Nothing Stops a Melech, Who Has Bitachon in Hashem and Ignores the Waves of Adversity

Nachshon was the first one who jumped into the Yam Suf, and now he is the first of the Nesi'im to bring his Korbanos. He wasn't afraid of those roaring waves, since he had Bitachon in the Borei Olam Creator of the world. This is true *Malchus*. מלך פורץ גדר A Melech breaks barriers. A *Melech* doesn't run away when he has adversity. Nothing stops him.

It is interesting that just prior to *Dovid's* killing *Golyas HaPelishti*, he was given sharp *Mussar* by his older brother Eliav. Eliav scolded him about his wicked heart & that he has no business getting involved in the battle against Golyas. Another person would get discouraged and depressed, especially since Eliav was an Adam Gadol, whom Shmuel HaNavi thought he was worthy to become Melech! But Dovid just ignored him.

Just as Nachshon ignored the waves, so did Dovid ignore his older brother. Similarly, when Rus was considering

to be *M'gayer*, *Naomi* tried to discourage her. She told her about the: אַרבַּע מִיתוֹת בֶּית דִין four ways of execution used by Bais Din to punish certain Aveiros, and even after they are killed, they remain in the: בֵּית בּקבָרוֹת cemetery of *Reshaim*, and have eternal Bizayon. She also informed her about the Issur of Yichud which is extremely difficult for a Mo'avis.

Yet, *Rus* was: מְתָאַמֶּצֶת pushed herself. The *Seforno* says that: נַשָּא לִיבָה אוֹתַה she lifted her heart that she wouldn't fall into sin! This is real Malchus'dik confidence! Fearless optimism! The opposite of Eisav, who as soon as he heard that a Bechor is Chayav Missa for: שָׁתוּיֵי יֵין doing Avoda after drinking wine, he said: הַנָּה אַנכִי הוּלֶךְ לְמוּת וַלְמָה זָה לִי בַּכֹרָה What do I need this Bechora for? I'm surely going to die from it! He was sure he would fail, and he gave up right away.

The husbands of *Rus* and *Orpah* were called: יוֹאָשׁ ושָׂרֵף Yo'ash and Saraph, and Chazal explain that Yo'ash means that they were Mya'esh from the Geula. Rus is married to such a M'yuash'dika person,

The Ma'ala of People Who Struggle

In this weeks' Haftorah, notice how the wife of *Manoach* isn't mentioned, even though she appears much more Chashuv than him [she is always teaching him, and the *Malach* repeatedly appears only to her, not to him]. We can suggest that **his** name is mentioned for this very reason, since he had many more struggles. We see clearly the Ma'ala of lower people who struggle vs. higher Tzaddikim who don't need to struggle as much.

This is the phenomenal lesson of: Aderaba! and V'nahapoch Hu! Look how our holy Torah is loaded with all kinds of encouragement for all kinds of issues, like Rus HaMoavi'a and Dovid the Admoni, etc. So many variations of all kinds of "zeros" becoming the top-top. A Yid always looks for the Aderaba approach, and Hashem helps him [since he has Bitachon in Him] to do all kinds of "impossible" things. Never, ever, look down at yourself; and never,

ever give up hope!

yet she goes the opposite direction and wins everything! This is why the Torah says so many times about the Avoda in the Bais Hamikdash: וִמְכְלַל לַאו אַתָּה שׁוֹמֵעַ הָן he will NOT die [when he does the right thing] and: וִמְכָלַל לַאו אַתָּה שׁוֹמֵעַ הָן the punishment for transgression is unspoken.

True, you **can** die, *Chas V'shalom*, e.g. if you are: מַחוּסָר בַּגַּדִים not wearing Bigdei Kehuna while doing Avoda, or without: קִידוּשׁ יָדַיִם וְרַגְלַיִם first washing your hands and feet, etc. **But you won't** - think positive! The positive Malchus'dik person ignores all those jumbo elephants of adversity in his life, and he goes forward.

When Boaz asked his: נֻעַר young helper about Rus, he packed in plenty of Lashon Hara; i.e., that she was a Ganav, she is not a Tz'nua, and a Moavi'a who still had the bad Middos of her nation. The Sefer Minchas Erev elaborates on how the: נֵעַר helper insisted how *Rus* was an insincere *Giyores*, and how he lifted his voice to berate her; as the *Passuk* says: הַרָּמַת קוֹל which denotes: הַרְמַת קוֹל

The #1 Yesod of Novardok: No Hispa'alus From People or Situations!

The Sefer Minchas Erev says that Boaz wasn't M'kabel Lashon Hara at all. On the contrary, he held her in the highest esteem. He called her: מָּבְּתִי my daughter, and the greatest Eishes Chayil. And Rus didn't get angry at Boaz for not sticking up for her. Look how these two Malchus'dik people ignore adversity, and aren't impressed by people and their pettiness.

We can all learn from this not to be *Nis'pael* from people and situations. The #1 *Yesod* of *Novardok* was: No *Hispa'alus!*

We see the perfect *Shidduch* of *Rus* and *Boaz*. True *Malchus!* מֶּלֶךְ פּוֹרֵץ גֶּדֶר A Melech breaks barriers. The *Melech* breaks the fence that's blocking him and he marches forward. We all need to learn this and not be *Nis'pael* from difficulties, like *Parnasa* or medical issues, *Rachmana Litzlan*, etc.

There is tremendous power in people who move on without *Yi'ush*, and they conquer worlds. No wonder R' Gershon Liebman *Zatzal* wasn't afraid even of Nazis, *Y'mach Sh'mam*, and he succeeded. I even heard him say during a *Shabbos Shuva Drasha*, that a person needs to be a *Tamim* and have no fear: וְאַפִּילוּ מִן הַשׁוֹאָה even not from the Holocaust!!!

By the way, not *Chapping Hispa'alus* includes your own worst sins! You keep moving upwards, and go-on to *Davka* become an *Adam Gadol*.

Novardok

Shalom Bayis was a major issue in *Novardok*. There isn't any *Kavod* to be gained at home, and your true Bain Adam La'chaveiro comes out at home base. The Alter Zatzal wrote 3,000 Maalos about his wife.

During their *Vaadim*, people opened up to each other **to some extent**. This is the reason for their phenomenal *Hatzlacha*; issues were addressed, and your friends helped you tackle them *Ai-Pi Torah* and *Al-Pi Mussar*. Usually they blamed themselves for their own *Ga'ava* or lack of *Bitachon*, which the right *Mussar Seder* would cure with *Si'ata D'shmaya*. They grew from *Vaad* to *Vaad*. I know of a *Novardoker* [Rabbi R.] whose wife used to yell at him, and he would answer with a soft voice: "I'll try to make myself better".

If you believe in: ה' אָמֵר לוֹ קַלֵּל It is really Hashem cursing me in the form of this human, so who are you arguing with? Hashem is talking to you via this person, and everything in your life is a message from Hashem. So we ignore the person, who doesn't realize that he's a *Shali'ach Min HaShamayim*, and we try to improve ourselves, by working on *Ka'as*, *Hachna'a*, or being *Dan L'kaf Zechus*, etc. I once heard R' Avigdor Miller *Zatzal* saying publicly: "The worse your wife is, the better!".

Someone once came to an old *Novardoker* telling him his many problems with his wife. He looked at him in amazement: "You're so lucky. With such a wife you can grow and grow!" When Mrs. R. told her husband: "But you told me last time that you'll improve!", he answered: "But this time I'll try harder". He was like a broken record of tremendous *Hachna'a* to his wife, no matter what she yelled about.

I was once eating at a *Novardoker's* house, and the children were acting up at the table. It was *Shabbos*, and he was saying a *Vort* on the *Parsha* in his usual low and soft voice. His response to the acting up: To speak even lower and softer than usual! And as usual, he was always in a state of good humor. He laughed and laughed. He created a happy home, thanks to his hours and hours of learning *Shaar HaBitachon*, which is where he got his tremendous *Simcha* from. His tremendous *Hachna'a* and *Eidelkeit* came from hours and hours of learning *Shaar HaK'niya! Novardok* husbands always blame themselves, since they live by the *Chovos Halvavos Shaar HaBitachon* who says that when your relatives mistreat you, you should be *Mochel* them and *Davka* do lots of *Chesed* to them; just blame your own sins and do *Teshuva*.
