that he was a Baal Teshuva. R' Chaim told him not to look at himself as a Baal Teshuva; instead, he should see himself as a Ben Torah, who happens to be a Baal Teshuva, but mainly he identifies himself as a Ben Torah. Novardok was quite sensitive to a person's dignity, despite all their Pratim.

In fact, R' Wainkrantz Zatzal once told someone to take a job in a place that they will respect him, and not a place where he'd be looked down upon. He was always building people up, including his *Talmidim*, and the staff in his Yeshiva.

He told me that the build-up you get can make the difference between success and failure. R' Chaim was also very street-wise, and he knew the mentality of different kinds of people very well. This can have a lot to do with the Vaadim in Novardok, where people opened up, and the Vaad members could become like professional psychologists.

R' Chaim gave several speeches when he was collecting, and his main theme was always how lucky we are to be from the holy Jewish nation. He was super warm & humble, despite his strong personality, and people loved him. He took a strong interest in people, and remembered their pecklach even after a long time. He really cared.

The Alter of Novardok Zatzal was once alone in an empty room with his daughter, with no food, no heat, no light, etc. The Alter told her that the whole world and all the money in the world isn't as good as this empty room. It is known that Novardokers could light up with true Simcha after hearing the most tragic and depressive news. This takes years of *Shaar HaBitachon*.

R' Gershon Zatzal was in the USA even when he was a: זְקֵן elderly person who couldn't walk. He brought along his Gabba'im to collect for his Yeshiva in France. He was lying on the couch of the: בַעל אַכְסַנִיָא host, when a man gave a check to his Gabba'im. R' Gershon did a Prat, and he yelled out: "How much was the check?" This is an example of how *Novardokers* cured their fears of people. Of course, you need a *Rebbe* to guide you for "Pratim"; i.e., which ones are for you.
