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


מכתב ברכה וחיזוק מזקני ראשי ישיבות באמעריקא

A TRUE HERO

I am a melamed in a cheder. One child in my class was scholastically very weak. His memory was not good, he didn't understand basic things, and the more things that were explained to him, the less, it seemed, he understood.

We learned mishnayos Yuma until Pesach, and he didn't understand anything – as if he was groping in the dark. But after Pesach we started learning mishnayos Tamid, and then we discovered that this child understands very well and remembers everything he was taught! He knew and succeeded like one of the better boys!

I was truly amazed, and the boy noticed my amazement. "Is Rebbi surprised?" he asked me, and I answered that I was indeed surprised.

"It really is something special that Hashem opened up my eyes," the child said. "When we were learning mishnayos, Rebbi told us about the holy Tanna Rabi Masya ben Charash and asked who heard about him. A few boys in class said that their mothers lit a candle in the zechus of Rabi Masya ben Charash, but Rebbi explained that Rabi Masya is not candles, he is a great Tanna who withstood a huge nisayon in shemiras einayim and burned his eyes so as not to stumble and see any forbidden sight. Hashem made a miracle for him and healed his eyes.

I thought to myself that I also need to safeguard my eyes. Across from the bus stop where I wait for the bus every morning is a school for nonreligious girls. At the exact time when I wait there, they come to school. Since Rebbi spoke about Rabi Masya ben Charash, I started to guard my eyes and not to look at all at the school and at who was walking there. I just started guarding my eyes and not lifting them in that direction at all, and while I do this I daven to Hashem that He should enlighten my eyes in His Torah, that I should understand what we're learning. That I should be able to be on the same level as the other boys in the class. "And that's it. Hashem heard my tefillos!"

I was shocked by the child's story. The child who, until the time he stopped looking at what was happening across from the bus stop, was considered weak in learning. This is a child who proved what true strength is all about, and he was zocheh to see tangibly Hashem's yeshuah.

I couldn't trade his prize with Eli's prize without his permission, so Eli ended up giving his unwanted prize to Yeshaya. Had Moshe Yehuda been there he very likely would have traded his prize with Eli's prize and Yeshaya would have been left with nothing...

One of my family members needed an important examination by a specialist. The cost of the examination was 1,500 shekels, and my health insurance did not cover it. The askan who had sent me for the examination told me that they would have to speak with the person in charge of the health insurance's budgeting, and to send a special request to the committee that approves nonstandard needs. "You'll need go through the whole process," he told me, "but even then, it's not certain that they'll reimburse you for the cost of the exam." Since the matter was very important and could not be pushed off, I couldn't wait for the answer; I couldn't have the examination be dependent on whether they would cover it or not. We set out with a checkbook and with tefillos

At that moment I had an idea. The letters of the word shehakol could stand for Shalem, hechzer - ken? Lo? - Will the insurance pay back the money? Yes? Or no? and the answer: Nihiya bidvaro - Hakadosh Baruch Hu would decide. The entire matter was according to His Word and in His Hands alone. After the examination I went over to the secretary, and after looking over our documents and checking the computer, she said, "You don't have to pay."


I finally thought to myself, "One minute, I always read in the Spring Hill Times that Hashem is the Kol Yochol. He could find it for me."

She was able to give her husband delicious supper!




We May Be Lacking Tefillah B'simchah

G Faint Whiff Of Hashem's Unlimited Wisdom and Kindness



Hashem gave us the ability to pick up movement with our eyes. This is something so basic that we probably do not give it any thought and we do not perceive it as something additional to the regular eyesight that we discussed until now.

It is different than perceiving stationary objects. There is a different set of movement going on inside the eye when it picks up mobility. If we did not have this extra function,

it would drastically affect our lives.

There is so much enjoyment that we receive from our eyesight. If our eyes would only see stationary objects, we would only be able to perceive movement when it would touch our skin which is something that does not happen often. Like when a gust of wind blows across our face - but not too much else.

People have a special appreciation for movement. Let's take a simple example from nature. It's only because we can perceive movement that we are able to appreciate watching a bird soar in the sky, that we are able to watch leaves of a tree sway in the wind and we can watch a waterfall or a running stream. Thank You, Hashem, for giving us the ability to perceive movement!

The ability to follow objects that are in motion requires special movement inside our eye. Our lives would be drastically different if we did not have this function. Let's elaborate some more on this point. We would not have any sports. If you can't see a moving baseball, football or basketball – you can't play a game. You also can't hunt for food. But really it gets more basic than sports. If you wouldn't be able to pick up movement and you wouldn't be able to focus on moving objects – driving would be impossible. You can't drive if there is a possibility that there is someone else in the vicinity that you can't see. This applies to cars, boats, planes and bikes. If your children are roaming around in the park, you would not be able to find them.

Even regular human interaction would not be the same. When someone approaches you, you would not be able to see them until they stop moving. Likewise when they turn to leave, they would suddenly disappear. People would just be popping into your life and popping out of your life.

Perceiving movement is such a vital and important function.

PARSHA SPARKS

In Parshas VaEira, HaKadosh Boruch Hu turned all the water of Mitzrayim into blood. Chazal tell us that if a Yid and a Mitzri drank out of the same cup using straws, the Mitzri got yucky disgusting blood and the Yid enjoyed refreshing, clear water.

Harav Avigdor Miller, zt"l, teaches us that Hashem's primary purpose in bringing the Makkos was for Klal Yisroel to witness and learn from them. The lesson of Makas Dam/Blood was to teach us that nothing in this world has intrinsic existence - not blood or water - only Hashem. If a person is thirsty and drinks a cup of delicious cold water and then feels refreshed, is it the water that helps? No, Hashem decrees whether or not the water will quench a person's thirst. Food works the same way. Two people can eat the same food and one will be satiated and the other will suffer a serious allergic reaction. If a person needs a particular medicine, he has to internalize that the medicine is neither helpful nor har....ul - Hashem decides the outcome. Why? Hashem is teaching us that food or water or medicine does not intrinsic power to affect anyone - everyone's reaction is a decree of Hashem, our loving caring Father.



STORIES WITH A SPARK

HaRav Yehudah Mandel, shlita shares: "Many years ago I suffered from terrible backaches. I was referred to a big specialist who had apparently helped hundreds of people. He used a method of soaking a cloth in cold water and rubbing it in a specific way on the patient's back. Unfortunately, it did not help me. Then I went to a different specialist who had healed many patients, but he used a treatment with warm water. It didn't help me either. I finally understood what Hashem was trying to teach me - it's not the hot water or the cold water that helps; it's only the Ribono Shel Olam. I decided to stop getting involved in what method to use and leave it up to Hashem. With that I had a tremendous refuah!"

A prominent Rosh Yeshiva, whose shiurim in Bitachon are world renowned, shared the most incredible personal story.

"A couple of years ago, I was about to undergo a round of treatments for the machla lo aleinu. The doctor warned me of the chemotherapy's serious side effects - I would lose my voice, lose my hair, feel very weak and sick and so on, r"l. I told him I didn't believe I would be affected at all – the chemicals would only destroy the disease and nothing else. Boruch Hashem, I went through the chemo and I did not lose one hair, I did not feel weak, and I did not miss one day of giving shiur!"

The message is loud and clear. Do not attribute power to any medication. We must bear in mind that all power, without exception, belongs only to the Ribono Shel Olam, Who takes care of each and every individual on this planet.

I want to go away for the summer like most of my friends. However, I do not have an extra penny to spend. I am looking at my friends who have plenty of money and could do whatever they want. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A The reason you feel stuck is because you think that money gets people places. Because you don't have money, therefore you can't go where you want to go.

Understand that owning money does not help people get anything more than what is coming to them. If it is good for a person to have a certain thing, even if he does not own a penny, Hashem will make sure he gets it. If it's not good for him to have it, even if he owns all the money in the world, Hashem will prevent him from getting it.

I know of people who planned extravagant vacations, but when it came time to go, unexpected things came up which forced them to cancel their plans.

The same happens in reverse. I know of penniless families who didn't dream of going on vacation, and unexpectedly, someone stepped forward and sponsored a vacation for them.

We come to realize that having material possessions or good times has nothing to do with how much money a person owns. Hakadosh Baruch Hu is the One who sees to it that each person should get what is best for him.

When you adopt this mindset, you will learn to enjoy wherever you are, because you know that מה' מצעדי From Hashem, a man's footsteps are planned [Tehillim 37, 23]; wherever you find yourself is exactly where Hashem planned for you to be.

Secretary in Medical Center

I am a secretary in 'Refuah Medical Center'. My job is to take calls from patients, listen to their medical conditions and then direct them to appropriate care.

Day-in and day-out, I listen to reports of illness and suffering, and my heart aches when hearing how so many people are suffering. How can I deal with this in a healthy way?

Ayou must realize that for every person who tells you about a medical condition he has, there are ten thousand people who don't have that illness!

In fact, says Harav Avigdor Miller Zatzal, when Hashem makes an individual sick, in addition to Hashem's specific reasons for making him unwell, one of the purposes is to remind all of the healthy people not to take their good health for granted!

When a person hears about someone who is sick, certainly his first reaction must be to feel their pain and to daven for their full recovery. However, subsequently, he is expected to focus on how fortunate he is that he is spared from that form of illness!

He must be full of gratitude to Hashem Yisborach for keeping him healthy, and for the joy that comes along with good health. He should realize, it's not only him who Hashem made healthy, Hashem made a world full of people, the vast majority of whom are enjoying a life of good health!

If you want your joy to be complete, and you do not want that person to suffer either, turn to Hashem and say, "In the z'chus that this person's sickness caused me to feel how much You love me and are caring for me, please give him a refuah shleima and restore him to perfect health as well."



THE QUOTE: "In matters of medicine often the medicine the doctor prescribes not only doesn't cure the illness but makes it worse. Therefore, how can a person ever rely on his own efforts since he is not sure if they will be beneficial or harmful. The reliance is only on Hashem"

THE LESSON: What makes this so incredible and amazing is that so many times we are so confident and reliant on medicine and doctors and we forget Who is really pulling all the strings. The Baal Bitachon remembers that medicine is no guarantee and that it is not the

doctor that he can rely on nor the medicine – only Hashem makes it all possible!

Moshe told Pharaoh (7:17), "So says Hashem, with this shall you know that I am Hashem...". We see from here that the purpose of the ten plagues was to demonstrate that Hashem is in control, and everything deemed to be 'nature' can be overturned in a split second.

Elaborating on this idea, the Ramban (13:16) teaches us that there are three fundamental themes we see in the ten plagues that we are supposed to ap-

ply to our own lives. The first message is that Hashem constantly renews the world, and everything happens at His bidding. Just as He normally decides that water will be water, He can easily decide that it will be blood. The second message is that Hashem is directly involved in every aspect of our lives. The final message is that He is All-Powerful.

day in Modim, "For Your miracles that are with us each day."

Why is it that appreciating the open miracles teaches us that everything is a miracle? Well, Hashem broke the bonds of 'nature' with the ten plagues because He is in control of nature in the first place. For example, He decided that the water the Egyptians drink will be turned into blood, but not the Jews' water. So even if a Jew and an Egyptian drank from the same cup with two straws, what the Egyptian drank was turned into blood, and what the Jew drank was a refreshing cup of water! The fact that Hashem turned the Egyptian's water into blood reveals to us that the very fact He wills it to be water is also miraculous!

In fact, our Rabbis teach that hidden miracles are even more miraculous than revealed ones. This is because open miracles are a one-time event, yet

hidden miracles happen constantly, helping keep us alive. The fact that can breathe, our hearts pump, and we have food and water are all miracles, and even miraculous more than the open miracles we experience! (Meshech Hochmah, Bechukosai)

This helps us understand a teaching of Chazal, "The mir-

acle of livelihood is greater than that of Krias Yam Suf." This is a miracle we experience constantly and is essential to our survival, so therefore it is greater. In the words of Rav Avigdor Miller, "250 miracles happened at Krias Yam Suf, yet thousands of miracles happen in the production of our food!"

Let's take a look at water. It keeps us and millions of species alive. There are thousands of species of animals and plants, not to mention the over six billion people on the planet. Water is the life source of each species and plays a vital function. It is truly miraculous how water is formed. Water vapor ris-

The Ramban explains that when we appreciate the phenomenal miracles that occurred and absorb the powerful messages they are meant to teach us, we will realize that everything is a miracle, and there is no such thing as 'nature'. He teaches that this is a fundamental idea of Judaism and is what gives us a part in the Torah of Moshe! Chazal (Niddah 31a) teach that miracles happen constantly, it's just that those who experience them are not always aware. We refer to this idea three times a

es into the atmosphere and condenses into clouds. When these clouds become saturated, water is poured down to the world, helping keep us alive. It was a one-time event that Hashem turned water into blood, yet we are always privileged to experience the miracle of water!

We now see how the messages of the ten plagues are ever so relevant to our day-to-day lives.


Rabbi Avigdor Miller had so much appreciation for


the gift of water and would fondly refer to it as the 'elixir of life'. One time, when he went to attend to a grandchild in the hospital, he went to get a drink of water. He recited a heartfelt berachah, then took a sip, relishing this great gift, and said to Hashem, 'I thank You'!

Someone once bought for him a two-dollar water bottle from a store that sold New York City tap water for tourists. For a long time, he kept this bottle by his seat in Shul, helping him appreciate this gift and reminding him that each glass of tap water has monetary value. 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Asher Yatzar Does Wonders!

Last week we discussed how Hashem is "נורא תהלת עושה פלא – too awesome for praise, **doing** wonders." It does not say "He did wonders" in past tense, which would refer to Krias Yam Suf, rather it is in present tense, which means that He is constantly performing wonders. Which wonders? No need to look further than your own body! A person who says Asher Yatzar properly, word by word, with emotion and true feelings of gratitude, shows that he is well aware of the fact that Hashem is performing wonders for him. As a result, he will see wonders in his own life. Here is such a story, brought in sefer Barchi Nafshi (Vayishlach, page 455).

A certain Talmid Chochom related that thirteen years earlier he had started having issues with his digestive system. Anyone who experienced such problems knows how painful this can be. After undergoing extensive medical tests, he was diagnosed with Colitis. Never heard of it? Now is a good time to thank Hashem for that! It means inflammation of the colon, which makes it more urgent and painful to go to the bathroom. One can go crazy from the difficult and painful symptoms which can include internal bleeding. The doctor told him that there is no natural cure for the type that he has and he must learn how to live with it for the rest of his life. Since this person knew that doctors are not the ones who determine our fate, he decided to take upon himself to strengthen the way he says the beracha of Asher Yatzar. Besides for taking natural actions to try to minimize the intensity of the symptoms he began to say Asher Yatzar with kavanah. Even if sometimes he didn't say it as well as he would have liked, he kept going. Then the unbelievable occurred, as the symptoms that had made life so difficult for so long completely disappeared. Strangely, when he went for tests, they saw that the sickness was still in his body, even though there were no symptoms. That being the case, B"H his life went back to normal.

Thirteen years later, the symptoms of Colitis came back, with its intense pains and difficulties. This time he went to one of the top gastroenterologists in Eretz Yisroel. The doctor performed several tests and concluded that this is indeed uncurable Colitis and any medicines can only help lessen the pain to a certain extent. The Talmid Chochom decided once again not to be disturbed by this grim prognosis and he took upon himself to say Asher Yatzar and the beracha of Refainu with more kavana. Wonders of wonders – the symptoms disappeared again. This time, when he went for more tests a while later, the doctor was shocked. Not only were the symptoms gone – his intestines looked completely normal! The doctor thought that there must be a mistake so he did a biopsy, and they removed a tiny piece of the intestine and inspected it in a laboratory. This test also showed the power of Asher Yatzar – the condition had disappeared!

If a person would realize what a good cure this beracha is, they would take it more seriously. Hashem performs wonders constantly in our bodies, and the more we realize that, the more we will merit that these hidden wonders should continue, without the need to deal with painful symptoms and difficult treatments which many times do not even work.

Did you know, as Rav Yehuda Mandel always says, that our job in this world is to say, "Hashem, You made the most beautiful world, and I am Your creation and I'm happy with the way You made

me! If You made me a shlemazel, I'm happy to be a shlemazel, if You made me forgetful, I'm happy to be forgetful, if You made me have nervous twitches, I'm happy." Whatever it might be: you're shy, you're not a people person...

Some people are not put together, some people are not neat, some people can't get their act together, and if that's your personality, say, "Beautiful! I'm so happy!" That's your tafkid in this world, that's why Hashem created you, to be able to say, "I'm happy with the way Hashem made me."

Now of course, if you have exercises to do to work on making yourself a better, healthier person, to bring you more menuchas hanefesh and a better connection to Hashem, then kol hakavod- go for it. But whatever personality you are born with, and you have now, that's your nature, and you were put in this world to say Hashem You made me this way, it's beautiful!



Just to end off with a story, the Chofetz Chaim says over that there were people that were lo yutzlach, they couldn't find a job, couldn't get their act together and they would just go around collecting tzeda-kah from door to door. People would go to the Chofetz Chaim and say, "It's a chutzpa, let them go get a job, it's their problem if they don't have money." The Chofetz Chaim said, "It's exactly the opposite, you think it's because they're lo yutzlachs that they don't have money. Actually, Hashem didn't want them to have money, and because of that Hashem made them with this kind of personality. Hashem didn't want them to have money. He wanted them to go around collecting. So therefore, you have a chiyuv to go help these people, because that's how Hashem made them.

For some people that could be their tafkid, so don't look down at them, and if you're similar, don't look down at yourself either!

Brisk

- Brisk is a city in Belarus. The non-Jewish name is Brest-Litovsk, and the Jews call it Brisk. Rav Yosef Dov Soloveitchik, known as the Beis Halevi, was the Rav of Brisk from 1877-1892. His son, Rav Chaim Soloveitchik, known as Rav Chaim Brisker, was the Rav of Brisk from 1892-1918. His son, Rav Yitzchok Zev Soloveitchik, known as The Brisker Rav, was the Rav of Brisk from 1918-1940.

- The Soloveitchik family traditionally educated their own children. The Brisker Rav used to learn with his own sons. Eventually, the yeshivos in Europe started sending some of their top talmidim to spend time participating in this shiur and learning from the Brisker Rav.

During the Holocaust, the Brisker Rav fled to Yerushalayim. There, he continued learning with his sons, and top yeshiva students came to learn with them. It was very informal and was never an official yeshiva.

After the Brisker Rav passed away, his son Rav Yosha Ber Soloveitchik turned it into an official yeshiva, Yeshivas Brisk. After he passed away, his son, Rav Avrohom Yehoshua Soloveitchik, took over the yeshiva. The Brisker Rav's sons Rav Meshulam Dovid and Rav Meir also started their own Brisk-type yeshivos. There are also other Brisk yeshivos led by various other members of the extended family.

 Brisk is a very elite yeshiva. It is only for talmidim who have already completed three years of post high school learning. In order to get accepted, one must have a letter of recommendation from his previous Rosh Yeshiva. Once accepted, one must still learn in the yeshiva for at least a year before being allowed to attend the shiur.

- Rav Chaim Soloveitchik had a unique way of learning Torah, which is now known as "The Brisker Derech." This has become a popular method of learning in all of the yeshivos. Some of the unique points of his derech halimud:

1. He put a strong emphasis on analyzing the text. When learning, one should not ask אואס שטייט דא (why) but איט שטייט דא (what does it say here).

In other words, the goal isn't to philosophize and try to figure out why the Torah says something. Rather, we should just focus on figuring out what

the Torah is teaching us. To be Continued

Illuminating Words of Chazal

"Everything about Hashem, His Torah and His world is supposed to bring out positive emotions and help us have a healthy relationship with Hashem." Rav Yehuda Mandel

Until I was introduced to 'A Life with Bitachon,' I had a very different understanding of yiddishkeit and of Hashem. I was afraid of Hashem and was not aware of Hashem's love. Why did Hashem make this happen? How can this be called perfect?

I get this question all the time, and I can relate to this question because until I met my Rebbe, 11 years ago, I also was very, very scared of Hashem. I looked at Him like a policeman who would give me a ticket for everything I did wrong. I looked at Him like a dictator with a stick in his hand. That's how I viewed Hashem. I was very scared of Hashem. And whenever I did an aveira, I said, "Okay, now who knows what Hashem is going to do to me." I remember one Yom Kippur when I was in Mesivta, like 10th grade, I by mistake wore leather shoes. I felt, Hashem won't let me live out this year. That's the way my mind worked. I had a tremendous pachad from Hashem, a very unhealthy pachad. That was my whole relationship with Hashem. I had a lot of negative thoughts and feelings, and I actually became unhealthy from it. And when I didn't know if I should do A or B, I got angry at Hashem. Why are you putting me in a situation where I don't know what to do? Here you want me to serve you and you're not telling me what to do? I became angry at Hashem. This is how I thought until I was 31.

Now, it's very important to note that there's no one to blame. We should never blame any of our parents or Rebbeim. My father was a Talmid of R' Chatzkel, who was very into Din, Yira, Onesh and Gehenim, because for my father, that's what motivated him to become a bigger, better, happier, healthier person. That's what brought him to have more menuchas hanefesh and simchas hachaim. That's what brought him to have a healthier connection to Hashem. They viewed Onesh and Din as soap and shampoo. They viewed Yira, Onesh, Din, Gehenim as a lollipop and wow, how Hash-

em wanted to make our lives sweet. They had a healthy relationship with Hashem and because of that, that's why for them, it worked, but for me personally, and for many people who call me up and tell me they're in the same situation as I was, it's not working.

I have a very choshuve talmid who told me that when he was growing up, Shivisi Hashem l'negdi Tamid meant that Hashem was watching him like a policeman, a dictator, with a stick in his hand, ready to get him if he did one thing wrong. Now, after following a Life with Bitachon, he saw the Radak on that pasuk, it says exactly the opposite. It says, Hashem is there holding your hand, watching you, loving you, protecting you, caring for you, wants to help you every second. Zugt the Radak, when you do that, the next pasuk says, you'll be the happiest person in the world, you'll walk around, upbeat, freilich, and shiker from Simcha, and it will be mechaper for all your aveiros, give you a straight ticket to Olam Haba, it will save you from everything, any dinim in the next world, dinim in this world. Shivisi Hashem L'negdi Tamid is a pasuk all about how Hashem is holding your hand and loving you.

When it comes to Avodas Hashem Yisbarach, I spoke to talmidim, R' Yechiel Perr told me this, in the earlier generations, the way that motivated them was yirah, onesh, din, gehenim, that was the mahalach. But in the dor before Mashiach, which is the dor we're living in right now, what works for most people is positive, is through Ahavah. The Chozeh M'Lublin says, it says in Maseches Sotah is Yiras Hashem Yim'asu. He says it's a positive thing. Now, in the dor before Mashiach, the way to connect to Hashem is through Ahava, through positive and more positive.

There's a yid in Lakewood who went to R' Chaim Epstein to get a haskama that yidden should learn a certain sefer to give them Chizuk in a certain area that they need chizzuk in. R' Chaim Epstein went through the whole sefer. He said, "I love it, but I can't give a haskamah, because there was one chapter about Gehenim, and it doesn't motivate people nowadays, it just turns people off, I can't give a haskama."

So you see that this is the way the Gedolim saw that today's generation would need something else. R' Moshe Feinstein writes in Igros Moshe and Darash Moshe, that the way to get people to love Hashem is not through din, yira, onesh, it's always through positive, positive, positive. In Igros Moshe he says the most effective way is through positive, positive, positive, positive.

That's what the Chozeh m'Lublin says, that before Moshiach, there's going to be a different way to connect Hashem. Yiras Hachet Yim'asu. We're not going to be able to connect to Hashem through Yirah. It won't work. Only if you're positive.

That's the hakdamah. So why did Hashem make it

that so many people would only find out many years later?

Why does Hashem make it that we find out later? The answer is, because the reason why I have such a passion for this mehalach, is through contrast. I saw how I used to view Hashem and how I view Hashem now. Before and after. Contrast is what makes a

person have a passion, what makes a person appreciate what they have. Every day I wake up and I say to Hashem, thank You Hashem for my Rebbe.

Zugt R' Avigdor Miller, to appreciate what you have, you need contrast. You have to have a before and after. This is what R' Avigdor Miller brings from many ra'ayahs and sources and mekoros and medrashim, and that's actually the metzius, that human beings only appreciate something through contrast. R' Yehuda Mandel taught me how to serve and see Hashem in a different light. And because of that, I have a passion, I have a passion, a very strong passion, a very strong desire. But if R' Yehuda Mandel would have been my father, then there's no way I would have such a passion. There's no way that I would, make it my avodas hachaim, to make it my life's career to go around and be mefarsem how much Hashem loves me. The only reason why I have such a passion, and the only reason why I'm doing what I'm doing, is only because of the contrast. A person can only appreciate this connection with Hashem, this relationship with Hashem, only through contrast. That's how human beings appreciate it. Up until now, until I met my Rebbe, before 31 years old, I had one tafkid and one tikkun, and now I have a different tafkid. And that's the tafkid of devoting the rest of my life to spread R' Yehuda Mandel's teaching, to show everyone how Yiddishkeit is sweet and positive and geshmack and fun and freilich. So, I believe that I am only passionate for what I do, and only appreciate what I do, and only love what I do, only because of the contrast.

And therefore, everyone has to know that use this opportunity if you found out later. If you found that later, now have a passion for it. Feel loved by Hashem that you found a rebbe that saved you,

that taught you this mehalech. That's the answer why people find that later in their life. Now, every day I get so excited, I wake up, thank your Hashem for my Rebbi. Without him I would be in the dumps. I was sick for a year. I was sick for a year!

Every morning I wake up and say, "Thank you Hashem for find-

ing R' Yehuda Mandel at 31. Thank You Hashem, because without R' Yehuda Mandel, I don't know where I'd be now," but at the same time, I say, "Thank You, Hashem that I only found him at 31. I would never have appreciated it to this extent, I would have never seen the contrast.

Therefore, the answer to your question is, any person who wants to know the emes will find it. And whichever stage you find it, that's perfect. That's how much Hashem wanted you to see the contrast, to appreciate what the difference is. Everyone has a different tafkid and a different tikkun. Until we find our Rebbe is one tafkid and tikkun, and after we find a Rebbe, a different tafkid and different tikkun.

Therefore, everything in yiddishkeit, everything about life is l'chatchila. That the way Hashem wanted it, and it's perfect, gevaldig and amazing.

A. HaRav Yisroel Falk responded: As far as a person's hishtadlus to make money, he would not necessarily be expected to ask for a raise in such a situation.


However, over here there is another consideration. When someone feels that he deserves a

raise and is not getting it, he could feel underappreciated. This feeling could decrease his motivation to invest in his work, and have a negative impact on him in general.

Therefore, in regards to doing hishtadlus to enhance the quality of your work and your sipuk, it would be proper to overcome your hesitations and ask for a raise.

Q. I am renting a house. Whenever something needs to be fixed, I ask my landlord to take care of it. But he always tries to get out of paying and he claims that it's not his responsibility.


My friends tell me, 'If you want to get anything from your landlord, you have to keep nudging him until he gives you what you want'. However, doing so robs me from my menuchas hanefesh. What is emunah and bitachon perspective about this?



We have to know; this message is coming from the goyim.


The Gemara teaches us how to be truly successful when faced with the option of machlokes: give in.

We are standing now in the awesome time known "Shovavim." This is a time when we can come extra close to Hashem, our Beloved Father.

Shovavim is a time that we can purify ourselves and become uplifted from the tuma of Mitzrayim that distances us from Hashem r"l.

What an unbelievable opportunity we have before us during these holy weeks.

Our year is packed with opportunities for our spiritual growth and attain great spiritual heights. By each Yom tov or eis ratzon one can acquire many different wonderful attributes.

For example; on Chanukah through the Menora we have the ability to tap into the "or haganuz." At the same time on Chanukah we also become strengthened in Emuna, bitachon and in praising Hashem consistently.

Chazal tell us that where a Baal Teshuva stands even a total righteous Tzaddik cannot stand. That's because the power of teshuva is to bring out the love that's buried in our hearts.

Now I would like to say the following. Many people, (especially our readers of the Spring Hill times) spend lots of their time thinking about all the chessed that Hashem does for them. Many Yidden spend lots of time thanking Hashem for all the goodness that He bestows upon us.

This is the biggest Teshuva. I am referring to the highest level of Teshuva better known as "teshuva m'ahava."

Let me bring a powerful story that will bring out what we are trying to convey here.

One wintry morning two of Rav Saadia Gaon's talmidim found their Rebbe crying, davening and doing Teshuva. The students were taken aback, and they asked their Rebbe for an explanation.

Rav Sa'adia said as follows. "One night I landed in a small inn run by an old yid. He was a very kind but simple man. He treated me nicely, we spoke for a while and after a Short while I went to sleep.

Early the next morning I bade him my farewell and I was on my way.

An hour later one of my pupils came to the inn to see if I was there. He asked the innkeeper if he saw Rav Saadia Gaon. The innkeeper was bewildered, because he didn't know that I was Rav Sa'adia.

When the student described me the innkeeper let out a cry, "Oy I didn't treat hime with the due respect."

The innkeeper hitched his fastest horse and he chased after me. When he finally caught up, he jumped from his wagon and he cried out, "Rebbe Rebbe I am so sorry, I didn't know it was you. Please forgive me."

I responded to him that he did treat me very nicely, "Why are you so disturbed? You have nothing to apologize for."

"No no Rebbe," he replied. "If I would have known who you are are I would have served you much much better."

Rav Sa'adia Gaon concluded, "Suddenly I realized that this man is teaching me a valuable lesson in the service of Hashem."

Had I known Hashem yesterday the way I know him today, I definitely would have served him better yesterday, and that's why I am doing Teshuva.

Based on this story we can say as follows. When we walk around, especially during these days of Shovavim and we gain a greater awareness of the chessed and rachamim of Hashem, this gives us a greater appreciation of Hashem.

This includes on a national level for all the nissim and and chassadim that Hashem is constantly doing with His nation as we are hearing all the time.

On a personal level, we keep getting more chessed in ruchniyus and gashmiyus as we are the recipient of Hashem's unlimited kindness.

This should help us do a greater teshuva like Rav Sa'adia Gaon in the story, which will bring us closer and closer to Hashem. That's because a greater Teshuva brings a greater closeness as we explained.

We hope that this Shovavim we should find ourselves so close to Hashem, that we will find ourselves in the Bais Hamikdash where we will experience Hashem's open kindness and closeness, with the return of the Shechina. Because when we return to Hashem, Hashem will for sure return to us.

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

Hashem Loves Uou

Il of my trees are uprooted! And it is clearly your fault," thundered Avi (name changed) to his land developer, Nosson (name changed), at the Beis Din of HaGaon Rav Gavriel Finkel ZT"L the Rav and Posek of the Alumni Beis Medrash of Beis Medrash Govoha.

It was post Hurricane Sandy and the racing winds knocked down thousands of trees across New Jersey. All of Avi's beautiful green trees became lifeless piles of wood laying face up on the ground. Yet, a whole bunch of Avi's neighbors, whose trees were not so green and well maintained, did not lose their trees. Surprisingly, their trees were thriving and firmly rooted, in sharp contrast to Avi and many others who lost all of their trees.

"It must be the negligence of my land developer who didn't plant the trees and cultivate them properly," said Avi to HaGaon Rav Finkel. "Why else are my trees any worse off than these neighbors whose trees survived the hurricane?"

Rav Finkel responded: "I would like to find out which neighbors spent hundreds of dollars in-

vesting in advanced irrigation systems to water their trees and which neighbors didn't. Please make a clear list with this information so I can investigate this case properly."

Shockingly, it came out that all of those who spent their hard-earned money on these underground sprinkler irrigation systems, LOST THEIR TREES during Hurricane Sandy, while the others who didn't spend this money, KEPT THEIR TREES.

Rav Finkel explained, "Those trees who had their water available to them at all times, because their owners installed advanced underground sprinkler systems, never needed to spread their roots to look for water and nutrition. Therefore, these trees never developed deep and firm roots, and they fell to the strong

winds of Sandy. In sharp contrast are the trees whose owners didn't install these irrigation systems – their roots needed to spread out more and more deeply into the ground in order to locate water and nutrients for survival. These deep roots proved stronger than the mightiest of hurricane winds."

This true story demonstrates that if things go hard for us, we are lucky in the long run, as we are building deep roots and firm footing, mightier than the strongest Hurricane winds of life. The Emunah, Tefilah, and new skills that we develop during challenges are valuable and precious - providing us with a deeply rooted connection with Hashem.

ZAIDY TO THE RESCUE

Alone, fourteen-year-old Shraga went into the empty Slonimer shul in Bnei Brak, where he saw a 95-year-old Yid davening. Little did Shraga know that the Yid was **Reb Osher Arkovich**. After the Yid finished, he asked the young boy his name and why he isn't in school.

"I haven't had luck in any school system," the boy replies, embarrassed. "I was expelled from eight schools already, and I'm now forlorn." Growing up, Shraga had a hard time sitting still in class, and school after school would expel him. 
Thus, the clerk agreed to give R' Yisrael's students all free doughnuts on the condition that they indeed made a *bracha* aloud for her to say *Amen* to.

The story doesn't stop there.


The next morning, R' Yisrael got a message from one of those students to tell him the impact of the previous night's events. "I'm changing my life around."





Adults would be given child size doses of medication and infants given adult size doses...


Dentists would be performing open heart surgeries, without any anesthesia, to fill in cavities.
